Volunteers of year get satisfaction from serving others

Five people will receive Volunteer of the Year awards for their voluntary efforts at Redstone Arsenal.

The honorees include Ellie Lee, 1990-91 Volunteer of the Year winner for community service involvement (project or event); Leah Amato, winner for community service involvement (agency or organization); Mary Moreillon, winner for military community sustained service; Brandon Parker, winner for Redstone Arsenal military community sustained service; and Vicky Martin, winner for youth service involvement.

Redstone Arsenal Volunteer Recognition Luncheon will be held April 22 at the Challenger NCO Club. Registration begins at 11 a.m., and the luncheon at 11:30. This event is being held in conjunction with National Volunteer Week, April 21-27.

"The five category winners will be honored at the downtown Huntsville-Madison County Volunteer of the Year ceremony held on the evening of 22 April at the Trinity Methodist Church on Airport Road at 7 p.m.," said Sue Paddock, the installation volunteer coordinator.

There were 12 nominees this year for Redstone Arsenal volunteer awards. The other nominees included Mary Beckwith, Dorothea Green, William Kerlin, Florinda Lopez, Margaret McBrearty, Yvonne Quantock and Fran Tyra.

Lee serves as coordinator for the Chaplains' Family Support Group for families of servicemembers deployed for Operation Desert Storm. She recalls how this volunteer effort began. "In August, the first people that left Redstone Arsenal were from the 832nd Ordnance Battalion which is my husband's battalion. During the first briefing with the families and soldiers who were leaving the next day, I realized that the family members were going to need support immediately," Lee said.

She noticed that the wives remained silent during the briefing, and suspected that they just didn't want their husbands' or their husbands' superiors to know the anxiety they were feeling. She asked for five minutes alone with the spouses, and the soldiers went out into the hall. For about half an hour, the family members opened up to her.

"Well I think the first thing that I said to them was I couldn't believe they didn't have any questions and weren't scared about what was happening; and I told them I understood their feelings and that I would be there to help them and that they weren't going to be

left alone. And they talked and they had questions," Lee recalled. Everyone in that closed session, including Lee, cried or at least had tears in their eyes.

That night, as the people were leaving the briefing, she told Chaplain (Capt.) Gary Bragg and Chaplain (Maj.) David McLean that a family support group was needed. They offered to help anyway they could. The first meeting of the Chaplains' Family Support Group was held about four days later, on Monday night, Aug. 13. Twelve family members attended. The group continued to meet every other Monday night until the war started, when it began meeting every Monday night. The group held a special meeting on Jan. 16, the night the air war started. Thirty families came to the Post Chapel, and about 12 stayed the entire night. Volunteers contacted each of the families on the group's roster which, at that time, consisted of about 70 families. Army Community Service provided pillows and blankets for the families who spent the night. The families had dinner there and watched events develop on television.

"There's now 178 families on the roster. Oh, this thing grew. For a long time, this was the only support group in Huntsville and the surrounding area. We had people coming down from Tennessee; I had one girl coming down from Cullman; from Scottsboro, Hanceville, some other towns I can't even think of," Lee said. The group continues to meet Monday nights at the Post Chapel.

Lee devoted from eight to 12 hours a day to the group until late February when the war was won. The work didn't stop at 5 p.m. and it didn't stop on Fridays, but it was well worth the time, she said. "I've grown as an individual. And to be able to help a family get something accomplished in a timely fashion, is tremendously satisfying. And when you talk to a distressed person on the phone for a few hours and can listen; and when you hang up, to know they feel a little bit better, I guess all the time and the effort is well worth it. Because this whole thing is about caring and it's about sharing and helping each other."

She is a native of Shippensburg, Pa., which is about 50 miles north of Gettysburg. Lee, 46, was the only child of Edward and Geraldine Sears who now reside in Maryland; her father is a retired pharmacist. She met Brian Lee, then a young captain, in 1974 at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., where he attended the advanced course. They were married on March 29, 1975 in Belton, Texas, which is near Fort Hood.

Lt. Col. Brian Lee became commander of the 73rd Ordnance Battalion at Redstone in July 1989. When the 73rd consolidated with the 832nd the following year to form a single battalion, Lee took command of the combined unit, the 832nd Ordnance Battalion. He and his wife have two sons: Marc, 21, who is completing his associate degree in business at Calhoun Community College and will be going to the University of Baltimore in the fall; and Chris, 19, who also attends Calhoun.

