Cost of Living Raise Part of 'Saved Pay'

What happens if the pay raise becomes effective in October and you got down graded in September?

Contrary to this week's latest hot rumor, not much.

Many individuals who got notice of proposed downgrade when RIF letters were distributed last week in MIRCOM, MIRADCOM and Patriot Project Office have expressed fear that they would not get the forthcoming October federal pay raise.

It doesn't work that way.

Individuals downgraded three grades or less - provided they held their present grade for two years - keep their present pay. That

means they continue to be paid in their current grade and step for two years, whatever the going rate is for that grade and step.

If the pay for that grade and step increases on October 1 or some time after, they get the increase. After two years, they drop down to the pay of the downgrade. At that point, a cost of living adjustment or other computations based on grade and step will be based on the new grade and step.

Someone busted more than three grades in the RIF gets adjusted pay based on a formula. At the end of two years, all pay benefits change to the new grade and step.


More Personal Medical Care


In the past few weeks; registration forms

'Lightning Vine'

Weather May Slow It

Grounds maintenance people at Redstone may be getting some help from the searing sun in their battle to control kudzu vines that blanket parts of the arsenal.

Studies show that the vine grows slower in temperatures over 90 degrees, although even with slowed growth it presents formidable problems. In a single season, the galloping vine commonly grows thirty feet in length, reportedly can grow up to 100 feet in a season and 12 inches overnight.

Kudzu is considered one of the biggest grounds maintenance problems at Redstone. It climbs the tallest trees and telephone poles, and grows over fences, stairs, street signs and anything else in its path.

Kudzu kills trees, either by smothering them or weakening them so that disease sets in, and simply overruns and crowds out lesser vegetation.

Several hundred acres of land here are largely inaccessible because of kudzu. It also enshrouds telephone poles, causing

them to deteriorate, and gets entangled in power lines where it can cause short circuits.

Several fires have resulted in winter when withered kudzu vines have been ignited during missile test work.

After years of burning, cutting, plowing and poisoning the vine without much effect, it had been planned to treat kudzu choked areas here with a soil sterilant late this spring, but chemicals could not be obtained. Sterilizing the soil effectively kills the kudzu, but renders the soil incapable of growing anything for two or three years.


Complete eradication is necessary because a single surviving plant soon will cover the ground again.

Growth retardants have been used on kudzu patches with some success, and in some areas the vine has been defoliated by spraying with diesel fuel.

Of Oriental origin, kudzu is said to have first appeared in the United States in 1876 at Philadelphia's Centennial Exposition where

Attitude Survey

As an initial step in starting the Organizational Effectiveness program in MIRCOM, CWO3 William M. Cortner III, the Organization Effectiveness Staff Officer in MIRCOM, is conducting a Institution-wide attitudinal survey of randomly selected permanent party military personnel Aug. 1 through Aug. 9.

The Permanent Party Questionnaire being administered started Monday at Redstone in order to find out soldiers' opinions about a variety of areas, Cortner says.

"The PPQ asks personnel to indicate the degree of satisfaction or dissatisfaction they feel about such things as the Army in general and as a career, about their jobs, leadership and living conditions, and about the Post environment and Post services they receive," he says.

"The PPQ is an anonymous survey given to all ranks randomly chosen by digits in the social security number.

"The questionnaire itself is not difficult or time consuming. It has 68 statements to respond to and rarely takes more than 10 minutes to fill out. The response of each questionnaire are machine processed and the degree or satisfaction expressed in response to each of the 68 areas is determined.

"We are telling recipients of the questionnaire that their opinion is important to the Army and, when shared by many individuals can indicate to commanders and directors those aspects of the military environment which are most in need of attention of modification."

RASA Commander Sets Retirement

Colonel Jack C. Fessenden, Deputy Post Commander and Commander, RASA, has announced his retirement at the end of August after more than 30 years of military service.

Colonel Fessenden entered the Army from Sioux City, Iowa in August, 1943, as an enlisted man and served in the infantry. Following his discharge after World War II, Colonel Fessenden attended college before returning to the Army in 1950.

