New users wanted for test equipment

Reuse program part of phase-down process for Pershing project office at Redstone

A million dollar piece of test equipment used by Pershing project office is now available for reuse by other Army projects.

The automatic in-system calibration verification equipment has performed well for a Pershing unit in Germany. Since Pershing is being eliminated under arms reductions agreement, the project office encourages reuse of hardware such as this by other weapon systems.

"We have got a million dollar system developed by the Pershing project office and assisted by TMDE (Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment) Support Group," said Jim Orick, a logistics management specialist in system support division, Pershing project. "We have sent it to the field and it has proven to be excellent. We feel the world needs to know the system has been developed and fielded and it has done a fantastic job. And we would like to see it used by other Army activities."

The automatic in-system calibration verification equipment is used to verify the calibration of system component test station assemblies. These test stations in turn check the components of missile systems. The in-system verification equipment enables the user to check the test station on the spot with little down time. "This is a way we can check all the SCTS (system component test station) equipment in the mission environment," Orick said.

It is portable, roughly 2 feet square by 4 feet tall, and can be wheeled into position on its roll-around cart. Martin Marietta Missile System did the development for Pershing project office with assistance by TMDE Support Group. Development began in December 1986, and the equipment was delivered in 1988 to the 517th Maintenance Battalion (TMDE) and issued to the 56th Field Artillery Command (Pershing) in West Germany. The system has "significantly enhanced combat readiness of the command," stated a message from the 56th's commander. "It has provided capability to have calibration performed in garrison and field locations, regardless of environmental conditions."

CWO 4 Bob Schultz, a missile system technician in Pershing project office, was stationed with the 56th from 1985-88 before the equipment arrived. "All the people I've talked to, all the warrants, they loved it," he said.

With this equipment, a test process that formerly took eight hours takes only two and a half hours. "And that's man-hours, that doesn't count the weeks of shipping hours (saved)," said Bill McMahan, an electrical engineer in ground support division, Pershing project.

There is only one unit available for reuse, but the project office does have the tech data package with all the development information. Those interested in applying it to their system can call 876-1291/1292/1293.

"It's an excellent concept," McMahan said, "and I've talked with some of the people involved with it back when it was developed and the savings in manpower was really large and it's a simpler way to do business. It wouldn't be a difficult concept to implement in other systems."

The equipment is to be phased out in 1991 unless someone utilizes it, according to Orick. "It's our desire to promote this system Armywide. The development cost was borne by the Pershing project office and the hardware will be available to the activities that need this item," he said. "If this doesn't happen it just goes to the junkyard and everybody loses."

To encourage equipment reuse, the project office has adopted a slogan: "Modern equipment offered for free is cheaper than equipment offered for sale at any price."

"We feel like it (this test equipment) is applicable to any new system that's in the development or planned development stage," said Nolen Swinford, a logistics specialist in Pershing project. "All they'd have to do is change the adapters and software and use it."

Acquisition streamlining to bring changes in career paths

Redstone's military and civilian acquisition specialists had a chance last week to hear first-hand some of the changes in store for their career fields.

Col. John Bramblett, director of the Army Acquisition Management Support Agency, presented a briefing Jan. 23 entitled "The Army Acquisition Corps, A Change in Philosophy."

The creation of the Army Acquisition Corps is a result of the Defense Management Review, which required every branch of the armed services to streamline the acquisition process.

The AAC is to be an elite group of military and civilian acquisition specialists who have both experience and education in the procurement and/or use of weapons and associated items of equipment.

According to Bramblett, the AAC will, through a tightening of requirements for acquisition jobs and a centralized certification and assignment process, correct problems associated with the old Materiel Acquisition Management program and provide a larger pool of qualified workers to fill critical positions. Critical positions are defined as those which require specific amounts of experience and education.

"This will weave together military and civilian skills into one organization," he said.

Problems experienced by the Materiel Acquisition Management program included no identified critical or developmental positions, and a personnel pool which was insufficient in numbers and experience to support positions. Officers in the MAM field were required to follow dual track careers which resulted in little acquisition experience, and had to work in brigade or battalion commands in order to receive pro-

President's budget reduces force, cuts some weapons

WASHINGTON — The Army will deactivate two divisions, reduce its civilian workforce and terminate several weapons programs as its share of defense cuts announced Jan. 29 when President Bush sent his proposed FY91 federal budget to Congress.

The FY91 Army budget requests \$76.1 billion total obligation authority. It includes funding for a 3.5 percent pay raise for soldiers and civilian workers to be effective Jan. 1, 1991.

A statement issued by the Army said in part: "The Army in FY91 will be smaller, but well equipped, trained and ready. The Army leadership remains committed to sustained quality of life for soldiers and their families."

