## Tax shelter opened to all wage earners

Now, every wage-earner can qualify for a tax shelter by setting aside money for their future, according to an Internal Revenue Service official.

Effective Jan. 1, every person who works for a living can set up an Individual Retirement Account regardless of whether or not they belong to a company plan, said Janet Parker, IRS public affairs officer of Alabama.

An Individual Retirement Account is a savings program to set aside money for the future. "All contributions are tax deductible," said Parker. "You can deposit 100 percent of your earned income, up to \$2,000 a year in any IRA account. This can mean an immediate deduction from your yearly taxable income."

Parker added that there is no limit to the amount of interest IRA accounts can earn. Both the deposits and interest earned escape taxation until time of withdrawal, at which time only the amount withdrawn is taxed, she said.

"If you withdraw from your IRA before you reach 59 and a half, the federal government imposes a 10 percent penalty tax on the amount of your withdrawal. However, if you become disabled you can start withdrawing from your account without penalties."

Another stipulation of an IRA account, said Parker, is that you must start withdrawing from the account by age 70 and a half.

Married wage-earners can each open up their own Individual Retirement Account and deduct up to \$4,000 from their joint taxable income. Couples with only one person working can open up a spousal

# Car registration plan uses 3-year decal

Bumper decals and expiration stickers will be replaced by a windshield decal under a new vehicle registration system beginning in July.

Also, permanent party personnel — civilian and military — will be required to register once every three years under the new Army system. Students and contractors will still be required to register annually.

"I think people are bound to like the new system because it's going to save them time and inconvenience," said Lt. Col. Ben Sanford, director of security. "Managers are going to like it because it's not going to take people from their work as long."

"It's going to be better as far as security because the decal's going to be at eye-level, and is going to be more visible to the MP. It's going to be more cost effective."

The new decal will stick to the inside of the windshield at the lower left side, similar to some state inspection decals. It costs the Army only 16 cents each compared to 45 cents for the bumper decal and sticker combination.

A space between its year expiration numeral and month expiration numeral will be used for rank insignia for "special parking requirements," Sanford said. General officers, colonels and sergeants major will have their insignia in this space for reserved parking purposes.

"It allows us some flexibility for other things too, perhaps handicapped parking," the security director added.

The military police last summer conducted a study of the present vehicle registration system. An analysis indicated permanent party officers are stationed here an average of three years, enlisted per-

sonnel two years, civilians 18 years (one year for temporary workers) and students an average of 16-18 months.

"Based on those figures, we felt we could go ahead and extend the registration to a triannual basis instead of one year and still have the same controls," Sanford said. "It's strictly from the security point of view that we have registration."

The windshield decal will have the same color scheme as the present system: blue for officers, red for enlisted personnel, green for civilians and black for contractors.

Workers registering at vehicle registration as of July 1 will receive the new decal. It is expected to take a year for the decals to be distributed to all civilians, military personnel and retired military.

Computer terminals are being added to the vehicle registration branch to make registration easier and faster. "Let's face it; right now it's very inconvenient to the customer," Sanford said.

The new decals will not have individual registration numbers, as under the present system, so MPs will use state tag numbers to identify vehicles. A computer terminal is to be added to the MP desk.

Sanford is "enthused" about the new system to register the arsenal's 54,000 vehicles. "I think it's going to be a great program and a great system and I hope we can get the cooperation of the community."

## Arsenal open in bad weather

Winter made its official entry Dec. 21 with a sleet storm, leaving roads icy and prompting some workers to call asking if the arsenal was open.

For the record, Redstone Arsenal operations do not stop in bad weather. The arsenal stays open and work goes on.

Bad weather means individuals must make a decision. If you believe that roads are too hazardous for you to drive to work, stay home until later in the day or call your office and ask to be put on annual leave.

Since I don't smoke nor drink, I didn't have many resolutions to choose from but I did manage to come up with some.


