Phantom Unveiled

The Birdhouse Caper

It was a real mystery for awhile. For the past few months, small, neat birdhouses have been appearing on trees and fenceposts around Redstone. Nature-lovers phoned the Game Warden's Office to compliment the care and consideration the staff took in its charged duties.

The wardens didn't know where the birdhouses were coming from.

Neither did the veterinarian.

Neither did the Facilities Engineer.

Neither did the MP's.

Finally, one day not long ago, some of the wardens spotted a man nailing up one of the small boxes, with no concern in the world as to who saw him, and decided to investigate this Phantom Birdhouser.

His name, it turned out, was Bill Friday. His occupation, it turned out, was laser physicist. His pastime, it turned out, was Scoutmaster of Troop 15 of the Huntsville branch of the Boy Scouts of America.

Which belatedly explains his activity. These were not just birdhouses, they were bluebird nest boxes. The Huntsville-Madison County bluebird population has been seriously depleted over the past few years, it seems, and Troop 15 has taken it upon themselves

to restore the bluebird to its proper place in the ecosystem.

"Four sources of pressure have caused the bluebirds to decline," Friday says. "One is cold. The winters we've had in the recent past were cold by normal standards and this one was terrible. Bluebirds have a natural aversion to cold. But they don't migrate far south and they don't den, so unless their feathers are especially thick, they freeze to death.

"Another is pesticides. Bluebirds are unusual, in that crop pesticides kill them directly. This is one of the reasons we chose Redstone for our project, since there is little or no cropland on post.

A third is loss of habitat. Bluebirds need open pasture with sparse trees or posts to hunt and nest. Recently the trees have been disappearing, and fenceposts aren't left up long enough to develop termite or woodpecker holes. That brings in the fourth pressure, competition from starlings and sparrows for what little nesting space there is available."

The Scouts started building their boxes with funds collected from the city. "Individuals or families sponsor a

2.75 Rocket May Get New Role

Just like Old Man River, The Army's 2.75 inch rocket keeps rolling along.

Used for years as a helicopter air to ground weapon, the rocket is literally rolling now.

The Missile Research and Development Command is evaluating the 2.75 in a ground based role, a weapon capable of saturating an area the size of several football fields with lethal fragments in seconds.

Evaluation of the weapon called Slammer VI has gone very well so far according to Colonel James L. Tow, project manager. There is no comparable weapon now available to the American soldier. Mobile, multiple rocket systems are used by the armies of many other nations.

The Project Office here managing the 2.75 inch rocket developed and has under test a wheeled launcher mounting six standard helicopter M-200 rocket pods. Each pod carries 19 rockets. In tests, Slammer VI

fired 114 rockets in less than 10 seconds.

Soldiers of the 101st Airborne

Division experimented more than a year ago with rocket pods mounted on jeeps. When that

sparked official interest in possible ground versions of the

Keeping School Staffed No Easy Assignment

If you are enlisted permanent party at the Missile and Munitions Center and School, at one time or another you may have wondered how military people are assigned to jobs and fields, and who assigns them.

The answer is an Initial Assignment Section in the School Brigade headquarters building that places enlisted people in the fields that fit their skills much like an employment agency in the civilian world. The section works closely with First Battalion and the school's five directorates to keep job slots filled.

"We assign personnel to valid positions, through coordination with the directorates," explained Staff Sgt. Royce A. Webb, Section NCOIC.

"Our job is to keep the basic oc-

cupational specialty field 75 percent full. The rest is up to the directorates," he said.

When a person arrives at Redstone as permanent party and is assigned to First Battalion, he is assigned to an occupational specialty by the battalion commander in accordance with Army Regulation 600-200, chapter three. That AR states that commanders will first try to put a soldier in his primary MOS. If that isn't possible they must find him a substitute MOS and give him on the job training. To determine which course to follow, the First Battalion commander relies on Initial Assignments.

When a person first reports to the initial assignment office, his records are screened for all necessary orders such as MOS's, promotions, and contractual

obligations. The people in the section must check orders thoroughly. They must hold to a soldier's enlistment contract so as not to break any legal agreements—no easy job. After these points are resolved, they can go on to field placement and job numbers.

