New technology gives Lance longer life

The lance, a thrusting weapon with a long wooden shaft and razor-sharp head, was a badge of honor to North American Plains Indians, carried only by experienced warriors.

Armed with the effective if crude-looking spears, and mounted on speedy, sure-footed horses, plains Indians were mobile and ready for emergencies, whether chasing buffalo herds or clashing with the enemy.

At close quarters, warriors hurled the lance with deadly accuracy.

Like its namesake of yesteryear, Lance is still a big stick. For the U.S. Army and the free world, it's a knockout punch for emergencies.

The horse has been replaced by a self-propelled tracked vehicle that travels across rough terrain, deserts, swamps, even swims rivers and inland waterways . . .

Trick or treat

Your child may run into bigger dangers than the bogie man on Halloween.

Though children love this dress-up holiday, it presents some special hazards parents should watch out for. Parents can make sure their children have a safe as well as exciting Halloween by taking the following precautions.

First, make sure that your child's costume is not a fire trap. Many materials used in making manufactured costumes are highly flammable. If the costume has been tested and found safe, the box will indicate this. Also, make sure the costume is visible at night.

Accompany your children while they trick-or-treat, especially if they are very young. Even if they are older, have children carry a flashlight to make it easier for them to see and be seen.

Unfortunately, children sometimes receive "tricks" instead of "treats" in their goody bags — poisoned or booby-trapped fruit and candy have been given out in some neighborhoods. It is best to limit your children's trick-or-treating to the houses of known neighbors. Also, instruct them not to eat anything until you have examined it.

Your children will also have a more pleasant Halloween if they remember to wear their manners under their scary masks. Make sure they know that destructive tricks are not in the holiday spirit, and that the well-behaved spook never forgets to say "thank-you" for his treat.

Disgusted MP rebuts motorist

Dear Editor,

I am one of the many disgusted personnel in the 291st Military Police Company who have read the article a Mr. Jim Miller wrote in the October 18 edition of the *Rocket*. I would like to take this opportunity to hit on a few subjects that Mr. Miller evidently does not know about. First of all, the Military Police who work on the gates, patrols and Traffic Section are only doing their job, which is security, protection and traffic control. Mr. Miller should pay more attention to other drivers and his driving instead of the so-called "obstacle course" and other activity on the gate (MP car with lights flashing). There is a purpose for this activity and it would not be done if there wasn't a need for it. Inattentive driving is one of the major causes of traffic accidents on the Arsenal every year. As of to date, I have yet to hear of a traffic accident on or around the gates because of a Military Policeman's actions.

Electro Optical test facility dedicated here

When Brig. Gen. (P) Frank Ragano pushed the button, the computer flashed "welcome!" on the screen, told the name of the Army's newest Redstone facility, and began describing what the facility will do.

"This place never ceases to amaze me," the MIRADCOM Commander told those attending dedication of MIRADCOM's new Electro Optical test facility Monday. "I

think this kind of talent and expertise is the reason this command is number one," he said, praising the people here who made the new facility in Bldg. 4500 possible.

The laboratory complex, able to perform laboratory and field tests on all missile optical devices, is assigned to the Reliability Test Division, headed by Jim Taylor, of MIRADCOM's Test and

Evaluation Directorate, under Bob Black.

Housing some five optical tunnels and a computer-controlled test setup in 15,000 square feet, the new facility is manned by eight permanent people and up to 14 contractors at any one time.

"We can take test data directly from Test Areas One and Three or videotape it and play it back later," said Randy Priddy, an electronic engineer who has played a prominent role in development of the facility.

Priddy said the laboratory thus far has worked with laser related programs, including Hellfire, Copperhead, Ground Laser Locator Designator, Laser Target Designator, Modular Universal Laser Equipment, and on the fire control system for the Advanced Attack Helicopter but can evaluate any optical devices like TOW and Shillelagh beacons.

"What used to take about twelve man hours to reduce some twenty seconds of data, now takes us about one hour," Priddy said.

The facility can operate lasers under high and low temperatures and perform intensive tests on such aspects as power output, beam width and divergence, boresight, and test seeker performance as well.

"This is a unique facility, the only one of its kind anywhere so far as we know," Bob Black told the group attending the dedication.

Notification speeds aid for handicapped dependents

WASHINGTON — Soldiers with handicapped dependents should notify DA of their needs before being assigned to Europe, according to U.S. Army Europe (USAREUR) Milpercen officials.

