## UGF DRIVE GATHERS MOMENTUM, \$28,000 IN; ONE-THIRD OF GOAL

The United Givers Fund campaign on the Arsenal began to gather momentum this week. Contributions reported through Monday from 4,000 employees totaled more than \$28,000. This represents almost one-third of the goal of \$94,000. The drive has been completed in the Rohm & Haas Division, according to Mrs. Glenn Hymer, division chairman, except for the

company's contribution. Gifts from 238 employees there, using the payroll deduction plan, totaled \$3,467. The average gift per contractor was \$15.01, with 97.1 per cent participation. This represents a 10 per cent increase in the size of individual contributions over last year, says Mrs. Hymer.

## Von Braun Receives DA Honor

### SEC. BRUCKER PRESENTS AWARD IN WASHINGTON

Dr. Wernher von Braun, director of development operations in the Army Ballistic Missile Agency, received the Exceptional Civilian Service Award from the Department of the Army last week.

Signed by Wilber M. Brucker, the Secretary of the Army, the Award was presented to Dr. von Braun at the annual banquet of the Association of the U. S. Army in the Sheraton Park Hotel in Washington, D. C., last Wednesday night.

Among those witnessing presentation were Mrs. von Braun and Maj. Gen. and Mrs. J. B. Medaris. Gen. Medaris commands the Missile Agency, which is developing the Jupiter Intermediate Range Ballistic Missile and weaponizing the Redstone Ballistic Missiles.

The award said in part:

"Dr. von Braun, an outstanding authority on the technology of rockets, guided missiles, and outer space, has made significant advances in the development of ballistic guided missiles for the Army, and has organized and given inspiring leadership to the highly competent team of scientists and engineers in the Agency. By these acts he has contributed immeasurably to the defense of the United States and has done credit to the scientific community he so ably represents."

## COL. COLLINS TAKES ON NEW DUTIES AS ANTI-MISSILE CHIEF

Thiokol solicitors have received \$9,830.88 toward a goal of \$12,000. This represents 75 per cent of the goal. This includes a gift of \$1,000 from the Thiokol Corporation.

Largest single contribution reported so far was made by George M. Robinson, of Athens. Robinson, an engineer in the Maintenance Branch of Support Operations Division, ABMA, used the pledge system to give \$120.

Although he lives out of the county, Robinson said he did not feel restricted to lending a helping hand to a particular locality. "It's still less than \$5 a pay period," he said.

"The progress reflected this week by turn-ins in the Arsenal's UGF campaign is encouraging," said C. W. Huth, chairman of the executive committee for the drive, "but we still have a long way to go to reach our goal."

"I would like to encourage all employees to take advantage of the pledge system to increase the size of their contributions. Larger gifts can be made with much less strain on your budget in this manner," he said.

Givers can check either of two suggested plans on pledge cards—four equal payments, Jan. 1, Mar. 1, May 1, and July 1, 1958—or 12 monthly payments, beginning Jan. 1, 1958. Or the employee can select his own method of making payments, and write the information on his card.

"Only two more weeks remain of our scheduled drive," Mr. Huth said today. "I urge every solicitor to redoubled efforts to contact his assigned employees quickly to complete our drive by Nov. 15. And I urge everyone to give generously, that our goal of \$94,000 may not only be reached, but surpassed. The 17 agencies represented are worthy of your help. Every dollar contributed will be used wisely to help make this a

better community."



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



## Electronic Stock Accounting System Effected by ABMA Supply Branch

Conversion from a manual stock accounting system to an electronic machine system is now underway by the Army Ballistic Missile Agency's Technical Materials and Equipment Branch, which is responsible for all supply for the Agency.

The new machine system is expected to save considerable time and money, and improve the overall effectiveness of TM&E's operation.

In fact, TM&E officials believe their system "will provide a more comprehensive method of controlling supplies than any other machine system for supply accounting presently known."

The system was developed by TM&E personnel in conjunction with the branch's Service Bureau, a contractor organization for servicing of International Business Machine equipment.

Supply inventory cards worked up during each day by TM&E clerks are processed that night through the huge IBM machines in ABMA's Computation Lab (B1. 650), and TM&E receives a report the next morning giving a complete account of all supply transactions for the previous day. In this manner, the TM&E Branch knows at any time the current

money value of its inventory, the number of items stocked, and the turnover rate.

Complete conversion to the electronic machine accounting system is expected in the branch by the first of January.



Lt. Nordstrom is being separated from military service this week. He has accepted a position with the Agency.

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




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