"So I've been involved in three wars — World War II, Korea and Vietnam — and spent more than a third of my Army career overseas," he says in thinking back over his years with the Army. "But I've enjoyed very much working with the people in RASA and others at Redstone, and I consider this a fine last assignment."

The 52-year old officer has been at Redstone a little more than a year. During that time, in addition to his assignment as Commander, RASA, Colonel Fessenden served for several months in a dual capacity as Director of Materiel Management. This placed him in the unique

position of managing both a national-mission element and a complex base operations support organization at the same time.

Colonel Fessenden also found time in his demanding schedule to become an active participant and strong booster of the Redstone Little Theater. Under his guidance, theater facilities were developed and expanded and emphasis was placed on the recreational and personal development benefits to the military community of participation and support of this program. Plans are for a more ambitious Little Theater program in the future.

Colonel Fessenden and his family plan to move to their home in Clearwater, Fla. and get settled there before he decides what he wants to do next. "I'll get involved in Little Theater work, but I have no firm plans yet about starting another career," he says.

Colonel Fessenden will be succeeded as Commander, RASA and Deputy Post Commander by Colonel Burt Dall.

Arsenal Donors Respond to Appeal

In the last days of April, William Wright was a victim in an automobile accident. A sliver penetrated his body, doing serious damage to his liver and severing the artery between the heart and liver. All attempts to repair this arterial damage were unsuccessful, and Wright continued to hemorrhage. On July 4, he was transferred from Huntsville to Vanderbilt Hospital in Nashville to undergo radical surgery.

During this period, Wright required massive amounts of whole blood to replace what was lost due to hemorrhaging. His father, Hack Wright, is a retired employee of the Directorate for Management Information Services. Through him, Redstone personnel learned of the desperate condition of his son. Individuals and small groups began to donate blood specifically for his needs, in an effort to help the Red Cross keep abreast of Wright's severe demands.

But these individual donations were dwarfed on July 20, when 75 Redstone employees appeared at the Bloodmobile and gave their blood to be used in the struggle to keep William Wright alive. This blood was supplemented on July 25 by the further donation of 20 pints more. The total donation from Army and NASA workers to date is 130 pints.

Surgeons at Vanderbilt on July 20, clamped off the damaged artery and bypassed it, using an artificial vessel. This brought Wright's bleeding under control for the first time in almost three months. His present condition is stable and doctors are optimistic that the artificial artery will not be rejected.



Children's Center Holds Registration

CSA Testifies on Unions

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — "The commitment required of a serviceman in combat is not something which can be turned on like a light as he enters battle," Army Chief of Staff Gen. Bernard W. Rogers told the Senate Armed Services Committee in a strongly-worded argument against unionization of military personnel.

The Army leader, representing the Joint Chiefs of Staff, appeared before the Congressional body on July 18. Rogers was accompanied by Vice Admiral James D. Watkins, Chief of Naval Personnel; Capt. James L. Jones of the Marine Corps; and Chief Master Sergeant T. N. Barnes, the Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force.

Rogers told the Senators that there is no place for military unions in the Armed Forces. "If a serviceman feels more confidence in his shop steward than in his chain of command during his training, this same feeling can be expected to continue into combat," he said.


The criticism was aimed at military union advocates who say there would be no union participation in decisions during wartime, and that peacetime union activities would not detract from the wartime effectiveness of the Armed Forces.

The soldier's combat commitment is "developed through long and difficult periods of training, and through an association during which there can be no competition for loyalty," Rogers continued, adding that an integral part of a soldier's training is aimed at developing and enhancing mutual confidence and respect between the members of the chain of command and the individual serviceman.

"The assumption that the required degrees of loyalty and confidence between the leader and the led will develop when a third party (a union) is interjected between the two is fallacious," said Rogers.

The Army chief said the basis for his position is the unique position in society occupied by the Armed Forces. Rogers described the basic mission of the Services as requiring a degree of discipline, duty, responsiveness and self-sacrifice without parallel in the civilian sector.

Members of the Armed Forces are faced with modern warfare, the "most complex,



chaotic and lethal environment known to man," Rogers said.