Ellie Lee's plans for the family support group include working on reunion activities for the spouses and their returning loved ones. This reunion will be a combined effort with Army Community Service, the Mental Health Clinic at Fox Army Community Hospital, and the chaplains. Lee expects that the support group will continue for quite sometime, serving the spouses and their returning soldiers who both have changed since the deployment. The spouses have become more independent since they've been on their own, she said.

"I would like to thank everyone on Redstone Arsenal and the Huntsville community for all of the support that they have extended to me. There really hasn't been any of the agencies here on post that have been difficult to work with, and they've all bent over backwards to help anybody in every way. And I particularly want to thank the chaplains at Post Chapel. They've really been the backbone of the support group," Lee said.

The Lees will be leaving Redstone in July for a new assignment at Aberdeen Proving Ground. Lt. Col. Lee is to report there July 15 as the OMMCS (Ordnance

Missile and Munitions Center and School) representative to the Office of Chief of Ordnance. He will be handling missile and munitions issues for the Ordnance Corps for Brig. Gen. Johnnie Wilson, the chief of ordnance.

"Now I have so many friends it's going to be awfully hard to leave," Ellie Lee said. "It's going to be very difficult to leave all those people I've gotten to work with all this time and gotten to know so closely and intimately."

Amato contributes her time to Army Community Service, the Officers Wives Club and the American Red Cross. At ACS she does the shopping and inventorying for the Army Emergency Relief food locker; she also is chairman of the worldwide files which means providing welcome packets for people coming to Redstone or obtaining information packets from other installations for those departing. With the wives club she serves as membership chairman, puts together the newsletter, coordinates fund-raising events, and helps collect and wrap Christmas gifts for senior citizens. She represents the wives club on the Army Communities of Excellence committee, the Service to the Armed Forces committee which is under the Red Cross, and as a delegate to the Family Symposium. With the Red Cross she serves as chairman for youth volunteers.

"I just feel that it's important to be involved in your community," Amato said. "Redstone is a nice place to work and live. And I've always been a strong believer if you're going to critique the community that you're living in, you need to be an active participant."

"By my being involved in more than one agency, I tend to know what we're doing in other agencies so we have more of a community effort. To me that's an important aspect," she said.

Amato's community service did not just start when she arrived at Redstone in August 1988. Before arriving she served as an installation volunteer coordinator in Germany.

A native of Connecticut, she taught home economics to senior high and junior high school students from 1962-63 in Madison, Conn. She and her husband, Col. James Amato, the Missile Command chief of staff, were married on June 8, 1963. They went to Germany that September; and she started teaching kindergarten over there. "And I loved the age group. I've been doing kindergarten and first grade ever since. Actually I've had just three years of first grade teaching. The rest is kindergarten, which I love," Amato said. She substitute teaches in her spare time at Weatherly Elementary and Williams Elementary schools.

Her husband has always been supportive of her community work, she said. "I don't share my husband's work, because obviously I'm not a soldier, but this is my way of sharing his life because we share the people and the community."

She was previously here from 1968-75. "There used

Redstone stands to gain from base closures proposal

Redstone Arsenal will gain 1,884 civilian jobs and major new missions — managing Army armament and chemical functions and well as missiles and rockets — if base closures and realignments proposed by the Defense Department April 12 take effect.

The actions proposed by Defense Secretary Dick Cheney must yet be approved by the newly-appointed base closing commission, which can change them before sending them to the president and Congress for final OK.

Several months will elapse before final decisions are made.

There will be major impact on the Army Materiel Command and its elements if the closures and realignments proposed by DOD go into effect.

At Redstone, AMC plans to create a new command — the Army Missile, Armaments and Chemical Command (MACCOM) — by moving armament and chemical functions and about 1,400 associated civilian spaces from the Army Armaments, Munitions and Chemical Command (AMCCOM) at Rock Island, Ill., to Redstone and merging them with MICOM.

Also, missile related fuze development and production and about 250 associated civilian spaces will be moved from Harry Diamond Labs in Adelphi, Md., to the new command here.

In addition, AMC said it would move the Materiel Readiness Support Activity at Lexington-Blue-Grass Army Depot and the Logistics Control Activity at San Francisco to Redstone, merge them, and establish a separate activity reporting directly to HQ AMC.