Here's my list of things I thought I'd try to do in 1982:

## Repair/rebuild function

Question: On 5 July 1981, the Depot Programming Branch, Maintenance Engineering Directorate, was transferred to Materiel Management Directorate. The Financial Section went intact while the Air Defense and Land Combat Sections (repair/rebuild) were transferred to four different branches within Materiel Management Directorate. Unfortunately, as of this date, the mission and function statements have not been changed and the new MLC 715-2 dated 6 July 1981 shows all functions (repair/rebuild) remaining in the Depot Programming Branch, Materiel Management Directorate. "Rumor" is that repair/rebuild functions will be transferred back to Depot Programming Branch in early summer. Is this true? If so, why were we ever split out? If not, when will the regulations be changed to reflect the current organization?

Answer: The repair/rebuild function was located in the functional branches in order to place total responsibility for supply of an item under the weapon system manager in the Missile Systems Division. There are no plans at present to change this arrangement, according to Jack Isom, deputy director of Materiel Management. The mission statements in MICOMR 10-2 for the Missile Logistics Center, which places repair/rebuild functions in the branches, were approved on 5 July 1981, and we are operating under them at present. However, official publication will be in change 7, which should be published and distributed by 28 Feb. 1982. Action is underway to update MLC SOP 715-2, and publication is expected in the next 30 to 60 days.

## Nine get S&E achievement awards

Nine men in MICOM's Army Missile Laboratory here received 1981 Scientific and Engineering Achievement awards.

Brig. Gen. Benjamin J. Pellegrini, deputy commander for R&D, presented the awards to James Pleasure, Harold Bates, Augustus Green Jr., Robert Russell, John Jordan, William Holt, Russell Applegate, Wayne Hudson, and James Davis.

Pleasure, who worked in Advanced Sensors, was cited for advancing the state of the art in radar signal processing, both hardware and software programs.

Bates, team leader for laser and imaging guidance in Advance Sensors, developed a research facility which improved the Army's technical capability and performance of major weapon systems.

Green for the past several years has advanced the state of the art in millimeter wave homing seeker technology giving the Army new options for missile and projectile systems. He is a team leader for terminal homing in the Millimeter Wave Guidance Technology Group in Advanced Sensors.

Russell, group leader for RF guided land combat systems in Advanced Sensors, conducted research leading to the development of simple, low cost area radar targets for use in the testing of the Army's new and most accurate long range missile, Pershing 11.

Jordan, Holt, Applegate, Hudson and Davis won a group award for contributions in the field of radio frequency guided missile hardware-in-the-loop simulation. All work in the Systems Simulation and Development Directorate.

## Four scheduled for federal trial

The trial of four people charged with conspiracy to defraud the government was scheduled to start Monday, Jan. 4 in federal court in downtown Huntsville.

John William Chambers and Roddy Hoyt Moody, two MICOM employees at Redstone Arsenal, and Betty Ruth Laird and Billy Norman Brown were slated for trial before U.S. District Judge Sam C. Pointer and a 12-member jury.

"All four are to be tried together," said Frank Donaldson, the U.S. attorney in Birmingham. Proceedings were scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m.

Mike Rasmussen, an assistant U.S. attorney assigned to the criminal division, was to prosecute. "It's pretty likely Ann Robertson, assistant U.S. attorney, will prosecute with him," Donaldson said.

The four were indicted Sept. 4 for alleged conspiracy to defraud the government by obtaining payment of false and fraudulent claims.

## Reenlistment bonus changes

WASHINGTON — Soldiers receiving bonuses under the Selective Reenlistment Bonus program will be paid in installments beginning Jan. 15, announced Army officials. Now, reenlistment bonuses are paid in one lump sum.

Under the change, soldiers will be able to collect up to 50 percent of their total bonus when they reenlist in a military occupational specialty (MOS) eligible for the SRB. The remaining portion will be paid in equal amounts over the rest of the reenlistment period.

Officials note soldiers reenlisting under the SRB before the new procedure takes effect will receive the lump sum. However, bonus payments will be based on the Oct. 1, 1980 pay rates and will not reflect the new pay raise. Once the modified bonus

payments begin, the October 1981 pay rates will apply in determining the bonus amount.

