## President orders freeze on hiring

WASHINGTON — President Carter has ordered a freeze on federal hiring as one of a several steps taken to curb soaring inflation and balance the federal budget.

Agencies at Redstone Arsenal had not received guidance on the details of the president's order as this edition of this newspaper went to press March 17.

A spokesman for the Office of Personnel Management said, however, that the president had ordered the freeze retroactive to February 29. Commitments made after that date and prior to March 14 when the freeze was announced will be honored, he said.

The OPM source said agencies were being told that full time permanent positions could be filled on the basis of one filled for every two losses. He said there was no freeze on promotions.

The OPM spokesman said individual government agencies might vary the guidance in their detailed instructions to field elements.

There was no indication of how long the curtailment on hiring will last.

### It's a plane

A Navy jet seen over Huntsville and North Alabama over the weekend is gathering data for the Army's new Pershing II battlefield missile. Redstone's Army Missile Command and Martin Marietta Aerospace at Orlando, Fla., are using the FJ-4B jet to simulate the flight of a missile approaching a target.

Hanging under the aircraft's wing is the sophisticated electronics equipment which guides Pershing II missile. As the plane dives, simulating the missile approaching a target,

## Platoon sergeant's skating trips are big hit with arsenal soldiers

Since he became a platoon sergeant in May, SSgt. Benjamin F. Sudey has heard the same complaints time and again.

"There's nothing to do here at night if you don't have a car."

"Man, I'm tired of looking at these barracks walls."

"The people in this company are fine, but I see them all day, every day. It'd be good to see somebody I didn't know just once."

As platoon sergeant of the 4th Student Company's first platoon, he made sure his

people knew about the Recreation Center and the Crafts Shops. But he got responses like, "Why should I walk all the way over to the Rec Center? We have a pool table and a television in the company dayroom." Or, "Arts and crafts are fine for some people, but I'm not into that."

In January, Sudey decided that something needed to be done. And since he didn't see a way of bringing more interesting recreational opportunities to his soldiers, he decided to take the soldiers to the recreation.

He got permission to use an Army bus. And

he passed the word that any soldier wanting to go skating at one of the Huntsville rinks should be in front of the 4th S.C. orderly room at 6:30 p.m. Thursday night.

Quite a few people were ready to go on the first trip. And the next week there were more. By March he could count on filling the 46-passenger bus for the weekly trip.

He has driven busloads of soldiers to roller-skating and ice-skating rinks here and has reported no trouble.

The trips have proven popular both with the soldiers that go and the commanders that sanctioned them.

For example, Pvt. 1 Molly Case heard about the trips at a 7th Student Company formation. She said, "I don't know what made me go the first time — I hadn't been skating in six years — but there was nothing else to do. I had a great time and told a lot of other people about it."

Sudey doesn't seem to think that there is anything remarkable about spending his free

## Spy tale's a security eye-opener

One of the least-looked-forward-to events in the life of the Redstone workforce is the periodic, mandatory security briefing — a long lecture and a dismal movie.

Most of us endure the warnings about hostile intelligence threats with resignation born from the conviction that all this spy business is a little silly. Nothing like that could possibly happen here.  
Well it has.

The future star of the Redstone security briefing came in from the cold — as they say in the trade — the other day. Colonel Rudolph Albert Herrmann might as well have stepped right out of one of those security movies that left a lot of us snickering over the years.

The colonel is a real live spy. Until the FBI made him an offer he couldn't refuse, the colonel worked for the Soviet KGB. Part of his job involved periodic visits to "dead drops" throughout the United States. A dead drop is a place where the Colonel Herrmanns of the world leave money and instructions and pick up information left for them by other folks in the same business.

According to the FBI one of his drops was in Fayetteville, another in El Paso. That's Fayetteville as in Tennessee, 18 miles from where you sit as you read this, and El Paso as in Texas, not too far from where many Army missiles are tested.

Why did the KGB have dead drops in Fayetteville and El Paso? The FBI has no comment.

