

## Turtle trapping — It's no snap

The net is heavy with fish and turtles in a writhing knot. Some of the fish are dead or dying. Big fish they are, carp and gar as long as your arm. Some have putrefied.

As the net clears the water and is hauled into the boat, the live fish thrash violently, bursting the dead ones. Globules of rotted fish flesh resembling pus drops splatter the boat and the men at the net.

The wildlife biologist's work in the Great Outdoors is not always pleasant. It is hard, heaving a full net into the boat. It also can be dangerous.

The danger lies not in a fall from a boat, nor in the hornet's nests on limbs that hang low over Huntsville Spring Branch. The danger is the lightning fast jaws of the snapping turtle which can sever your fingers with the ease you'd tear matches from a book.

Very cautiously, a 20 or 30

pound snapper is extricated from the entanglement of the net. The heavy reptile up is held vertically by his tail while the mesh of the net is worked over the claws of its squirming feet.

A pedicure administered with wire pliers from the tool box helps.

Finally it's free of the net, but the battle is only half won. The blade of a paddle rapped sharply across the turtle's neck causes him to withdraw into the shell but otherwise doesn't phase the tough customer.

A pair of big channel-lock pliers is used to grasp the dangerous snout and the muscle of a man is pitted against the strength in the turtle's neck. With much straining, man proves stronger.

Three swift blows with a ball pein hammer, and the turtles round head is flat on top. Subdued,

## Parking fees unlikely for Redstone Arsenal

The President's office of Management and Budget has issued its final policy directive on charging for federal employee parking on government property.

According to the directive, fees are to be set for each installation and phased in by November 1, but this does not mean fees will take effect then at Redstone Arsenal, according to a spokesman for Mobile District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Mobile District was tasked to survey parking fees in communities adjacent to military installations in the southeast. It would appear a parking fee is not applicable to the arsenal, since there is no charge for parking in comparable facilities in the community.

Following guidelines for conducting the survey, Research Park was selected as the business-industrial complex in the community that most approximates the work environment of the arsenal.

A survey showed that no parking fees are charged at Research Park. Where no fees are to be charge, the directive tasks installations to come up with other measures to encourage carpooling.

At installations where a parking charge is

found to be applicable, fees are to go into effect November 1 at half the determined rates. The full rates will be effective October 1981, according to the directive.

Rates for DoD installations are being set on the prevailing market values of parking in each area. Under the guidelines parking fees would apply mainly to installations in an urban setting, since there is no basis for establishing fees for isolated installations or those like Redstone where employee parking in the community is largely free. In areas where the fair monthly rental value of a parking space is less than \$10, no fees will be charged, the directive states.

Several exemptions are provided for in the OMB Directive:

— People working on weekends or late and early shifts may be exempted during those periods at their agency's discretion.

— Handicapped employees who require specially equipped cars are exempt.

— Parking at government housing, cemeteries, chapels, post theaters, commissaries, exchanges and related facilities will be exempt.

— Vanpools with eight or more riders will

## New system will speed processing

Up till now, processing either onto or off the arsenal has been a tedious, time-consuming business for soldiers. Typically, a newcomer is confronted at Military Personnel with a list of 12 different places he must go and a soldier leaving Redstone must check out with 17 different offices.

Relief is on the way, though.

According to Maj. Jerry Roberts, Military Personnel chief, the in-out processing procedures are going to be streamlined. The new procedures will cut processing time in half and are expected to be put in effect by early October.

Under the new plan most of the necessary steps will be taken care of by Military Personnel Division, with only a few steps left to the soldier to take care of at his own leisure. Military Personnel Division will be given advance notice of who is coming and going, which isn't the situation now, and thus will be better prepared for speeding soldiers through processing.

Soldiers will only be required to check in with four to five offices and most of these offices will be within walking distances of each other. The new plan will as a result save gas and time for the soldiers and will enable the Army to make better use of the soldiers' time.

Roberts said details of the plan are now being worked out and coordinated with the various offices.

