## Lt. Col. Ernest Ewbank Named Asst. Commandant at OGMS



Lt. Col. Ernest W. Ewbank is the new assistant commandant of the Ordnance Guided Missile School.

Col. Ewbank, holder of the Bronze Star Medal and Army Commendation Ribbon, comes to OGMS from Fort Polk, La., where he served as Ordnance Officer in the First Armored Division.

An outstanding amateur tennis player and a graduate of the University of North Carolina, Col. Ewbank has been in the service since March 1941. He has twice served overseas in the Southwest Pacific from 1942-1945, and in Panama from 1952-1955.

His career began at Fort Stewart, Ga., in 1941. From there he went to Fort Ord, Calif., to the Southwest Pacific, and back to the Third Service Command in Baltimore, Md.

After that followed tours in Second Army Headquarters at Fort Meade, Md., at the U. S. Military Academy at West Point.

## 3-Part Housing Program Gets Under Way Here

The first of a three-part housing construction program planned for Redstone Arsenal got under way Saturday when ground-breaking ceremonies were held for a 50-unit MCA project.

Two Capehart housing projects are proposed. Bids for one of these, 270 units, have already been received, and construction is expected to start in the near future. A third project consisting of 400 units is also proposed.

The 50-unit MCA (Military Construction-Army) project is being constructed north of the present

Wherry Housing.

## Assistant Secretary Of Navy Visits Here

Albert Pratt, Assistant Secretary of the Navy, and a member of the Special Defense Advisory Committee on Professional and Technical Compensation, held a day long conference Thursday with top officials of ABMA, Redstone Arsenal, and OGMS.

Mr. Pratt, who is in charge of the Navy Personnel and Reserve Forces, is a member of a committee established in May by Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson to study means of strengthening and stabilizing the status of career personnel and the essential skills

in the military department.

Establishment of this committee resulted from a Hoover Commission report which stated that compensation for military and civilian personnel in the upper grades is inadequate to compete with private industry.

Headed by Ralph J. Cordner, president of the General Electric Company, the committee is to recommend methods of increasing incentive in the technical career field, both through legislative action and administrative policies.

Deputy Post Commander Col. T. O'Keefe (above) has become deputy post commander at Redstone. A native of New York City, Col O'Keefe came to Redstone from the Lordstown Ordnance Depot, Warren, Ohio, where he was commanding officer.

## 5,307 ACRES FOR LEASE HERE

Col. Harold E. Bisbort, Army District Engineer at Mobile, has announced that the Engineers are advertising 5,307 acres of land at Redstone Arsenal for lease for haying and grazing purposes. The lease will be for a term of five years, beginning Oct. 1, 1956.



## 'INSIDES' OF 120-TON LOCOMOTIVE TAKEN OUT IN BIG REPAIR JOB HERE

A heavy maintenance repair job is underway at the new Locomotive Shop Building, operated by the Railway Branch of Transportation Division.

The insides of a 120-ton Baldwin locomotive were lifted out by a 15-ton capacity overhead crane and lie scattered around the shop.

Huge pistons taken from the engine measure 12-3/4" in diameter. Eight of them, making an "eight-cylinder" motor, turn a huge crankshaft to run a generator. This actually makes it an electric instead of a diesel engine, for the electricity thus generated turns traction motors near each axle, which really make the wheels go 'round.

"If we didn't have this overhead crane," says Ancil L. Kent, Chief of Operations, Transportation Division, "we would have to send a job like this to the base maintenance shop, located at Fort Holabird, Md., and pay the freight on it. This is not only expensive, but greatly increases the downtime," he explained.

"With our own facilities we can make the needed repairs on a job

like this and have the locomotive back out on the rails in two weeks or less, depending on availability of parts. It would take two months for a trip to Holabird."

Shop personnel are proud of Locomotive 7461 "She'll hold two 55-gal. drums of crankcase oil," said James R. Foote, shop foreman. "And when cold weather comes, we put 40 gallons of anti-freeze in her cooling system."

Her tanks hold 700 gallons of Diesel fuel. Mr. Foote would not say how many miles per gallon—or gallons per mile—No. 7461 rated. "It varies with the type of run," he said.





**REDSTONE U. OF A. GRADUATE STUDY PROGRAM ENDS FIRST YEAR**

In October, 1955, the University of Alabama and Redstone Arsenal entered into a contract whereby employes at Redstone might have an opportunity to do graduate study in classes taught by the University of Alabama at Redstone Arsenal. Preliminary meetings of potential graduate students were held in November and December of 1955 and January of 1956. As a result of these meetings, two graduate classes were offered in mathematics beginning in November. These were Advanced Calculus and Operational Methods. In early February, a course in Introduction to Theoretical Physics was begun followed by a course in Human Relations in Industry. Starting this same month were Advanced Heat Transfer, Vibrations and Transients of Linear Systems. Beginning in June another course in mathematics, Introduction to Mathematical Statistics, along with a second course in Theoretical Physics was taught. The summer courses ended Aug. 17.

During the course of the first academic year 101 students enrolled in the graduate program. Two of the classes were taught by department heads from the University who commuted to Redstone. The other classes were taught by civilian and military personnel who were appointed as part-time teachers by the University. During this summer, three graduate students have done additional study at the University campus, and during the fall and

winter terms more graduate students will attend the campus of the University to complete requirements for their master's degree.

Tentative plans of offerings for the 1956-57 academic year resulting from a questionnaire this spring have been completed. Classes begin Sept. 19. All classes this year will be held in Building T-152 (old Troop Area on Patton Road on the Arsenal). Classes will be offered in physics, mathematics, chemistry, mechanical engineering, aeronautical engineering, engineering mechanics, accounting and management during this academic year.



This is an unassembled examination and calls for mechanical skill, although some education can be substituted for experience.