What was the colonel collecting from his

dead drops in Fayetteville and El Paso? Again, no comment.

We might all ponder those questions. Here's two more: Who was collecting and dropping

off the information in Fayetteville and El Paso for Colonel Herrmann to pick up? Are they still doing it?

# Triana sues Olin for \$500 million

Some 500 residents of Triana filed suit in federal court March 14 asking \$1 million each in damages from the Olin Company for DDT contamination.

The suit contends the people of Triana ate fish and drank water contaminated with DDT residues from a plant once operated on Redstone Arsenal by the chemical company. The U.S. Center for Disease Control said recently after testing most of the residents of the small community bordering Indian Creek that they had much more DDT in their bodies than has been found elsewhere.

The residents said in their eight page

complaint that they "accumulated in their bodies greater than average quantities of DDT and other chemicals." The DDT contamination, they contend, is "injurious to the health" and reduces life expectancy.

The class action suit asks for \$500,000 in compensatory damages and \$500,000 in punitive damages for each resident.

Olin made DDT in a plant leased from the Army for 23 years. Manufacturing stopped in 1970. Studies by the Army and TVA have found large quantities of DDT in the bottom of Huntsville Spring Branch and Indian Creek on the Arsenal and DDT contamination of fish and wildlife in the area.

The Army and TVA have worked for almost a year on an engineering study attempting to define the extent of the DDT contamination and investigate possible ways to clean it up.

A group of commercial fishermen based in Decatur sued Olin last year in Federal Court asking \$500 million for DDT contamination of fish in Wheeler Lake which has destroyed the once profitable commercial fishery.

The State of Alabama has also filed suit against the chemical company in federal court.

Bobby James, president of the Whitesburg Commercial Fishermen's Association, said March 16 that he and three other members of his group planned to join the Triana suit.

test engineers can evaluate the accuracy of the guidance equipment.

# Special census rules apply to military personnel

WASHINGTON — For Americans in the U.S., April 1 is stand up and be counted day as the U.S. Bureau of Census tries to account for about 222 million people. This nose-counting happens every 10 years.

According to the bureau, most Americans will receive census questionnaires through the mail. Some special rules, however, will apply for soldiers stationed in the 50 states, the District of Columbia or Puerto Rico will be required to fill out a Military Census Report (MCR) whether they live on or off base — in housing units or barracks.

The Military Census Report asks questions not appearing on the regular census forms, such as whether you reside in family-type housing or group quarters (barracks, BOQ) and questions about active duty service.

Unit census project officers will be appointed to distribute the MCRS and to collect the completed forms.

Military families living in government

quarters on-post or in family-type housing off-post will also receive regular census questionnaires through the mail. This form should be filled out and mailed back to the bureau.

Everyone living in the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa and the Trust Territories of the Pacific Islands will be included in the national census. Soldiers stationed at military installations in these areas will receive individual census reports to fill out, but no military census report form.

Soldiers and civilians living overseas will not be included in the U.S. population, according to the bureau. Soldiers will be part of a statistical summary the Department of Defense will furnish the Bureau of Census.

On census day, people assigned to ships in U.S. ports will be given Shipboard Census Reports (SCR'S) by their ship's project officer. Deployed ships, however, will be considered as overseas.

Soldiers enroute to a new duty station on

April 1 will be counted by the unit having control of them on that date.

The census report will affect many things in the next decade. The census will be used to reapportion seats in the House of Representatives. County and city officials will use census data to set local election district boundaries.

Private business may use census statistics in marketing new products, selecting new store locations and hiring people.

Although federal law requires everyone to answer the census, it also guarantees that individual responses to the census are confidential.

When you get your regular census questionnaire, the bureau asks that you fill it out truthfully and return it promptly. According to the bureau, an estimated \$2 million will be saved for every one percent of the nation's households that promptly mail fully answered questionnaires.

## 'Wartime' patch wear clarified

You must have served in a hostile fire area in order to wear a "wartime" patch on your right shoulder.

