## Dr. Emmons Guest Lecturer at Ohio State University


Dr. William Emmons, Head of the Organic Chemistry Group of the Redstone Division of Rohm & Haas Company, spent the week of July 23-27 as a summer lecturer at the Chemistry Department of Ohio State University.

The program in which Dr. Emmons took part was set up by Drs. Newman and Cava of Ohio

State and will bring to the campus this summer such people as Professor Johnson of the University of Wisconsin and Professor C. R. Hausser of Duke University. Dr. Emmons delivered three lectures to the graduate students and the faculty.

Dr. Emmons received a BS in chemistry from the University of Minnesota in 1947 and a PhD in organic chemistry from the University of Illinois in 1951. Upon graduation he joined the Redstone Division of Rohm & Haas.

## HERMES MISSILE IS PRESENTED TO AREA CITIZENS

A Hermes missile, the Army's first surface-to-surface guided missile, was officially presented to the citizens of Huntsville and Madison County by Redstone Arsenal in a brief ceremony last week.

In making the dedicatory talk, Brig. Gen. H. N. Toffoy, Redstone commander, cited the "significant developments" that came from the Hermes project which were later employed to achieve greater performance and accuracy in Nike, Corporal and other weapons systems.

"The most recent example of direct application to Hermes work is the adaptation of one of the efficient Hermes-developed rocket engines as the main power plant for the power plant for the earth satellite which the President of the United States announced a few months ago," the general said.

The Hermes, he said, is the most appropriate missile to put on public display "to represent the interest, the progressive spirit, and the achievements of the Huntsville-Madison County - Redstone community."

The missile is located at a new park on the Parkway at Airport Road. A historical marker identifying the missile, placed by the Huntsville-Madison County Chamber of Commerce, was unveiled by Carol Record, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Record, and Bobby Cooper, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Cooper.

## CWO John Flecher Retires After 20 Years Army Service

Chief Warrant Officer John Flecher of the Ordnance Guided Missile School retires from the Army today after 20 years service.

CWO Flecher, son of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Flecher, Route 1, Wampum, Pennsylvania, is a Signal Corps officer who has been serving as an instructor in the Redstone Branch, Surface to Surface Missile Division here at the school.

He retires after serving since July 10, 1936, but will remain here to work for the government as a Civil Service employe.

CWO Flecher has had a varied career during which he has served nearly six years overseas and put in tours of duty at eight stateside posts. He served in England, Africa, and Italy from August 1942 to March 1944 and in the Far East from July 1950 to December 1953. Besides his recent tour at the Ordnance Guided Missile School, he has served at Fort Meade, Md., Fort Benning, Ga., Fort Sill, Oklahoma, Fort Knox, Ky., Fort Monmouth, N. J., Fort Lewis, Wash., and the New York Port of Embarkation.



**Graduate Program Students Making Excellent Progress**

Some students participating in the Redstone Arsenal Graduate Study Program are reported making "really amazing progress."

A case in point is that of Pfc Robert Poh who holds a B. S. degree from Newark College of Engineering. Last fall, Poh registered at the Huntsville Center for Fluid Mechanics, a 100 course. Poh, along with a couple of other inspired characters, made a careful study of the University of Alabama Catalog and discovered a clause which stated that courses in the 100-plus bracket could count as graduate credit, with the approval of the appropriate dean.

Poh consulted Philip Macon, director of the Huntsville Center. The upshot of the discussion was that Poh applied for admission to the University of Alabama Graduate School and was accepted. Promptly he demanded credit for Fluid Mechanics — and received it.

Meantime he registered for a course in Mathematics 126, just beginning at the Redstone Arsenal Graduate Study Program. By February he had earned six hours of graduate credit.

Now he was ready for the next graduate course beginning February 25. He almost missed this one when he caught his hand in the class-room door and opened a significant cut, but an hour and four stitches later he was back in class studying vibrations.

This summer he is on six-weeks leave earning six more graduate hours at the Tuscaloosa Campu-

—a total of 15 graduate hours in less than a year. Not bad for part-time student, full-time soldier.



The power of habit should not be underestimated since an individual's success or failure may be the result of habits formed early in life. 

This act which demonstrates the power of habit would have gone unnoticed and without damage had the left hand not been holding a tall glass of iced tea when it made its habitual trip to the ear. If you care to try this as an experiment, I suggest you leave out the sugar and lemon—it's sticky.

**ORDNANCE CORPS RECEIVES ARMY AWARD OF MERIT FOR SAFETY IN '55**

The Ordnance Corps recently received a Department of the Army Award of Merit for Safety for 1955, it was announced by Arsenal Safety Office officials.

This was the fifth award for improvement of its safety record

which the Ordnance Corps has earned in the last five years.

In accepting the award, Maj. Gen. E. L. Cummings, Chief of Ordnance, said, "I am confident that the men and women of the Corps will again measure up to my expectations and make 1956 the best year for safety ever experienced."

"As in the preceding four award years, I extend congratulations and best wishes for continued success to personnel at all Ordnance installations."

However, Gen. Cummings pointed out that "the progress made in operational safety at some installations was not up to expectations during 1955. It is not encouraging to note some retrogression in the individual records for the first five months of 1956. Therefore, I offer the reminder that in January, 1956, the objectives of the Ordnance Safety Program for calendar year 1956 were established as: motor vehicle accidents—0.8 accidents per 100,000 miles driven; civilian disabling injuries—1.8 injuries per 1,000,000 man-hours; other Army disabling injuries—1.3 injuries per 1,000,000 man-hours; military disabling injuries—3.0 injuries per 100,000 man-days."

Gen. Cummings continued, "The safety record of the Ordnance Corps is now at a point where further improvement in accident prevention can be achieved only through continued and concerted efforts of management, supervisory, and operator personnel. I expect each commander to take immediate action to insure that all personnel at his installation are fully aware of the responsibility



