## Thanksgiving feast is biggest of year

### Dining facilities expect to feed a thousand people at traditional meal

The menu may be similar to the Christmas meal, but more people are usually on hand for the traditional Thanksgiving meal in the dining facilities.

Both of Redstone's military dining facilities, No. 1 at building 3438 south and No. 3 at building 3438 north, will be serving single soldiers from 11 a.m. to noon Thursday. Soldiers with family members, guests and retirees will be served from 1-2:30 p.m. A combined total of a thousand people are expected to be fed, according to CWO 2 Felix Battle, installation food service technician.

"We have a large meal for Christmas, but we don't get *that* many people; a lot of people go home for Christmas," he said.

The secretary of defense has granted approval to exempt all active duty officers and family members from paying the Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday meal surcharges. Officers and family members will pay only the food cost.

Prices include \$2.40 for family members of active duty — \$1.20 for those age 11 and under; \$2.40 for officers and enlisted personnel; \$5.55 for guests of active duty — \$2.75 for those 11 and under; and, \$5.55 for retirees and guests — \$2.75 for those 11 and under.

"It's a time of the year people normally get together and hey, Thanksgiving tradition," Battle said, explaining why people opt to eat their holiday meal here. "And also, it's cost effective. You get an outstanding meal at the same time in a pleasant atmosphere."

Long hours and hard work goes into preparing this meal. The contract food service employees normally start the afternoon before.

Around 900 people were fed the traditional meal last year, according to Charles Minga, quality assurance

and contracting officer representative. "We're looking for a little more this year," he said.

Redstone has two military dining facilities. Dining facility No. 2, in building 3480, was closed as a cost-savings measure in February. In recent years, renovations at the other facilities had increased their seating capacity.

For the traditional meal, the dining facilities will be preparing some 600 pounds of turkey, 350 pounds of smoked ham, 250 pounds of beef steamship round, and 210 pounds of shrimp. Other items on the menu include savory dressing, cornbread dressing, giblet gravy, mashed potatoes, candied sweet potatoes, buttered green peas with mushrooms, cranberry sauce, buttered corn, buttered broccoli, tossed green salad, assorted dressings, cole slaw, creamy dressing, mixed fruit salad, creamy fruit dressing, hot rolls, butter patties, pumpkin pie with whipped cream, mincemeat pie, fruit cake, assorted candies, mixed nuts, assorted fresh fruits, coffee, tea, milk, and carbonated beverages.

Besides the big Thanksgiving meal, the dining facilities' schedule for the troops on Thursday includes breakfast from 7-8 a.m. and dinner from 2:30-5:30 p.m. For more information, call 876-2317/3067.

Chaplain (Capt.) Donal Sheahan, Catholic Chaplain at Redstone, will be the featured speaker.


All chaplains will be participating in the service as well as other military personnel assigned to Redstone Arsenal. The public is invited to attend.

## Commissary prices 26 percent cheaper

FORT LEE, Va. — The results from the 1989 DoD Joint Services Triennial Commissary Pricing Survey are in and they verify what many experienced commissary shoppers already know: merchandise purchased in the commissary costs less than in commercial supermarkets.

The survey, conducted by Competitive Commodities and Services, Willow Hills, Pa., under contract negotiated by the Air Force Commissary Service, is required by a Department of Defense directive and must be conducted by a private sector firm.

U.S. Army Troop Support Agency officials report that Army commissary customers save an average of 26.4 percent on basic purchases (25.5 percent when surcharge is included) when compared to the same product purchased in a commercial supermarket.

Ten percent of all commissaries were surveyed. TSA's commissaries at Carlisle Barracks, Pa., Presidio of San Francisco, Forts Benning, Ga., Carson, Colo., Hood and Sam Houston, Texas, Jackson, S.C., and Meade, Md., were selected based on a re-

quirement that all sizes and geographical locations were to be represented.

Prices from the commissaries were compared with private sector supermarket prices in the immediate vicinity of the installation associated with each commissary. Convenience, drug, small locally owned grocery and box warehouse stores were not used in the survey.

Eleven percent of items sold in each commissary were used for comparison to ensure an accurate survey of brands and sizes. The categories compared were dairy, grocery-food, health and beauty aids, meat (packaged and cut meats), grocery-nonfoods (household items, laundry needs, pet foods), fresh produce and tobacco products.

