### Waiting wives



# Either sex deer hunts slated

Redstone deer hunters will have their first-ever weekday, either sex deer hunts this season starting next week.

The majority of the deer taken on the arsenal each year are shot during the either sex hunts. In prior years, those hunts have always been held on week ends, but hoping to take advantage of the holiday shut down of the arsenal firing ranges, officials set some of the either sex gun hunts for week days.

According to arsenal games wardens and hunters, prospects for a successful hunt are better than ever. Deer hunters have been restricted to bucks only since the gun season opened a month ago, but they report deer more numerous than ever in all arsenal hunting areas.

The first either sex hunt, Dec. 26, will be for military personnel, including retired military, and their guests. Military-Civilian either sex

hunts have been scheduled Dec. 27, 28 and 29.

On Military-Civilian hunts half of the available spaces in hunting areas are allotted to civilian government workers and others including contractors who have an arsenal security badge and vehicle decals.

More Military-Civilian either sex hunts have been scheduled Jan. 2, 5, 6, 12 and 19.

On all days when Military-Civilian hunts are scheduled, those portions of Wheeler Refuge within the arsenal boundary are open to authorized hunters.

Additional Military-Guest either sex hunts are scheduled Dec. 30 and Jan. 13.

The either sex hunts are authorized by the state department of conservation as a means of controlling the size of the arsenal deer population.

Bow hunters can take deer of either sex at any time.

# Special Troops wives group aids Harris children's home

What began as a monthly coffee for Special Troops wives has evolved into a Christmas project to provide gifts for children at Huntsville's Harris Home.

"We all have kids so we could identify with that," said project coordinator Mackie Frazier. "When we heard about Harris Home, we jumped at the chance to help those kids."

a decision. If you believe that roads are too hazardous for you to drive to work, stay home until later in the day or call your office and ask to be put on annual leave.



# Holiday schedule for deer hunts


The Outdoor Recreation Center goes on special holiday hours beginning tomorrow as a convenience to hunters.

The 7th S.C. was never out of striking distance in the final game, but HHC's experienced and collected group of players never gave them the breaks they needed in the second half.


HHC got six free-throw points in the first half while giving up five. They collected five more in the second half, but never gave up another.

# Tips ease holiday travel hassle

Redstone's peopled by folks who hail from a number of far-off places. Starting today, they'll begin to leave here and join the crowds traveling home for the holidays. And many — especially young military people — may be unfamiliar with the pitfalls of travel.

"In a lot of cases, this is the first time they've gone out and traveled on their own — making reservations, paying for the ticket," said SFC David Kelly, operations NCO responsible for advising traveling members of the 7th Student Company. Of his company's 173 soldiers, 95 percent are young (17-19) and have less than six months in the service, Kelly said.

All classes at the Missile and Munitions Center and School wind up at 10:20 this morning. Since most soldiers assigned there will be signing out and leaving today and tomorrow, Kelly and others on Redstone have spent the last 45 days briefing their troops about holiday trips. Their advice could help any first time traveler.

"We counsel them about carrying large amounts of cash, and just plain losing it. Whenever they travel, they need to get money orders or travelers checks and keep those receipts in other baggage or mail them home," Kelly said. "We also remind them that their ticket is a negotiable item, like cash, and to watch that carefully."

Kelly also warns soldiers traveling by car not to drive long distances without stopping.

"I harp on that. We want them to have a good time — and we want to see everyone back. Your family or girlfriend would rather see you a day late than not see you at all," he said.

He also cautions soldiers to be sure to sign out when clearing post. "Take just ten minutes before you leave to do that. We try to doublecheck but it's possible for someone to slip through the cracks. You will be challenged on your leave status, and there's no sense marring a happy occasion with problems later," Kelly said.

"Our big goal is to see that we've done everything we can to assure them a good leave and a safe trip," said Capt. Louis Deeter, commander of the 7th Student Company. Deeter distributes a Christmas letter to his troops as they leave for the holidays which provides them with phone numbers and information they might need if they encounter travel problems.

"We also like to brief them on the purpose of the leave, which is to see loved ones and to get a break from the academic atmosphere," Kelly said. "We also challenge them to come back a better soldier and do their best job as a technician. Often, that's the first thing they remember when they come back."


Travel officials offered additional advice for those who will be traveling by plane.

First and foremost, get to the airport early, said Dorcas Throneberry, chief of the

# Obnoxious solicitors may lurk in airports

Christmas travelers may have more to watch out for than just the crowds in airports. Those crowds may contain some persistent solicitors usually from religious sects, out to garner some holiday donations from inexperienced or unsuspecting travelers.

These groups, such as the Hare Krishna and the Unification Church headed by the Rev. Sun Myung Moon, are in the airport legally. In some airports, such as Atlanta's Hartsfield International, they are supposedly restricted to operating only in special areas, such as booths. They are authorized to operate in that assigned area but they have been known to coax travelers into that area and then ask for donations.