"Incoming personnel are assigned to a specific positions number either vacant or projected vacant," said Webb. "Individuals assigned to MMCS with one of those required numbers will be assigned to the position number it was matched with. Any exceptions are coordinated through the directorates."

After the section finds a field for a newcomer, their task is finished. The directorates then assign him to a specific job.

Of course, many times after a person is

positioned in a job here, he is dissatisfied with the job or the field itself, or with the people who work with him. If he has this problem, the initial assignment section is not the place to go if he wants to make a change.

"If a person isn't happy with his field, we recommend that if it's possible to be reclassified he find and apply for another MOS school," stated Webb. "If an individual doesn't like his job, his field, or the people he works with, it's up to him to do something about it. First go to the immediate supervisor, then first sergeant, company commander, directorate, and IG. Use the chain of command."

The Initial Assignment Section plays an important role at the school. By working closely with First Battalion, it keeps the place well-staffed.

Why is it that every weekend those of us who eat in the dining facility in Building 3480 have to cope with long lines, shortage of seats and shortages of food items because the dining facility is also feeding visiting youth organizations?



The visiting youth organizations are scouts, members of an organization that has a long standing special relationship with the Army. Commanders are authorized and encouraged to aid scout units. The aid includes feeding and berthing as well as allowing them to use camp sites on post. During the month of February which was about normal, the average number of scouts on weekends served in Building 3480 which seats 180 and is used less by soldiers than the other one open on weekends was breakfast, 37; lunch, 18; supper 25. Food service officials feel the scouts can be accommodated without difficulty, deny any shortage of food items results from feeding them. Scout units are told to use the facility at specific times: 0900-1000 breakfast; 1300-1330, lunch; 1630-1700 dinner except Friday, 1700-1800. If coping with the youngsters bothers you, why not eat when they are not there?

February Awards Accountants Hear Heflin Over Half Million

The Missile Materiel Readiness Command placed more than half a million dollars in orders for support and services with Huntsville firms during the past month.

In addition, three companies in or near Huntsville received contracts for missile related equipment. Included were awards to Huntsville companies, Abilities Development Center, \$181,349.31, to produce Dragon tracker carrying bags; and A. C. Electronics, Inc., \$421,850, to continue production of TOW missile system tripod mounts. Day Wood Products,

Brownsboro received \$783,974 for Dragon round shipping containers.

Businesses nearby and some across the nation were awarded approximately \$117,000.

During the same period the Missile Research and Development Command awarded \$10,138,481 in contracts for missile systems and equipment, and MIRCOC awarded \$70,635,743 for materiel in this category.

The Procurement and Production Directorates execute the awards for the respective commands.



The Post Commander thought the incident so unfunny that he asked the Army Criminal Investigation Command to make a thorough investigation.



The Cubs' meeting place, Building 3518, and an adjoining structure used by Brownies both had damage, most of it shattered windows, estimated at about \$2,000 by the Facilities Engineer.

There was no estimate available on the loss of the contents of the Cub building. Most of the materials and supplies destroyed belonged to individual Cubs and leaders.




Civilian Technicians Serve Alongside Soldiers

They say they like the work, but then they talk about it.

What emerges is a portrait of the civil servant as a one man roving fire department...24 hour days...constant moves... In the deadly serious business of missile readiness, they stand where the rubber meets the road, point men for the Army Missile Materiel Readiness Command (MIRCOM).

They work far from the bright offices and eight hour days of Redstone Arsenal in the out of the way places where soldiers and missiles are ready to fight and in those places, they are the readiness command.

When they say they like the work, they've told you a lot about themselves.

They are missile maintenance technicians, or "MMTs" in government short form, members of the Maintenance and Engineering Directorate of MIRCOM.

Their job involves advising soldiers on how to keep missiles operational, to provide training as requested by the unit commander, and to monitor supply lines. Most MMTs spend half their time in training soldiers, an area in which all are competent. Training may include just one soldier, organized classes for formal instruction, or training on the missile sites, on the job training.

There are no typical days, no routine calls. Every MMT does many things in addition to what is considered his usual duties. He gets into transportation, supply and other tasks all related to logistics.

According to Edwin Larson, chief of the directorate's Technical Assistance Branch, when a soldier trying to repair a missile gets to the end of his rope, the MMT gets a call. "It means a screaming emergency," Larson said.