About 230 civilian spaces would be moved here in that action.

By law, all approved movements must begin two years from the approval date and be completed in no more than six years from the approval date.

The base closing commission has until July 1 to review the DOD proposals, hold hearings and make any changes before submitting its recommendations to the president. The president can accept the list within 15 days or send it back to the commission for rework. If he does that, the commission has 30 days to present him with a revised list. The president can accept or reject the list. If he rejects it, all actions stop.

If the president sends a list to Congress, Congress has 45 working days to accept or reject it in total. If the Congress rejects the list, the president has the power to veto the congressional action. Congress by a two-thirds vote could override the veto.

May I suggest that Mr. Sweeney read the Driving Guide, available free at the Courthouse, that most people (myself included) only read before taking a driving test. However, to retain the *privilege* of being able to drive in the state of Alabama, one should remain cognizant with its contents.

Had the two cyclists been "line-astern" instead of "side-by-side" would Mr. Sweeney have passed them without changing lanes? His letter, and the act of beeping the horn, suggests he would have. I would hope that he would not pass an automobile in the same manner — at least, not mine! Remember, they are, and should have been, "considered the same as automobiles."

An experienced cyclist (both pedal and motor) will constantly adjust his lane position to take account of road and weather conditions. Anything from potholes

to crosswinds, or inspection covers to animals, may cause a cyclist to swerve within their lane. Contact between a car and a cycle may damage your paintwork, but is certain to be more dangerous for the cyclist.

In summary Mr. Sweeney, it is you who was "rude and inconsiderate" by trying to bully the cyclists into letting you put their lives at risk. As a car driver, who has had to adjust to driving on the wrong side of the road, I agree the obscene gesture was over-the-top, but it is surely better than having to take one of the discourteous fellows to a hospital after causing an accident. We should all learn to show more consideration for other road users and change the daily Grand Prix into an orchestrated procession. Time is money — but what does a human life cost?

Early-out bill

Editor:

In the March 6th issue of the *Rocket*, there was a letter to the editor giving rationale for and urging support for an incentivised early-out bill proposed by Congresswoman Barbara Boxer.

The bill is scheduled to be introduced before the end of April. The bill has been revised to address those areas that were criticized in its original version. A summary of the bill, formally titled "Federal Employees Retirement Incentive Act," follows:

— Covers government agencies or facilities undergoing reductions in force. (This was DOD, only, in original.)

— Provides four years of credit for age or years of federal service for the purpose of calculating the employee's retirement benefits. Age and service credit can be combined as long as the total does not exceed four years. (This was five years in original.)

— Sunsets after three years to allow Congress and the Office of Personnel Management an opportunity to evaluate its effectiveness.

— Requires agencies to reimburse the Civil Service Retirement Fund for costs of the enhanced retirement option over a 30-year period.

This bill is good for all: management — reduces turmoil of a RIF; youngest employees — reduces risk of job loss; mid-level employees — opens career opportunities; and older employees — incentivised retirement.

If you have not contacted your congressman and fellow federal employees to encourage their support, now is the time to do so.

Cheney recommends closing 43 defense installations

WASHINGTON — Citing the need to adjust the number of military bases as the size of the nation's armed forces is reduced, Defense Secretary Dick Cheney April 12 recommended closing 43 U.S. defense facilities and reducing or realigning the work forces at 28 others.

His proposals must be approved by the newly-appointed base closing commission. If OK'd by the commission, the proposals must next get the president's sanction and will take effect unless Congress passes a law stopping them.

The commission began hearings this week to decide

whether to modify Cheney's list or send it to Congress intact.

"By 1995, the number of people in the U.S. military will be about one-fourth smaller than it is today," Cheney said. "Smaller forces need fewer bases. It's as simple as that."

DOD estimated it would cost \$5.7 billion over six years to close the bases. Savings in reduced operating costs are estimated at \$6.5 billion over the same period. Beginning in fiscal 1998, DOD will save about \$1.7 billion a year in reduced operating costs.

Army installations and activities involved in the action include:

- **TO CLOSE:** Fort McClellan, Ala.; Fort Chaffee, Ark.; Fort Ord, Calif.; Sacramento Army Depot, Calif.; Fort Harrison, Ind.; Fort Devens, Mass.; Fort Dix, N.J.; and Harry Diamond Laboratory Research Facility, Va.