Survey results indicate that in Army facilities the larger savings are in produce, 35.5 percent; tobacco, 31.8 percent; meat, 31.5 percent; grocery-nonfood, 30.6 percent; while the lowest are in health and beauty aids, 25.6 percent; dairy, 25.4 percent; and grocery-food, 22.6 percent.

# Fiber optic guided missile has successful test

The Army's Non-Line-Of-Sight (NLOS) weapon system, the fiber optic guided missile, has demonstrated successfully a key combat capability, the ability of a single soldier to launch and guide two missiles at once.

Pvt. Gary Rankins fired two missiles, 25 seconds apart, guided both and scored direct hits on tank targets about nine kilometers away during a test Nov. 14 at Eglin Air Force Base, Fla.

After launching the missiles, the Fort Bliss, Texas, soldier locked on and guided the first missile to impact, then switched to video of the second, locked on and scored another direct hit. Targets were approximately 150 meters apart.

Missiles used for the milestone demonstration were the final qualification missiles built for the Initial Operational Evaluation and includes hardware used earlier during the technology demonstration program and flight tests at Redstone Arsenal. That hardware is the original design by MICOM's Research, Development and Engineering Center and consists of a TV-guided missile carried and fired from a high mobility, multipurpose wheeled vehicle.

The program shifts now to White Sands Missile Range, N.M., for troop firings in an Extended User Evaluation.

Meanwhile, Boeing Military Airplanes of Huntsville and Hughes Aircraft Company of Canoga, Park, Calif., are in full scale development of an improved

system featuring a faster, longer range missile with variable speed, a day/night capability and a warhead growth capability.

Results of the IOE are being evaluated and fed back into refining and improving the Army design.

When fielded in the early '90s, Army gunners can attack and destroy for the first time enemy helicopters and armor masked by terrain or hidden from the line of sight.

## Youth Center plans age-group hours beginning Dec. 1

Operating hours for Redstone's Youth Center have been altered to better accommodate its patrons.

Beginning Dec. 1, pre-teens (children between the ages of 6 and 12) can use the center from 3 to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturdays. New hours for teens are 6 to 9 p.m. weekdays and 3 to 9 p.m. Saturdays. The center is closed Sundays and holidays.

The new hours have been established so that the center can offer more services geared to the ages of its members, according to Shelby Williams, director of Youth Services.

"It's real hard to do programs for ages 6 to 19, because interests are so different," she said.

Every effort will be made to prevent hardships on families with children in both ages groups, according to Williams. Those teens who need to come to the center after school will be allowed to serve as volunteers to assist with center operations.

Williams believes the change in hours will allow more quality programs, since numbers of children will be smaller. She also expects it to help with discipline.

"It's hard to work with 150 kids of all ages," she said.

The center is also forming a youth council, made of children between the ages of 8 to 19, which will take an active role in deciding what activities will be offered. The council will also establish a sponsorship program for children who are newly-arrived on post, Williams said.

Williams encourages all teens interested in working as volunteers to go ahead and sign up, since the number will be limited. She also welcomes questions or comments from parents.

# Redstone Corps of Engineers worker gets top award

A Redstone project engineer was one of 12 Army Corps of Engineers workers worldwide who received the "Hard Hat of the Year" award.

Willie Raifus Hall, who works in the Corps' Redstone area office which is part of the Mobile District, was selected as the winner for the South Atlantic Division. The award represents the top honor for construction representatives and project engineers in the Corps of Engineers.

Fiscal 1989 marked the second time in two years that a Mobile District construction representative has won the award in the South Atlantic Division which includes five districts.

The other 11 honorees represented the North Atlantic, North Pacific, South Pacific, South Western, New England, Lower Mississippi Valley, North Central, Pacific Ocean, Europe, Ohio River, and Missouri River Divisions. The awards were presented during the Worldwide Chief of Construction Conference held in Orlando, Fla.

"It's something that I think was a team thing, that everybody worked hard together," said Hall, who received a trophy from Corps officials out of Washington, D.C. "And I think the fellow workers played a big part in it because we have other engineers here that play a big part in assisting as far as working with the field personnel and the contractors to ensure quality assurance."

The Mobile District has 40 area offices and a Middle East project office. Dan Burns, chief of construction in the district and Hall's sponsor at the awards banquet, said: "From a division of almost 8,000 people... that places \$800 million worth of work each year, Willie has been chosen as our example of the best of the best."

