Italian General Will Address Italian Group Finishing Courses at OGMS Mon.

Maj. Gen. Felice Santini, air attache of the Italian Embassy, Washington, will make the principal address next Monday, June 23rd, to 60 Italian Air Force officers and airmen who are completing their training on the Nike - Ajax and Nike - Hercules surface - to - air missiles at the Ordnance Guided Missile School.

The graduation exercises for the second Italian class to complete training here will be held at 10 a. m. next Monday at the Post Theatre.

The graduates, like their compatriots who completed the first phase of their missile schooling on May 26th, will transfer to the OGMS Unit Training Center to continue their training.

Gen. Santini is a native of Rome who prior to his Washington assignment was chief of military intelligence in the Italian Air Ministry.

Dr. von Braun Receives Honorary Degree From University of Pittsburgh

An honorary degree of Doctor of Science was conferred recently by the University of Pittsburgh upon Dr. Wernher von Braun, Director, Development Operations Division, ABMA.

Honorary degrees were also conferred on three other persons by Chancellor Edward H. Litchfield. They were: Frank Richard Denton, vice-chairman of the board, Mellon National Bank and Trust Company; Arthur Hays Sulzberger, publisher of the New York Times; and Robert De Blois Calkins, president of the Brookings Institution.

Dr. von Braun's citation was for "your imagination, leadership and determination in the pursuit of new knowledge and for your extremely successful application of that knowledge to problems vitally affecting your nation's welfare."

COL. McCLOSKEY NAMED DEPUTY POST COMMANDER

Col. Owen T. McCloskey has been named Deputy Post Commander of Redstone Arsenal, it was announced by Col. Keith T. O'Keefe, Post Commander.

Col. McCloskey came to Redstone from Ft. Benning, Ga., where he served as Ordnance Officer in the U. S. Army Infantry Center from May, 1955, until his assignment here.

The Ohioan is a graduate of Aquinas College and Ohio State University, both located in his home town of Columbus. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration at Ohio State. He received a Master of Arts degree in foreign affairs at George Washington University, Washington, D. C. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., and the Armed Forces Staff College at Norfolk, Va.

Col. McCloskey became a member of the Armed Forces in 1940 and has served in many states of the union as well as England, France, and Belgium. He is entitled to wear the Hazza Star Medal and Order of King Leopold II of Belgium.

As Redstone Deputy Commander, he succeeds Col. John M. Woestenburg, who has been transferred to Fort Benning.

Just prior to Col. McCloskey's transfer from Ft. Benning, he was presented a Certificate of Achievement for "outstanding service" by Brig. Gen. John F. Ruggles, Deputy Commanding General of The Infantry Center.

WITH WAGE BOARD BOOST

\$909,000 Yearly Payroll Hike Due

3,798 WORKERS AFFECTED HERE

Annual payrolls of the Ordnance Corps activities at Redstone Arsenal will increase by \$909,000, Maj. Gen. J. B. Medaris, Commanding General of the Army Ordnance Missile Command, announced last week.

The Army - Air Force Wage Board in Washington advised the Command that all Wage Board employees will be affected by the increase. It resulted from a periodical wage survey in the Huntsville area, which encompasses a radius of 70 miles.

The number of employees involved follows:

Redstone Arsenal and Ordnance Guided Missile School — 1,857.

Army Rocket and Guided Missile Agency — 256.

Army Ballistic Missile Agency — 1,676.

Army Ordnance Missile Command Headquarters — 9.

The average increase will be 11½ cents per hour. It will become effective with the first pay period after June 27.

Gen. C. C. Williams, Formerly Chief of Ordnance, Dies in Va.

Maj. Gen. (Ret.) Clarence C. Williams, Chief of Army Ordnance from 1918 to 1930, died Friday at Woodstock, Va. Interment was held at the Arlington National Cemetery, Monday, with full military honors.

A West Point graduate near the head of his class, Gen. Williams was on Gen. Pershing's staff during World War I. He returned to the U. S. in 1918 to reorganize the Ordnance Dept. He established the Field Service Division in Ordnance, which is responsible for the storage and maintenance of weapons. He made other changes in handling weapons, especially in purchasing. He gave the Infantry and Artillery more say-se about the weapons they wanted and is reputed to have said, "If the fighting men want elephants, we'll get them elephants."

Gen. Williams was born in Georgia. His decorations included the Distinguished Service Medal. He was an officer and later commander of the French Legion of Honor. He was Companion of St. Michael and St. George (British) and Commander of Order of Polonia, Restitua (Polish).

Gen. Williams is survived by three sisters, Martha Williams, and Mary Carpenter, with whom he made his home, and Mrs. George W. Beers, Washington. His wife was the late Constance Lodge Williams, daughter of Henry Cabot Lodge, Sr.


This book is being compiled with the assistance of the Huntsville-Madison County Chamber of Commerce, City and County officials, and civic organizations.

Dr. Rufus Oldenburger, professor of mechanical engineering, Purdue University will speak on "Non-Linear Automatic Control" at 10 a. m. today at the Rocket Auditorium, Bldg. 7120.

Dr. Oldenburger will discuss the synthesis of control functions for non-linear systems subject to some criterion for the optimal transient response. He will also cover the phenomenon of stabilization of otherwise unstable systems by application of non-linear theory. Interested persons are invited to attend this non-classified lecture.

