U.S. Roland said doing well in joint testing with Europeans

U.S. Roland, the Army's foreign-developed but American-built air defense system, has passed with flying colors the most critical portions of the joint European-U.S. test program nearing completion to prove out the system.

"Tests have gone remarkably well," said Brig. Gen. Joseph O. Lax, Jr., U.S. Roland Project Manager, "which proves that the transfer of European technology to this country has been successful."

Lax said the Army, Hughes and Boeing have built four fire units, produced more than 100 missiles, and have conducted extensive contractor and government tests demonstrating that U.S. Roland meets Army requirements and is compatible with European hardware.

"We have achieved excellent missile reliability in flight tests at White Sands Missile Range," the general said, "and we encountered no major problems in road tests at Aberdeen Proving Ground."

Of 45 flight tests at White Sands, 34 were completely successful, five were partial successes, and six unsuccessful. The

supersonic missiles were launched against computer-simulated targets, Firebee drones, Helicopter drones, and unmanned F-86 and F-102 fighters.

Some targets, flying at altitudes ranging from 200 to 9,000 feet, performed evasive maneuvers. In one test, a single fire unit successfully engaged two targets only seconds apart.

One of the advantages of Roland is the ability to operate day or night, and in any weather. White Sands tests included firings when the gunner could not see the target, relying on radar for tracking. Two other firings were made in light rain.

Approximately 100 French and German soldiers and civilians, bringing their own fire units, missiles and support equipment to White Sands, have participated in the joint test program and all three countries will share test data.

American missiles have been fired from France and German fire units and American equipment has fired European missiles.

Early in the test program, crews from

O'Neal, inventory management specialist; Patricia D. Spivey, program analysts; Vivian E. Christian, budget analyst; Thomas W. Elkins, contract specialist; Linda S. Pitts and Doris G. Agnew, procurement and production specialist; Laura C. Fuentes, equipment specialist; and Charlie W. Prince, computer specialist.

And in MIRADCOM, Melba H. Stephenson and Helena Gawreluk, budget analyst; Estherlene S. Morse and Frances S. Berry, contract specialist; and Billie S. Greenhill, and Jean E. Brazzel, program analyst.

Participants will enter the trainee positions Oct. 1.

Program goals

The CLIMB program is designed to give high potential, lower level employees in dead-end, non-career-field jobs a chance to enter positions in established DA career fields after extended training.

Each applicant's experience, education, awards, training and other activities, as described by the applicant in the CLIMB application, were evaluated, based upon the skills, knowledge, abilities and personal characteristics required to perform the duties of the CLIMB positions.

Those persons rated highly qualified in the evaluation process were then interviewed individually. The interviews were used as one element in determining the best qualified candidates.

Within 30 days after entering the program, individual development plans will be prepared for each participant designed to outline the training and development assignments which will enable the trainee to perform the duties of the CLIMB position, and to advance to full performance.

CLIMB spaces are used only for the training and development phase of the program. Each space is temporarily assigned to an organization. As participants finish training, they will be assigned permanent spaces, and the training spaces will be free for re-use.

Post hospital: it's well named

It is indeed fortunate that family and friends of Brigadier General Leon Alexander Fox were located and were able to participate in the dedication of Redstone's gleaming new hospital named in his honor. For without their remembrances, the late general would have been known to us only through the turgid pages of musty material in Army archives, where his illustrious career as soldier and doctor is chronicled with all the felicity of a laundry list. There it is documented that he was born in Birmingham in 1890, graduated medical school in 1912, entered military service through the Alabama National Guard, went on to earn three additional graduate degrees in health sciences including two doctorates. It credits him with the discovery that malaria is transmitted by the anopheles mosquito, and with quelling the typhus outbreak in southern Italy. But it does not state that American victory in World War II depended in no small part on subduing those diseases.

Nor does it even hint at the late general's remarkable personal qualities which were described at the dedication in loving detail in tributes by a daughter and by a former medical colleague. His range of knowledge and interests was astounding and diverse. He was described as a scholar, especially interested in the Greek philosophers and

scientists whom he studied, referred to and quoted throughout his life, and was a student of American history and politics as well. He was a devotee of football, baseball and boxing and, at the same time, of opera.

He bred and raised dogs, horses and farm animals of top quality bloodlines. In all he did he was committed to excellence. Fox Army Hospital will perpetuate the memory of a remarkable man.