"What they do is come out, shake hands, act very friendly and invite traveling military people to come with them," said an official at Fort McPherson near Atlanta. "When they are in their legal area of operation, they ask for donations, often in exchange for a book

with no price marked. Some young military personnel have been talked out of all their money. This has included their return fare and the money they had for their trip or leave."

In Atlanta, travelers are advised to go to one of the lounges operated by the USO or the airlines and wait there for their ride out of Atlanta.

The problem is not limited to Atlanta. Solicitors are visible at most airports with connecting flights to Huntsville. This past year, the solicitors became so bothersome at San Francisco's airport and at Chicago's O'Hare Airport that a drive was initiated to halt their efforts.

The USO in Chicago sold toy clickers to travelers, who upon purchase automatically became members of FROGS (For Repelling Obnoxious Grabby Solicitors). The toys clicking sound is regarded as a cry for help by those armed with clickers. They begin clicking when they become the target of a

solicitor, or when they notice them soliciting someone else.


When FROGS hear the clicking sound, others with clickers hurry to the source of the sound, clicking their clickers as they go. They surround the solicitor and the person being solicited. Often the solicitor becomes rattled and loses his concentration.

The USO began the clicking movement in Chicago because so many service members were being solicited by the sects.

"These servicemen are young, naive and typically from a farm in Iowa," said an airline porter and USO volunteer in Chicago. "They get out of boot camp, have never been to a big city and are vulnerable. They get paid \$200 or \$300 for the first time and they feel wealthy and happy. They arrive at O'Hare and get stopped by a Hare Krishna solicitor and they hand over \$20 or \$30.

"I feel silly standing there clicking," he said. "But I feel gratified at night when I go home and feel that I've stopped some poor serviceman from handing over 20 bucks."

passenger section in the travel office. Some large airports are so crowded during the holidays that just getting into the airport may take a long time. She said it's also important to leave plenty of connecting time between flights.

After checking in, stay in the boarding area, advises travel clerk Dorothea Larimore. Most flights are overbooked so if you dash back to board the plane at the last minute, your seat may be taken.

"Some people may not be aware that if they are denied boarding, some compensation is due," Throneberry said. Airline agents should automatically try to provide alternate schedules for passengers that cannot be seated on their scheduled flight. If there is none, the traveler is eligible for a refund that may be up to double the original purchase of the ticket, Throneberry said.

## Possum

Possum is a traditional southern dish. Many of us may have forgotten, but, properly cooked, it is a dish fit for a Colonel. In dressing the possum, don't skin it. Instead, scald and scrape away the hair, just as is done in dressing a hog. Cut the animal into lengthwise halves. Place the halves in a greased pan on the roasting rack and cook for about 2 hours at 300 degrees, basting frequently with barbecue sauce.

## Muskrat



Musk rats are not closer kin to rats than are the squirrels and they make just as good eating as any squirrel. Try this: In dressing them, be careful not to cut the musk gland in their bellies. Remove hind quarters and shoulders and discard the sides. Also, remove white stringy tissue from inside each leg. Place in water with a slice of onion and handful of salt and parboil the hams and shoulders for about 30 minutes. Remove, drain and place in baking dish. Season well with salt and pepper and cover with strips of bacon. Add 1/4 cup of water and 1/4 cup of vinegar and cook until tender. Baste frequently with liquid while cooking.



## Geese

Wash the bird well inside and out. Dry and dust well with salt and pepper inside and out. Stuff the body cavity with sliced apples. Truss, if necessary, and put bird breast-up in roaster. Cover the breasts with strips of bacon, then, use a piece of cheesecloth soaked in bacon drippings to cover the entire bird. Roast at 325 degrees for 25 minutes per pound of bird, basting frequently with the drippings.



## Groundhog

Groundhogs are cleanly animals and just as good eating as any other. For something different, try a groundhog pie: In dressing, be sure to remove the scent glands under arms and its smaller back. Cut the dressed animal into pieces. Cover these with water. Add a handful of salt and 1/4 cup of vinegar and parboil slowly for about 1 hour. Remove the meat from the bones. Place in a baking dish and add 1/4 cup of chopped onions, 1/4 cup of chopped green peppers, 1/2 tablespoon of flour and 3 cups of beef broth bouillon. Mix well. Cover dish with pie crust dough and bake for about 40 minutes in a 400 degree oven or until crust is well brown.



## Beaver

There is no such thing as a tough beaver. The meat is always tender and well flavored. If you doubt this, try one cooked this way: In dressing it, be careful not to cut the castor gland. Remove this. Cut this animal into small pieces. Remove all fat. Soak overnight in water, then drain. Place pieces in vessel with just enough water to cover them, then simmer until tender. Remove. Drain and put in a frying pan along with slices of bacon. Season well with salt, pepper and anything else you prefer and fry until well done.

