## Panels study fraud, waste

President Carter has established two panels to combat fraud, waste and inefficiency in the Government. According to studies, theft and inefficiency in Government cost the taxpayers billions of dollars each year.

Deputy Attorney General Benjamin R. Civiletti will head the investigation into fraud and waste. He will coordinate the work of 12 newly-appointed Federal inspectors general and other investigators, including the FBI and Special Counsel, Merit Systems Protection Board.

The second panel, called the Presidential Management Improvement Council, will be headed by James McIntyre, Jr., Director of OMB, and Alan Campbell, director of OPM. The council will consult with business, labor, and academic leaders to seek ways to improve Federal productivity.

Civiletti's group will investigate mismanagement as well as criminal fraud, Attorney General Griffin T. Bell said. The group will consider suing contractors to recover stolen or wasted money and will work out ways by which agencies can stop doing business with contractors who cheat or waste money.

Campbell said that the management panel will seek ways to measure the efficiency of Government workers, to peg pay to performance under the new Civil Service regulations, and to overcome what he sees as Government's tendency to seek short-term solutions to long-term problems.

Among the attractions will be a crafts display featuring the handiwork of MIRADCOM people, a volleyball tournament and a barbecued chicken dinner.



# Defense 'housekeeping' activities must share in shortages of fuel

WASHINGTON — The Department of Defense will receive 100 per cent of its current gas and oil requirements for essential military and readiness operations, but petroleum products for "housekeeping" activities will be supplied at allocation levels applied to similar civilian uses, according to Department of Energy's Economic Regulatory Administration.

In FY 78 DoD energy use totaled 247 million barrels of oil, or about two per cent of the nation's total consumption. Defense-related industries used another two or three per cent.

DoD energy use in wartime would almost triple, according to Dr. Ruth M. Davis, deputy undersecretary of defense for research and advanced technology, and

guaranteed access to assured supplies of energy is essential to national defense.

All planned weapons systems vehicles and all those already in operation depend on petroleum fuel, Davis noted.

In response to the energy problem, DoD has pursued many conservation measures, sought alternative fuel sources and used alternative fuels where possible, but from 1975 — 1978 total energy consumption increased 14.1 per cent. There were some successes — for example in California DoD use of gasoline was cut 41.5 per cent during the three-year period.

Energy-efficient training is being emphasized to reduce petroleum consumption and, where possible, DoD is using natural gas and propane to replace petroleum for heating.

# Energy use, cost on rise at Redstone

Energy consumption and energy costs are on the rise at Redstone. Despite energy conservation measures, the electric bill for May 1979 rose \$129,321 over the May 1978 bill. This works out to an increase of about \$6.46 per person!

This increase gets paid out of tax dollars. To make sure Redstone's energy conservation program is as effective as it can be, Col. Burt Dall, Deputy Post Commander, and the Command Equipment Management Program Review Team are inspecting each activity, checking to see that the following energy-saving methods are being used:

- Thermostats should be set at 80 F. in summer and 65 F. in winter
- Lighting should be reduced by 50 percent where possible.
- Refrigerators should be defrosted when there's more than a quarter inch of frost.
- Outside lights should be turned off unless they're needed.
- Portable heating units (space heaters) are prohibited.
- Air conditioning shouldn't be used unless necessary.
- If air conditioning units are on, all doors and windows should be closed.





# Picket and rally said successful

Arsenal employees on their way to work last Thursday morning were greeted near the gates by pickets.

Approximately 35 members of local federal employee unions stood along Martin Road outside Gate 1 and Rideout Road outside Gate 9 and carried signs expressing dissatisfaction with Administration policies concerning federal employees. Traffic flow into the arsenal did not appear to be in-

terrupted but some motorists slowed to read the hand-lettered signs which read, for example, "Gloom, despair and agony on me — deep, dark de-pression, Excessive Jim-ery" and "With a friend like Jimmy, wouldn't you prefer an enemy."

In the afternoon, the picketers moved their operation to Redstone Road outside Gate 3, and to the intersection of Drake and Patton Roads.

"Some come by and make a thumbs down gesture, but a lot of people have waved and blown their horns to show they support us," said Evangeline Felsinger of Maintenance and Engineering who was holding a sign outside Gate 1.

Several picketers cited specific issues which compelled them to participate.

"I'm picketing to call attention to the pay cap and the potential combination of the retirement systems, and to make people more aware of what's going on," said Josh Johnson of NASA, who joined members of IFPT-MESA Local 27 outside Gate 9. "We hope it will help."

"Our salaries are lagging behind," Johnson said. "We shouldn't be singled out to carry more than our fair share of the burden."

"The main reason I'm here is because they're messing around with our retirement," said J. W. Hill of the Materiel Management Directorate.

"I feel like the employees ought to be aware . . . they should look into what's going on. All of our benefits are being eroded," said Miriam Hopkins of NASA.