Services for people with physical, emotional or intellectual handicaps are limited in USAREUR, officials explained. Several families have experienced hardship because USAREUR was not told of the

handicap and did not take the handicap into consideration in making the assignment or in approving dependent travel, the officials said.

Army Regulation 614-203 requires that handicapped dependents be identified to DA as soon as the handicap is known. This will insure the handicapped dependent is taken into consideration before a new assignment is given.

In addition, officials said the soldier must

indicate the handicapped dependent on the application for concurrent travel (DA Form 2370) before being assigned to Europe. An attempt will then be made to assign the soldier to an area where the dependent may receive the needed educational or medical care.

If the soldier can't be assigned in an area where these services are available, DA will help solve the problem, officials said. (ARNEWS).

What's your opinion of the congressional authorization of Junior Enlisted Travel funds?



2d Lt. Laleta Sylvester, Co. C—"I think the Army should pay for junior enlisted travel. I believe it will be a good investment. It should really boost the morale overseas."



Pvt. Keiko Stringer, Co. B—"I think that's good because these families have been paying for it themselves - from a very small paycheck. The first time we went overseas my husband was of low rank and it hurt us. It's good to keep the families together."

1st Sgt. Manuel Gaitan, Marines—"I believe it is a good idea. It will relieve the financial hardship for our younger enlisted, and they need the relief. It's really rough on a young, recently married man or woman if they have to be separated from their family for financial reasons."

Junior Enlisted get new travel allowances

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — Junior enlisted soldiers should begin receiving dependent travel and household goods benefits to overseas assignments on Nov. 1, according to DA and MILPERCEN officials.

The junior enlisted travel (JET) entitlements, passed last week by Congress, will soon put junior EM on the same footing as more senior soldiers. The entitlements package authorizes the Army to spend \$46.4 million this year for soldiers in grades E-4 with less than two years service and E-1 through E-3 to move their families.

The JET program does not apply to moves within CONUS or to overseas areas where dependents are restricted from residing.

Benefits that families in these grades will enjoy for the first time include shipment of a privately owned vehicle, 1,500 pounds of household goods, dependent travel allowance, temporary lodging allowance and cost of living allowance.

Until now, soldiers in these grades were eligible for shipment of 225 pounds of combined military and personal goods.

Officials stressed that, while all junior EM are eligible for these benefits, they are still subject to approval of dependent travel to overseas.

For soldiers now in CONUS and alerted for overseas assignment, this means that they must apply for and receive approval for dependent travel before receiving JET entitlements.

For soldiers now serving overseas, who want dependents to join them or who want the Army to pay for return dependent travel

to CONUS, this means they must complete the minimum overseas command sponsored tour.

Eligibility for JET entitlements does not guarantee dependent travel, concurrent travel or housing in government quarters, officials stressed.

Junior enlisted soldiers are not eligible to reside in government quarters, according to DOD directives.

Approval of dependent travel is subject to availability of civilian quarters in an overseas command, officials explained. If such quarters are available for occupancy within 60 days after a sponsor arrives overseas, concurrent, or joint sponsor-dependent travel, will be approved.

If quarters are not available for at least 61 to 140 days after a sponsor's arrival overseas, officials noted, deferred travel will be granted, meaning that dependents will join their sponsor at a later date.

Because many soldiers who are eligible for JET entitlements are first term enlistees and within one or two years of ETS, officials added, they should be aware that they must extend and serve the minimum command-sponsored tour length (usually three years) before dependent travel is approved. (A soldiers with 18 months remaining service, for example, would have to extend 18 months to receive dependent travel if assigned to Germany.)

In addition, officials cautioned, the Army command in Europe recently issued a strong warning about financial hardships junior EM can expect to encounter there.

In Germany, where most eligible families would be expected to take advantage of JET

entitlements, the dollar this week fell to record lows against the German mark exchange rate levels.

This increases the cost of paying German rents and utilities which the command says are much higher than average costs in the U.S.

Costs for setting up households in Germany, the command said in August, could run \$1,000 or more for deposits and advance rents. Minimum auto liability insurance premiums, for a married soldier under age 25, the command added, begin at \$400 annually.

"A junior enlisted soldier should carefully consider whether or not he wants to take his dependents overseas at all," one official remarked. "And if he's just finishing AIT, for example, he only has one week to make that decision and apply for dependent travel."

While advance pay and other allowances help offset expensive costs in Europe, officials said, soldiers should keep in mind that their future paychecks will be smaller during repayment of advance pay.