"We're not there to turn the wrench, but to tell the soldier how to do it," Andrew Dooner, a former MMT said. "If he does it himself, he'll know how to do it next time. On rare occasion we may show the soldier how to hold the wrench, but it's generally hands off the tools for us."

"It can be frustrating and we can feel like telling the soldier to step aside and let us do it, but we don't."

Larson said that MMTs are qualified on more than one missile system. When one system is being phased out, they are trained to work on one that is soon to be fielded. Also, Larson said, MMTs need expertise in more than one system as "We can't put an MMT in cold storage if there's no call for his or her services on some system."

Dooner recalled, "When we're with a missile unit wherever it may be, we're the sole representative of MIRCOM - we're 'Mr. MIRCOM' to the people there. We get all kinds of questions. If we can't answer the question, we say, 'I'll get you an answer.'"

"It's amazing how many questions they

get. When they can't answer, they can call in here over a special phone system, write us a letter or a special report, we're here to react quickly," Larson said.

MMTs enjoy a close rapport with all personnel in a missile unit, and have their complete trust.

"We're considered part of the staff," an MMT will say. "We're close to the soldier with the greasy hands and we're close to his Commander." A man who knows how to fix things can be handy in a pinch.

MMTs are noted for their competence. Need for them has become more important in the days when budget cuts mean less training for the soldiers who maintain a system.

Their competence becomes evident from the letters of commendation and recommendations for outstanding performance ratings that come into the directorate. "I checked off on nine letters of commendation just this morning signed by high ranking officers," Larson said.

"It's not all excitement, commendations, and travel to exotic places. MMTs feel they are easy to overlook when a promotion opens up back home, and home too often, for an MMT eventually becomes his suitcase.

"When we have a vacancy, we may interview ten people who are qualified, before we find one who will take the job," Larson said. "Everything goes fine until we tell them they'll be moving constantly the rest of their careers. Then they're likely to say, 'That's not for me' or their wives won't let them take the job."

"You know, a fellow gets a house all set up beautifully in the U. S. His wife likes things nice, and they put together all the things they've collected around the world. Then he gets orders to go overseas. His wife says, 'Hey, not this time, I'm not going to have my things all torn up moving around,'" Dooner said.

Some MMTs violently oppose going to Korea and others feel the same way about going to Europe. Dooner said he has been both directions.

One MMT, James Hutchinson, an expert in air defense battery terminal equipment, leaves his family in a permanent home here while he goes on short tours and temporary duty trips. "I've spent seventy percent of my time away from home in the last seven years," he said. "Most recently I was in Korea where I had to travel constantly."

Joe Mays, an assistant chief in the section, has been an MMT in the field. He said that in Germany, for instance, an MMT rents an apartment, but German apartments are not furnished with kitchen cabinets, closets or light fixtures. "You can spend several thousand dollars equipping one of those places, then you come back and bring all that stuff with you. What do you do with a bunch of light fixtures?" he asked.

"I knew a fellow who owned three refrigerators at once," Larson said. "But an MMT takes pride in his work, he enjoys the challenge, he likes to travel. It's just the family problems that can be upsetting. "Joe (Mays) was telling me this morning that we have a high rate of attrition due to deaths, illnesses, failing physicals for overseas duty—it runs about 14 percent a year. MMTs are under a lot of stress. It's likely to eventually show up in their health."

In spite of the headaches and heartaches, MMTs like their jobs, the soldiers they work with, the technical problems they solve.

As Larson says, they're a different breed of cats.

Radar Repairman Named March Soldier of Month

Spec. 4 Michael L. Mowe, a HAWK pulse radar repairman at the Missile and Munitions Center and School, was recently selected Redstone's Soldier of the Month for March.

Selection for the honor is made by a group of command sergeants major based on appearance, and knowledge of military subjects, current events and world affairs.

With the honor goes a three day pass and dinner and motel accommodations in Huntsville compliments of the Chamber of Commerce.

Mowe, son of Mary E. Mowe of Portland, Ore., attended David

Douglas High School there, and completed basic training in September 1971 at Ft. Lewis, Wash.

He has been in the Army six years and was named 10th Group Soldier of the Quarter while stationed in Butzbach, Germany. He also placed second in Soldier of the Year competition while in Germany.