Writer criticizes appraisal impact on Merit Promotion

I wish I had a nickel for every time I heard someone say, "Those supervisor appraisals for Merit Promotion are unfair." At first I thought these people were trying to blame their own shortcomings on the system, but after working here for four years, I find myself saying the same thing. After several experiences with the Merit

in the areas indicated on the rating, he has no choice but to check the block indicating he does not know. This kind of rating does not help the employee, when other applicants have been rated all outstanding. The employee is being penalized not because he is not qualified, but only because his supervisor lacks a certain knowledge of his abilities. For example: John Doe is in a dead end field as a GS-4 technician and wishes to change to another field in order to move up. A Merit Promotion Announcement has come open in Personnel Management and John applied for it. The supervisor rating comes in and John's supervisor says that he does not know anything about his abilities in Personnel Management and indicates this on the rating sheet. John has no chance for the job now, even though he may be highly qualified. Even if John has a B.S. in Personnel Management he has lost any opportunity for the position. The only jobs John's supervisor can honestly rate him for are technical positions. As a result John's

opportunities for advancement are reduced in scope and in number. Other applicants in Personnel Management were given an undue advantage by receiving outstanding ratings. There are many employees at RSA like John in many other fields such as secretaries and clerks.

Why does the supervisor rating have such an impact? There is too much weight being placed on the supervisor ratings. Is it fair to place so much emphasis on a subjective rating? It appears that the system needs examining when so much importance is placed on subjective information when a selection board is designed to make selection objectively.

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




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Thiokol static fires GSRS rocket motors

Thiokol-Huntsville has successfully static fired two rocket motors designed to comply with NATO interoperability requirements for the General Support Rocket System (GSRS).

The company is developing the propulsion system for the Boeing concept GSRS, a ground-to-ground weapon intended to complement cannon artillery during intense combat conditions. The system is being designed to accommodate requirement of several NATO nations.

In its propulsion system, Thiokol has incorporated a number of low-cost components and is utilizing technology such as quick-cure HTPB propellant, a plastic nozzle and aft-end ignition which serves as the nozzle closure.

John H. Goodloe, Vice President and General Manager of Thiokol's Huntsville Division, stated that these motor firings were especially successful in view of the short schedule since incorporating the

NATO interoperability requirement and the degree of low cost materials and technology utilized in the Thiokol design.

Thiokol is part of a Boeing GSRS team,

led by the Boeing Army Systems Division, which also includes Teledyne Systems Company and Honeywell, Incorporated. The Boeing team is competing for GSRS production contract.

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
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Saccuzzo takes honors at OWC golf tournament

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

Hughes and Boeing performed many of the tests but Fort Bliss, Texas, soldiers have just concluded operational firings, including several under "no warning simulated tactical conditions.

Another Roland advantage, especially important to mobile units, is the surveillance radar's ability to detect and identify aircraft while on the move. At

Aberdeen, the radar was operated while the fire unit traversed a jolting track.

U. S. Roland's fire unit experienced no major technical problems in more than 1200 miles of tests which included rough road, maneuverability, braking, noise level, safety and impact of railroad switching tests, along with air lifts by helicopters to demonstrate transportability.

The Army has moved men and equipment to Vandenberg Air Force Base, California, for additional mobility and tracking tests, including adverse weather and countermeasures environments.

Kent Taylor is Chief of U.S. Roland's Product Assurance and Test Division and Raymond Ginocchio was field office representative for the test program at White Sands.

Being built in this country by Hughes and Boeing under license to Euromissile, U.S. Roland will protect troops, air bases, fortifications, supply depots and other battlefield targets against low level air attack.

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
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Tribute

Gen. Fox, new hospital praised at dedication

It was a hot day for the third week in September with temperatures in the 90s.

Several hundred people either sat in chairs under a blazing sun and used their programs as fans — one foresighted individual brought a parasol — or stood in the partial shade of the building as Fox Army Hospital was dedicated.

Col. Robert B. McLean, M.D., Hospital Commander, introduced distinguished guests. Among them was Dr. Theodore Woodward, a close friend of BG Leon Alexander Fox, for whom the hospital is named. The doctor obviously enjoyed being there, and brought his camera to take his share of the many pictures made that day.


Dr. Woodward spoke to the audience of different events, both official and personal, he and Gen. Fox experienced when they worked together. The doctor is Professor and Chairman, Department of Medicine at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and Hospital.

The main address was given by MG Enrique Mendez, the Deputy Army Surgeon General. "When I walk into a hospital I get a feeling in a few minutes about whether it is a good place. I knew as soon as I went into this new hospital that it is a good," he said.

Frances Fox Huber touched on personal recollections of her father. She and her

sister, Trenetta Fox Mead, were both here for the dedication. Mrs. Huber said of her father, "He was a generous, intense man with a marvelous sense of humor and an incredible number of interests. Above all he was a scholar especially interested in the Greek philosophers' and scientists. He was a wonderful and loving father."

Three unveilings were part of the ceremony: a memorial stand with a bronze plaque bearing the likeness of Gen. Fox in front of the hospital; an oil painting of Gen. Fox to be hung in the new hospital; and a plaque honoring Medal of Honor winner Cpl. William W. Bennett, for whom the access road to the hospital is named.



Soldier pauses to read Bennett memorial

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
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
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