## Doomed alligators hurry northward

I quote a recent evaluation of my suggestion to stock alligators on Redstone Arsenal to control the beaver population (Submitted on March 29, 1979):

"DARCOM natural resources specialists recommended that installations with beaver problems introduce alligators as a possible control measure. In accordance with AR 420-74, this command contacted state and federal wildlife officials concerning the matter. Both agencies advised that Redstone Arsenal is north of the natural alligator range and that we could not expect alligators to adapt to arsenal premises."

A similar suggestion was not under consideration or in use at the time of my submission. It appears that the natural alligator range has moved quite a bit north in the past few years. Considering the rapid northward advance of the natural alligator range I am optimistic about reaping a huge suggestion award when I re-submit my idea for application in New Hampshire in 1989.



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# Bus line planned from Fayetteville

Plans are now being finalized for the establishment of a commuter bus line from Fayetteville, Tennessee into Redstone Arsenal.

Initially, one bus will make the run on U.S. 231 from Fayetteville. Stops are planned at Park City, the weight scales and several other points en route. The bus will enter the arsenal through Gate 1, making stops at several buildings and research park.

The bus line is being established by Henry Taylor, who said the system's success ultimately depends on the support of arsenal employees. Taylor plans to charge riders \$20 a week, with one week's tickets to be purchased in advance.

Taylor said all employees interested should contact him by calling (615) 433-8903 after 5 p.m. or by writing: Commuter Coach, Box 228, Fayetteville, Tn. 37334. As information is received, pick-up points and times will be established.

# Christmas mailing dates announced

WASHINGTON — Christmas mailing dates for mail destined for overseas APO areas from CONUS have been announced, according to military postal officials.

Special efforts will be made to speed up Christmas mail processing through the gateway cities in the continental U.S., according to officials.

People sending mail overseas may select one of five different postal service categories. These postal services are:

(a) Priority — provides airlift service for parcels from the point of origin to destination. Priority mail is the highest postal service offered and is moved immediately after passengers' luggage.

(b) Letters — provides airlift service and movement for letters on the same basis as priority mail.

(c) Parcel airlift (PAL) — PAL provides for airlift service in the continental U.S. and overseas for parcels not exceeding 30 pounds in weight and 60 inches in overall size. A fee is charged for packages mailed under PAL. PAL mail has no priority in movement and is moved on a space-available basis.

(d) Space-available mail (SAM) — provides for movement of parcels by surface transportation within CONUS and airlift service from the gateway city to the APO. SAM to an overseas APO cannot exceed 15 pounds in weight and 60 inches in overall size.

(e) Surface — provides for surface transportation of mail over land and sea. Surface mail cannot exceed 70 pounds in weight and 100 inches in overall size.

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## Shortened sleeve ruins new shirt



WASHINGTON — If you're planning to cut the sleeves off your new long-sleeve service shirt, don't.

According to DA officials, altering the long-sleeve shirt to obtain a "short-sleeve" shirt effect defeats the purpose of the DA wear policy on the new shirts. Officials said, alteration of uniforms is not authorized unless the uniform regulation or appropriate technical manuals specifically state that it can be done.

The long-sleeve shirt has a dress collar and must be worn with a necktie. The short-sleeve shirt, however, is designed with a convertible collar which lays flat when opened. Neckties are optional when shirts are factory manufactured as short-sleeve shirts. According to officials, the short-sleeve has been delayed in procurement and available in post exchanges by mid-September.

## Ft. Sill wins DoD environment award

WASHINGTON — An Army installation Environmental Quality Award.

Fort Sill, Okla., won its second such award for leadership and achievements in the handling of an environmental quality program. Fort Sill previously won the environmental award in 1973.

According to DoD, a committee of environmental experts selected Fort Sill for having a comprehensive environmental

program and for their efforts in pollution control, resource recovery, wildlife management and historic preservation.

The committee also recommended that three other military installations be recognized for their environmental programs. They were Pacific Missile Test Center, Point Mugu, Calif.; Vandenberg Air Force Base, Calif.; and Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii. (ARNEWS)

## 15 suggesters get Presidential letters


Presidential recognition letters were presented to 15 MICOM workers Friday in recognition of a "substantial contribution to more efficient government operations."