"Arbitration, collective bargaining, and shared decision making—all common aims of organized labor—have no place in this setting; rather discipline, loyalty, a high sense of duty, responsiveness and an unencumbered chain of command are the elements which enhance success," he continued.

Rogers said the Services already have the mechanism through which servicemen can voice their concerns. "Concerned, dedicated, knowledgeable, involved leaders at all levels in the chain of command provide the mechanism through which the needs and concerns of our service personnel can be heard and resolved," he said.

Rogers went on to identify the existing channels through which servicemen can present problems or lodge complaints. In addition to the chain of command, he said the channels include the Inspector General system, Article 138 of the Uniform Code of

Military Justice, and the right to correspond directly with the Commander-in-Chief or with individual members of the Congress.

He said servicemen can also make use of commanders' "open door" policies, advisory councils, commanders' "hotlines," commanders' calls, surveys and other activities to draw attention to problems and have them solved.

Gen. Rogers has been on record in opposition to military unionization for some time. Earlier he told the same Senate panel that specific prohibitions were required. The prohibitions he endorsed included prohibiting servicemen from joining unions claiming to represent military personnel on the terms and conditions of military service; a prohibition against soliciting on service installations for military personnel to join such unions; and a prohibition forbidding commanders to negotiate with unions which purport to represent servicemen.

from a friend in Germany. When asked what he intended to do with the tomatoes, which average about two-and-a-half pounds apiece, Hanson said he was going to "serve them to the troops," meaning his lucky co-workers.

Schlesinger Wins Marshall Medal

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Association of the United States Army has selected the Honorable James R. Schlesinger as the 1977 recipient of the Association's highest award, the George Catlett Marshall Medal for Public Service.

The selection of Schlesinger, former Secretary of Defense and now Counsellor to the President on Energy, was made by the Association's Council of Trustees. The award of the medal for "selfless and outstanding service to the United States of America," will be made during the Association's annual meeting.

Schlesinger entered public service as the Assistant Director of the Bureau of the Budget. He was appointed to head the Atomic Energy Commission in 1971, to be the Director of the Central Intelligence Agency in 1973 and later that year to be Secretary of Defense.

Letters from AUSA members nominating Schlesinger cited his "... intellect, strategic grasp and international statesmanship . . . above all else, his honesty and integrity."

"As Secretary of Defense," another letter said, "he was equalled only by the great man for whom the medal itself is named."

Special Inspection and Audit

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — The Army Inspector General and the Army Audit Agency are conducting a special inspection and audit survey of the management and accountability of Army materiel. The inspection and audit, ordered by the Chief of Staff on April 23, includes a complete inventory of equipment, clothing, and hand tools of 112 company-sized units, along with an audit survey of installation reports and records at 15 installations in the U.S. and four overseas units.

The purpose of the inspection and audit is to see how good a job the Army is doing in management and accountability of Army materiel.

Because the size of the Army and its worldwide locations make a complete simultaneous effort impossible, the IG selected a reliable sample of the Army's inventory at the user level for inspection.

The special inspection is in two phases. Phase I began June 13 and ended July 1, involved 55 units from Forts Hood, Riley, and Knox, the 2nd Infantry Division and

other Eighth Army units in Korea. Phase II began August 1 involving units at Fort Bliss, Bragg, Jackson, and Lewis, the Eighth Infantry Division, Third Armored Division, and other V Corps troop units in Germany.

The inspections will determine the status of materiel shortages by 100 percent inventory in the selected units, matching on-hand quantities of materiel with property records, validating current supply procedures or identifying those that are inadequate or inefficient, and providing recommendations to correct problems discovered.

The Army Audit Agency is reviewing records at Forts Bragg, Benning, Bliss, Campbell, Polk, Jackson, Stewart, Ord, Lewis, Riley, Carson Huachuca, Hood, Knox, and Sam Houston, as well as the Eighth Infantry Division and Third Armored Division, Germany, Second Infantry Division, Korea, and the 25th Infantry Division, Hawaii, for a 12-month period.

Check Your Tires

Last year, according to Department of Transportation estimates, there were 45,436 traffic fatalities. And the truth is that some of these deaths were caused by neglected tires.

