Mighty Missile Display Set Saturday

NATIVE ALABAMIAN

Gen. E. H. McDaniel to Be Guest Speaker at Event

A native Alabamian, Maj. Gen. Edward H. McDaniel, will be guest speaker at Huntsville's Armed Forces Day celebration Saturday, May 18.

Gen. McDaniel is director of manpower operations in the office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel, Department of the Army, Washington. He is a native of Abbeville, Ala.

The event in which Gen. McDaniel will take part is to include exhibits of some of the nation's newest and most deadly rocket and guided missile weapons. The morning parade and all-day show will be held in downtown Huntsville, with the missile displays and various other exhibits situated on the Courthouse Square.

The address will be delivered, and the parade reviewed, from a stand on the Square. "Power for Peace" will be the theme of the observance.

Gen. McDaniel is a 1926 West Point graduate with an extensive background in Army field and staff positions. During his 31 years of active duty he has served two periods in the Far East and two in Europe. His World War II service included combat duty with the 29th Infantry Div's on as chief of staff and infantry regimental commander.

In 1953 and 1954 he was deputy chief of staff for the Army Forces Far East. He then became chief of staff for the Allied Land Forces Southeastern Europe, in Izmir, Turkey. He has been in his present position since last year.

Gen. McDaniel is a graduate of The Infantry and Cavalry Schools, the Command and General Staff College, the Army War College, and the National War College.

He has been awarded the Silver Star with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Legion of Merit with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Bronze Star Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Commendation Ribbon with Pendant, the Purple Heart, the French Legion of Honor, and the French Croix de Guerre with Palm. He has also received from Greece the Order of the Phoenix, Knight Commander.

Mayor R. B. Searcy Saturday signed the following proclamation:

"Whereas, the third Saturday in May was proclaimed Armed Forces Day by the President of the United States in 1950 to symbolize unification of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and Reserve Forces at all levels of command; "Whereas, the annual observance of this national occasion during the past seven years has afforded the public an opportunity to witness the close working relationship of all members of America's defense team, which stands ever alert to new dangers to the security of the nation and the free world;

"And whereas the preservation of our freedom and the search for peace require the maintenance of a strong and alert national defense;

"Now therefore, I, R. B. Searcy, mayor of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, do hereby proclaim Saturday, May 18, Armed Forces Day in Huntsville, and urge every citizen to share in this eighth annual salute to our fellow citizens serving in the Armed Forces of the United States."

BELIEVED BIGGEST VARIETY OF SUCH WEAPONS EVER ASSEMBLED PUBLICLY

A representative segment of the nation's military might, including nearly a dozen of the Army's latest and most deadly rocket weapons, will be displayed in Huntsville Saturday on Armed Forces Day.

It is thought to be the biggest variety of rockets and guided missiles ever assembled publicly in this country. All of the unclassified major missile weapons in the Army's arsenal are to be shown.

Thousands of persons from Huntsville and surrounding area are expected to attend.

The weapons, to be exhibited by Redstone, ABMA, and OGMS, will be a major attraction on an all-day program marking the eighth annual Armed Forces Day. The Army, Navy, and Air Force will take part in the observance, which will include "open house" events at National Guard and Navy Reserve quarters, a fly-over by a jet fighter formation, band concerts, a downtown parade, and a speech by Maj. Gen. E. H. McDaniel, director of manpower in the Army's office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for personnel.

Among the guided missiles shown will be the Nike-Hercules, which will be making its public debut. It will be shown by OGMS Little John, Dart, Lacrosse, and Nike-Hercules have been added to the Army missile family in recent months. The first three have been displayed on the installation previously, but will be making their first appearance in Huntsville.

Others in the Army line-up are Redstone, Corporal, Honest John Little John, Nike-Ajax, Dart, Lacrosse, a new type Bazooka, a multi-tube launcher, and an artillery rocket launcher. An Air Force Falcon and a booster for a Matador missile will be displayed by Thiokol Chemical Corporation.

In addition to the missiles themselves, several pieces of related ground equipment will be shown. In this category will be a guidance and control trailer for the Redstone missile and a new

type fire engine. Activities will begin at 9 a.m., Central Daylight Time, when the exhibits and booths will be in place around the Courthouse Square and open to the public. In addition to the weapons, many other displays by the Armed Forces will be located on the square and in store windows downtown and at the Parkway Shopping Center.

The speech and parade will come at 10:30 and 11 respectively. (See tentative schedule of events elsewhere in this issue.)

POST'S MISSILES ON AFD DISPLAY AROUND NATION

Nearly a score of Army rocket and guided missile weapons from this installation will be "on parade" around the country this week in connection with Armed Forces Day.

Nine will be shown in Huntsville Saturday.

The Washington area's observance, scheduled for Andrews Air Force Base, will include five weapons from here. The Army Ballistic Missile Agency is sending a Redstone missile, and Redstone Arsenal will display the Lacrosse, Little John, Dart, and Nike-Hercules.

The Ordnance Guided Missile School is slated to exhibit a Nike-Ajax anti-aircraft missile at Brookley Air Force Base, Mobile.

A Hermes, the first experimental missile developed by the Army, will be entered in a parade on Friday at Chattanooga. It is being furnished by Redstone Arsenal.

A Corporal ballistic missile from Redstone will be in a parade Saturday morning at Shelbyville, Tenn. Saturday afternoon it will be moved to Ft. Campbell, Ky., to be included in an Open House scheduled Sunday by the 101st Airborne Division.



Bid Opening Dates Announced for Two Redstone Projects

Lt. Col. R. O. Miller, Assistant Army District Engineer at Mobile, has announced that invitations for bids have been issued for two jobs at Redstone Arsenal, with bid opening dates scheduled in June.

The first job is for the construction of three class and laboratory buildings. They will be two-story concrete and concrete-block structures with each floor having an area of 24,160 square feet. The buildings will be equipped with plumbing, heating, ventilating, air conditioning, interior electrical, and lightning protection systems, and utility vaults and pits. The bids received for the work will be opened on June 4.

The second job is for the construction of two shop training buildings and a boiler and compressor house.

Each shop building will have a floor area of approximately 36,000 square feet, with structural steel framework, masonry and corrugated asbestos siding walls, concrete floors, and an insulated built-up roof. They will be equipped with plumbing, forced-hotwater heating, interior electrical, inter communication, compressed air, and air conditioning and ventilating systems, an electric clock and program system, and a 10-ton traveling crane.

The boiler and compressor house will have a floor area of approximately 1,900 square feet and will be of masonry construction. A 30,000-pound boiler and a 3,500-pound compressor will be installed in the structure, as well as the required utility systems including power ventilation.



Deschere, Richey Present Papers at Meeting in Indiana

Allen Deschere, general manager of the Redstone Arsenal Research Division of Rohm and Haas Co., and Dr. H. W. Richey, technical director of the Redstone Division of Thiokol Chemical Corp. presented invited papers yesterday (Tuesday, May 14) at the annual meeting of the Commercial Chemical Development Association held at French

Lick, Ind. The Commercial Chemical Development Association, made up largely of company presidents, vice-presidents, and department heads of the largest American chemical companies is designed to promote the advancement of commercial chemical development. Each year experts in the fields of research, development, production, and sales are brought together for the mutual exchange of information.







Donaldson finished the inning with eight players on the field.

During a pre-game ceremony, Brig. Gen. J. G. Shinkle, RSA deputy commanding general, greeted the players of both teams and threw out the first ball.

The "Rockets" next home game will be on the 21st of May at 19-00 hours against the Huntsville "Boosters" at Linton Field.