- **TO BE REALIGNED OR REDUCED:** Fort Detrick, Md.; Harry Diamond Laboratory, Md.; Aviation Systems Command and Troop Support Command, Mo.; Rock Island Arsenal, Ill.; Fort Polk, La.; Fort Monmouth, N.J.; White Sands Missile Range, N.M.; Letterkenny Army Depot, Pa.; Army Research Institute, Va., and Fort Belvoir, Va.

Materiel command changing due to closures, realignments

WASHINGTON — Base closures and realignments proposed by the Defense Department April 12 will cause major changes within the U.S. Army Materiel Command.

Here is a summary of the AMC changes.

- An Industrial Operations Command (IOC) will be created at Rock Island Arsenal combining HQ DESCOM and the ammunition and arsenals functions of AMCCOM. The IOC will manage and operate ammunition plants, depots and Pine Bluff, Rock Island and Watervliet Arsenals. Systems Integration Management (SIMA)-East will move from Letterkenny to Rock Island.

- A new command, Missile, Armaments and Chemical Command (MACCOM), will be created at Redstone Arsenal by moving armament and chemical functions now under AMCCOM from Rock Island to Redstone and merge them with MICOM.

- AVSCOM and TROSCOM will merge in place and become the Aviation/Troop Support Command with a single NICP.

- The Materiel Readiness Support Activity at Lexington-Blue Grass Army Depot and Logistics Control Activity in San Francisco will consolidate at Redstone as a separate activity reporting to HQ AMC.

- The Combat Materiel Research Laboratory (CMRL) will be created at Adelphi, Md., composed of LABCOR activities already there and moving others to Adelphi. Those moving include: Electronic Technology Device Lab from Fort Monmouth; Battlefield Environmental Effects element of the Atmospheric Science Lab from WSMR; Harry Diamond Labs Woodbridge Research Facility; information mission area related research from Army Institute for Research in Management Information, Communications and Computer Science at Georgia Tech and Directed Energy and Sensors Basic and Applied Research element of the Center for Night Vision and Optics at Fort Belvoir.

- Aberdeen Proving Ground will be a secondary CMRL site, retain research for ballistics, modeling/simulation/analysis, materials, life sciences and gain research and exploratory development materials elements from the Belvoir RD&E Center; the Army Materiel Technology Lab (AMTL) from Watertown, Mass.; the Army Research Institute MANPRINT function from Alexandria and the vulnerability assessment functions from the Chemical RD&E Center, Edgewood Arsenal.

- Sacramento Army Depot will close and its ground communications electronic workload will be transferred to Tobyhanna, Anniston, Red River and Corpus Christi Depots.

- Artillery and tactical vehicle rebuild will move from Letterkenny to Red River and Tooele Depots respectively.

- Tactical missile maintenance workload for all services will be consolidated at Letterkenny including

work now being done at Anniston, Red River, Sacramento and Tobyhanna Depots.

- A small portion of the AMTL will be added to the Aviation Aerostructures Directorate at Hampton, Va., to form the Army Structures Directorate.

- Ground vehicle propulsion basic and applied research elements from Warren, Mich., will be added to the Aviation Propulsion Directorate in Cleveland, Ohio, to form the Army Propulsion Directorate.

- Armament related fuze development and production missions will move from Harry Diamond Labs to Picatinny Arsenal.

- Missile related fuze development and production missions will move from Harry Diamond Labs to Redstone Arsenal.

- CMRL will continue to operate a remote lab facility at WSMR. The major elements of the Vulnerability Assessment Lab and the remaining part of the Atmospheric Science Lab will remain at WSMR.

Family symposium outbrief slated

The deputy post commander has scheduled a follow-up briefing to hear updates on quality of life issues surfaced at the fourth annual Family Symposium held in March.

Col. Joseph Mabry will listen to recommendations and proposed actions presented by responsible staff elements in the meeting set for 10 a.m. to noon Thursday, May 2 at the Recreation Center, building 3711. All family symposium delegates and interested members of the community are encouraged to attend to track progress on issues surfaced at the March 18 symposium.