The Army's SRB program has three separate reenlistment zones for soldiers in certain critical and shortage skills. Zone A includes soldiers reenlisting between 21 months and six years of active duty. Soldiers reenlisting between six and 10 years are included in Zone B. Zone C includes soldiers reenlisting between their 10th and 14th year of active service.

SRB bonuses range from \$2,000 to \$16,000, depending on the specialty. Payments are based on the length of the reenlistment. The bonus multiplier allowed for the MOS and the soldier's rank at the time of reenlistment. Chapter 9, Army regulation 600-200, outlines SRB policy. (ARNEWS)





**What do you think was the most important event of 1981?**






Sp5 Robert Hillis, HHC, MICOM — The military pay raise. That was a really big raise and helped a lot of soldiers.



Sp4 Benito Reta, 515 Ord. C. — The return of the hostages.





# Government assets are for government use

Government assets include everything from the smallest pencil to the largest vehicle and also privileged information.

An Army regulation — AR 600-50 — prohibits using any government asset for private interest or gain. "The public expects us to exercise our responsibilities with integrity, guided by ethical principles, and to be above private gain and private interest," said Maj. Gen. William Schneider, DARCOM chief of staff, in a recent official letter.

The general restrictions regarding use of government assets are:

- Government property or facilities may not be used for other than officially approved government business.

- Government equipment and supplies may be used only for official government business.

"Although misuse of government assets is prohibited across the board, recent emphasis has been placed on private business activities," said Dayn Beam, an attorney-advisor in the legal services division, MICOM legal office.

The general restrictions on outside employment

include not engaging in outside employment or activity that interferes with performance of government duties; and not doing anything that even creates the appearance of using public office for private gain.

A revised MICOM regulation eliminated the previous requirement that employees must report their outside activities. "So now individuals are no longer required to report outside employment but are encouraged to seek guidance of supervisors if they see the potential for conflict of interest," Beam said.

Misuse of government assets can range from using a government vehicle for a prolonged coffee break to using non-public information for private gain.

"Misuse is a violation of AR 600-50 which can subject you to the full range of administrative and statutory sanctions," Beam said.

The penalty could be a written reprimand or termination of employment or — in severe cases such as stealing — criminal prosecution.

# W-2 forms on the way

WASHINGTON — The 1981 Internal Revenue Service forms W-2, (wage and tax statement) for active duty military and civilian personnel will be issued by the end of January, say officials of the U. S. Army Finance and Accounting Center. Most reservists can expect the forms in February.

Issuing W-2 forms in late January allows late 1981 taxable payments to be reflected on 1981 W-2 forms, thereby reducing the number of incorrect W-2 forms, say officials.

All W-2 forms for military personnel are issued by the center at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind.

Department of the Army civilians also can expect their W-2 forms by the end of January 1982 from their local finance and accounting offices.

Officials advise that local finance and accounting offices cannot issue W-2 forms to individuals wishing to file early income tax returns. (ARNEWS)

# Pro pay scratched from budget

WASHINGTON — A proficiency pay plan earmarked for some 22,000 combat arms leaders has been scratched from the 1982 Defense Budget, Army officials announced recently.

The plan would have offered certain NCO's serving as squad leaders, section leaders, platoon sergeants and first sergeants up to \$150 a month. It was expected to take effect last October.

Under the proposed plan, soldiers in combat arms leadership positions would have received the pro pay monthly by grade, whether or not they held the

rank of the position. An E-6 serving as an E-7 platoon sergeant, for example, would have received the bonus for an E-7.

Officials said the Army's decision to withdraw the \$27 million program from its budget submission stemmed from field commanders requesting reconsideration for a program that would include more than just combat arms skills. The reevaluation that followed resulted in a decision that the best way to improve retention of needed soldiers was through other incentives, such as selective reenlistment bonuses and promotions. (ARNEWS)

- Engraved plaques or flag sets will be awarded to organizations and individual solicitors for outstanding achievements in the annual AUSA membership drive.



## Army announces '81 energy results

WASHINGTON — The Army reduced its energy use in fiscal year 1981 by 13.4 percent, Army Chief of Staff Gen. E.C. Meyer has announced.

The reduction represents a savings of \$343 million. Even with this effort, the Army as a whole was 1.4 percent short of the goal, explained Meyer.