State Taxes

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — Beginning September 1, Kentucky, Louisiana, Nebraska, and Oklahoma will join the 19 states and District of Columbia now withholding state taxes, say DoD officials.

It is also anticipated that Maryland will also begin withholding in August. The Maryland legislature voided a state exemption of military pay from taxation, and the governor signed the revised law in May.

DoD also expects Hawaii and Oregon to begin withholdings in November.





Committee Says Commissary Subsidy Not Justified

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — In a report released July 8, the Senate Appropriations Committee said that the commissary subsidy is "no longer justified in light of current military salaries and benefits."

The report on the FY 78 Defense Appropriation Bill stated that the commissary subsidy "provides no combat readiness and makes no contribution to national defense."

For that reason, the Committee is recommending the phase-out of the commissary subsidy over the next three years.

The subsidy for FY 78, estimated at \$309 million, goes to pay for the cost of military and civilian personnel to manage and operate some 400 commissary stores.

Even after the elimination of the subsidy,

commissary patrons "would still enjoy" a price savings of about 13 percent below commercial supermarkets as well as a sales tax savings of between 2 and 8 percent, according to the Committee.

"It has been established (by survey) that commissary prices are about 23 percent below the price of similar goods in a commercial supermarket," the report added.

As a comparison, the Senate panel points out that in 1964 the subsidy amounted to only \$100 million while the estimated cost in FY 78 is \$309 million.

"Over the next ten years," the panel said, "the full subsidy will cost taxpayers \$3.8 billion—a fantastic sum in the defense budget for an item that has no military

mission."

The Committee has also recommended elimination of \$90 million to subsidize the cost of shipping exchange goods overseas. Such shipments at government expense are not authorized by law, according to the report.

Both recommendations are contrary to the position expressed by the House of Representatives.

Bill Lazarus, Executive Vice President of the American Logistics Association said that he expects the recommendations to be ignored in a Senate-House Conference on the Appropriation bill. ALA adamantly opposes elimination of the commissary subsidy because of their belief that it would demoralize the military.





Parcel Airlift Is a Bargain

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — Soldiers and their families (both overseas and in the United States) can save themselves and the government money by using a convenient postal bargain—Parcel Airlift for parcel mailings.

PAL is cheaper than Priority Mail, the new designation for Air Parcel Post (Airmail), and is provided airlift service on a space available basis to and from overseas Army Post Offices. PAL airlift service begins at the time of mailing; generally parcels arrive at the same time as those mailed as expensive Priority Mail.

PAL has some limitations however; packages can't exceed 30 pounds in weight or measure more than 60 inches in combined length and girth, but the fourth-class (surface) postage rate and \$1 fee required for PAL service are a bargain for Soldiers.

For example, a 30 pound Priority Mail parcel measuring 60 inches in length and girth is mailed from Los Angeles to APO N.Y. 09108 (Munich, Germany) at a cost of \$17.20, while that same parcel—mailed as PAL—costs only \$9.76. The soldier saves a total of \$7.44.

DITY Moves Save

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) The Army's Do-It-Yourself program for moving household goods is becoming very popular with soldiers, according to DA staffers. In the first six months of the program's operation, over 2,500 soldiers have pocketed more than \$600,000 in DITY incentive payments. The program has also saved the government about \$350,000.

The largest number of DITY shipments has been made by E-4s, who received an average incentive payment of \$206.

Enlisted members are using the DITY program more than officers. So far, the ratio of enlisted-to-officer participation has been four to one.





DoD Orders Rapid Release of Information

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — Secretary of Defense Harold Brown notified all employees of the Department of Defense, both military and civilian, that the Department will work to fulfill the letter and spirit of the President's recent pledge for new openness in government.

Brown stated, "It will be the Department's basic policy to make available

timely, accurate information about plans, budgets and activities so that the public, the Congress, the press, radio and television may assess and understand Defense programs." He added, "Requests for information, from organizations and private citizens, will be answered responsively and as rapidly as possible. Coordination with other Departments and Agencies will be accomplished when necessary without undue delay."

- Information will be made fully and readily available unless its release is precluded by statute (as in application of the Privacy Act or the Freedom of Information Act) or is precluded by current and valid security classification.

