## Three events set for Veterans Day

The local veterans organizations and the Madison County Military Heritage Commission are coordinating three events in honor of Veterans' Day on November 11 and 12.

The first event is ceremonies in conjunction with updating the "Hall of Heroes" in the Madison County Courthouse lobby, Huntsville. The ceremony honoring all veterans will begin there at 11 a.m. on Nov. 11. Rear Admiral (Ret.) Tazewell Shepard, himself decorated during WWII, will speak.

An American Veterans Banquet will be on the 11th at 7 p.m., Huntsville Hilton. The featured speaker will be U.S. Congressman Ronnie Flipppo. Entertainment will be by the Snappy Steppers, and the Rock of Ages Band, both composed of senior citizens. The public is invited to the banquet and tickets are available at the Huntsville-Madison County Chamber of Commerce, the Madison County Commission office, or any veteran organization. On the Arsenal they may be obtained from the Public Affairs Office, Bldg. 5250.

The ceremonies will conclude with a parade through downtown Huntsville beginning at 11 a.m. on the 12th. A review stand will be at the Courthouse. The parade will include floats, veterans' groups, bands, and missile units.

## Tests find no DDT in drinking water

ATLANTA — The Environmental Protection Agency said Friday that it had found no DDT in more than 60 drinking water sources sampled on and near Redstone Arsenal.

EPA took the samples several months ago on the arsenal, in Triana and in Huntsville. The samples included water taken from 20 public water systems and 32 private wells.

"Our final report confirms preliminary findings that these water supplies are free of DDT," John C. White, regional EPA administrator, said.

The EPA report also confirmed that heavy metal concentrations in the samples were well below contamination levels. The federal agency did find low levels of contamination of other pesticides such as Endrin and Dieldrin in some of the wells it sampled. EPA said the levels of insect poison they found are low and comparable to levels found in "highly agricultural areas of the southeast."

## Red tape entangles post vanpool pioneer

Tomorrow at many places — Redstone is not one of them — federal workers including servicemen start paying Uncle Sam for the privilege of parking their cars on federal property while they work.

All other federal activities and installations have been told to give their best parking spots to van pools and car pools.

The purpose of all this is to encourage federal workers and servicemen to pool rides, saving precious gas as they lead the rest of the nation down the path of conservation through sharing.

Although not always visible from Washington where the encouraging is being directed, there are bumps in that path. Marvin Throneberry of the Redstone Arsenal Support Activity found one last week.

Throneberry is the Tennessean who bought a 12 passenger van in the aftermath of the truck strike that came within a few days of drying up the gas supply in North Alabama a few months ago.

Since July, Throneberry has been commuting in his van, carrying riders from places like Taft, Hot Rock, Bobo and Toney. They pay enough to cover his gas, routine maintenance and extra insurance coverage. He likes the company on the long ride and thinks occasionally of all that gas his van pool has saved.

His status as Redstone's pioneer van

pooler brought Throneberry a modest amount of fame. He has been interviewed by newspapers and television reporters anxious to inform the public about local angles to the national story of energy saving.

The other day a uniformed enforcement officer of the Alabama Public Service Commission (PSC) came to see Throneberry. He had read about him in the paper. The purpose of the officer's visit was to tell Throneberry he was in violation of Rule 19 of the Motor Carrier General Orders, Rules and Regulations, issued one year ago today.

Throneberry had one thing in common with everyone else at Redstone Arsenal. He had never heard of Rule 19, but now he knows it covers his van pool and probably many of the carpools operating on the arsenal and elsewhere throughout the state.

The Alabama law says any car or van pool where money changes hands requires state approval unless:

- The pool operates solely within one city or police jurisdiction (Example: Huntsville to the arsenal) or
- The pool operates solely within two adjoining cities and their police jurisdictions.

All other carpools and van pools where money changes hands must comply with

## Times change, but Halloween's the same

Who would think of putting on a Halloween costume for protection from devils? Or of decorating with fruits and vegetables to honor a goddess? Or that trick-or-treating children are actually taking part in an ancient ritual?