Mowe commented, "I feel I never would have went this far without the help I got from my section and the encouragement from the company particularly the first sergeant and the company commander.

New PX Set For July Opening


Construction on the new main store for the Redstone Post Exchange is 45 percent complete according to the Facility Engineer, and should be ready to open about mid-July if not delayed due to weather conditions. It is being built off Vincent Drive as part of a Shopping Mall.

PX activities now scattered in a number of locations will be consolidated in the new building for one-stop shopping by soldiers and their families, another step in improving post facilities.

The new approximately 65,000 square foot building will contain laundry and dry cleaning, flower, optical, barber and beauty shops, a convenience, gourmet shopette to support the nearby military housing areas, the military clothing sales operation, the sewing center, and the retail store.

The Home and Sport Center in Bldg. 3651 will remain in that location as a four season type activity, Don Emmons, Redstone Post Exchange manager, said. Articles to be stocked there include such seasonal goods as toys and garden supplies and some convenience items. The beverage sales store will continue to be part of the Home and Sport Center.

Building 3479 near the troop area is proposed as a consolidated troop support activity, and will have a snack and pizza bar, a Troop PX retail store,

a combination barber and beauty shop and a laundry pick-up point. "This building is within walking distance of

the barracks and would be operated for the convenience of soldiers living in that area," Emmons said.



2.75, the project office worked up several concepts.

Scouting Anniston Army Depot for something available that could be used as a launcher, Major Norm Patten of the project staff came up with the M-91 chassis, a two wheeled towed launcher originally developed to fire chemical rockets. Anniston modified the carriage to take the M-200 rocket pods and the first Slammer VI was soon firing on Redstone's flight test range.

It was demonstrated during a

large scale exercise later at Fort Bragg. Senior officials liked what they saw.

Five additional launchers were built and used for safety and operational tests at Yuma Proving Ground by the Army Test and Evaluation Command. The same launchers were used this week to successfully demonstrate the system at Fort Sill.

Slammer VI provides tremendous fire power, could be fielded on short notice at low cost, using readily available material. The rocket and the M-200 launcher

are in Army stocks. So are many of the M-91 chemical launchers.

Because it uses the 2.75 rocket, the Slammer VI can accommodate all the varied warheads now operational with that system, and could also use those now under development, including smoke, multipurpose submunitions, and illumination.

In addition to Major Batten, Bob Brock, Jack Still and Mel Bartlett have formed the Slammer VI development team for Col. Tow.

They foresee a system that

would require about five soldiers to operate. Possible missions include destruction of area personnel and materiel targets, suppression of air defense, artillery, anti-tank weapons and mortars, smoke screening and illumination.

The project office has life cycle management for the 2.75 rocket system for the Army, also manages procurement and delivery of 2.75 rocket components for the Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps who use it as an air to ground weapon.

Dobbins, Harris Given New R&D Assignments

Two senior civilian engineers of the Missile Research and Development Command have moved to new assignments within the command.

Edward B. Dobbins, has assumed new responsibilities to assess and evaluate the command's missile technology programs. H. Hoyt Harris, replaces Dobbins as Deputy Project Manager for the U.S. Roland.

Both men are Sloan Fellows, graduates of a year-long management course at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology leading to a master's degree in management. Both have been involved in Army missile research and development for more than 20 years.

Dobbins will assist Dr. Julian S. Kobler, Director of the Technology Laboratory, with specific responsibilities in the assessment and integration of research, and development. He will advise Kobler on whether or not specific technologies are ready for weapon system use.

Harris is now deputy to BG Frank P. Ragano managing the U.S. Roland, a mobile all weather air defense system developed in Europe, being manufactured under license in this country for

U.S. Army use. For the past four year, Harris has been Deputy Project Manager for the Stinger missile, a shoulder fired anti-aircraft weapon. His replacement in that post has not been determined.

A native of San Marcos, Texas, Dobbins received a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M and a master's in mechanical engineering from Purdue. He first came to Redstone in the 1950's as an Army officer, later joined the missile R&D program as a civilian engineer. An expert in missile propulsion, he directed the Army Rocket Propulsion Center for several years before going to MIT. Dobbins lead the team here which evaluated several foreign developed air defense systems. Their study formed the basis for Army selection of the U.S. Roland system.