"After this meeting we will take the issues that need to be followed up or tracked and comprise them into the Family Action Plan," said Sue Paddock, the

Redstone Arsenal family action plan manager at Army Community Service. "But one of the main ingredients to make the program a success is to keep the community aware of progress. And we think this is a good way to communicate to the community what the status is of the issues that were presented."

Twenty-three staff elements will be represented at the meeting. Some 85 issues were addressed by the family symposium delegates in the following seven areas: single soldier; transportation, finance and personnel; Post Exchange and Commissary; housing, traffic and maintenance; morale, welfare and recreation; medical and dental; and youth, education and employment. to be a preschool here at Redstone that I taught at from '68-72 until my son was born," she recalled.

The Amatos have a son, Jeffrey, 19, a freshman and Army ROTC cadet at the University of Connecticut; and daughter, Leann, 15, a ninth grade student at Westminster Christian Academy.

In her spare time Amato, 50, from Litchfield, Conn., likes to cross-stitch, dabble in music by playing the organ, read, do arts and crafts, and shop. She also enjoys being a part of changes that result from community service.

"Because of all the fund-cutting, there are no monies," she said, referring to the need for volunteers. "Just because the money's gone away doesn't mean the need for services has gone away. And therefore, every agency needs help."

Martin serves as PTA president at the Academy for Science and Foreign Language, one of the local magnet schools which draw students from throughout

Huntsville. This entails conducting the meetings for the 29-member PTA board and the general body PTA which has some 515 members, including parents and teachers. She also attends the city board of education meetings. Typically parent-teacher associations raise funds to provide things for their schools and work with teachers to provide programs for the young students. Her school's 492 students include about 42 military youngsters. A support group for youngsters of deployed servicemembers, called the Operation Red, White and Blue program, was started at the school. "I think that was beneficial to the kids," Martin said.

She was elected president last spring by the school's PTA and will serve in that capacity until school ends in June.

"What I did this year wasn't anything special. I'm honored to get this award but I know there's a lot of people who do volunteer work. I hope I just was selected as a representative for them," Martin said. She devotes at least 40 hours a week to her work as PTA president at the Academy for Science and Foreign Language where her son attends fifth grade. The variety of tasks can include preparing a newsletter some weekends.

"I get a lot of personal satisfaction," Martin said. "I enjoy working with the people a lot, the parents and the teachers. The principals and I have a good working relationship."

Martin, 41, who was raised in Kincaid, Ill., came to Redstone in June 1989 from Columbus, Ga. From 1988-89 in Columbus, she had worked for pay as program administrator in the continuing education department at Columbus College and also did volunteer work with her son's school. Her husband is Lt. Col. Ben Martin, deputy commander for the Readiness Group. Their son, Zachary, is 11. The Martins will be leaving in June for a new assignment in

Germany. Martin said her husband and son have been very supportive of her volunteer work.

"I've always worked with kids; all my jobs have been in some form or another with kids," said Martin, who received a bachelor's degree in education from Southern Illinois University in 1972. When she met her husband in Germany, he was a lieutenant and she was a recreation specialist for Department of Defense. They were married in 1974. "I've either volunteered or worked every place we've been; the longest we've been anywhere has been 23 months in 12 years," she said. Her past volunteer work has included coaching youth soccer. She coached during the 1989-90 school year at Redstone, and also for three years at Fort Benning, Ga.



now we're averaging about \$12,000 a year for the community and that's with a membership of about 35," said Moreillon, who has been contributing her time to the NCO Wives Club for the past seven years. She first served as treasurer for two years, then as president the next two years, then as vice president for a year, before becoming president for this year and is a nominee once again. Besides her volunteer service she works full time at the American Red Cross as director of volunteer services, working with more than 1,800 Red Cross volunteers in Huntsville and Madison County. "We have the largest volunteer program in the county," she said, referring to the Red Cross.

She started out as a Red Cross volunteer in Germany in 1981 and served in that capacity for three years. Moreillon arrived here and served the next two years as a Red Cross volunteer on post. The following year she became a paid case worker with the Red Cross at Redstone. After a year, she transferred downtown where she has been a staff member for the Huntsville-Madison County Red Cross the past four years. Moreillon uses work leave to do some of her volunteer work in the daytime. The NCO Wives' work is mainly in the evenings and on weekends, but some fundraisers such as the club's Christmas giftwrapping at the Post Exchange occurs during the day. That giftwrapping raises money for the NCO Wives' annual scholarships and merit awards to students in the military community. Moreillon also has assisted with Redstone's annual Family Symposium as a facilitator the past three years. In 1989 she served as a facilitator with the Department of Army's Family Symposium in Washington, D.C.