The Army said it will deactivate the 9th Infantry Division based at Fort Lewis, Wash., and the 2nd Armored Division based at Fort Hood, Texas. Planned reductions of civilian workers will be handled mainly through normal attrition with the least possible turbulence.

Although modernization of the force will continue, the Army said it will delay previously planned production of some programs — including the Non Line of Sight System managed at Redstone being developed by Boeing in Huntsville. Instead, NLOS will complete development but production decisions will be made at a later date.

Procurement of the most advanced version of the

Abrams tank, the M1A2, will be limited to 62 vehicles needed to prove out production techniques and complete testing. The Army plans to then layaway its tank production facilities. Funds are being sought to begin full scale engineering development of the new LHX helicopter and explore new technologies for modernization of Army heavy forces. That includes development of a kinetic energy anti tank missile (LOSAT) managed at Redstone.

Procurement of the Apache and AHIP helicopters will end with FY90. The Army will continue to buy Blackhawk helicopters and Bradley fighting vehicles in FY91.

The Jan. 24 issue of this newspaper carried a letter from a writer who stated he/she was a military supervisor of civilian workers. He/she complained of a lack of Army/MICOM regulations and guidance on how to deal with civilian workers and rate their performance.

MICOM regulation 690-2 covers all leave including sick leave.

MICOM regulation 690-25 covers discipline and insubordination.

MICOM regulation 690-10 covers performance standards and appraisals.

A supervisor is responsible for writing performance standards for the people he/she supervises.

Editor:

In reference to the military supervisor who does not understand how to rate civilian employees, there is a mandatory supervisors course that MICOM employees are required to take during their first year as a supervisor. This course can be scheduled through the CPO training office and will answer many questions regarding policies. As for the civilian rating system, it is

primarily job element specific in the rating areas, but there is room for comments in item 13 on the DA form 5398. The supervisor is responsible for ensuring that the rating elements are accurate and for correcting any deficiencies. As a DA civilian supervisor and an Army reserve officer with over 18 years, I am familiar with the military rating system. It leaves much to be desired when you consider that the average military ratings based on rank approach the perfect or walk-on-water level the higher the grade. Eventually, almost every soldier's EER or OER reads about the same as they are promoted to each higher level. A soldier's career or retention can be based on how well their supervisor can write, rather than how well they can perform their duties. The civilian ratings do not carry this full impact, but there are other methods of dealing with problem employees.

The relationship between most military and civilian employees is excellent and successful military supervisors realize the effectiveness of a combined team. I would suggest that the writer of this letter contact the Management Employee Relations Branch of CPO the next time there is a problem with subordinates and not spew sour grapes over the proposed budget/manpower cuts that may eventually impact all employees both military and civilian.

Reference the letter entitled "Performance Ratings" in the *Redstone Rocket* dated Jan. 24. It is apparent that the writer either chooses to not read or is very, very unfamiliar with the Army's Civilian Performance Plan (DA Form 5397) and the Civilian Performance Rating (DA Form 5398). Both are governed by Chapter 430, Army Regulation 690-400. If the performance standards are very vague, I then say to you, sir — shame on you! As a supervisor *you* are charged with the responsibility of ensuring the performance standards are accurate and must sign Part III- Authentica-

tion attesting to that fact each rating period. The same goes for the performance rating: *you* are the one doing the rating. A substandard performance deserves the appropriate rating (minimally acceptable/satisfactory or unacceptable/unsatisfactory). The system is in place regardless of the type of supervisor (military or civilian) and the regulations do exist. I suggest you seek assistance from the civilian personnel office in order that you may learn the correct way to complete performance plans and appraisals.

I am sorry you feel the way you do about federal civilians. We do work as hard and diligently as our military counterparts. Keep in mind that one day, you too may be a federal civilian! I have had experience on both sides of the coin (military and civilian).

Missile programs slated for procurement in FY91 include the Line of Sight Forward- Heavy (15 fire units and 220 missiles), Stinger (6,922 missiles); TOW-2 (13,284 missiles); Avenger (88 fire units); Patriot (817 missiles); MLRS (24,000 rockets); ATACMS (377 missiles) and Hellfire (3,002 missiles).

Funding is included for the development of the Advanced Anti Tank Missile System (AAWS-M), the Advanced Missile System-H (AMS-H) and the Follow on to Lance.

Procurement of the Chaparral missile system will terminate.

Many installations face budget ax

Major Army commands at Redstone and in Huntsville will continue to be unable to hire or promote workers and must get along with less travel and overtime but appear to have escaped being closed or reduced as others elsewhere will.

The impending changes were made known Jan. 29 as the Defense Department released its FY91 budget proposal and plans to live with reduced funds. They will take place over the next three years.

Defense Secretary Dick Cheney announced many military installations will be closed. Among them: Fort McClellan, Ala.; Fort Ord., Calif.; Sacramento Army Depot, Calif.; Troop Support Command Headquarters at St. Louis, both Army tank plants and seven ammunition plants.