But in fact these customs and others associated with Halloween come down to us in a mixture of traditions from several ancient religions.

Most of the traditions come from the Celts, a tribe settled in Great Britain before the coming of the Romans. Their priests, Druids, marked the coming of winter about Nov. 1, and associated winter — with its long, cold nights — with death.

On Nov. 1 the Celts would worship Samhain, lord of the dead. They thought spirits of the dead would be allowed to return home for that one night, to enjoy the warmth of the hearth and smells of cooking food.

They also thought that demons and evil spirits got loose on that night to torment and frighten humans. They lit huge bonfires on Halloween night to frighten away such spirits.

The Celts also used the fires to mark the beginning of a new season — each family would put out the fire in their home and light a new one from the community bonfire.

Besides frightening the demons away, the Celts used to try to appease them with offerings of food. Or, they could disguise themselves as demons, so that the evil spirits wouldn't recognize them and would leave them alone.

### Fortunetelling

Fortunetelling was popular at this time of year. Druid priests would tell the future by studying the entrails of animals. Young people would try to predict who their future mates would be by throwing apple peelings over their shoulders and seeing what initial the peeling looked like.

When the Romans conquered Great Britain, they brought along some holiday customs the Celts adopted. The Roman goddess Pomona, goddess of gardens and orchards, was honored on Nov. 1. So eating nuts and fruit, especially apples became part of Halloween.

When Christianity became the major religion of the Roman empire, Christians celebrated Nov. 1 as All Saints Day, or All Hallows Day. This day, still celebrated in the Catholic church, is to honor all the Christian saints. The night before was called Hallows' Eve, or Halloween.

Some early Christians believed that evil spirits could roam about during this night,

having their own devilish festival before the Saints Day. So some of the pagan customs lingered on.

### Jack o'lantern

One legend explains the origin of the term "Jack o'lantern." It seems an Irishman named Jack couldn't get admitted to either heaven or hell. Heaven wouldn't take him because he was a miser and hell wouldn't take him because he'd played pranks on the devil. So Jack was condemned to wander the earth forever, guided only by the light of his lantern.

Halloween wasn't celebrated much during America's early history because of the severe religious doctrines that prevailed. But when more people with

Celtic backgrounds came to settle in the states during the 1800's, the holiday became generally accepted and celebrated. Today the holiday is celebrated throughout central Europe, wherever the population has a strong Celtic background.

Americans' biggest contribution to Halloween came when they started using pumpkins to make Jack-o'-lanterns. The Celts had carved other fruits and vegetables into lanterns, but once pumpkins were used, they became a definite Halloween symbol.

So this year when you're giving out treats so the "spooks" won't harm you, or dunking for apples, or even carving a pumpkin, remember you're keeping up a tradition that dates back before Christianity — or even recorded history.

# James supports registration for draft in arsenal speech

Governor Fob James told a defense-oriented audience here last week that it is wrong to no longer require Americans to register to be available for a possible call to military service if needed.

"Someone duped this country into not even registering," the governor told the

Tennessee Valley Chapter of the American Ordnance Assn.

He said a process of simple arithmetic, adding the total force of the active Army, Army Reserve and National Guard, indicated that in a few months of modern war "we would be in serious trouble with no means to tap the manpower or womanpower of this country."

The United States dropped both the draft and the national registration requirement that went with it several years ago.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff urged Congress to restore registration this year, but Congress refused.

Registration, James said, "is part of the price we must pay to make sure no American president is ever put into a compromising position when the fate of our country hangs in the balance."

About 300 members of the association attended the Oct. 23 dinner meeting in the Redstone Officers Club.

Discussing local issues with newsmen prior to the meeting, James said the state would soon begin a search for a prison site somewhere in the Tennessee Valley.

## New Army shirt: How to wear it

There is a right way to wear the Army's new light green dress shirt, seen more often around the arsenal.