"I really enjoy volunteering. I have done it all my life as a military spouse and once I went to work full time, I found I still had a need to volunteer and the NCO Wives Club is a way for me to do that," Moreillon said.

"There's a lot of self-reward from helping others. And I have always enjoyed being a part of my community. And I've also received help over the years and I'd like to give something back," she said.

Her volunteer service and her full-time job complement each other. With the Red Cross, she has a youth clown troupe which is part of her job. Many times she donates her personal time as a clown, particularly at nursing homes.

Moreillon, 44, is a native of Jacksonville, Ill., which is near Springfield. Her husband, George, is a sergeant first class with C Company, 832nd Ordnance Battalion. They came to Redstone seven years ago from Butzbach, Germany. "I married George in '79 but I've been a military spouse since '65 with not a very long break," Moreillon said. She has three sons: Tod Rynders, 27, Tom Rynders, 23, and Eric Rynders, 21.

Her term as NCO Wives Club president is from last June 1 to May 31. The other officers include Linda Johnson, vice president; Maryrose Ball, corresponding secretary; Mary Parrish, treasurer; Beryl Cutts and Judy Fredrich, board members; and Sandra Davis, parliamentarian. Sandra Chen is honorary president, and Minnie Clifton is honorary adviser.

"I just would like to encourage everybody to volunteer," Moreillon said. "You get a lot more out of it than you put into it."

For about the past 15 years Brandon Parker, a

retired colonel, has been a member of the Redstone Military Retiree Advisory Council and the Post Chapel Consolidated Fund Council. He has also served in various capacities in the Huntsville Chapter of The Retired Officers Association. For 15 years Parker has been a member of various committees on post. He serves as the retiree representative on the board at Fox Army Community Hospital. He continues to work closely with the Redstone retired services officer, Lew Spencer, and the chairman of the retiree advisory council, Robert L. Moore. Retiree Activity Day, held each September, is among the retiree council's projects which Parker helps with. Through the years he has also helped the survivor assistance officer with funeral arrangements, primarily for military retirees.

"I think with the fact that I served such a long tenure in the United States military, I think that we should use our experience and give something back to the military community," Parker said, describing the importance of volunteer service to this community.

His personal reasons for volunteering go back to his childhood. He is from a large family — one of 17 children — and the siblings had to help one another. This carried over to his 36-year military career in which he served primarily in the infantry, beginning with two and a half years as an enlisted soldier before commissioned. "When you're in the infantry you become very close to your men; you help them to where they can help you," Parker said. When he retired in 1979, he stayed active in the military retiree community.

"I think the military community — active and retired — needs to give back to the military community. It's a payback. One way we're giving back is to help other people. And one of the critical areas is where you have widows and widowers; you need to step in and help them get on with their life," Parker said. "My primary commitment is to help widows and widowers to get back in a new life."

Parker, 68, found himself in the same circumstance in May 1990 when his wife, Mary, died after a brief illness. "It just helps a lot when your friends and others help you through a very devastating period in your life. And I'll continue to help other people that have gone through a very devastating period," he said.

He was the 16th of 17 children — seven boys and 10 girls — of William and Margaret Parker of Anniston, Ala. Five boys and one girl served in the military in World War II. His oldest brother, Maj. Gen. James Parker, was a pilot who commanded the 20th Air Force; James died at 49 when his B-17 crashed in 1946 on Formosa. James was "the first general officer to

Logistics school a cooperative effort with colleges

The Missile Command officially opened its Logistics University at building 5675 with a ribbon-cutting ceremony April 10.

About 300 people attended, including MICOM officials and presidents of the three local academic institutions conducting college classes on Redstone Arsenal.

Maj. Gen. William Chen, commander of MICOM and Redstone Arsenal, praised the Missile Logistics Center people who saw the need to establish the education program and make it a reality. He also acknowledged the Personnel and Training Directorate's role in breaking through the bureaucracy to establish the mechanics of making the university work.