Born in Birmingham, Harris graduated from the University of Alabama with a degree in electrical engineering, later had commissioned service in the Air Force. He first came to Redstone as a civilian engineer in 1957, has specialized in development of air defense guided missile systems.


Harris directed test operations for the Mauler missile system in

Two Get Big Suggestion Awards

Two men from MIRCOM, Captain Howard E. Miller and Earle J. Smaltz, each received large checks last week for ideas they had and put in as suggestions.

He is the commander of the Headquarters Company, was formerly assigned to the Stinger Project Office, and has a degree in aeronautical engineering from

California State Polytechnic University.

Smaltz, an electronic technician in the Targets Management Office, was on a committee charged with developing a target and control system for tri-service use. "As I sat in meetings the systems directed by DOD kept getting more and more expensive and had features the Army didn't need for the VSTT and Firebee targets," Smaltz said. "I knew the Army could buy a system off the shelf that could be tailored to meet Army needs for a lot less money, so I put in the suggestion."

The estimated first year tangible savings came to \$3,663,500.

What is Smaltz going to do with the money he received? "It couldn't have come at a better time," he said. "We're building a new house."





MMCS Hobbyist Builds Fine Furniture

Working may seem like a dreary way to use up free time, but not to Ken McVay, a civilian training specialist in the Staff and Faculty Development Department at the Missile and Munitions Center and School.

McVay spends much of his free time building and refinishing furniture for himself and friends. Working in a small but well equipped shop at his house, he has built around 30 pieces of furniture that look as if they were done by a professional woodworker, and has restored countless other pieces.

"I enjoy doing it for a hobby, it's very interesting," he said. "I make it primarily for my family. I sure don't make any money at it."

Although he never took woodworking training, outside of a year of wood shop in high school, his products show no sign of being built by an amateur. McVay credits his interest in the art to his early home life.

"Since I was born and raised on a farm, I had to work with wood. I really got going when I was in high school," he said with a reflective smile.

Besides building skillfully, McVay has a talent for furniture design. He has designed each piece he has built, not once using a store-bought blueprint.

"I draw up something and then bring it out here (to his work

shop) and go to work on it," he said, making the whole process sound easy.

Among his creations are lightstands, small tables, a quilt holder, a buffet, baby cradles and desks. He has also rejuvenated used pieces such as chairs, tables, and dressers.


Although he builds most of the furniture for his family, he sometimes builds or restores for friends. "I build and sell to friends to help pay for the cost of the wood and tools, but that's the only reason. I've never entered a show to sell," said the woodworking veteran.

McVay sometimes gives away his products as presents, feeling that giving a homemade gift is more personal. A few months ago he built a baby cradle for an expectant couple, after more than 200 hours of toil.

Having built so many different kinds of furniture, McVay has become quite knowledgeable in selecting wood. Most of his creations are in either cherry or walnut because, he said, it looks

good and is fairly easy to work with. He uses Shittim wood, a very rare, very expensive wood grown only in Israel and in the mountains of northern Alabama, when making wooden jewelry or religious articles.

McVay, talking like any old pro,

says there are no easy ways or shortcuts to do things if you want to do them right. "It takes time and patience to do things and do them well," he said as he glanced at the quilt holder he'd built. "There are no shortcuts, no one

should ever take chances. Do it right the first time."

"Do it right" is the way Ken McVay does his job here and his hobby at home. It's not hard to tell. The end product always shows the quality behind it.

box by donating the money needed to build it. Right now we have about 135 scattered around the post."

The boxes are inspected weekly. Those containing bluebirds are recorded to determine the success of the project. Where other species have moved in (especially sparrows), the boxes are cleared out for use by their intended occupants.


"We'll be using this project for our display at the Scout Exposition at the first of April, and hope we can get some more people interested in it. We're using information from similar projects in Ohio and Illinois."

Friday said bluebirds are voracious insect-eaters, their diet including grasshoppers, crickets, caterpillars, slugs, and some beetles, and as such are beneficial to man.

Besides this, their appearance as pastel-like jewels flashing in the air is invariably pleasing.

"We estimated there were about 30 pair of bluebirds on Redstone when we began this project. Hopefully, we will have helped to substantially increase that population."