Meyer gave special thanks to six MACOMS which surpassed both the Army facilities and the mobility energy targets. The MACOMS, were U.S. Army, Japan; U.S. Eighth Army; U.S. Army Health Services Command; U.S. Army Communications Command; Military Traffic Management Command; and U.S. Army Forces Command.

"Since 1977, we have committed \$240.1 million to energy conservation investment program projects. What we have learned is that a command-supported energy awareness program maximizes the energy

savings per invested dollar," said Meyer. "Facilities energy use accounts for 83 percent of Army consumption. I expect each installation commander to concentrate efforts on reducing that energy use through a planned program of low-cost and no-cost energy conservation projects and an innovative year-long energy awareness program.

"The FY 82 Army goal is a 15.6 percent reduction from FY 75. I look to the chain of command to make the program a success," stated Meyer. "The efficient use of energy must become a way of life that permeates everything we do in the Army. It's in the every-day common sense area where we can make much progress. Improved energy efficiency will significantly contribute to the desired enhancement of overall readiness," concluded the Army chief. (Arnews).

## 'Limited' open season ended

Last Thursday was the last day for a so-called limited open season for people not currently enrolled in a plan under the federal health insurance program.

Meanwhile, the Office of Personnel Management was awaiting a decision by a U.S. Appeals Court on when the annual open season may be scheduled.

The appeals court was expected to address the issue sometime in early January, according to Ed Shell, an OPM spokesman in Washington, D.C.

The annual season for enrolling or changing enrollment in plans under the Federal Employees Health Benefits program was postponed by OPM because of negotiation problems with the various plans. Open season had originally been scheduled for Nov. 9 to Dec. 11.

# IRA: What's in it for me?

What's the big deal about Individual Retirement Accounts and what does it mean for me the working taxpayer?

A new 1981 tax law, effective Jan. 1, 1982, extends eligibility for opening an IRA account to all wage-earning taxpayers, according to Janet Parker, public affairs officer of the Internal Revenue Service of Alabama.

"Up till now, you could only open an IRA account if you didn't already belong to a company retirement plan," said Robin Hunter, assistant operations officer for the First Alabama Bank of Huntsville's main branch downtown. "For the first time ever, all workers can save for the future while earning and having a tax deduction."

"So many companies don't have good retirement plans, at least not what you could live off of, and social security doesn't usually provide enough either. IRA is a way to secure the future," said Hunter.

"Opening an IRA account will give you an im-

mediate tax deduction because your contributions can be subtracted from your total annual income," said Herbert E. Kemp, Jr., IRA representative for Redstone Federal Credit Union.

To qualify for an a 1982 tax deduction Kemp said taxpayers have until April 15, 1983, but he advised that the earlier you make your deposits the sooner they can start earning interest.

Both institutions offer IRA accounts at no extra cost and accounts can be opened for as little as \$10, up to a maximum of \$2,000 a year. Contributions can be made either regularly or irregularly said Kemp, or by monthly allotments.

"A person 40 years old who contributes \$2,000 yearly at the first of the year, at age 60 can accumulate \$132,036, \$229,935 at age 65, and \$390,355 at age 70." This example Kemp gave using 10 percent dividends compounded quarterly.

IRA accounts are expected to earn more than 13 percent interest in 1982 according to the financial advisors, as compared to the 6 and a quarter percent interest earned in regular passport savings accounts.

According to figures published in a First Alabama Bank retirement accounts' pamphlet, depositing \$2,000 a year for 40 years can earn you as much as \$1,870,475, at 12 percent interest.

Hunter provided the figures for the following table giving examples of what a small savings in an IRA account could mean at 12 percent interest compounded quarterly, with equal monthly contributions:

	\$10	\$50
10 years	\$ 2,262	\$ 11,310
20 years	9,640	48,204
30 years	33,710	168,555
40 years	\$112,228	\$561,142

Insurance companies also offer individual retirement accounts. According to Jim Landingham of Benefit Associates, insurance companies have a lot of experience in dealing with IRAs and they have done well in the money market. An asset in having an IRA with an insurance company said Landingham, is that you can get an annuity plan with a guaranteed income for the rest of your life.