- Information will be withheld when disclosure would adversely affect national security or threaten the privacy or personal safety of men and women of the Armed Forces.

- Information will not be classified or otherwise withheld to protect the government from criticism or embarrassment.

Secretary Brown outlined three principles that will apply to the release of information:



'Diane' Speeds Soldier Reenlistments

Diane has contacts at Department of the Army level. Although many visitors may never realize she is in the office, Diane has done much to speed up operations since she arrived four months ago at the School Brigade, Missile and Munitions Center and School Reenlistment Office.

Given a prospective reenlistee's basic personnel data, her contacts can tell her in a matter of minutes what used to take weeks for Sergeant Major Robert Blackstock and Staff Sergeant George D. Murch, III to confirm.


With almost amazing ease, Diane can pin down the assignments available to soldiers about to reenlist or list the options or service schools they are qualified to re-up for. In many cases she even provides the control number that indicates DA approval for reenlistment.

However, she will do nothing without supervision. But that is understandable for a machine. GPS UXQ212 DIANE is a portable computer terminal leased by the Army to allow career counselors access to current reenlistment data.

According to Murch, the computer's data banks are maintained by both the career counselors and branch personnel managers at DA. Known as the Retain System, Murch explained, "The computer matches needs and desires of the potential reenlistee against the available requisitions and requirements of the particular reenlistment program."

Murch thinks the system's biggest advantage is in time savings. Although the system hasn't changed his personal counseling procedures, he can now give prospective reenlistees the information they seek almost instantly. The same kind of information sometimes took up to two weeks to confirm before Diane came along.

Murch added, "Working with a computer isn't really as impersonal as some people

may think. When you enter or request information from this system, you have an actual conversation." With the machine operating in a training mode, he demonstrated how the system reacts to improper inputs by entering a birthdate of 1978. Diane responded, "Age is -1. Age must be greater than 17 and less than 56 to re-up. Do you have a local waiver?" That response is much more pleasant than the stereotyped "That does not compute."

Another factor that keeps the system on a personal level is the part played by the branch personnel managers at DA. Murch explained that on an infrequent basis the

managers will be asked to fill a personnel requisition that requires a specific grade and MOS. In this situation they often check the Retain System files and notify the career counselors of qualified individuals to see if the soldier is interested in the assignment.

The system does not replace the career counselor or reduce the importance of his skills. There is no substitute for individual counseling on a one-to-one basis and not all options can be handled under the Retain System. However, in the many areas now included in the system the long days of waiting for information are ended. Diane has contacts.



Redstone Takes Up The Racket


To be really successful at this increasingly popular sport, you must have all the quickness and agility of an NHL goalie, the concentration and determination of a champion tennis player, and the craft and cunning of a major league knuckleball pitcher.

The sport that requires all those traits, and maybe a few more, is racketball. Extremely popular here and around the rest of the country as well, racquetball is well liked because of its simple rules, it is good exercise, and it's fun. The game, as its name implies, is a competitive sport in which a racket is used to serve and return the ball. The object of the game is to win each set by serving or returning the ball so your opponent is unable to return your hit before the ball touches the floor twice. Racketball is played on a court with dimensions of 20 feet high, 20 feet wide, and 40 feet long with a back wall at least 12 feet high.

Although the game is simple, fun, and good exercise, the main reason racketball is gaining popularity so rapidly is because almost anyone can, with practice, become a good, solid player. Unlike many other sports where size, weight, and age are vital to a player's success, racketball players can be short, tall, fat, thin, old, young, male or female—it doesn't matter. More important is learning how and where to hit the ball, where to position yourself on the court, and the many ways to outsmart your opponent.

"You have to learn to approach each opponent differently, depending on the shots you're good at and the shots they have difficulty reaching," said Ray Rowden, Company A, a two-year veteran of the sport.