CSM Edward Polite, who discussed the matter with Army officials in Washington, said that first of all the shirt should always be worn with the rank insignia, but not with any other insignia, such as a crest or medal. Officers should wear the rank insignia on the epaulets, while NCOs should wear it on the collar.


Indoors, the shirt can be worn with the Army-green sweater. Outside it can be worn

with the Army windbreaker, but the rank insignia must also be worn on the windbreaker.

The shirt can also be worn as part of the Class A uniform.

A tie must be also worn with the shirt. Tie tacks or clasps "in good taste" should be worn with the tie. Polite said that he has asked Army officials to define "good taste" more concretely, in order to avoid questions about what is a proper tie clasp or tack.

Polite said a short-sleeve version of the shirt should be out in January. A tie won't be required for it.



**Why do you think Combined Federal Campaign donations have decreased this year?**



**Pvt. 2 Gregory M. Boswell, Co. A** — "I think it's because people feel the money isn't being spent properly and with inflation the way it is, people just don't have the extra money."

Calvin Morris, 8th S.C.** — "I think the young troops today are not tuned into the needs of the unfortunate people in our society, because they're in their own natural world, such as jogging, physical exercise, hiking, etc. They do not come in contact with what the unfortunate people go through on a daily basis."

# Flu shots set for civilians

Flu shots for civilian employees will be given at Occupational Health (Bldg. 116) during the month of November on work days from 10-11 a.m. and 2-4 p.m.

Shots will not be given to people under age 26 because they require youth-strength vaccine which isn't available.

Dr. Irene Roan, preventive medicine chief, said immunization is recommended for persons with chronic health problems and those over 65 years of age.

# \$9,500,000 building program includes four new barracks

Here's what will be built at Redstone with money in the FY 80 military construction appropriation passed by the House of Representatives last week:

- Enlisted Barracks — \$7.2 million for four buildings sited west of Patton Rd. and south of Aerobee Rd. Each barracks will house day rooms, lounge areas and sleeping rooms. The four will house 550 enlisted persons, with max capacity of 714 troops.

- Radar Operations Facility — a two-story structure for researching and developing radar sensors and other optical

tracking systems. Will be sited west of the RSA airfield. Estimated cost is \$1.3 million.

- Airfield Control Tower — \$435,000 to replace the control tower at Redstone's Army airfield and to fix up some of the supporting structures.

- Security Fence — \$340,000 for fencing and lighting at critical storage areas at the south area of the arsenal.

- Secondary Waste Treatment Plant — \$270,000 for additional treatment to comply with the federal laws.

# Car rental rates increase for defense workers

WASHINGTON — DoD and Coast Guard employees should be aware of a change in rental rates at Budget Rent-A-Car. According to a Military Traffic and Management Command (MTMC) spokesman.

Last May, MTMC announced a new agreement with Budget Rent-A-Car that provided unlimited free mileage rates for DoD and Coast Guard employees provided cars are returned to renting locations.

On Sept. 1, Budget raised its rates by \$2, making the new rates \$20 per day for a compact car, \$21 for a standard car, and \$22 for a full size car. Weekly rates are not available at Budget Rent-A-Car.

Rates for Avis, Hertz, and National remain the same at \$20 per day for a compact, \$21 for a standard, and \$22 for a full size car. Weekly rates at five times the daily rates are available at these companies.

Travel offices and other personnel arranging car reservations are reminded

that rental cars selected must be those which permit completion of the mission at the lowest cost to the government, explained the MTMC official.

He added that all rental sources, such as the GSA motorpool and GSA contract lease cars, should be compared before a reservation is made with the low cost commercial firm.

Not all Budget Rent-A-Car locations are participating in the DoD program. Individuals should check with their local Budget Rent-A-Car office for more details. (ARNEWS)

# Improvements planned for recreation area

Improvements are coming to the troop recreation and picnic area adjoining the swimming pool on Vincent Road.

George Parker, chief of the Morale and Welfare Division, said that first the area will be landscaped. Parking will be enlarged and improved. Three pavilions

with picnic tables will be built, plus ten concrete picnic tables on concrete pads. Several picnic grills will also be added.