JET applications for dependent travel will be handled by local MILPOS, officials observed. They advised soldiers wanting to apply for JET entitlements to ask MILPOS for a DA Form 2370 (application for dependent travel) and DD Form 1056 (dependent passport application), adding that soldiers and dependents should have birth certificates, citizenship papers and other vital documents ready for travel request processing.

More information on specific requests can be obtained at local MILPOS.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Tennessee Valley Chapter of the Association of the United States Army (AUSA) won two Best Chapter Awards for 1977-78 during the Association's 24th Annual Meeting.

The chapter won the Lt. Gen. Walter L. Weible Award for best overall chapter meetings and the Council of Trustees Award for best chapter overall. In addition, it won the Lt. Gen. C. G. Dodge Award for the chapter with the most extensive involvement by women.

More than 6,000 conferees representing

the 118,000-member organization convened here for three days in the Sheraton Park Hotel for professional meetings and seminars. Featured speakers included the Secretary of the Army, Clifford Alexander, and the Army Chief of Staff, Gen. Bernard Rogers.

The Tennessee Valley Chapter has 2,815 members. It's headed by Walter L. Jackson of Huntsville, Ala. Past president Dr. Julian Kobler accepted the Council of Trustees Award for the chapter. Mrs. Eileen Hallock, Women in Action chairperson, accepted the Dodge Award.

qualifications outlined in AR 135-210.





Soldiers face reenlistment curbs in some MOS

WASHINGTON (ARNEWS) — Reenlistment curbs, mostly for first-term soldiers but also affecting many E-4s and E-5s, took effect Oct. 16, MILPERCEN officials said this week.

First-term male soldiers who entered active duty from Oct. 1975 through Sept. 1976 who hold one of the following MOS may be restricted from reenlisting in these MOS. They include: 23Q, 24B, 24D, 24F, 35K, 35R, 51R, 54D, 62G, 62J, 63G, 63H, 71Q, 73C, 75B or 91E.

The same restrictions apply to first-term male soldiers who entered active duty from Oct. 1974 through September 1975, who hold MOS: 22K, 23Q, 24B, 24D, 24F, 41C, 43M, 55B or 68D.

Soldiers in these two previous groups may still be allowed to reenlist in these MOS but must submit, along with reenlistment requests, a list of three shortage MOS they are willing to accept training in if their primary MOS request is rejected.

All first-term soldiers, regardless of when they entered active duty, face the same restrictions and requirements to submit three alternate MOS for retraining if they hold MOS 02B, 02E, 02F, 02G or 02M.

Other restrictions prevent soldiers in grade E-5 and above and E-4s on standing promotion lists, who do not now have a primary MOS in CMF 91, from reenlisting for retraining into MOS 42D, 42E, 76J, 91B, 91D, 91E10, 91F, 91J, 91N, 91P, 91R, 91S, 91U, 91Y or 92B.

Soldiers in grade E-6 or E-5 and on a standing promotion list may not reenlist for retraining in MOS 42C, 71G, 91G, 91H, 91L, 91Q, 91T or 94F.

No soldier in grade E-5 or E-4 and on a standing promotion list may reenlist for retraining in MOS 13B.

Soldiers may not reenlist for training in MOS 91R30 if they have not held 91R as a primary MOS for at least one year.

Soldiers with four years or more active duty service may not reenlist for training in MOS 35G10, 92B10 or 91C10.

Redstone's abandoned pets: misery, death their destiny

One dog is small and sickly, so thin that every bone shows. His fur is matted; in places, it has fallen out. His eyes are cloudy and do not focus. He is too weak to walk. The vet will try to save him, but it's too late.

The other dog is larger. He is thin, too, but fierce. He shies at noises like a wild animal. When anyone comes near him, he growls. Corner him and he will attack. He runs with a pack that is a mixed breed — part coyote, part dog. He will be shot to death.

What do these two dogs have in common? Their owners abandoned them on Redstone Arsenal.

The pets cost too much. They were too much trouble. The owners got orders to go overseas. Whatever the owners problems, abandoned pets are a big problem at Redstone.

Post veterinarian Maj. James Byrum said the survival rate for the pets is very small.

"Dogs are not really meant to live out in the wild," Byrum said. "Cats revert to a wild state more easily, but we have trouble with them because they're so prolific."

"We're always finding litters of cats under barracks, in drainage ditches — in

the most awful conditions," he continued. "Also, they live in close association with the skunks, who often pass on rabies."

Cats remain loners, Byrum said, but the dogs that do manage to survive when abandoned are those that form a pack.