Other Army installations and activities to be realigned or reduced include AMC Headquarters, Depot System Command Headquarters, Red River Army Depot, AMC Management Engineering Activity, Information Systems Command and the following forts: Knox, Gillem, Hood, Lewis, Sheridan, Meade and Sam Houston.

The Army plans to inactivate the 2nd Armored Division at Fort Hood, move the 7th Infantry Division from Ord to Lewis and downsize the 9th Infantry Division there to a brigade to accommodate cuts of 20,000 soldiers in FY90 and 16,500 more in FY91.

AMC Headquarters is scheduled to lose 270 civilians and 40 soldiers by 1994.

The Management Engineering Activity, based in Huntsville, has about 300 civilian workers assigned. Most are based with AMC commodity commands elsewhere in the country. About 130 are now working

at Huntsville. The organization's personnel are to be reduced by 190 over four years.

Newsmen attending a Pentagon briefing were told that as a result of changes being made to the Army weapons acquisition system the Army plans to reduce by 10,245, the 124,000 civilians now involved in that process and about 750 of the 4,400 soldiers. Up to 80 percent of the civilian cuts will come from the Army Materiel Command and its major commodity commands — including MICOM — which have most of the personnel involved in acquisition. AMC now has about 107,000 civilians and 8,200 soldiers assigned.

The Army said the cuts would be taken through attrition when possible. Everything will be done to avoid outright layoffs.

Just how those reductions will play out at bases such as Redstone are not yet known, Army spokesmen said, (See Ax, cont'd on page 4)

Redstone worker Solomon Greene dies

Solomon H. Greene, an education coordinator at the Community Counseling Center, died from a heart attack Jan. 19 in Montgomery. He was 58.

Greene, who was blind, started working for the government in 1968. The funeral was held Jan. 24 in Montgomery. A memorial service will be held 7 p.m. Thursday at St. Joseph's Catholic Community, 2300 Beasley Ave. in northwest Huntsville. Beasley Avenue is three blocks south of University Drive on Pulaski Pike.

Survivors include his wife, Louise B. Greene of Montgomery; a son, Solomon H. Greene III of Montgomery; and a daughter, Sandia Greene of Montgomery.

Greene attended public schools in Tuskegee then two years at the School for the Blind in Talladega. He completed Tuskegee High and Tuskegee Institute with honors. "He found out he was blind in elementary school then they sent him to the school for the blind and then he came back and finished high school and

college with honors," said family friend Juanita Sales, an attorney in the Missile Command Legal Office.

On scholarship at Tuskegee Institute, Greene earned a bachelor's degree in social science. He received a scholarship to attend Howard University in Washington, D.C., on the graduate level and earned a master's degree there in sociology.

In 1968, Greene began working with the Anniston Army Depot as a computer programmer. Later he transferred to Redstone Arsenal as coordinator for alcohol and drug abuse awareness.

Organizations Greene was associated with included Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Knights of Peter Claver (a Catholic group), the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, National Federation of the Blind, Transportation Board of Huntsville, Tuskegee Alumni Club, the Alabama Democratic Party, St. Joseph's Catholic Community, and St. Jude Catholic Church in Montgomery.

Panama action successful because of quality soldiers

The Panama action was successful because of the quality of U.S. soldiers, Secretary of the Army Michael P.W. Stone said when he visited Redstone last week.

"They're the brightest and best in the United States," was how Stone characterized the Army's fighting force.

Stone was guest speaker at the Association of the United States Army, Redstone-Huntsville Chapter's general membership dinner on Wednesday at the Officers Club.

He told a group of some 430 guests, who included some of Redstone's top weapon system managers, that the Panama operation was executed as precisely as it could have been.

"The operation clearly demonstrates the professionalism of our military capability," Stone said.

Stone described how soldiers flew aboard airplanes for five hours, after sitting cramped inside the aircraft for as long as two hours prior to take-off, how they dropped from 500 feet into the darkness of unknown territory, to link up with forces on the ground.

He commended the helicopter crews who flew without benefit of air traffic controllers, yet were able to successfully complete night missions aided by night

vision goggles, landing on buildings no larger than Redstone's Officers Club.

After 48 hours, all resistance disappeared, Stone said, with all the Panamanian Defense Force having been captured or taken off their uniforms.

This, he said, was one of the factors that contributed to the numbers of injuries incurred among the civilian population, because American troops didn't know if they were facing civilians or Panamanian military in disguise. It was not until someone in the group threw a hand grenade that troops knew what they were dealing with, Stone said.

The equipment news from Panama was good, according to Stone.

"We had no reports of equipment malfunctions. Everything worked well and the soldiers were pleased with it," he said.