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
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
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
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# Handicapped worker gets commendation

Dr. Harvey L. Hamilton, manager of the Army-Wide Training Literature program in the Directorate of Training Developments, has been selected as the MMCS's Handicapped Employee of the Year and came in second as the Army Handicapped Employee of the Year.

A native of Bay Minette, Ala., Hamilton joined the Army at the age of 17 and was sent to Korea. But low test scores caused him to be discharged.

"That, I think, was the biggest challenge of my life," Hamilton recalled. "I was determined to show those people."

He returned home where he finished high school. Then five days after starting a job in a sawmill, his left arm was crushed and had to be amputated just above the wrist.

With the money he received as compensation for the accident, Hamilton went to Alabama A&M University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in general science in 1962.

Four years later he earned a Master of Science degree from the same school. He then went on to receive a Master of

Education degree in 1972 and another Master of Education Degree in 1974.

Hamilton could really feel that he'd overcome those low Army test scores when he received his doctorate in educational administration and higher education from the University of Oklahoma in 1977.

Hamilton began working at MMCS in 1966. He's the father of a twelve-year-old son and of a twin son and daughter aged 17. His wife Sara has a degree in home economics.

Hamilton was presented a certificate of commendation in a ceremony at the school recently. The certificate read; "Though physically handicapped, Dr. Hamilton has demonstrated an outstanding record of achievement by completing a doctorate in education as well as accomplishing his assigned duties in a commendable manner. Through the courage, perseverance, and initiative displayed by Dr. Hamilton in overcoming his handicap, he has been a constant source of inspiration to others and has been a positive influence toward encouraging other handicapped persons to overcome their handicaps."


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# Army seeks E-6s and E-7s for club management openings



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
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## Dismissal motions are filed in DDT lawsuit

Olin Corp., chemical manufacturer named with the Army in a \$500 million damage suit brought by local commercial fishermen over DDT pollution, has filed motions in federal court asking that the suit be dismissed.

Each of 10 counts of alleged wrongdoing is disputed in nine pages of motions filed by Olin in federal court last Wednesday.

Thirty-two commercial fishermen who claim to have fished in local waters contend their businesses have been ruined by pollution from a DDT factory Olin used to run on the arsenal. Fish in the Tennessee

River and its local tributaries have been found to contain excessive amounts of the persistent pesticide.

Grounds for the suit are alleged violations of federal and state law ranging from the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 to statues deadline with negligence and willful misconduct.

In its motions Olin claims the fishermen have not received injury or damage that is recognized by law and asks that all claims for punitive damages be stricken, along for the fishermen's request for jury trial. Olin lists numerous other reasons it claims make

the various counts of the suit invalid.

The fishermen filed the suit in July, seeking \$50 million for each of the 10 counts claiming damage to their livelihood and health resulting from DDT manufacture here, which their suit states began in 1947 by

"The Calabama Chemical Company or Benton H. Wilcoxon" with Olin buying the business in 1954 from Wilcoxon who "continued to supervise the manufacture of the chemical known as DDT for Olin ceased manufacturing DDT in 1970." In that year the Army revoked the Olin lease.

the turtle is heaved into the gas tank well in the back of the boat.

The methods may seem a bit harsh, but are effective, and necessary if you're trying to subdue a mad snapper in a small boat crowded with gear, as has been the mission of Tennessee Valley Authority biologists Scott Atkins and Frank Bowers, who are assisting the broad-ranging DDT study being conducted here by the Army Corps of Engineers.

Beginning earlier this month and continuing through September, Atkins and Bowers are collecting a variety of wildlife which will be examined by TVA laboratories as part of a study to develop solutions to the problem of DDT in local waterways that is entering the food chain.

In addition to snapping turtles — seven were trapped in Huntsville Spring Branch — the biologists are also collecting fish

of various species, green heron, wood ducks, water snakes, muskrats and shrews. Identical samples collected at various other points in the Tennessee Valley watershed between Wilson and Guntersville dams will also be subjected to laboratory analysis, as TVA seeks to define the extent of contamination in wildlife that results from DDT manufacturing waste that was deposited in local waterways by a factory that used to operate on Redstone Arsenal.