According to Sgt. Ray Thorpe, Deputy Game Warden, there are at least two packs of wild dogs on the arsenal now. Some, he believes, are the result of inbreeding with coyotes.

"They're just the same as wild animals," Thorpe said. "We get complaints from cattle owners who leave grazing land here because these dogs will go after cattle in the winter."

"We shoot them on sight," he went on, matter-of-factly, "and we tell hunters to shoot them on sight, too — provided they can make sure it's a wild dog, of course."

Thorpe also said the wild dogs bring down deer, but he did not think they would harm a human unless cornered.

Abandoned pets turned into Byrum's office stay there for three working days. If they are not claimed by the owners or adopted by someone else within that time, they are destroyed.

Many of the abandoned animals are in terrible condition and cannot be saved by the time they reach his office, said Byrum. He blames their condition on the owner's thoughtlessness.

"People should stop and think before they get a pet," he said. "Especially people in the military. You have to consider, 'If I get sent overseas, will I be able to afford to take my pet?'"

He also warned that while cute puppies are manageable in quarters, full-grown dogs often aren't.

Byrum urges people who have to get rid of a pet to advertise on bulletin boards and in the Daily Bulletin to try to find it a home. And he recommends leaving the pet at the Huntsville Animal Shelter over abandonment.

"People think they're condemning their pet if they leave it at the animal shelter," he said.

"Well, a lot of people get pets from the animal shelter. I don't think leaving it there is condemning it nearly as much as just letting it off on its own."

Loose dogs, cats a dangerous nuisance

Uncontrolled pets, especially dogs, are a nuisance and health hazard on the arsenal, according to Cpt. Jesse Crider of Military Police. And the problem is getting worse.

By regulation, dogs must be penned, leashed, or under voice control at all times.

Yet dogs are running free, chasing joggers and cyclists, tearing clothes off clotheslines, and ripping open garbage bags, said Crider.

Such dogs may even attack someone or spread diseases to other pets or to humans.

Cats cause similar problems, said Crider.

One of the duties of the MPs is to impound uncontrolled pets. Owners whose animals are impounded are subject to disciplinary action, and may even have to remove their pets from post.

Crider said that the MPs always attempt to call an animal or snare it in order to catch it. But when other means fail, the MPs use a dart gun on an animal which has bitten someone or on a stray which is causing problems.

The darts contain a drug which immobilizes the animal long enough for the

MPs to capture it. The drug usually works exactly as it is supposed to, but sometimes a pet has a bad reaction to it.

"Sometimes the animal just doesn't have the constitution to take the shock of being darted," Crider said.

"Also, we measure the amount of the drug to be used by weight," he continued, "and sometimes it's hard to judge the animal's weight correctly."

Of course they must capture an animal that has bitten someone, especially if it lacks a rabies tag.


Maj. James Byrum, post veterinarian, urged all pet owners to get rabies shots for their pets and make sure the animal wears the tag.

"If the animal has a rabies tag, we still have to quarantine it, but we can notify the owners that we have it," Byrum said. "Also, if an animal bites someone and then runs away, knowing if it had a tag helps doctors decide what treatment to give the victim."

Byrum said it was especially important for pets on Redstone to get rabies shots because of the large number of skunks — prime carriers of rabies — on post.

Byrum and Crider agreed that in most dog-bite cases, the dog is not a wild stray but a neighborhood dog running loose.

"You might remind people," said Byrum, "that the average dog bite — because of examination fees, treatment, or whatever — costs a minimum of fifty dollars."





CSC announces reform timetable

The Civil Service Commission has issued a tentative schedule of dates for actions resulting from passage of the law on reorganization of the federal civil service.

According to the schedule, government-wide discussions with personnel staffs, agency program managers and the Civil Service Commission Office of Personnel Management will be held late this month.

In December draft regulations will be submitted for comment, and in January, 1979, interim regulations will be published. Also during January agencies will be making plans for the Senior Executive Service (SES), such as making board selections, designing the pay systems, and deciding how many positions are to be covered.

From January through April career supergrades will be asked if they want to be in the SES.

New performance appraisal systems are to be designed in March, 1979.

July 1, 1979, is the estimated date when the new SES system must be established.


October 1, 1981 is when every employee is to be told what the critical elements of their jobs are. These are to be used as the basis of decision for separation.