Stone said the only thing that didn't go well in Panama was press relations, mentioning the 600 radio, television and newspaper reporters there, all looking for stories from soldiers who were trying to do their jobs.

He praised female soldiers who make up 10 percent of Army servicemembers, saying, "they do a remarkable job and the Army couldn't operate without them."

Stone read excerpts of a letter a Panamanian woman sent to an Army commander in which she expressed thanks on behalf of the Panamanian people for the U.S. soldiers who invaded Panama for the cause of "peace and democracy."

Tour restrictions eased in Panama

WASHINGTON — Easing tensions in Panama in the aftermath of Operation Just Cause have prompted Defense Department officials to hike tour lengths for duty in Panama.

In addition, Army personnel officials announced Jan. 24 that restrictions on family member travel to Panama will be lifted March 1.

Slated to take effect June 1, tours in Panama will last 36 months for accompanied soldiers and 24 months for those on unaccompanied assignments. In November, mounting unease in the region prompted DoD officials to reduce tours in Panama to 24 months accompanied and 12 months unaccompanied and to classify Panama as a dependent-restricted tour area. Soviet inspectors have on-site visit

A Soviet Inspection Team conducted a Pershing elimination inspection at Redstone Arsenal on Friday.

The inspection team arrived at 2:40 p.m. by C-141 aircraft accompanied by personnel from the On-Site Inspection Agency (OSIA). The team departed at 4:30 that afternoon.

Purpose of the inspection was to confirm elimination of a Pershing II launcher and a training missile under the Treaty on Intermediate Range Nuclear Forces. This equipment will be turned over to the Alabama Space and Rocket Center for permanent display.

New office complex gets Stone's OK

MICOM's plans to build a new office complex with third party financing got a major boost last week when the Secretary of the Army gave the project his personal endorsement.

"I will support it and expect we will go ahead with it," Michael Stone told an AUSA dinner audience at the Officers Club Jan. 24.

The secretary's endorsement of the project intended to provide new office and administrative space for 4,000 MICOM workers came on the same day the Secretary of Defense ordered a 90 day freeze on the start of new military construction projects.

Stone said he found the plan to let industry build the Sparkman Center and lease it back to the Army in keeping with Defense Secretary Cheney's intent.

"This project will not be financed with government funds," Stone said. The way it will be built, "is exactly the way to go."

Cheney's order to hold off awarding new military construction contracts until the end of April is not expected to have a major impact on other construction planned here.

MICOM has authorization to begin work on a proposed \$17.5 million, 175,000 square foot addition to the McMorrow Lab this year. It will house the Systems Engineering Directorate. Also planned to begin this year is a \$900 thousand, 10,000 square foot addition to the Redstone Scientific Information Center.

Neither of those projects was scheduled to be contracted prior to May 1.

Quality of force to be maintained

The Army will be smaller as defense spending is reduced but adverse impacts at Redstone and in Huntsville will be less than elsewhere, the Secretary of the Army said last week.

Michael Stone told an AUSA dinner audience in the Officers Club Jan. 24 that activities here will have a major future role because a smaller Army will continue to need the high tech weapons and equipment developed and managed here.

Unable to discuss detailed impacts — government officials were directed not to discuss details of the President's proposed FY91 budget until it went to Congress this week — Stone said that beginning with the new fiscal year, he expects the Army to shrink over the next four or five years as a result of reduced defense funding.

He said Army leaders are agreed that the way to do that is reduce the size of the Army while maintaining quality of the force, quality of life, training and modernization.

"If I must chose between size and maintaining a quality Army, I will reduce the force," he said. "We are not going back to a hollow Army."

Among the things smaller Army must have, Stone said, are systems such as MLRS and ATACMS that make it possible "to go deep and attack at long range." Later he told reporters air defense and a man portable anti tank weapon (AAWS-M) will also get priority. One air defense system, the non-line of sight system being developed by Boeing in Huntsville and Hughes Aircraft will continue in engineering development, but will probably not be produced as soon as the Army originally planned, Stone indicated.

The Secretary discussed changes in the acquisition process at breakfast Jan. 25 with project and program managers and visited the Missile Research, Development and Engineering Center and the Missile Logistics Center before returning to Washington.

What new defense budget means for soldiers

Most soldiers stationed at Redstone will probably notice little difference, if any, in their military lifestyles under planned cutbacks of the FY '91 military budget.

According to a news release issued by the Army Jan. 27, soldiers serving in units slated for drawdown or relocation will feel the most effect from proposed budget cuts.

The following is from the body of the release, as it affects military personnel.

"The Army will continue to promote its best soldiers; NCOs and officers will attend leader development schools at appropriate points in their careers; and soldiers and their families will enjoy an uninterrupted quality of life.