## Coon



In dressing the coon, be sure to remove the scent glands at knees and armpits: Place in shallow pan on roasting rack and cover the whole carcass with cheese cloth that has been soaked in bacon drippings. Don't add water nor cover pan. Bake at about 275 degrees for 3 or 4 hours. The last half hour, remove the cloth and baste several times with gravy, dusting the animal with flour after each basting.




# 'Love Loaf' funds to combat world hunger

Members of the family were encouraged to contribute coins toward famine relief.

The drive yielded \$987.15. According to Baasen, the proceeds will be used to fight hunger in disaster areas of the world through World Vision International.

World Vision International, originator of the Love Loaf program, will receive the money for emergency relief work. World Vision is an interdenominational, nonprofit Christian humanitarian agency that combines social concern with evangelism in 50 countries, Baasen said.

Baasen continued, "We believe the program was a success. It gave our chapel families a new awareness of world need as well as an opportunity to do something about it. It costs World Vision only \$15.00 to feed a hungry

family of five for a month, so we have a feeling that we have done something important." Food, medicine and vitamins will be sent

immediately to the hungry in disaster areas of the world because of the Chapels' Love Loaf Program, the chaplain concluded.

## Holidays make separations hard to endure

"All of us (military families) go through it eventually," said Karen Stout.

"It's harder every time because we're more used to each other," said Betty Anderson.

"It" is the long separation of husband and wife, father and family, because of overseas duty.

Thousands of military dependents cope with such separations every year, but the situation

is especially hard to take during the holiday season.

"These holidays — Christmas and New Year's — are the worst. They're so couple-oriented," said Stout, whose husband Maj. Don Stout has been stationed in Korea for the past four months.

"You just have to do things as usual," said Anderson. This Christmas will be the third her husband SFC Kenneth Anderson has missed because of overseas duty.

This year her husband will be returning in mid-January, so Anderson said she and her sons plan to have two Christmases.

"We usually put the tree up on the first of December, but this year we're going to wait until the Saturday before Christmas to put it up," Anderson said.

"We're only going to open part of our presents on Christmas — we'll save the others until he gets back." "This is something the boys wanted to do, too."

Stout said her husbands' parents are coming to visit before the holidays and that she and her daughters will visit her parents on Christmas.

"I'm lucky because I have family living so close," said Stout, who is originally from Birmingham.

Both women agreed that two of the best ways to cope with separation, whether during the holidays or not, are by keeping busy and keeping a positive attitude, especially around the children.

"You have to do things," said Anderson who works at Red Cross fulltime and also keeps busy with her sons' school activities. "I find it a lot easier to work. Even if you have small children at home, you still need to get out and do something else."

"Keeping busy, that's by far the best way to go," agreed Stout.

She's active with the Officer's Wives Club, is publicity chairman for the Red Cross volunteers, works at the Dental Clinic once a week, and is treasurer of her daughter's PTA, among other activities. She also jogs and plays tennis.

Stout says her children have accepted the separation "just fine." She thinks that their youth (they're five and seven) makes them adaptable. But she also thinks her own positive attitude helps.

"If I walked around all the time saying, 'I wonder what Daddy's doing now, don't you miss poor Daddy?' they would feel worse," she said.

"When the kids miss him, I accept that, but I don't dwell on it. Sometimes they'll say, 'I wish Daddy could have seen that,' and I'll say,

'I do, too — why don't you write to him about it,'" Stout said.

"We haven't been morbid about this," she added.

Anderson said her sons hadn't missed their father as much during other tours as they do now that they're older.

"It's hard for them, because they had lots of things they liked to do with him. I have to take his place and be there for some things.

"I get the privilege of teaching my oldest son to drive and going to all sorts of sporting events," Anderson said with a laugh.

"If I have negative thoughts, it's going to make it worse on the kids. It bothers me, but I don't let them see that it bothers me," she said.

The hardest thing, both wives said, was the lack of communication with the absent partner.

"We're used to discussing everything," said Anderson. "I'm dependent on discussing things with him — maybe too dependent."

Anderson said she writes her husband several times a week and gets replies almost as frequently. He calls once a month, and the whole family talks over problems.

"We make a list of things to tell him and ask about," Anderson said.

Stout, though, finds that the time lapse in letter writing makes discussing problems almost impossible.

"If you have a problem, if you feel blue, by the time you write it and he gets the letter, it's been ten days," she said.

"By then, whatever the problem is, either you've resolved it or it's resolved itself.

"I don't have time to wait for him to tell me what to do," she added.

But are there advantages as well as disadvantages to separation?

"I think it (separation) strengthened our marriage. It's hard being away from each other, but sometimes being away makes it stronger," Anderson said.

But Stout disagreed. "What are the effects of separation? It's not good, no.

"It's like the old saying about two lives that run like trains on parallel tracks. In the course of a year you have no guarantee that your tracks are still parallel," she said.

"I'm not really worried about my marriage or I wouldn't be able to talk about it like this. But I can't deny the fact that we're both changing and will be different people after a year. You can't second guess how things will be," said Stout.

"It would be interesting to have you ask me the same questions again in a year."