The biologists said sediment and water samples, aquatic vegetation and water dwelling invertebrates at the bottom of the food chain will also be analyzed for contamination and to chart movement of DDT in the environment.


TVA expects to determine such things as how much DDT is in each element of the food chain, how it's getting in there and how it's spreading, and what the effects on wildlife are in terms of such things as reproduction.

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
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

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
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# New rules for arsenal hunting

Redstone hunters will not have to attend a pre-season orientation this year, one of the few but significant changes made in installation hunting rules.

First shots of the 1979-80 season will be fired just after noon on Sept. 15, the opening day of dove season. Hunting of one kind or another continues through the end of February.

Deer hunters will have a better chance to take home venison this year. There will be more gun hunts for animals of either sex — have been scheduled including several on week days between Christmas and New Year's when missile flight tests are nor-

mally shut down.

Also for the first time, arsenal hunters have the option of taking deer with muzzle loading rifles. The hunting reg — Change 10 to MICOM Reg. 210-2 now available at the Outdoor Recreation Center — says deer hunters may use either shotguns firing slugs or muzzle loaders of 40 caliber or larger firing a single ball or rifled slug.

The hunter orientation and safety lecture, mandatory in the past, has been dropped this year, but it puts an additional burden on hunters to be thoroughly familiar with arsenal hunting rules and procedures.

The first either sex gun deer hunt will be

for military personnel and guests and has been set for Dec. 26, a Wednesday. Military-Civilian hunts are set for each of the following three days.

There has been no major change in hunter eligibility. Military personnel — including active duty and retired — can hunt most days and take two guests. There are 23 scheduled military-civilian deer hunts in which 50 percent of the available hunting spaces will go to government civilian employees and contractors who have arsenal vehicle access and security badges. Eight of the either sex gun deer hunts will be military-civilian.

be able to park free until October 1981. The OMB directive provides that fees be the same for all spaces in a parking lot. Parking assignments will be rearranged at many installations to offer carpoolers and the handicapped the most convenient spaces. At installations where the fair market rent is between \$10 and \$20, the initial rate from November 1 will be set at \$10. The Secretary of Defense may adjust fees and regulations at installations where readiness or considerations of Geography require it.

# Employees say no to paid parking

When asked if they were in favor of paying for parking, Redstone employees generally respond with a resounding no. Several questions were asked in a telephone survey, including: What do you think of the paid parking proposal? Would you support parking fees if those dollars were earmarked for vans, buses or some other way for federal commuters to cut their energy costs? If parking was free for carpoools, would that influence your decision to carpool? Some of the answers—

"I can sum it up in one word — ridiculous," said Fred Bowman in Military Personnel. "But if they did apply it to some energy saving purpose I'd have no objection to paying the fee. And it would certainly make me more receptive to the idea of carpooling if it's free for them to park." "I think that's silly. It seems like they're just coming up with more ways to take our money," said Sp5 Martin Burditt of the Transportation Office. "The consensus in our office is that it's absurd," said Mary Jane Hearn of Publication Illustrations. "You don't pay for parking in the south. That's one of the fringe benefits of living here. If we wanted to be up in the Washington rat race paying for parking, we'd move up there." Marzell Motley of Facilities Engineering said she would be in favor of the proposal if there was some good purpose for the fee. But as for joining a carpool to cash in on the free parking, she said, "I'd rather be joining to save energy than to save money."

# Surcharge illegal on credit gas sales

WASHINGTON — Soldiers should be wary of gasoline station retailers who put a surcharge on credit card purchase, according to the Department of energy. The Federal Trade Commission has advised gasoline station retailers that they are prohibited from putting a surcharge on

customers who use a credit card rather than paying in cash. A surcharge is a charge paid in excess of the usual or normal amount. In this case, a surcharge would be any cost over the price which is displayed on the gasoline pump. (ARNEWS)