"Officer strength reductions will be applied across the entire spectrum of the officer corps. Accessions will be reduced, senior retirement-eligible officers will be selected for early retirement and selected overstrength year groups will be quantitatively reduced by formal board action. Voluntary separations, resignations and retirements will be encouraged to the maximum extent possible through policy and procedural changes. Reductions will be implemented in a balanced manner by year group, competitive category branch, special skills, functional area and grade."

Although reductions will be made through voluntary means whenever possible, involuntary reduction-in-force procedures will be used when necessary to ensure that current and future requirements are met, according to the release. Reductions, both voluntary and involuntary, will be based on the realigned force structure and readiness needs.

The release also states that officer promotion boards will continue to be held throughout FY '91, and officer promotion rates are expected to remain relatively stable throughout the year.

The figure for planned enlisted accessions is 95,520,

a drop of 1,880, or two percent, from 1990. This is not considered a significant reduction, according to the DA release. Promotions for the enlisted ranks are also expected to remain relatively stable, with a full

schedule of centralized promotion boards planned. No early out program is anticipated for FY '91, and tour length and permanent change of station policies are expected to remain the same.

because studies under way involve consolidating activities and functions but final decisions have not yet been made. Among those discussed with the press that may involve Army activities at Redstone and in Huntsville:

- An effort to "streamline" the Army's laboratory structure and possibly consolidate some activities.
- An effort to consolidate Army test and evaluation activities.
- Consolidation of Army TMDE by consolidating the TMDE Support Group at Redstone, the project manager, TMDE, at Fort Monmouth and other func-

tions being carried on at Lexington Army Depot and AMC headquarters.

- Consolidation of some Information System Command operations.
- Several efforts intended to consolidate and improve Army logistics operations.
- A study on improving civilian personnel administration by consolidating area offices.

The tank plants scheduled to close are at Detroit and Lima, Ohio. Army ammo plants to be laid away include: Mississippi at Picayunne; Longhorn at Carnack, Texas; Indiana at Charlestown; Kansas at Parsons; Louisiana at Minden and Sunflower at DeSoto, Kan.

Soldier demoted for missed transfer


A Redstone soldier has been sentenced to a one-grade reduction and forfeiture of part of his monthly pay for refusing to make a permanent change of station move.


Sandifur, who has 14 years of active duty service,

SDC conducts successful kinetic kill vehicle test

WHITE SANDS MISSILE RANGE, N.M. — The U.S. Army Strategic Defense Command successfully conducted the first Kinetic Kill Vehicle Integrated Technology Experiment (KITE) flight test Friday, validating the design of a nose cone shroud and on-board seeker window to withstand the intense heat generated by the high velocity launch.

The KITE test is part of the High Endoatmospheric Defense Interceptor (HEDI) project being conducted by the Army for the Strategic Defense Initiative.

"The test, which lasted only 8 seconds before its self-destruct mechanism fired prematurely, was 90-to-95 percent successful," Alan Sherer, HEDI project manager, said at a press conference following the firing. "All the critical test functions worked perfectly during the flight: the shroud came off clean and didn't impinge on the rest of the missile, cooling initiated as planned and the instrumentation provided the needed data on the shock load on the forebody and seeker window."

"We don't yet know why the self-destruction mechanism fired before kill vehicle separation, shortening the test from a planned 14 seconds by nearly half, but we're going to find out. Fortunately, all the critical elements of this first test were accomplished in the early part of the flight."

The test vehicle uses a self-destruct mechanism to prevent the KITE vehicle from flying beyond the White Sands Missile Range boundaries.

The experimental kill vehicle was launched by a SPRINT propulsion system that accelerated at the rate of 1.5 to 2 miles per second, resulting in vehicle temperatures approaching that of a rocket's exhaust. Ability to protect the kill vehicle with a shroud during launch and to successfully cool down a window in the nose cone so that an onboard seeker on future tests can function posed the critical technological challenges on this first mission.

The purpose of endoatmospheric (within the at-

mosphere) interceptors such as HEDI is to take advantage of the atmosphere to provide the discrimination between reentry vehicles and other objects such as decoys that may be designed to confuse the interceptor.

This series of KITE tests is designed to demonstrate that the necessary technologies are in hand to perform

the intercept and non-nuclear destruction of ICBM reentry vehicles within atmosphere. Operating at lower altitudes, the HEDI interceptor can take advantage of the atmosphere to aid the discrimination between reentry vehicles and other objects such as decoys that may be designed to confuse the interceptor.

These tests will lead to Functional Technology Validation testing of the HEDI project technology at U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll in the Central Pacific against a ballistic missile target. HEDI's high velocity and maneuvering capabilities make it a prime candidate for inclusion in the terminal tier of a strategic defense system.

The HEDI project is managed from U.S. Army Strategic Defense Command offices in Huntsville.

Military families can be paid for medical-related travel

In the past when an active duty soldier or family member of an active duty soldier had to be medically evacuated from their home post to a major medical center several hundred miles away for complex specialized care, the family had to foot the bill for several unplanned things.