Hall, 50, is a native of Abbeville, Ala., which is in Henry County about 18 miles northeast of Dothan. He was the oldest of 11 children — eight boys and three girls — of Walter and Mary Alice Hall. His father, a

public worker with little education, died in 1980. His 72-year-old mother resides in Abbeville.


After graduating from Henry County Training School in 1958, Hall started doing construction work for Perenia Construction Company in Fort Gaines, Ga. He spent the next eight years with various companies working locks and dams in South Alabama. In 1966 he became a laborer with the Corps of Engineers. That temporary position became a career. He worked at various sites in Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi before coming to Redstone in 1984.

"I love it, it's a challenge. Everyday's something different," Hall said. "What makes it a challenge is I worked 19 years in civil projects — lock and dams, roads and bridges — and up here you work with military so it's quite a difference as far as construction procedures. I encourage all kids to get a good education because there's a lot of things out there, especially in construction, you can miss out on if you don't have a good education — and in life, itself. And if I could do one thing different, I would've gone to college first and wouldn't have as much of a problem with correspondence courses. But, Corps of Engineers and government itself has been a rewarding experience throughout the years."

He has six children (five by a previous marriage) and a granddaughter. He and his wife, Ophelia, reside in Madison with their 9-year-old daughter, Arlena, who attends West Madison Elementary. His three oldest daughters are all college graduates: Wilma Hall and Abigail Carter graduated from Auburn, and Veta Ann Nelson graduated from Tuskegee. His sons, Willie Jerome Hall and Leslie Lamar Hall, are both in college studying electrical engineering — Jerome at South Alabama, and Leslie at Florida A&M.

Hall's hobbies are fishing and hunting. He attends the St. Peter United Methodist Church in Madison. "I enjoy working in the Huntsville area and we plan on making this our home," he said. "Maybe I can stay until I retire."



Soldiers and civilians from the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School answered the call for assistance after last week's tornado.

They set up an emergency operations center at Redstone and dispatched troops with equipment to help at the scene of the disaster in southeast Huntsville. The emergency operations center began at 4:45 p.m. Wednesday, about 10 minutes after the tornado hit, and closed about 5 p.m. Friday.

It took requests for assistance and dispatched an initial group of about 35 soldiers from the 515th Ordnance Company along with two forklifts, a wrecker, and two light sets to illuminate the area. "Close to 11, 12:00 that night, they deployed to the tornado site to give assistance," said Col. James Amato, commander of 269th Ordnance Brigade. He was in charge of the emergency operations center.

At 4:30 a.m. Thursday, 60 members of 73rd Ordnance Battalion were sent to the scene of the disaster. A second group of 60 soldiers from the 73rd was dispatched about three hours later. This brought the number of soldiers sent from OMMCS to 120 members of A Company and B Company of the 73rd, and 35 members of the 515th Ordnance Company.

Another 120 soldiers were dispatched Thursday afternoon to relieve the first group. "They stayed there until the Huntsville Police Department called that off at approximately 1700 (5 p.m.) Thursday," Amato said.

"Friday morning, again we sent out 120 people to support the site," he said. "They stayed there to approximately noontime Friday till we were told by the emergency operations people on-site they were no longer required."

That was not the end of the support provided by OMMCS. On Saturday, a request came from the Red Cross to assist elderly people who were required to move from the damaged Country Club Apartments on Airport Road. This need was met by about five soldiers from the 832nd Ordnance Battalion along with a 2.5-ton truck.

Besides Amato, individuals involved at the emergency operations center included brigade staff members

CSM Bill Jones, Maj. Jack Soesbe, Capt. Ed Dickens, Capt. Steve Conyne; Ken Carroll and Ed Ottman, key civilians for logistics support at OMMCS; MSgt. Roger Blandsfield, the duty officer that night, and SFC Rex Davis, the duty NCO. Others who helped at the center included Sgt. Donald Bracken, Spec. Marianne Clinedinst, Maj. Al Phillips and Capt. Drew Early. The two battalion commanders — Lt. Col. John Hostettler of the 832nd Ordnance Battalion and Lt. Col. Brian Lee of the 73rd — were at the center to get their requirements.

Lee and Capt. Dave Perreault were deployed with

the initial group from the 515th Ordnance Company in order to relay reports from the scene by cellular phone. Those in charge of the 515th's deployment included CWO 2 Stephen Foster and CWO 2 Mitch Pradia. Capt. Curtis Norris is commander of the 515th.