Stock brokers offer a wide variety of retirement plans but usually charge a small fee. The advantage of going to a brokerage firm is the flexibility and variety of investments available to make your money grow, said a local broker.

Financial advisors seem to agree that the field is almost wide open to IRA accounts and there are almost no limits to what you can do with them. Their advice is to investigate options thoroughly for the best IRA account suitable for you and to make sure you deal with a reputable institution that has experience with retirement accounts.

Before this 1981 tax bill was passed, most taxpayers only had social security as a retirement income to look forward to. Monthly Social Security Benefits range from \$120 to \$750 with the average being \$370 to \$375, said Mrs. A.S. Mankoski, a Social Security service representative.

By saving as little as \$10 a month for 40 years, or accumulating \$112,228 in an IRA account, a person could receive monthly interest payments of \$1,125, at 12 percent. Monthly interest payments on \$561,142 would be \$5,615 and on \$1,870,475, a grand total of \$18,712.

What does IRA mean to me a working taxpayer? IRA is an opportunity for me to contribute to the welfare of my future, while earning a tax shelter for today.

IRA for the non-working person, and deduct up to \$2,250 on their tax return.

The new tax law allows every working person to contribute 100 percent of earned income, up to \$2,000 a year to an IRA account. Previously, wage-earners not covered by a company plan were limited to 15 percent or \$1,500, whichever was less.

"Contributions to spousal accounts had to be in equal proportions under the old law," said Parker, "but now deposits can be made anyway you chose

provided no one account exceeds \$2,000, and total contributions don't exceed \$2,250."

Taxpayers eligible under the new law have until April 15, 1983 to make IRA deposits and still deduct them on their 1982 returns, she said.

Most financial institutions offer a variety of IRA accounts now available to all wage earners. For the first time, wage-earners have an almost limitless means for saving for their retirement, according to financial experts.





# Hotline helps soldiers with equipment problems

WASHINGTON — Soldiers experiencing equipment problems now have another source of support.

The U. S. Army Depot Systems Command at Chambersburg, Pa., has established telephone hotlines at several depots in the continental United States. These hotlines, DESCOM officials say, will supplement the maintenance help available at Army installations from DARCOM logistics assistance offices. Commodity command field maintenance and supply technicians and local direct support/general support units are other maintenance assistance activities supplemented by the hotline system.

In order to provide better service support to combat troops when all other available maintenance resources are exhausted, the added hotline outlet will help soldiers address the more difficult equipment maintenance problems.

With the system operating around-the-clock,

seven-days-a-week, all a soldier need do, after exhausting all local resources, is call the depot hotline that services the problem equipment.

# Many developments here in 1981

A new telephone system, the Army's transfer of land to the Space and Rocket Center, and a new learning resource center were among the major developments here in 1981.

The Army Emergency Relief and the Combined Federal Campaign were both successful in their annual drives at Redstone.

Also during the year, the Army began supplying soldiers with the new Stinger air defense guided missile system. And the improved TOW missiles were deployed on schedule to U.S. soldiers stationed in Europe.

In sports, the Missile Command's Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC) again captured the Commanders Cup for athletic excellence and best sports program. A sergeant here won Army-wide fishing honors and the Redstone youth soccer program had its best season ever.

In March, Army activities at Redstone began using a new telephone system for placing official commercial long distance calls. The Federal Telecommunications System (FTS) was an addition to the Automatic Voice Network (AUTOVON) system us-

ed here for dialing direct to Department of Defense agencies.

The FTS dial-7 system allows the caller to phone agencies outside the Defense Department but within the United States.

On March 27, the Army formally passed 350 acres of Redstone Arsenal to the Alabama Space and Rocket Center in a brief ceremony attended by Rep. Ronnie Flippo, and state, city and county officials.

The land is to be used by the Space and Rocket Center for an \$11 million expansion to be developed in three phases over the next decade. The city of Huntsville will also develop a portion of the tract as a public park.

A civilian personnel Learning Resource Center opened to the workforce June 1 as a large one-room addition to Bldg. 7446. Features include individual learning booths, each equipped with audio and video equipment.