They would have to pay the extra for temporary housing and food for the attending family member. And of course, all the time which might be weeks or even months, they are still having to maintain the home back at their appointed duty station. Often times, children are even left behind with sitters which adds even more expense. In addition, if the attending member is active duty, he or she would also have to use up accrued leave.

Well, not anymore. In April of last year, the Army found a way to prevent this type of financial hardship from happening to active duty Army families.

Chapter 7 of the Joint Federal Travel Regulation authorizes temporary duty orders to servicemembers accompanying a family member who is ill, or a family member accompanying an ill soldier. This is in addition to the regular base pay and is designed to prevent this type of financial hardship.


Judy McFerrin from Resource Management Division at Eisenhower Army Health Service Regional Headquarters, Fort Gordon, Ga., states that since April 1989, funding has been made available for servicemembers and/or their family members coming from overseas and continental U.S. locations to military medical treatment facilities for care.

However, McFerrin states, the orders should be cut prior to the soldier leaving his duty station. "They need to fill out a DD 1610 for TDY, have their supervisor sign it and take it to MILPO prior to leaving. Advanced funding is available only if the person is on non-medical attendant TDY orders. They can get the advanced funds at their duty station or if there isn't enough time, then they can get them at the post military personnel office where the hospital is located."

McFerrin said the funds come out of a special fund, that no ones unit will be charged. The orders are good for up to 179 days. They only require a doctor's recertification every 30 days to continue them.

The only difference between non-medical attendant orders for servicemembers and those for family

members is that the servicemember is given regular TDY funding and files a voucher when he returns to his home base. On the other hand, the family member is only reimbursed for actual expenses and must settle every five to seven days for a new advance. Savings bond tax break available for college expenses

A new savings bonds program gives some taxpayers a break if they use the revenues to pay for higher education, say officials at the U.S. Army Finance and Accounting Center, Indianapolis, Ind.

Under the Education Savings Bond Program, qualified taxpayers won't have to claim as income all or some of the interest they earn on Series EE bonds issued after Dec. 31, 1989, if they use both principal and interest to pay tuition and other education expenses for themselves, their spouses or dependents.

The following may answer some of your questions:
Q. What educational expenses qualify?

A. Tuition and others, such as lab fees and required course expenses necessary for enrollment in or attendance at an eligible educational institution. But, expenses relating to any course or other education involving sports, games or hobbies are eligible only if they are required as part of a degree or certificate granting program. Room and board are not considered eligible expenses. Expenses are calculated net of scholarships, fellowships, employer-provided educational assistance and other tuition reduction amounts and must be incurred during the same tax year in the bonds whose interest is being excluded are redeemed.

Q. What qualifies as an eligible educational institution?

A. Post-secondary institutions, including vocational schools, that meet the standards for participation in federal financial aid programs, such as guaranteed student loan programs, qualify for the program. Proprietary institutions, such as beautician or secretarial schools, generally don't qualify.

Q. Can outstanding bonds be used in this program?

A. No. The program went into effect on Jan. 1, 1990.

Q. Can anyone purchase these bonds and take advantage of the exclusion?

A. No. Only bonds issued to a person at least 24 years old before the bonds are issued will generate excludable interest. In most cases, a taxpayer will have to

be 24 years old before the first day of the month in which the taxpayer purchases the bond because bonds are issued as of the first day of the month in which purchased.

Q. What if the amount of the bond redemption proceeds exceeds the amount spent on qualified educational expenses.

A. If the amount of the redemption proceeds from all eligible bonds redeemed during the year is more than the amount spent on qualified educational expenses, the amount of excludable interest will be reduced by a pro rata amount. For example, if the bond proceeds amount to \$10,000, \$5,000 in principal and \$5,000 in interest, and if the qualified educational expenses amount to \$8,000, the taxpayer would only be able to get an exclusion for 80 percent of the interest earned, or \$4,000.

Q. What income limitations apply to the program?

A. The full interest exclusion is only available for married couples filing joint returns whose modified adjusted gross income equals \$60,000 or less. For single taxpayers, that figure is \$40,000. Above these amounts, the percentage of the amount of interest exclusion decreases as the amount of modified AGI increases. For example, taxpayers filing jointly with a modified AGI of \$75,000 would only be able to take

advantage of one half of the exclusion, and taxpayers filing jointly with a modified AGI of \$80,000 would be allowed only an exclusion of one third of the eligible interest income. A similar phase down will be applied to the single filer. The phase-out for married couples filing joint returns amounts to \$90,000 modified AGI, and for singles, \$55,000 modified AGI. Married couples filing separately will not be able to take advantage of the program regardless of their incomes.