"I thought we responded very quickly," Amato said. "We didn't have any difficulty responding to the request. As a matter of fact, we had a larger capability than was used during the exercise. I would say because of the overwhelming community support, we were not needed as much as we would've been able to support."

# Redstone soldiers did their part in tornado relief

When members of the 291st Military Police Company arrived at the site of last Wednesday's tornado touchdown, they were faced with a sight which few have adequate words to describe.

"Chaos" was the way SFC Kenny Renew portrayed what he saw. He was serving as duty officer for the 291st when the tornado hit.

"What I saw was indescribable," he said.

He was among the first soldiers to report to the area of Golbro and Waterford Square Apartments.

"People were hanging onto car doors and crying. I think most were onlookers who had just panicked.

"A man who lived in the apartments came to me and said he thought his neighbors were home (when the tornado hit)," Renew said.

Renew went with the man, expecting to find bodies from the wreckage of the demolished apartment building. No one was there, but what he found astounded him.

"Appliances from the kitchen were in the living room. A toaster had gone through two walls and was stuck in the living room wall, like shrapnel." In the bathroom, a coffee table was wrapped inside the shower curtain.

Renew expressed pride in the MPs he worked with that night, most of whom were young soldiers, new to the 291st and Redstone.

"The majority of the MPs were brand new — they haven't even started on the road yet. We were removing rubble, and we never knew what was underneath. But they all remained calm," he said.

"Once they got there they were on their own. We had no command and control. We depended on them to do what was appropriate," he said.

Sgt. Shedrick Ballard was among the first contingent of MPs to arrive at the scene.

"I just couldn't believe the damage it had done. There were sofas sitting outside. On Airport Road there were still cars in the road with the headlights on. It was like a bomb had gone off," he said.

Spec. Timothy Allen, a Michigan native, was unprepared for the destruction at the scene.

"I was amazed at what it hit and what it didn't. I've never seen a tornado in my life. I didn't know they could cause that much damage," he said.

As he dug through the rubble with the other

soldiers, he witnessed the extremes in human behavior which seem to be a part of any disaster.

"I saw one guy, I think he was a relative of the people in the cleaners. He had a red rose in his hand, and he threw it into the building. It really touched me," he said.

On the other end of the scale, looters were already attempting to take advantage of others' misfortune. Allen helped keep them out of the area.

At least one Redstone soldier made a great impression on Renew during the search and rescue effort.

"The post sergeant major (CSM Isaac Clifton) was 100 percent with the MPs. He was down there with us, checking on our welfare and assisting us. He was really concerned," Renew said.

The MPs weren't the only soldiers involved with search and rescue. The 515th Ordnance Company sent

heavy earth moving equipment, lights, generators and cranes — and the soldiers to use them.

Soldiers from the Missile Command Headquarters Company were there to help out. Some were detailed there, and some were just passing by and stopped to help, according to 1st Sgt. Gary Shirley of HHC MICOM.

"We've got people who are EMTs, one works part time for the Sheriff's Department. They were crawling through rubbish," he said.

A MICOM soldier who is a licensed ham radio operator ran a radio all night for communication among rescuers.

"They did a fantastic job for the situation at hand," Shirley said.

By noon Friday, an estimated 700 soldiers had been sent to assist with relief efforts.

# Fox Hospital responds to actual mass casualty event

Fox Army Community Hospital canceled its mass casualty exercise planned for last Friday after the real thing happened two days earlier.

Eighteen people were killed and hundreds injured when a tornado ripped through southeast Huntsville on the afternoon of Nov. 15. The call for assistance went out over the local hospitals' communications system, and Fox Hospital responded.

"We provided eight emergency vehicles with crews throughout the evening. We had at least 24 people out at the site. Not all of them were dispatched; we had some people that were *right there*," said Capt. Sylvia Rodriguez, public affairs officer for Fox Hospital.

Some of the hospital workers were residents of the affected area or happened to be in the wrong part of town when the disaster occurred. An untimely traffic accident didn't help matters. One of Fox Hospital's ambulances was transporting a victim to Huntsville Hospital when it collided with a car driven by a civilian nurse at the intersection of Bob Wallace Avenue and Memorial Parkway. Fortunately the injuries from the wreck weren't serious. "Our ambulance was disabled and another ambulance was called in to take that critically ill patient we had in there," Rodriguez said.