Two multi-purpose (basketball, volleyball, and badminton courts) a nine-hole frisbee golf course, and a 1.3-mile

station fitness course will also be constructed.

Parker said all of the improvements should be finished by next spring. The improved recreation area will be within walking distance of the barracks and housing areas.

## M240 machine gun draws praise

WASHINGTON — "The results have been superb. The M240 is a superior machine gun, its assignment to U.S. units has been a true contribution to combat effectiveness, and its availability is greatly appreciated by the rank and file soldiers of our units."

The USAREUR Commander-In-Chief Gen. Frederick J. Kroesen had those words about the new armored vehicle machine gun adopted for the Army's present and future tanks and other armored vehicles.

The M240, or Belgian MAG 58, has been issued for all M60A1 and M60A3 tank battalions in USAREUR and these units have all completed at least one tank gunnery period with the new machine gun.

The M219 had been the standard armor machine gun since 1959, but its service record has not been good, according to Army officials. The Israelis, for example, had problems with M219 reliability during the 1973 Mideast War.

As a result, the Army began seeking a replacement, an official said. The Belgian MAG 58 (now known as M240) was the

selected alternative. The M240 is a highly reliable weapon and, on the average, it fire 13.6 times as many rounds between failures as the M219.

According to a DoD announcement, a contract has been awarded to Fabrique Nationale Manufacturing, Inc., Columbia, S.C., for a first year production of 625 of the machine guns as part of a multi-year program. The five-year procurement plan will provide for equipping the rest of the Army's tanks and other armored vehicles.

The M240 is a gas-operated, air-cooled, metallic link belt fed machine gun which fires from the open bolt position and features a quick change barrel with fixed headspace. It is designed for 650 to 750 rounds per minute cyclic rate of fire with a muzzle velocity of about 2800 feet per second. It fires the standard 7.62mm NATO cartridge to a maximum effective range of 1200 meters. (ARNEWS).



# Pooling to work? Know the rules

Thinking of starting a car or vanpool? You can avoid any hassle by sharing rides with others. If you take turns driving and no money changes hands, you've got no problem with anyone. You should check with your insurance company to make sure you're covered.

If one person drives and collects a fee from the others to cover expenses, however, the Public Service Commissions of both Alabama and Tennessee have rules that may apply to you:

In Alabama, any pool where money changes hands requires state approval unless;

- The pool operates within one city and its police jurisdiction, or

- The pool operates within two adjoining cities and their police jurisdictions.

All other pools where money changes hands must:

- Register with the Public Service Commission by filing a state form with \$10 registration fee.

- Paint state registration number on the rear of the vehicle used by the pool.

- Carry medical or first aid kit and fire extinguisher.

- Comply with state specified safety standards for vehicle and driver.

- File proof of minimum insurance (\$25,000 injury or death to one rider; \$100,000 for all, \$10,000 property damage).

- Keep records of service and maintenance on the vehicle.

- Haul no more than 10 riders.

The PSC says it takes about a week to issue its Commuter Certificate sanctioning the pool.

Apply to: State of Alabama, Public Service Commission, P. O. Box 991; Montgomery, Ala. 36130.

Tennessee has similar requirements. Any vanpool with fewer than 15 passengers that crosses state lines has to pay a \$25 registration fee. There's also a yearly inspection fee of \$5. Tennessee has the same safety requirements as Alabama. Apply to: Tennessee Public Service Commission: Cordell Hull Building; Nashville, TN 37129 for the proper forms.

Alabama standards on safety and insurance, register with the state and pay a \$10 fee good for the life of the vehicle. The Alabama PSC issues a "commuter certificate" and an identification number to approved pools.

The state says Rule 19 is to protect people riding in car and van pools. Vehicles registered with the state must carry insurance minimums of \$25,000 per person for injury or death; \$100,000 for all passengers and \$10,000 for property damage.