"It gives you a good feeling when you're finished playing, it's a great workout," said Greg Bialon, Mircom, a newcomer to the game. "It's a good way to lose weight and





it was displayed as an ornamental vine at the Japanese pavillion. It caught on as a shade vine for porches where it could be confined and controlled easily as kudzu is a local plant, reproducing from root-like rhizomes and seldom producing seeds that will grow into new plants. Kudzu spread rapidly as homes and farms were neglected and abandoned, but did not become widespread until the 1930s when the Civilian Conservation Corps and other agencies began touting it as an erosion control and forage plant. At a time when not much was known about erosion, which was taking a heavy toll on southern land, it was planted along road banks and in areas where excessive cultivation had caused severe soil

loss. Plants used today for erosion control such as Coastal Bermuda grass and fescue were not available then.

The Soil Conservation Service set out an estimated 85 million kudzu plants in the south.

Because of its root structure kudzu is not an ideal soil-holding plant, and in some cases on the arsenal erosion problems have developed, undetected, beneath the vine's thick mat of growth. It was planted extensively on the southern part of the installation in the early '40s to hold the earthen cover on ammunition storage igloos.

With the present feed shortage caused by heat and drought in the south, Kudzu is being promoted by agronomists as livestock forage. Rich in protein, it is rated equal to alfalfa in food value. For all its bad reputation, it may get a chance to redeem itself. Even with a name like kudzu, it does hold some good.

Return to Draft Savings Minimal

WASHINGTON — Dr. John P. White, an Assistant Secretary of Defense, told Congress recently that the All-Volunteer Force works in the active duty sectors, but has problems in the reserves.

White told a House committee that a return to the draft would save between a half billion and \$2.5 billion, at most two percent of the total defense budget. "I don't believe that the American people would favor a return to the draft to achieve dollar savings," he said.

"As a peacetime military personnel procurement policy, the volunteer force is working well," White said. He reported that since the draft ended the military services "have successfully met the demands of manning," with an annual rate of 400,000 successful, non-prior recruits.

The best single measure of an applicant's

potential success is possession of a high school diploma, White said. The Defense Department had been successful in recruiting high school graduates, but recently has faced increased difficulty in enlisting them.

The success in active service recruiting has not been matched in the reserve components, White said. He explained that manpower shortages have been caused by the loss of draft-motivated individuals who joined the reserves in the late sixties and early seventies. The people who entered the reserves during this period have completed their six-year obligations and most are not re-enlisting.

There are DoD plans to experiment with several incentive programs to help overcome recruiting difficulties in the reserves.

TRADOC Centralizes Weapons Program

FT. MONROE, VA. — The Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) has begun assigning senior officers with small staffs to major Army weapons development programs to be the single focal point for all user interests in that program.

The TRADOC Total System Manager, in effect becomes the user's counterpart to the DARCOM Project Manager who is charged by the Secretary of the Army with responsibility for the weapon itself.

Three TSM offices will be operating shortly, with the Roland, Patriot and GSR systems. Three others, Hellfire, Pershing and Stinger, will follow before the end of the year.

Each of the TSM offices will be staffed with a colonel and three staff officers, one each specializing in training, logistics and personnel.

The TRADOC Total System Concept

envisions addressing doctrine, tactics, organization, logistics, training and personnel requirements of the user in fielding the new weapon system as the weapon itself evolves in its development program.

In a recent announcement, TRADOC headquarters said: "The TSM will have direct interface with DARCOM but will not duplicate the project manager's duties or be competitive with him. The two offices will work in a complementary fashion each depending upon the other for advice and coordination.

The TSM office will be physically located at the TRADOC Center or School most involved in the development program. TSMs working with air defense systems, for example, will be based at the Air Defense Center at Ft. Bliss.

As TRADOC's single point of contact for his assigned system, the TSM will be

charged with insuring that all TRADOC personnel involved in the development program do the best possible job. TRADOC said the TSM "may be retained after the system is sent to the field to monitor the product for potential improvements."

The command envisions setting up TSM offices for about 30 weapon systems. Others will be created "early in the development cycle" of new weapons, at about the time the system is placed under a DARCOM project manager.

A principal objective of the Total System Concept, TRADOC said, is to involve the user "totally" much earlier than ever before in the development process. The command said that has become necessary because of increasing complexity and cost of new weapons and the need to reduce the time required to develop and field them.