Fox Hospital treated 12 people and transported at least 50 to other local hospitals — Crestwood, Humana, Huntsville, and the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) Clinic. Both the Fox Hospital commander, Lt. Col. Karl Snyder, and deputy commander for administration, Col. James R. Young, were out of town attending conferences. Maj. Alan Pearson, deputy commander for clinical services, was acting commander at the time.

"We had medical personnel, including physicians and corpsmen, who helped with the ground search and triage and they even worked in local emergency rooms," Pearson said. About 7 p.m., the hospital

took its 25 patients plus staff personnel and at least 25 other people to the basement as a precautionary measure when notified by military police of a possible funnel cloud at Martin and Patton Roads. They remained in the basement about an hour and a half until the weather bureau said the weather had cleared.


Most of the hospital's military staff members were already at the hospital when Pearson declared a mass casualty situation at 5:35 p.m. "And we had a tremendous response from our civilian folks, they came back voluntarily to help. That's a very gratifying response," he said.

# Honorees say other Army families just as deserving

Redstone's "Great American Family" consists of an Army lawyer whose wife is a full-time college student and their three sons.

Maj. Greg and Cathy Taylor, chosen as the 1989 Great American Family Award recipients for the Missile Command, will represent MICOM in the Department of Army selection process. They came to Redstone in June 1987.

From 1978-81, Taylor served as a volunteer coach for soccer and track at the U.S. Military Academy Prep School at Fort Monmouth, N.J. A native of Great Britain, he had played for the nationally-ranked soccer team at the University of Connecticut while in college.

He coached soccer for under 6-year-olds and the under-16 post team at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., from 1981-84. At the Kwajalein Islands from 1985-87, Taylor coached high school soccer, refereed, and coached and played on an All-Star team that played visiting teams. When Taylor, deputy staff judge advocate, comes home from work, she goes back to school at night.

## Police, fire personnel assist

Several soldiers from the 832nd Ordnance Battalion at Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School unloaded two trucks of clothing and food supplies from Birmingham south on Friday evening. The items were to be distributed to churches, according to Ed O'tman, mobilization officer and public affairs officer for OMMCS.

## st tornado effort

unrestricted public access continued through Friday as cleanup activities kept the Parkway blocked.

For a while Wednesday night, the arsenal was without power and civilian drivers in the dark on unfamiliar roads found their way off post by following the cars ahead of them. Normal restrictions on public access were put back into effect Friday at 8 p.m.

Twenty-one Redstone firefighters were dispatched to the tornado scene and worked all night extricating victims from crushed cars, hand-digging for bodies and survivors in the rubble of shattered buildings, moving downed power lines and putting out small fires started by cutting torches used to carve up twisted steel beams and girders.



# Safety can keep holiday cheer from turning into tragedy

Decorating a Christmas tree, lighting scented holiday candles and dressing up the front door are all part of the magic of Christmas. But a little caution in decking the halls can keep friends and loved ones from tragedy.

Last year, the Consumer Product Safety Commission estimated that more than 4,000 persons were treated in hospital emergency rooms for injuries related to Christmas tree lights and non-electric Christmas decorations.

Allan Zenowitz, chairman of the DoD Fire Protection Committee, stressed the importance of buying quality decorations, both for safety and lasting value. Buy light sets that have been certified safe by Underwriters Laboratory (UL) or Factory Mutual (FM).

If you are using lights purchased in a previous year, Zenowitz suggested getting them out and testing them early to make sure wires are not dried and mangled and all of the bulbs work. That way, you'll have time to replace them if necessary.

If you live on base and plan to purchase a live tree, make sure it is permitted. Some installations prohibit live trees.

The fresher the real tree, the safer and prettier. Safety experts suggest buying the tree early and placing it in a stable, waterholding stand as soon as possible.

Before putting the tree in water, cut about two inches off the trunk — at an angle if your stand will permit. An angle cut allows maximum water absorption.

Place the tree away from fireplaces and heat sources, and make sure it does not block the room's traffic pattern or doorway.

Provide substantial support for the tree, whether real or artificial.

If you're buying an artificial tree, look for a label stating it's been tested for flammability. Read the safety instructions that come with the tree. Metallic trees bear warnings to use colored spotlights rather than string lights, for example.

If you're using an extension cord, make sure it's in good condition and don't overload it. Place it where no one will trip over it.