Throneberry says he will apply for the Alabama commuter certificate. On the

advice of the Alabama PSC officer, he also checked with Tennessee authorities and found his home state also wants him to register. The fee there is \$25 with a yearly inspection fee of \$5. Since he drives from one state to another, Throneberry has also checked now with the Interstate Commerce Commission. He learned to his relief that the feds require nothing further from him.

There's one last problem. Alabama's Rule 19 says he can carry 10 riders. Throneberry has been hauling 11.

"One of them is a temporary employee, though. I guess we can work that out okay," he said.



# DDT disposal


Tons of DDT-contaminated soil are being removed from the site of the Olin Chemical Corporation plant that operated near the center of the arsenal from 1947 until 1970.

The soil is being buried in clay-lined pits at a hazardous disposal site one-half mile west of the plant site.

A representative of Ashburn and Gray Contracting Co. said their trucks are removing approximately 20 loads a day from the plant site. Each truck load contains 18 to 20 tons of soil.

The pit presently being filled will hold 9,900 cubic yards of soil. Another pit has been dug with a capacity of 5,500 cubic yards and if needed, as many as four more pits of that size will be dug. The pits are to be sealed with clay, covered with top soil and seeded with grass after they are filled. Monitoring wells have been drilled around the pits.

Thus far, the Army has spent roughly \$1 million cleaning up DDT residues on the arsenal. That amount includes this project and construction of a plant that filters ditch water before it enters the Huntsville Spring Branch.



# Gym manager runs with the best

Sgt. Jack Durkin is a familiar face to participants in Redstone's Run for Your Life program. In charge of that program and several others as facilities manager for the post gym, Durkin also is one of the program's most enthusiastic participants.

Durkin was bitten by the running bug in July, 1978 after talking to Earnest Beck, one of the three 2500-mile veterans in the program. Between July and December that year, Durkin logged 1089 miles training for the Joe Steele Rocket City Marathon. He is now about to reach the 2500-mile plateau in his Run for Your Life training. Durkin ran the Joe Steele marathon last year, and went on to run exhibition at the Boston Marathon. He plans to take part in both marathons again this year.

Boston, he said, was a "fantastic experience. If anyone is looking for a good marathon, that's the place to go." He said running exhibition was worthwhile just for the feeling of knowing you can run 26 miles.

When Durkin came to Redstone in September of 1977, 42 people were involved in the Run for Your Life program. Once people became aware that the program was available, "they started coming out of the woodwork," Durkin said. Over 100 people are now involved in the program, which encourages running as a lifetime sport. Many of the program's participants are now

preparing for the upcoming marathon in December.

How does the program work?

Those who enter it choose the level of training they want to pursue. Individuals can begin with a preparatory stage, combining walking with running if they've previously led a sedentary, inactive life. They can then advance to a conditioning phase, and finally a sustaining phase which involves running indefinitely with a minimum goal of a timed 7 to 10 miles per week.

Participants keep a record of their progress on score sheet, noting miles run and time. The completed score sheets are kept by Durkin. To build incentive, mileage certificates and patches are awarded when runners reach the 50, 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 750, 1000, 2500, 5000, 7500, and 10,000 mile points. Run for Your Life T-shirts are given to all runners reaching the first milestone, 50 miles.

There are eight marked running programs in the family housing area. The program is open to all military personnel, dependents, and civilian workers at Redstone.

Running may be Durkin's favorite sport now, but he found work in his unique field, Army Recreational Services, because of his experience in aquatics. Originally assigned to be a company clerk, Durkin was at his first duty location, Ft. Huachuca, when he



heard that swim instructors were needed. Durkin, a certified Water Safety Instructor, applied and found himself working for recreational services within a week.

At Huachuca, Durkin was in charge of four pools. From there, he went to Panama, Canal Zone where he was in charge of the year-round aquatic program at two beaches and four pools. Durkin began branching into

other areas of the rec services field there. Much of his training has been self-motivated — from books and talking to others.

"There's a lot of common sense involved.

I just read about things and pass the information on," Durkin said.

Durkin came to Redstone in 1977. He handles several sports — raquetball, basketball and tennis — and sees to it that all fields and courts are in playing condition.