Good-bye Bobby; A Tribute To A Hockey Great

During his prime he was the best player in hockey, and probably the best the game has ever known. He could pass with unmatched grace, shoot a puck with blistering speed and amazing accuracy, and his finesse and cunning made it almost impossible for opposing players to check him.

That was Bobby Orr in his years as a defenseman with the Boston Bruins of the National Hockey League, 1966 to 1976. Fans were thrilled by his playing. Nobody ever played like he did, nobody else ever skated with the freewheeling, agile style he possessed, and no single player ever had his talent and charisma. Everybody loved Bobby Orr, or so it seemed.

But now, at only 28, Bobby's skating days are numbered. Five operations on his left knee have left him nearly crippled. After 10 years in the NHL, he soon will hang up his skates for good.

I guess you would have to have seen him play daily, not just on an occasional Saturday night, to feel the kind of sorrow hundreds of Orr fans feel now that he's retiring. Night after night he would make those famous one-man rushes

from one end of the rink to the other, skating so smoothly and quickly, evading player after player.

And night after night he, along with teammates Phil Esposito, Ken Hodge, and Wayne Cashman, would put on scoring shows no other team has ever matched. Many times they scored eight and ten goals a game. They were magnificent to watch.

Bobby Orr's absence is felt every time Boston takes to the ice. Gone is that famous black and yellow jersey with the familiar number 4. No longer does that familiar chant "Score—Bobby Orr!" echo through the ice stadiums of North America.

It gives you a sad, empty feeling when you realize how good Bobby was, and how young a retiree he is. Bobby is on the Chicago Black Hawks roster this year, but he has played in just a few games, and his contribution has been minimal. His doctors expect this will be his final season.

But what hurts almost as much as seeing him retire is seeing what some sports writers are saying about him. Not unlike the way they treated Babe Ruth, Bill Russell, Joe Namath, and other

great athletes when their abilities waned from age or injury, they are writing that Bobby wasn't as great as he was made out to be. Some insinuate the press built him up, made him larger than life, a pretty boy who could play well, but not that well. If they took the time to watch Bobby play, they would quickly change their tune. He was the best, and his records prove it.

When he was only 14, playing with local teams in Pery Sound, Ontario, the Bruins signed him on. After playing a few years with Boston farm clubs, he entered the NHL at 17, immediately gaining recognition by winning the 1967 rookie of the year award. Always an introvert, Bobby never bragged about being great. He let his performance do the talking. In 10 years in Beantown, he never complained, and he always gave 100 per cent to the team.

His accomplishments were great. He holds records for most goals in a season by a defenseman—46, most assists by a player in a single season—102, only defenseman to score over 100 points in a season, and is 15th on the all-time NHL scoring list, amazing because he played only

10 seasons and is the only defenseman in the top thirty scorers.

He also has won more league awards than any other player. In his 10-year stint with the Bruins, he was named NHL most valuable player three times, scoring champion twice—something no other defenseman did even once—and the league's best defenseman eight consecutive years.

Maybe his biggest honor came from the people of Boston, who voted him the city's all-time greatest athlete. When you consider the athletes Boston has produced—Ted Williams, Bill Russell, Bob Cousy, Dave Cowens, Babe Ruth—it's an exceptional honor.

Now, at the end of a brilliant playing career, he will retire to coach the young Chicago Black Hawks. If he is half as good a coach as he was a player, the Hawks are in for many good years. But it's still heartbreaking to see him on the bench instead of the ice. Fans will always remember him as "the best." In their hearts, they still see Bobby streaking down the ice, scoring goals, blocking shots, and making brilliant plays.

Good-bye Bobby, we'll miss you.

Ralph Resigns RSA; Moving to Ft. Riley

After more than three years at Redstone, during which he molded the Redstone sports program into one of the Army's best, sports director Rafael (Ralph) Santaliz is leaving April 8 to take the job of sports director at Ft. Riley, Kan.

Ralph, 27, will get a pay raise, better facilities, a bigger staff, and the challenge of Ft. Riley's gigantic sports program. Riley has more than 49,000 troops to Redstone's 2,200.

Although he is looking forward to taking over at Riley, Ralph says he regrets leaving. "I hate to leave here because we've done so much work," he said. "It's hell to leave when you've done so much work."

Ralph introduced many new sports here and geared them all to college-level. In basketball, baseball, football, soccer, golf, and bowling, Redstone plays many college teams each season, something few Army posts do consistently.