Don't permit smoking near the tree or wrappings.

Supervise young children and young pets near the tree. Teach children to care for it safely.



Janette Smith, the hospital's automation management officer, happened to be one of those in the wrong place at the wrong time. She and her husband, Hubert, who works in the Information Systems Command at Redstone, were at Crestwood Hospital visiting a patient who had had surgery. They were in the woman's third floor room when the tornado hit. "We started hearing the rumbles, like a train," Smith said. "My husband and the husband of the lady we were seeing pushed me into the bathroom.

"It just rumbled and got louder and louder," she said. "The nursing staff at Crestwood, they were just wonderful. They had us lay down in the hallway and cover our heads."

Crestwood Hospital sustained damage to its roof, windows were shattered, and the ground in front of the hospital was littered with debris. Like other cars in the parking lot, the Smiths' car was totally disabled. They had to wait in line for a telephone, but were finally able to contact their twin daughters at 7:30 p.m. Sandra and Sharon, 17, were in a beauty shop when the storm hit.

"It was a nerve-racking experience, I don't ever want to do that again," Smith said.

Christana Hudson, NCO-in-charge of the ambulance section at Fox Hospital, usually gets off work at 3 p.m. and stays around a while in case she's needed. This time she was needed. "I just started calling them in — my ambulance drivers and medics. By the time I hung up the phone, it seemed like they were here," Hudson recalled.

Sgt. William Steward, advanced medical NCO and emergency medical technician, was in the hospital's first unit on the scene. "It was worse than I thought it would be, I thought it would be a lot of motor vehicle

accidents," he said. "You could see the destruction — buildings demolished, cars overturned."

They transported two women and a man to Huntsville Hospital where one of the women died. "She had massive blunt trauma to the chest," Steward said, adding that she was not wearing a seatbelt when she struck the steering wheel of her car.

"There were people walking over those power lines which I thought was the dumbest thing in the world," he said. "You could still hear them (the lines) crackling. These were innocent bystanders trying to help. They meant well but they did not know just how hazardous it was."

Maj. Arturo Sala, the hospital's operating room supervisor, was in McDonald's eating a meal with his two children when the storm struck. The McDonald's is located at the intersection of Whitesburg and Airport Roads. "I was in the middle of the whole thing," Sala said.

"The thing that is most impressive is the sound. I heard like a very distant rumble," he said. "It sounded just like a freight train. It kept intensifying."

He yelled for everyone to get away from the windows, and the approximately 20 people in the fast-food outlet got on the floor. "As soon as the thing hit, the windows began to break. We were being sprayed by little pieces," Sala said. "The other thing that was real impressive was things hitting the side of the building. I thought it was hail. That was a constant spraying. My car is full of pebbles inside."

The roof of McDonald's was damaged, but no injuries to the occupants were reported. Sala recalls seeing injured people, who appeared to be in shock, coming in from cars in the intersection.

"I tell you that's a day I will never forget in my life," he said. "That one is in my memory."

## Commanders play key role in family-care efforts

WASHINGTON — The Army policy governing family care planning is being clarified for commanders.

A recent revision of the family-care section in Army Regulation 600-20 authorizes commanders to delegate counseling responsibilities so long as they retain final approval, explained Chap. (Maj.) Jack Anderson in the Office of the Army's Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel.

"The change includes a comprehensive appendix of sample power of attorney, guardian-acceptance certificates and letters of instruction to local and long-term guardians," Anderson said. "The regulation now contains reworked DA Forms 5304-R (Family Care Plan Counseling Checklist) and 5305-R (Family Care Plan).

"This change also stresses that commanders con-

sider separating soldiers who are unable to comply with the clearly defined family-care requirements," Anderson added. "So much so that it provides tables that identify the applicable separation regs."

In a recent message, Lt. Gen. Allen K. Ono, the Army's personnel chief, called on commanders to continue their efforts to assist soldiers in developing the most comprehensive plans possible to take care of their families.

"The effectiveness of family-care plans depends on command emphasis and on strict compliance with the family-care requirements by every soldier who is pregnant, a single parent or a dual military spouse," Anderson added. "Sound, viable family-care plans permit soldiers to feel confident that their family members will be well cared for if they're alerted for deployment or mobilization." (Arnews)

Winning posters will be used to broadcast competition initiatives to the Army Materiel Command community and the rest of the Army.


