New Cafeteria Opens On Arsenal

Unveiled at Redstone Arsenal on March 1 was a super-modern cafeteria, decorated in contemporary colors with modern dining appointments.

Maj. Gen. J. B. Medaris formally removed the ribbon on the new cafeteria. Col. Fred Florimont, Regional Exchange officer whose headquarters are in Atlanta, Ga., was present for the ceremony.

Capt. John J. Wattendorf, Redstone Arsenal Exchange officer, conducted the visitors on a tour of the facilities accompanied by the cafeteria manager, Mrs. Hattie Burns.

Free coffee and doughnuts were served at the open house immediately following the formal opening.

The cafeteria, located in the Headquarters Building for the Army Ballistic Missile Agency, has a private dining room opening into it, a snack bar and a regular service line.

Metal and plastic furniture in soft grey is trimmed with a coral-pink stripe around the table edgings.

Drapes of soft green hang beneath wooden valances of coral-pink and the green of the walls is contrastingly light.

An estimated 2,000 people will be served every day in this cafeteria which comfortably seats 323 people.

200 ATTENDING HAWK MEETING

Approximately 200 persons representing various government agencies and private industry contractors will meet at Redstone Arsenal today and Wednesday, to interchange ideas and planning on the Hawk anti-aircraft guided missile.

The missile is being developed by Raytheon Manufacturing Co., Boston, Mass., under technical direction of Redstone Arsenal.

Edward L. Smock, project director, of the Arsenal's Project Management Staff, is coordinating plans for the local presentation, largest to be held here on the Hawk missile.

The representatives, coming from throughout the United States will be welcomed by Brig. Gen. H. N. Toffoy, Arsenal commander, on Tuesday morning in the Rocket Auditorium, where all the business sessions will be held. An introduction to the presentation will be given by Col. Miles B. Chatfield, director of Redstone Ordnance Missile Laboratories.

A social hour will be held at 5 p.m. today at the Russel Erskine Hotel, followed by a dinner at 6:30.

The Army - Air Force Wage Board has granted an increase in wage rates for all Wage Board employees at Redstone Arsenal, the Army Ballistic Missile Agency, and the Ordnance Guided Missile School.

The new rates will be effective 12 March 1956 and will be reflected in employees' checks as follows:

a. Check received by employees of the Ordnance Guided Missile School on 29 March 1956 will include the increase for a period of one week (12 March through 18 March).

b. Checks received by persons employed in other than the Guided Missile School on 5 April 1956 will include the increase for the full pay period (12 March through 25 March).

The new rates will be applied step for step and grade for grade. For example, if an employee is now in Step 2 of Grade 12 making \$1.97 per hour, he will receive \$2.07 per hour (Step 2, Grade 12).





RED CROSS WORK AT ARSENAL TOLD

(Editor's note: The following article regarding local Red Cross aid to Arsenal personnel was provided by officials of the Madison County Chapter, ARC).

Since July 1, 1955, when the Red Cross fiscal year began, thru February, \$2294.00 has been provided servicemen at Redstone in emergencies. Some of this is repaid in small monthly payments when the serviceman and his family will not suffer a hardship. The fact that is important is that this amount of money was used by Redstone servicemen in this amount of time for emergencies. In addition to actual money is the service.

For each emergency there is the necessity of at least two telegrams or two long distance telephone calls, often more. One comes from the home verifying illness and giving doctor's interpretive statement, the other goes back telling leave has been granted and when serviceman expects to arrive at home.

This service is a 24-hour service, given Sundays and nights. Just recently a man because of Red Cross facilities got home by plane to California in time to see his father before his death. This service was given on Sunday. The man came in on his return and repaid the entire \$250.00 advanced to him but said money couldn't repay what it had meant to him to have RC help at that time. He said he had the money in his savings but, of course, could not get

to it on Sunday.

Red Cross also serves as a means of communication for servicemen and their families. A man may be worried about home conditions and through RC we can get factual information.

In addition to the services given the servicemen and their families at Redstone, the Red Cross blood program is available. Also the First Aid training and Water Safety training. A group of MP's have just completed an intensive training session in First Aid and are now qualified as Red Cross First Aid instructors. This was possible because a National Red Cross Field Representative could come to Redstone and spend a week teaching these men.

Until December 1953 Madison County did not participate in the Blood Program except for Defense. It was through the civilians at Redstone who knew the value of the Red Cross blood program elsewhere that our local Medical Society became interested in having this program in our local hospitals.

Many of the Redstone wives, both military and civilian, are active Red Cross volunteers in the Madison County Chapter. They

serve in many ways. Many work regular days in the office working as receptionist, typists, and doing the necessary filing. Others help to staff the Bloodmobile, serving in many ways to assist the Bloodmobile nurses.



AN HONEST CONFESSION IS GOOD FOR THE SOUL. The origin and date of this wise saying is unknown, nevertheless, a truer statement has never been made. It has been true throughout all the ages and during all stages of human life. Its meaning is clear and all can recall incidents that have occurred during a lifetime that adds weight to the proof that the statement is true.

Perhaps one may recall an event during childhood when an honest confession relieved a burdened soul. Such was the case when a small boy possessed with a mischievous nature pushed the small outdoor "reading room" over and let it fall in a ditch. No one saw the culprit, but a father wise from past experiences, obtained a confession from the lad by telling him the story of George Washington and the cherry tree. When the confession was made, however, the father immediately used the only "switch" that has been omitted from the present day home that is controlled by automation. The only explanation given by the father for digressing from the cherry tree story was that, "More than likely George's father was not in the cherry tree

when it was chopped down."

There is of course a more serious side, the subject of confession. It is a mandatory factor in the Christian religion. Those of the Christian faith must confess the divinity of Christ and must confess their faults one to another in order to meet the Bible requirements. Whether the confession is trivial as illustrated by the cherry tree story or pertains to such weighty matters as the salvation of man, it is still good for the soul.

Recently, a fellow arsenalite suggested that the Safety Director must feel good after making a speech on "Hindrances to the Guided Missile Program." Meaning that an honest confession is good for the soul and implying that safety is a hindrance to the program. This statement was received as a joke since it came from one of our most cooperative supervisors and directly from him to the Safety Office. Even though spoken in jest it still furnishes food for thought.

The impression that safety hinders production is one of the greatest obstacles encountered in an accident prevention program. That such an idea prevails cannot be denied and that a fair portion of the blame rests with safety personnel is accepted. An investigation of this subject will reveal that when hindrances are caused by safety it is not due to safety engineering but rather to a lack of safety engineering. True safety engineering is to determine the safest method of doing a job commensurate with cost and degree of hazard involved. When this rule is followed production will be increased by safety and not hindered.

Hindrance may be expected when safety personnel attempt to

enforce their ideas regardless of cost and degree of hazard. This policy results in impractical safety suggestions that may not only hinder production, but may defeat the accident prevention program as well.

An honest confession is good for the soul and the Safety Office confesses that they are endeavoring to promote a program in keeping with the true meaning of SAFETY ENGINEERING.


