are reflected in AR 25-20, "Investigating and Processing Claims," and AR 25-100, "Claims of Military Personnel and Civilian Employees for Property Lost or Damaged Incident to Service." These regulations are dated 1 October 1959 and became effective on the first of November, 1959.

JA Approves Claims

While only The Judge Advocate General of the Department of the Army may finally DISAPPROVE claims, any headquarters with a Judge Advocate on its staff may APPROVE claims of up to \$500; any headquarters exercising General Court-Martial jurisdiction and having a Staff Judge Advocate may approve claims of up to \$1000; and the Chief, Claims Division, Office of The Judge Advocate General, may approve claims of over \$1000.

In view of this, Headquarters, U.S. Army Ordnance Missile Command, can approve certain claims of up to \$1000. It is expected that the new procedure will materially decrease settlement time, as approximately 90 percent of all claims will now be settled at this level.

Realizing that claims benefits can rarely satisfy an individual for lost or damages of items of sentimental value or for the time and trouble required for processing claims; and that careful handling of household goods at all times can best prevent dissatisfaction and improve service morale, the Army has also established a system of inspection at all stages of movement.

The new procedures, as outlined above, materially decreases settlement time but claimants can



As a result of a comprehensive review of the entire system of household goods movements, the Army recently inaugurated changed procedures designed to insure, first, safer and more careful handling of service members' property in movement or storage and, secondly, the prompt settlement of any resulting damage claims.



LONGEST OVERLAND TRIP YET IS TAKEN BY THE REDSTONE

A Redstone ballistic missile was launched into the longest overland ballistic trajectory ever attempted in the United States, the Department of the Army announced today. The launching took place at White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico.

The combat-ready weapon carried a "flying TV station" designed to give battlefield commanders an aerial view of the target before, during, and after impact of the missile warhead. This television system was developed under the technical supervision of the Army Signal Corps.

The firing was accomplished by veteran Army troops fresh from assignment in Europe with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) forces.

Impact of Redstone in the 40-mile by 40-mile extension to White Sands Missile Range was the first utilization of the co-use "safety zone" for a ballistic missile program.

The missile's trajectory carried it more than 45 miles high and about 120 miles northward from firing site.

The television camera, carried in an aerodynamically stabilized capsule ejected from the missile re-entry body during the downward leg of its trajectory operated perfectly for the third time in as many tests at White Sands.

Launching the 70-foot-tall liquid propellant missile toward its uprange target were troops of Battery "B", Forty-Sixth Field Artillery Group (Redstone).

Engineer and user evaluation data was gathered from the fully

instrumented test.

The extension area of some 1,600 square miles to the north end of the 100-mile-long Missile Range is used by White Sands Missile Range under an agreement with 32 families who reside in the area. The residents are evacuated for a 12-hour period during each of the 20 extension area firing dates called for in the military-civilian agreement.

The airborne TV camera in today's test transmitted its pictures of the target area to receiving stations near the battery firing position.

GORDON HARRIS WILL BE PIO FOR ARMY ORDNANCE

Gordon L. Harris, public information officer of the Army Ordnance Missile Command until recently, will shortly join the staff of the Chief of Army Ordnance, Lt. Gen. J. H. Hinrichs.

Harris will leave Huntsville about June 30 to assume his new duties in the Pentagon. He will exercise staff supervision over the Ordnance Corps public information program.

He came here in October, 1956 as public information officer, Army Ballistic Missile Agency. In March, 1958, when the AOMC was activated he was promoted to the Command position by Maj. Gen. J. B. Medaris.

Harris supervised the information programs of the Army's missiles and space exploration projects that began with the launching of Explorer I, first Free World earth Satellite, Jan. 31, 1958.

He was public relations advisor to General Medaris and his successor, Maj. Gen. August Schomburg, and Dr. Werner von Braun, who will soon become Director, Marshall Space Flight Center, National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Harris is a graduate of the Columbia College and the Pultizer School of Journalism, in New York City. His son, Thomas, is a senior at that college. Another son, David, employed in the Con-

Control Office, Army Ballistic Missile Agency, has a master's degree in journalism from Columbia.



Insurance For 19 Year Olds Is Individual Problem

Under the current Blue Cross-Blue Shield group plan, certain employes have covered their dependent children over 19 years of age by special arrangement with Alabama Blue Cross-Blue Shield Organization.

When the Federal Government sponsored Health Program becomes effective on July 3 and 10, the current group plan will be cancelled. It will be necessary under these circumstances for employes who have hospital and health benefits for their children over 19 years with the Blue Cross Organization, to contact that organization if they wish to retain this special individual coverage.

The government program does not cover children over 19 years of age unless they are certified incapable of self support through physical or mental incapacity which existed before the child reaches that age and can be expected to continue for more than one year.

Army

ARMY AIRBORNE RADAR SYSTEM surpasses the human eye in separating objects at great distances and produces photographs of what it sees. Designated as the AN/UPD-1, the complete system includes the airborne radar equip-

ment in an Army L-23 aircraft and a mobile ground van. The conversion and processing equipment in the van produces a strip of photographic map which shows the distant areas clearly without distortion due to distance as the human eye and the camera are limited.

Record Ocean Drop Achieved by Navy Off the Marianas

Agana, Guam (AFPS) — The Navy's bathyscaph Trieste dropped 37,800 feet into the black mud of the Pacific January 25 to record a new mark in the exploration of ocean mysteries. The record depth was achieved 200 miles southwest of here in the Marianas Trench, believed to be the deepest scar in the earth's surface.

Aboard the cigar-shaped Trieste were Jacques Piccard and Navy Lt. Don Walsh. This, in part, is an account of the record dive as related by Lt. Walsh: "At 7:15 a.m. with weather good but seas fairly rough we

climbed into our motor whale-boat from the destroyer Lewis. Waves were five to six feet high. The Trieste still was under tow by the Navy tug Wandank.

"Jacques Piccard, myself and two assistants boarded the Trieste. This is tricky. You have to jump from a moving small boat onto the Trieste which is more under water than on top. After we were assured preparations were complete the assistants shut the heavy steel doors and we were alone with our thoughts.

"The bathyscaph tilted stern first and we settled down to the routine of the deep dive. At 800 feet we saw our last daylight."

From this point the two-man crew reported a long but uneventful trip to the bottom where they settled gently in a swirl of

ocean mud. At about 6,000 feet they donned heavy clothing to combat the chill of the ocean depths and ate candy bars to provide food and energy.

Trieste stayed on bottom 20 minutes for data taking, then signaled for return to the surface. The trip up, much faster than the descent, ended as Trieste popped to the surface 10 hours after beginning the record dive.