SFC Gary Simms, COMPACT chief of personnel actions in Personal Affairs Branch, said clarification is needed on correct wear of the unit patch for Korean service.

All soldiers in Korea from June 27, 1950 through July 27, 1954 may wear the patch.

Those who served there from April 1, 1968 through August 31, 1973 may wear the patch if

they were awarded an overseas service bar for service in a hostile fire area. The service must have been in an officially designated hostile fire area in order for wear of the wartime patch to be authorized, Simms said. Soldiers who served in Korea during the 1968-1973 period may also wear the wartime patch if they awarded the Purple Heart, Combat Infantryman Badge, or Combat Medical Badge.



time with the privates, even though most of them aren't even in his platoon. He said, "They needed something like this. Besides, I enjoy it."


The privates in his platoon aren't surprised either. On a recent outing, a pair of them explained, "That's just the way he is. He's about the friendliest platoon sergeant there is."



## Top NCO favors rink here

Redstone Arsenal's top NCO, CSM Edward Polite, was delighted to learn that an effective recreation program was started and kept operating by the NCOs and enlisted people of MMCS.

He was especially pleased that the people enjoying the activity had originated the idea and developed it themselves. He said, "Too often the Army hierarchy has given our young soldiers what we thought they wanted. We need to find out what they want — to listen to what they are saying."

After learning of the weekly skating trips organized by SSgt. Benjamin Sunday of the 4th Student Company, Polite looked into expanding the idea and spreading the benefits. He is currently evaluating several alternatives.

The most ambitious alternative concerns establishing a roller rink on the arsenal. "In my personal opinion, I would like to see one here. I think we would have more participation than we could handle."

"The young soldiers I have discussed this with have been 100 per cent behind the idea. And this is the first proposal that I've gotten a 100 per cent response with."

He is not ready to predict a rink for Red-

stone's future though. "There is still a lot of research to be done on things like initial costs and maintenance costs as well as details concerning how it might be run and who would operate it."

Even though he favors the idea, he has not decided if it is in the best interests of the arsenal community yet.

Polite said Redstone now supports a good recreation program, but he thinks it can be improved.

He is trying to develop "sounding boards" within several segments of the post population, especially among the lower enlisted soldiers and dependent teens, so the command can hear and consider their views.

Polite welcomes ideas and suggestions. "Any soldier can send me a note with their idea. They don't have to worry about having it typed, dressing up their language. They don't even have to sign it unless they want an answer."

He doesn't suggest that the Army will provide everything that's asked for. But he wants to avoid wasting time and money on things the people don't want, he said.

they would have called but couldn't find or remember the number.



# Registration called 'sensible and important'

The peacetime Army can make it as an all volunteer outfit, but it will have real problems if a war starts and there is no way to quickly draft additional soldiers, according to LTG John R. McGiffert, Director of the Army Staff.

McGiffert told a dinner meeting of the AUSA Tennessee Valley Chapter on March 11, that getting registration for the draft in place now is a "sensible and important step", one critical to the Army's ability to shift quickly to a war footing in the event national mobilization becomes necessary.

Without registration, he said, the Army has

a problem "and the Soviets can see that as well as we can."

The general said the Army had long supported registration as a way to save "70-75 days" that would otherwise be lost between the start of a war and the time draft machinery could be revived and get the first inductees to training centers.

President Carter - who turned down an Army sponsored appeal to revive registration last year - has now asked Congress to require both young men and women to register. The President has the authority to require men to

register, but Congress must give him the money to set up the system. Congress would have to pass a new law to make women register, something this Congress is not likely to do, McGiffert said.

He said the Army hoped that Congress would go ahead and give the President what he needs to register men.

McGiffert said Army recruiting efforts this year were doing better than last year and predicted the service would enlist the soldiers it needs for the peacetime force.

He said the Army is spending much more this year to raise both the strength of the reserve forces and to equip them with modern equipment.