Q. Will these income limits be adjusted for inflation?

A. Yes. After 1990 these income limits will be indexed for inflation and then rounded to the nearest multiple of \$50. (Arnews)



motions. Accession was strictly voluntary, at any year of service.

Bramblett pointed out that Public Law 99-145 requires program managers of major programs to have at least eight years of acquisition experience, including two years in a procurement command. Major program managers must also have completed the Procurement Management Course at the Defense Systems Management College.

Deputy program managers, functional chiefs, and managers of non-major programs have the same educational requirement, but need only three years of acquisition experience. These requirements are outlined in draft DoD manual 5000.52, Bramblett said.

The MAM system of certifying officers for acquisition positions did not adhere to the law and DoD directive.

Army officers can volunteer or will be selected for the corps when they are at the rank of captain, after they have been assigned a functional area, but no later than the eighth year of service. Civilians can volunteer for the program at the grade of GS/GM-13. The plan calls for a pool of 3,000 officers. Captains and majors will receive advanced civil schooling, if necessary, and then will be placed in developmental positions. Civilians can be placed in developmental positions until certified to compete for critical positions. A number for the civilian pool has not yet been established, according to Bramblett.

Eligible to volunteer for the corps are officers in functional areas 51, 52, 53, 97 and 15/35. Civilians in the career fields of general management, finance, logistics, non-civil engineering/science, automatic data processing and contracting are also eligible to volunteer.

If those people who apply for the program do not yet possess the experience and educational requirements, they will be identified as candidates and will be given an opportunity to attend DSMC within two years.

Civilians who are certified as eligible for critical positions will compete for the positions only with other certified candidates, and if they enter the program, must sign mobility agreements.

Although military members of the corps will retain branch affiliations, selection effectively means they will have single-track careers, and are locked in to the acquisition field. Any civil schooling deemed necessary for their careers will be 100 percent Army-funded. Ad-

ditionally, officers selected for AAC will compete for project/program manager positions and will not be allowed to compete for battalion/brigade commands.

So far, a total of 359 military and 964 civilian critical positions have been identified. The military positions are for the ranks of lieutenant colonel and colonel. Civilian positions are grades GM-14 and above. General officers and senior executive service members are not covered by the plan.

Redstone deer largest killed in state with bow

It took almost nine years to be officially recognized. But when the 1991 edition of "Alabama Whitetail Records" is published, it will list a deer killed on Redstone Arsenal as the largest ever killed with a bow in the state of Alabama (non-typical whitetail category).

Weighing 240 pounds, the 17 point buck was taken in 1979 by then Maj., now Lt. Col. Don Kern, director of the munitions training department at Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School.

A recent official measurement by Pope and Young official Ed Jones put the deer on top in the record book, according to Kern. Pope and Young are the official record book measurement officials for bow kills worldwide.

Kern's deer scored 162 points, calculated by measuring antler circumference at the base of the skull, length and breadth of the rack, etc. The former record for a deer in the non-typical category killed with a bow in Alabama was 153 points. The two categories of whitetail deer for record book purposes are non-typical and typical. The average size of deer killed this year at Redstone is 100 pounds, Kern said.

Kern related the story of how he came to kill what he calls his "monster" deer, referred to as such because of its large size.

"I hunted this deer for almost three years. I saw the big buck almost every time I went into the area by boat to duck hunt, but never when I went into the area by land. The only thing I could guess was that the buck was so used to seeing and hearing duck hunters come into the area that he associated no danger with me," Kern said.

"On the last day of the 1979 hunting season, I finally got my chance. I went into the area by boat and after pulling up on a little island in the water and waiting about 30 minutes, this big buck came out of the shadows to sun himself," he recalled.

"If you could have seen the size of that deer standing there, you would not have believed it. After having taken a few of the normal sized deer on the Arsenal, this deer looked to be the size of a cow."

Kern shot the deer from a distance of 25 yards. The interesting thing about the deer is that it took almost nine years to be recognized as a record, Kern said. He

got orders for Germany shortly after killing the deer and left it to be mounted.

"It was three years later before I even got to see the (mounted) deer," said Kern, now serving his third tour at Redstone.

After returning to Redstone last year, Kern was contacted by measurer Ed Jones, who had heard of the deer and wanted to see it.

"Jones measured the deer, and about three months ago we found out that the Arsenal had a state record," Kern said.

Space-age robot serves as training and recruiting tool

The robot moves forward and talks in a mechanical sounding voice. It turns around and extends its arm to carefully lift an item from the floor.

Hero 2000 doesn't look like the robot you see in science fiction movies, but it does serve the purpose. It's used as a training aid in the electronics technology and training department at the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School.

"The robot is used to teach the instructors here at Redstone robotics fundamentals," said SFC Angelo Perez, radar team NCO-in-charge. "The reason is, in the future they expect to have even more robotics items. Right now the only robot they actually have doing a function here on post is the Explosive Ordnance Disposal robot."