The center offers self-paced, individualized instruction in over 1,000 computerized courses, Army Logistics Management Center courses, Training

Extension Course tapes, and educational video tapes.

The year's Army Emergency Relief fund drive, boosted by a new allotment form system, was the most successful ever at Redstone Arsenal.

The 1981 AER drive here exceeded its \$8,000 goal by over \$4,000. This was the first year for the allotment forms which allow active duty military and retired military to check off what amount they want deducted from their pay for AER. Allotments accounted for over \$8,000 of the \$12,217 total reported May 20.

The Huntsville Area Combined Federal Campaign also set an all-time record with \$576,236 in collections and pledges. The annual six-week campaign improved on the previous year's total of \$446,645 and was mentioned in United Way of America's "Executive Newsletter" distributed weekly throughout the nation.

# Commissary has biggest sales month ever

Redstone's commissary projects that December was its first \$2 million sales month ever.

"In the month of December, we expect to do \$2 million in sales," said Chet Boutelle, deputy commissary officer. "We've never had a \$2 million month since the commissary's been at Redstone."

Sales figures for fiscal 1981 show the commissary had \$19,840,961 in sales, compared to \$17,857,957 for fiscal 1980.

The \$2 million increase was mostly due to inflation, according to Boutelle. "We sell everything at cost," he said. "Inflation goes up if costs of goods go up."

Some of the increase is due to the "amount of people on post, compared to say 1979," Boutelle added.

"And we think we're doing a little better job of merchandizing to sell, too."

Sales in Army commissaries for fiscal 1981 totaled \$1.43 billion, a 9.1 percent increase from the previous fiscal year, according to the Army Troop Support Agency.

The top four commissaries are Fort Bragg (N.C.) with sales of \$50,038,935; Fort Bliss (Texas), \$49,206,815; Fort Hood (Texas), \$45,018,445; and Fort Lewis (Wash.), \$37,949,348.

"While inflation was a major contributor to the sales increase, commissary personnel attribute the sales record to special sales and promotional merchandising which offered customer savings, the opening of three commissary annexes in Korea and

renovation of others," Troop Support Agency reported.

TSA manages and operates 142 commissaries and 34 annexes worldwide.

Redstone's commissary sales for fiscal 1981 included \$14,817,195 grocery, \$4,145,088 meat, and \$878,678 produce.

soldiers' hands is a major achievement, a milestone the command has worked for, according to Col. James Rambo, Stinger project manager here.

The Army announced last spring that it began supplying soldiers with the new Stinger Air defense guided missile system. First combat-ready units to get the man portable, shoulder fired weapon were maneuver elements of the U.S. Army in Europe. The U.S. Marine Corps are also to use the weapon.

The first deployment of improved TOW missiles to U.S. soldiers stationed in Europe was completed on schedule as the Army began modernizing its heavy-assault tank killer.

Although similar in size and weight to the basic TOW missile deployed since 1970, improved TOW features a redesigned five-inch diameter warhead that will penetrate heavier armor.

Sports news in 1981 included the retiring of the Commander's Cup to HHC, winner for three straight years. HHC captured points in bowling, basketball, volleyball, softball and flag football.

SFC Bob Ballard, an instructor in the Explosive Ordnance Disposal evaluation and training division at the Missile and Munitions Center and School, won the title of U.S. Army angler of the year. He finished eighth out of 205 competitors at the Military Bass Anglers Assn. tournament on Kentucky Lake, Ky. in October.

Over 270 boys and girls participated in the Fall Soccer Program. They ranged in age from five through 14, played on 18 different teams, and were coached by over 30 volunteers.

Other 1981 developments include:

The Federal Bureau of Investigation on March 1 assumed funding responsibility for the Hazardous Devices Course located here at the Missile and Munitions Center and School. Previous funding for the course was provided through the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.

Four crewmen from Redstone's airfield escaped injury in an emergency landing of their Army aircraft in a cotton field outside Harpersville, Ala. July 29. The twin-engine Caribou cargo plane later returned to Redstone Arsenal with a new engine.