He's pleased with the participation in sports here.

"The gym is constantly filled," Durkin said. And even though he has noticed a number of overweight soldiers here, he believes the majority of the troops at Redstone are physically fit.

## How to have a safe night run . . .



The switch from Daylight Savings Time to Standard Time causes everyone to make some adjustments. For some, that may only amount to switching on the headlights for the drive home from work, or enjoying getting up to daylight again.

But for Redstone's avid running population, the hour shift is a sure sign that the safest time for running — daylight — is shrinking fast. And as area runners increase their running time in preparation for the upcoming marathon in Huntsville, they will be training along darkened roads and paths.

Even before the time change, there were reports of early morning runners ignoring elementary safety rules. One arsenal worker who drives along Goss Road before 6:30 met a number of joggers wearing dark

clothing. In the early morning darkness, he said he had trouble spotting them and could have hit them.

If you're one of those running in darkness, here are some guidelines that should be followed:

1. Wear light-colored clothing. White is the color most easily seen in headlights. Reflective vests, headbands or stick-on patches will enable drivers to see you at distances of up to 200 yards.

2. Never assume that drivers see you. Run against the flow of traffic — that way you can see what's coming. Stop at all intersections, cross driveways carefully and listen for the sound of automobile engines.

3. Know your course. Never take a run in a dark, unfamiliar area. Hard-to-see hazards like buckled pavement, cracked sidewalks, tree roots and curbs can cause falls and possible injury.

4. If possible, run with another person — both for companionship and safety. Be sure to run single file, not two or more abreast. This will give you more room to maneuver out of the way of cars.

5. If you do run alone, let someone know where you'll be running and when you expect to return. This guarantees against being left helpless if attacked, hit by a car or injured.





# Barracks to lose free TV antenna

By October 1, 1980 the Army will discontinue master antenna TV (MATV) service to the barracks here at Redstone, according to Dewitt Waelde, MICOM staff communications-electronics officer.


Presently the Army provides MATV service to six barracks and the hospital. Every room and dayroom in these barracks has an MATV outlet that enables a soldier to plug in his TV and get the four Huntsville TV stations. This service is free.

But Waelde said that because of AR 105-20, after Oct. 1, 1980 soldiers will only have the choice of paying for cable TV (CATV) or trying to pick up local stations with rabbit-ear antennas. MATV, however, will continue free until October 1, 1980.

Satellite Cable TV Corporation presently provides CATV to the housing areas in the northern part of the arsenal. Subscribers to their service receive four Huntsville station, three Nashville stations, and three Birmingham stations, with the option of Home Box Office. Cost is \$8 for installation, a \$7 monthly fee, with Home Box Office costing an additional \$10 per month.

Waelde said that AR 105-20 will make one additional change. Now the CATV hookups in the barrack dayrooms, the recreation center, and the clubs are paid for by non-appropriated funds — specifically the Morale Support Fund. AR 105-20 will allow appropriated funds to pay for these hookups and will also pay for CATV in the hospital.

Only rabbit-ear antennas will be allowed in the barracks, Waelde said, but those people in family housing will be able to use an outside antenna if they get permission from Facilities Engineering.

## Mileage deduction rates increase

WASHINGTON — Individuals using their cars for business in 1979 may now deduct 18.5 cents a mile for the first 15,000 miles driven, according to the Internal Revenue Service. Previously, the mileage rate was 17 cents a mile.

The rate for cars driven more than 15,000 miles on business and cars that have fully depreciated, however, remains 10 cents a mile.

According to the IRS, individual taxpayers may deduct the mileage rate instead of gasoline, oil, repairs, insurance,

depreciation, and other operational and fixed expenses.

For vehicles used for charitable, mechanical and moving expense purposes, the rate has increased to eight cents a mile for 1979. The rate covers the cost of gasoline and oil.

Taxpayers may choose to deduct actual expenses rather than using the standard mileage rate if they keep accurate records supporting the deduction. Parking fees and tolls may also be deducted in addition to either standard rate. (ARNEWS)