The Army uses robots, in roles such as bomb disposal, to perform tasks that would endanger a human. The school here provides robotics fundamentals that can then be applied to specific systems. "We try to keep it as generic as possible," said Steven Stocks, the laser specialist in the advanced technology team. "Then they can learn what each particular robot does on their particular system."

Hero 2000 is also used for recruiting and community awareness. It's taken on tours for the recruiting command, and on visits to high schools. "One of the main reasons the robot goes out on tour is it's an eye catcher," said Jerry Andress, chief of the transistor team. He coordinates the tours for the robot. "It's not only to high schools," Andress said. "It's gone out here in town to grade schools. Mainly he goes on tour here to grade schools as a sort of a community awareness thing; to let the children know yes the military is here and no we are not scary."

The recruiting tours are nationwide, mainly in the eastern part of the United States. "In a year we'll probably get anywhere from seven to 12 requests from recruiting commands," Andress said. "If they pay for us to get him there, we'll try to get him there."

Perez, whose actual military specialty is land combat support, is the resident robotics expert. He programs the robot and takes it on the various tours.

"In the last 12 months I've spent 10 or 12 weeks in high schools," Perez said. "It normally boils down to visiting a different high school every day and talking to anywhere from 200 to 1500 kids per day. The kids basically think it's a neat toy. They all want to play with it; they all ask specific questions about it."

Hero 2000 is a Heathkit Corp. product that costs about \$5,000. It arrived about three years ago in kit form and the people in the department put it together. The robot stands about 38 inches tall, 26 inches wide, about 28 inches deep from front to rear, and weighs 78 pounds. "I know (the weight), I've picked him up enough times," Perez said. "It weighs 167 in the box."

A rotating scanner on its top serves as a range finder; it can measure distances to an accuracy of half

an inch. It can detect light, hear sounds, and pick up objects that weigh less than a pound. "He can talk although he does sound exactly like you'd expect a robot to sound," Perez said.

"Basically what it consists of is an IBM compatible computer inside a chassis that's mounted on wheels," he said.

That apparently suits the instructors, Army recruiters, and some wide-eyed school children just fine.

Club being organized for all Redstone runners

A former collegiate steeplechase champion is organizing a running club for Redstone military and civilian people of all levels of ability.

2nd Lt. Dan Peterson says the Redstone Runners Club is open to anyone associated with the arsenal, including family members. The first meeting will be held 10 a.m. Feb. 10 at Pagano gym, after that morning's Brotherhood Run 10K.

"There isn't a (runners) club on the post and I'm a pretty avid runner, and there are a lot of other interested runners on post. It's nice to have an organization," said Peterson, executive officer for B Company, 832nd Ordnance Battalion.

Advantages he sees in having a runners club include the social aspect, promoting physical fitness, information on running and upcoming races, and a mechanism for sponsoring races. "There'll be opportunities for competition but the main things are social and physical fitness," Peterson said. "Most people don't like to run alone. I know I don't. I like to be in a group and run with other people. If you're in a club, you're going to learn about running; if you've had problems somebody else might have had, you can learn from them. You can get a lot of good information: what

kind of shoes to wear, how to train. I've been running a long time but I don't claim to know it all."

Others involved in organizing the club include Lt. Col. Fred Ledfors, deputy director of Intelligence and Security Directorate; Sgt. Dale Meskimen, administrative assistant and driver for the commanding general; and Capt. Robert Best, commander of B Company, 832nd.

Peterson, 23, is from Kenosha, Wis., where he started running competitively in 1983 near the end of his junior year at Tremper High School. He ran the 300 meter hurdles and about every other event except the sprints. He was captain of both the track and cross country teams, and qualified for state in track. Peterson went on to compete for the University of Wisconsin at Parkside where he still holds the school record for the 3000 meter steeplechase (9 minutes and 2 seconds) and 2000 steeplechase (5:51). In the summer of 1984, he was Junior Olympic national champion in the 2000 meter steeplechase. He competed in the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) national championships 3000 meter steeplechase in 1985, '86, '88 and '89. In 1989, he made All-American at the NAIA nationals by taking fourth place. He went on active duty after graduating last May.

"The Army promotes physical fitness, that's one thing I've always liked about the Army," said Peterson, who plans to compete in the 3000 steeplechase for the All-Army team in April.

He ran his first marathon, Huntsville's Rocket City, last December and completed the 26.2-mile distance in a respectable 3 hours and 11 seconds. His personal best for 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) is 31 minutes and 4 seconds.

"Running's good stress relief for me," Peterson said. Anyone interested in the new running club can call him at 876-2598.

Last year's communitywide effort identified 94 issues, according to Sue Paddock, action officer for the event.


The symposium will be conducted in much the same way as those in past years, with several work groups made up of 100 delegates.