One man outside of Gate 9 would only say, "The sign says it all." The sign he held read "Stop the Ripoff."

The previous evening, a bus carrying 40 Redstone employees went to Plains, Ga. to participate in a union rally.

"We were trying to send Carter a message and I think it was received," said Lester Mitchell, a member of AFGE Local 1858 that made the trip to Plains. Mitchell said the Plains demonstration was one of several that occurred nationwide Thursday in support of the government employee

plight, including one in Washington, D.C.

The majority of those assembled in Plains were members of the AFGE 5th District which encompasses the five state area of Alabama, Georgia, Tennessee, Florida and South Carolina. There was additional support from other federal employee unions and AFL-CIO, Mitchell said.


In Plains, the demonstration consisted of a march from the outskirts of town to the depot that was Jimmy Carter's campaign headquarters during his 1976 campaign for the presidency. The marchers carried signs concerning political issues such as the pay cap on federal employee's wages, and American flags were prevalent, Mitchell said. Once the marchers reached the depot, they were addressed by several politicians and union officials.

"It was a total success," according to Mitchell, and "the marchers were peaceful and congenial, and we had good cooperation from the police and people of Plains."

## Interest rate up for savings bonds

Starting this month, people buying series E and H savings bonds will receive 6.5 percent interest upon maturity, according to Army finance officials.

E bonds must be held for five years and H

bonds for ten years to receive the full 6.5 percent rate.

Those who already have series E and H bonds and saving notes (Freedom Shares) will also receive the increased annual interest rate beginning June 1. The increased rate will begin with the first semi-annual interest period starting on or after June 1.

Interest on series EE and HH bonds, scheduled to go on sale in January 1980, will also be increased to 6.5 percent. (ARNEWS)



# Corps of Engineers becomes a MACOM

The Army Corps of Engineers became a Major Army Command (MACOM) on its 204th birthday June 16.

The new command will consist of the engineer divisions and districts, research and development laboratories and other field agencies. It will not include members and units of the Corps of Engineers' branch of the Army, such as combat, construction and facility engineers and other engineer organizations that are part of other MACOMS, officials said.

Establishing the corps as a MACOM is expected to improve the understanding and use of corps services and resources available Army-wide, officials said, and lead to increased readiness and provide for a rapid transition from peacetime to wartime engineer support during mobilization.

There will be no increase in the number of civilian or military personnel due to the change, officials said. The corps currently has 44,000 personnel.

# Ragano tops fund effort



## Warning issued on temporary spare

WASHINGTON — Some spare tires are dangerous if used for long periods of time or at high speeds, warns Department of Transportation.

"T-type" spare tires and rims, original equipment on some 1978 and 1979 cars, were developed to reduce the spare tire weight for smaller, lightweight cars and to save trunk space.

Designed for temporary use, these tires should only be used until the regular tire can be repaired or replaced.

Drivers are also warned not to replace the temporary (T-type) tire with a conventional tire while using the special T-type rim. Such a mismatch can result in separation of the tire from the rim and loss of vehicle control.

Car owners should check their owners manual to see if they have a T-type spare.

Anyone considering buying a car with one of the temporary use tires should ask the salesperson about the special characteristics of the tires, officials advise. (ARNEWS)

# The airlines give . . . the government takes away

Government travelers may have been delighted when they were handed 50 percent discount coupons when they flew United and American Airlines. But as is often the case, what others give, the government takes away.

The coupons, which were issued by the two airlines from May 28 through June 17, entitle travelers to purchase half-price

tickets which can be used from July 1 through December 15. The discounts apply on all of American's CONUS flights and flights to the Caribbean area, Mexico, Canada, San Juan, St. Thomas and St. Croix, and on all of United's CONUS flights and round-trip flights beginning in Hawaii. Coupons were distributed to all passengers as they boarded flights.

However, anyone traveling on official travel orders must forward coupons to the transportation officer immediately upon return from TDY.

The "coupon return" evolves from a comptroller general decision which prohibits government employees from accepting payments from private sources during the performance of official duty. Thus, the government is entitled to any payments or coupons an employee receives when the government pays for that ticket, whether it's issued by transportation or purchased by the individual for later reimbursement.

Transportation officials estimate that the

coupons will save the government a great deal of money in coming months. Redstone's biggest savings should come from United flights to Los Angeles. Dorcas Throneberry of the transportation office said that approximately 50 employees would travel there during an average three-week period. Each coupon received from that trip will save \$182 on a future trip, based on current air fare to Los Angeles.

Throneberry said Redstone will also save as a result of United flights to Washington, D.C. and New York.

Travelers receiving coupons should forward them to the transportation officer (attn: DRSMI-KHTP) in building 3488 along with the name and office symbol of the traveler turning in the coupon.

Transportation office personnel will apply these coupons to future round trip tickets. Whenever possible, the coupons will be applied to a trip by someone else in the same directorate. Throneberry said this should help with individual organization's budgets.