In 1982 the merit pay system for GS-13 through GS-15 is to be completely installed, with this part of the bill to be implemented in three phases: 25, 50 and 100 percent.





be hurled with deadly accuracy, but at distances of many miles, at targets that can't be seen. Once it reaches its destination, the missile can deliver a devastating nuclear or conventional punch.

Today's Lance, developed by the Army at Redstone Arsenal and LTV Aerospace in Warren, Mich., was fielded in 1971 and is deployed with 18 U.S. and allied battalions. It replaced Honest John and Sergeant, the Army's first-generation medium-range missiles.

Looking to the future, technology now exists at Redstone to extend the useful life of Lance well into the 1990's and beyond, according to Col. Howard Jelinek, Lance Project Manager at MIRCOM. Approval of the concept of life extension has been received by the Lance Project Office.

"We're maintaining the high state of readiness in the current Lance system but preparing to take advantage of the new technology," Jelinek said. "Thanks to new developments by the Research and Development Command (MIRADCOM) here, the Army can go from present Lance to a third generation system with much greater range and accuracy."

Jelinek said improvements could make non-nuclear Lance twice as effective.

And the beauty of Lance II, built on the solid foundation of the present system with its mobility, ruggedness and reliability, is that the new system would incorporate the latest state-of-the-art technology, but cost less to produce than the older system.

MIRADCOM technology that could be applied to Lance includes:

— New sighting and laying ground support equipment that cuts reaction time in half.

— A guidance and control technique, ring laser, strapdown inertial guidance that looks especially promising. Ring laser gyros are solid state devices having fewer moving parts than conventional gyros, are more rugged and reliable, yet cost less. Strapdown inertial guidance, likewise, is more compact and flexible than conventional systems, yet more accurate.

— A new propulsion system, solid replacing liquid, for extended range.

— A variety of warheads, including terminally guided submunitions that could be dispersed over the target area to seek, track and destroy armor.

MIRADCOM plans to demonstrate much of the new technology in a non-tactical flight test later this year at White Sands Missile Range, N.M.

"This new technology makes Lance a strong contender for the Army's new assault breaker program," Jelinek said.

Operating under all weather and terrain conditions, Lance artillerymen can quickly occupy a firing position, lay and fire the missile against high priority targets such as artillery, troop concentrations, command and communications installations, missile sites, maintenance, supply and transportation centers.

Once the missile is fired, the crew can jump in the vehicle and drive off.






Nice guys finish last . . . for fraud

"Good Old Charlie. What a nice guy. Keeps the office in coffee and cigarettes. You know he's retired military. We chip in and he buys it cheap in the commissary and PX . . ."

"Good Old Lucy, what a nice gal. Look at this watch she sold me. Her husband's in the Army and Lucy told me she could get it for me cheap in the PX . . ."

Good Old Charlie and Lucy have several things in common. They're dumb. They're well on the way to trouble.

The pennies they save their friends, or make for themselves on their little deals, aren't worth the penalty when someone turns them in or they get caught.

A lot of Charlies and Lucys get turned in, often by the very people they're trying to help.

When that happens, loss of privileges to buy at the commissary or PX is just a first step. Retirees can be barred from coming on post except to go to the hospital. Soldiers can and do get leaned on hard.

Cigarettes are the favorite trade item for soldiers who buy in the commissary or PX and then re-sell to civilians for whatever the traffic will bear.

A soldier who gets caught at it faces a possible Article 15, a record of punishment that remains in his record of punishment that remains in his records and just could make the difference when it comes time for promotion or re-up. Those who really get into it big can be tried by courts-martial if the offense occurred on post, or in state or federal court, and do time, be busted or get fined, maybe all three.

Retired personnel and dependents can also find themselves in big trouble for peddling cigarettes bought at the PX and commissary. The cigarettes the Army sells are not taxed. Re-selling them is a violation of federal and state laws.

Junior Officer Council reorganizes

This year Minor hopes to bring in guest speakers on military justice, personnel management, and other subjects of interest to the group.

"The JOC is important for a junior officer's career," he said. "If a guy's got a problem or a question, we've got people involved in enough areas of interest to get an answer for him — we can even take it all the way up to the commanding general.

"JOC is a great thing," he continued. "It helps the officers involved and it helps the community they work in. It's the personnel's gain and the Army's gain."

The change to AR 621-1, an official said, eliminates added service for soldiers attending less than 20 weeks of degree completion, permissive TDY or cooperative degree programs at civilian institutions.

The change brings these schooling obligations in line with short course training programs that also exclude added service obligations for programs less than 20 weeks long, officials said.