Ralph also introduced and improved many other sports, such as tennis, paddleball, handball, weightlifting, track, and the martial arts. "We always tried to do things right," explained Ralph. "We never did anything half-baked. College-level play in sports here was one of my goals."

The sports program at Redstone has been rated one of the best by Department of the Army officials, a surprising fact in light of the post's small military population. Ralph credits the success of his programs to his staff, which averages about 14 people, and to hard work.

"I set the guidelines, but the people behind me got the programs going," he

said. "If it weren't for the fact that we worked together so closely, we would never have gotten so far."

A native of Puerto Rico, Ralph has been connected with the Army in some way ever since childhood. His father was an Army careerist, and before taking a job here as sports director, Ralph was an infantry officer. "I had to choose which way to go, the military or a sports career," he said. "I'll always love the military, but I'm not sorry I chose this field."

Although a military career may have looked promising at one time, it looks now as if Ralph's sports career was the right choice. Besides building a successful sports program and earning a good salary at Redstone, he has acquired a wide and favorable reputation.

"It's hard to go when I've so many close friends. I know almost everyone here by

their first name," he said regretfully. "I am sure going to miss the people here."

Ralph's overall popularity and success did not spare him from sniping. His management of Redstone teams was criticized as monopolistic. Not only did he coach most post teams, said his detractors, he insisted, in coaching football and basketball, on using only a few favorite players.

He was ridiculed for initiating too many sports for so small an installation. Some, like European team handball, apparently died for lack of players as much as from lack of interest.

But in assessing the tenure of a man like Ralph, these are small points. He did a fine job, and the record proves it. Redstone athletes can only hope post sports will continue to flourish without him.



Christians Find Ministry in Traveling Theatre

What kind of life would somebody have if he had no real home and was always traveling, had little money to live on and had only a few possessions?

If you were to ask that question to the Covenant Players, college-age people who go around the world performing in Christian plays, the answer would be, A great life. One group of the Covenant Players was here recently, putting on four shows for people at Redstone as part of their tour of the south-eastern U.S.

The group, one of 48 that the California-based Covenant Players maintain in 15 countries, has been on tour since early January and returns to Reseda, Calif. in May for another assignment. Its members are Gary Barcus, Julie Lungstrom, Sharry Smith, Jackie Weaver, and Fred Pleasure, all from the Golden State.

For the Players, living on the road is a way of life they have grown to accept, despite its hardships. "It's kind of hard sometimes, having so little money and goods," said Miss Smith, who is on her first tour. "But it's worth it. This job has so many rewards."

The rewards Miss Smith was speaking of aren't the kind you get from a paycheck or a pension, but the kind you get from being yourself and doing something that makes you feel good. "We feel this is a way to minister to people while using the talents the Lord gave us. It's a very rewarding experience," she said.

Although they are a drama group, the Players don't think of themselves as actors, but instead as ministers trying to lead people to the Lord. "It is a ministry to use," explained Miss Smith. "Drama is the tool we use to communicate. It is our way of expressing our love for Christ, just like a priest or minister does."

The shows they put on depict family problems, values in life, drugs and alcohol, faith in God, Christmas, and Bible stories. In fact, they have more than 400 plays of varying lengths in their repertoire, and the specific themes they cover are limitless.

The plays are written by one man, Charles Tanner, who founded the Covenant groups

have put on more than 200,000 shows, and have won worldwide acclaim.

The training players go through before performing on the road is extensive and difficult. They must learn acting like the professionals do. Communication, poise, confidence, and body and voice control are all part of their training. Pleasure, one of two men in the group, said, "I remember once they had us pretend to be bacon in a frying pan, frying and sizzling. That sure was a trip."

Unlike Covenant Players of a few years ago, they now do a lot of singing, which also requires special training, especially if they teach you to play an instrument. After formal schooling, the learning goes on, because in drama there are always new techniques to be learned.

"Each performance teaches us something. We're constantly learning and doing different things. You might say that we will always be students," said Gary Barcus, the group's leader.

"When their training is over, and the instructors are satisfied that a person is ready, he is sent to the main office in Reseda, where he is assigned to a group.

The training is long and hard, according to the Players. But then, anything really good never comes easy.