ARMY GETS 'KINGFISHER'—Award of a \$7,500,000 contract to the Lockheed Aircraft Corp., Missile Division, Sunnyvale, Calif., for procurement of the "Kingfisher," (model shown above) a high performance target missile used to evaluate surface-to-air defense systems, has been announced by the Army Ordnance Missile Command. The program is under jurisdiction of the Army Rocket and Guided Missile Agency.

Work to be carried on by Lockheed will be done at Sunnyvale and Van Nuys, Calif., and Holloman Air Force Base, New Mexico. "Kingfisher" is utilized in tests conducted at the White Sands Missile Range, an element of the Missile Command. The contract was signed last week in the San Francisco Ordnance District Office.

Dr. Oldenburger is the author of four books treating various topics in mathematics and control systems, in addition to numerous papers.





Safety Mark Broken — On Friday, the 13th

The civilian injury-free goal of 30 days as set by the "Safety Scoreboard" was reached on Wednesday, 11 June, but was broken on Friday, 13 June, when an employe in the Transportation Office received serious burns at Bldg. 3636. This employe was engaged in steam-cleaning an automobile when he lost control of the steam hose and the whipping action of the hose resulted in the burns. He was sent to the Huntsville Hospital for treatment.

Reaching this 30-day goal means that civilian employes worked approximately two million man-hours without a serious injury. This is the first time that a 30-day goal has been reached by civilian employes at this installation this year, but it indicates that such is easily possible if supervision and individual employes will actually concentrate their efforts to avoid the unsafe conditions and unsafe acts which result in disabling injuries. According to the Safety Office, another goal of 30 days is being set and all personnel are urged to concentrate their efforts toward reaching this goal.

Prouty Takes Reins As Accountants Head

J. G. Thomas, Rohm & Haas Co., Huntsville, reported the chapter standing in the Stephenson Trophy Competition as 18th place in national competition. Official standings will be received from New York headquarters later this month.

Stanley Veatch, Redstone Arsenal, past president, discussed plans for the 39th International Accounting Conference to be held at Chicago, June 22 thru 25. Eight members of the North Alabama Chapter plan to attend this conference. A record attendance of over 2,500 members is expected from the Association's 137 chapters located throughout this country and from over 60 foreign countries. Twenty-four top corporate executives and ranking accounting and business experts have been scheduled to appear as speakers.

Engineers Ask Bids On Building for Use Of ABMA Contractors

Contractors have been asked to submit bids to the Army Engineers for the construction of an engineering service rebuild facility for the use of industrial firms doing contract work for the Army Ballistic Missile Agency.

Col. Harold E. Bisbort, U. S. Army District Engineer, has announced that bids for the work will be opened at the Corps of Engineers office, 2301 Grant St., Mobile, Ala., at 11 a. m., C. S. T., on June 24.

The facility will consist of an industrial type building, approximately 110 feet by 198 feet, on a structural concrete slab, with steel framing, corrugated cement-asbestos siding, steel roof deck, and built-up roofing. It will have a high center bay with two-story lean-to on both sides. The building will be steam-heated and air conditioned, and will be equipped with two 15-ton overhead electric travelling cranes. An access road and parking area will be constructed to serve the facility.

Bids Called on Work On Signal Building

The U. S. Army District Engineer at Mobile, Col. Harold E. Bisbort, has announced that bids will be opened in his office, 2301 Grant Street, Mobile, at 11 a. m., C. S. T., on June 27, for making additions and alterations to the Post Signal building, which houses the main telephone exchange, at Redstone Arsenal.

The principal items of work in the job will be the construction of an addition with approximately 5,700 square feet of floor area; the renovation of existing heating, air-conditioning, and plumbing systems in the building and their extension into the addition; and the construction of an electrical system to serve the addition. Provisions will be made in the construction for the future addition of a second story if necessary for further expansion at a later date.

Redstone Missile Fired at Canaveral

A 63-foot Redstone ballistic missile roared into space last Wednesday at Cape Canaveral Fla.

Specially trained troops of the 40th Field Artillery Missile Group fired the missile for the first time on May 17. The 40th Group also fired the Redstone under tactical conditions at the White Sands Missile Range in the New Mexico desert, marking the first time the weapon had been fired inland.

The 40th Group, armed with tactical range Redstone missiles will sail for Europe about June 20. The Redstone ballistic missile capable of using either conventional or nuclear warheads, has an effective range of about 200 miles.

Invitations to Bid On Several Jobs for ABMA Are Sent Out

Invitations to bid for several miscellaneous construction jobs for the Army Ballistic Missile Agency have been sent out by the U. S. Army Engineers.

According to Col. Harold E. Bisbort, Army District Engineer at Mobile, the work includes paving and mechanical work around the deflector pit at the powerplant test area; constructing an addi-

tional parking area for 174 vehicles with lighting at the parking lot serving Bl. 4488; and constructing stabilized aggregate launching pads with flood lighting and latrine facilities at a Jupiter missile crew training site.

Three stabilized launching pads (simulated field conditions) will be constructed at the Jupiter Missile Crew Training Site. Lighting facilities will provide for training during other than normal duty hours.

Bids for the work will be opened at the Corps of Engineers office, 2301 Grant Street, Mobile, Ala., at 11 a. m., C.S.T., on June 20.

The rotating position of senior representative initially will be Dr. F. E. Goddard, Chief of the


Aerodynamics and Propeller Department of JPL. The senior representative will represent JPL in all matters concerning JPL AOMC and its other associated agencies.