Chen also expressed thanks to the three college presidents for their schools' role in LogU. They included Dr. Jerry Bartlett, Athens State College; Dr. Leon Frazier, Alabama A&M University; and Joseph Moquin of the University of Alabama-Huntsville.

LogU is a cooperative education program in which MICOM has enlisted Alabama A&M, Athens State and UAH to provide college-level logistics and logistics related classes at Redstone.

"Thanks for the opportunity of this new and exciting program," Jean Montgomery, MLC employee and LogU student representative, said.

"The beauty of LogU is that it allows students to take classes on site," Montgomery said. Classes are taught at building 5675 between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 2 p.m., thus allowing logistics employees the personal convenience of attending day classes. Employees then add on hours to their workdays to make up for the hours spent in class.

In addition, the government pays tuition costs, a boon for employees with the problems of saving for their childrens' educations, much less their own, Montgomery said.

"The government will have a good return on its investment," Montgomery said, because of increased quality of work, productivity, employee professionalism and attitude.

LogU was conceived of and developed to turn around the loss of experienced logistics employees due to retirements and attrition. Recent surveys at MICOM indicate a lower formal education level among lower-grade employees versus their high-grade managers. With promotion being the main method of advancement, a future drop in qualifications of managers appeared imminent.

To turn this around, the command set up LogU, not

to provide a degree program for employees, but all courses taught are college creditable and consistent with the standards of the institutions involved. Enhancement of the employee's academic credentials through matriculation with these institutions is left between the student and institution.

Jim Flinn, Missile Logistics Center director, paid tribute to the Arsenal's logisticians, a group that numbers 2,000.

"We knew, before Peter Arnett of CNN knew, that Hellfires on Apaches had gone across the border and taken out the eyes and ears of Saddam Hussein," Flinn said.

The ground war in Operation Desert Storm was over in 100 hours, Flinn said, in part because MICOM's missile systems were there — missiles conceived of, fielded, managed and supported by logisticians here.

Patriot was there and operational not just because Raytheon built it, but also because people in Huntsville made it happen, Flinn said.

"We began years ago getting our stuff ready, and in

August (1990) the largest movement of missiles and equipment ever in history started," Flinn said.

"If not for the logistics support in Southwest Asia, the outcome would have been different," Joe Moquin, UAH president, said. "I appreciate the impact you have on the availability of military systems and how well you support them."

In praising the cooperative effort of three Alabama institutions of higher learning in bringing education to the workplace, Dr. Leon Frazier, executive vice president of Alabama A&M University, said LogU is a "new way of bringing education to the people."

"We can no longer depend on strategies of the past to educate people today," Frazier said.

Dr. William Blow, Alabama Commission on Higher Education representative, also attended the ceremony. He has characterized the cooperative effort of Alabama academic institutions and a government agency as the "first of its kind in the state."

LogU started classes in September 1990 and all classes are held on-site, during the day and prepaid. The convenience makes not only for an enthusiastic, wide-awake student, but handles the inconvenience to home life and financial burden of the student, according to Jim Wasson, chief of Logistic Analysis and Automation Division and LogU coordinator.

New cooling system uses steam to conserve electricity

A new refrigeration machine that uses steam as the energy source is providing chilled water for air conditioning in part of the missile school area.

This is "a refrigeration machine using the lithium bromide refrigeration cycle and steam as the energy source to furnish chilled water for the school area," explained Oscar Eubank, energy coordinator in the Directorate of Engineering and Housing. "This technology will become more commonplace and reduce/replace electrically-driven refrigeration machines in applications at facilities whose air-conditioning load exceeds 125 tons."

Lithium bromide is a "non-ozone depleting refrigerant," he said. Two new refrigeration machines are housed in building 3316 just south of Little John Road. They consist of an 800-ton machine and a 400-ton machine for a total capacity of 1,200 tons. The smaller machine is in use alone until probably the first of June when the larger machine will have its turn. Then, the smaller machine will be turned on again and both will be operating when maximum capacity is required in late July through mid-August.

The units were purchased by OMA (operation and maintenance Army) funds for more than \$600,000. The smaller machine began operating in March. "These units utilize steam from the city garbage-


burning steam plant, a renewable energy resource which began supplying steam to the Arsenal in July of 1990," Eubank said.

"The use of this energy resource at this and other installations around Redstone in the future will allow the reduction of peak electrical energy demand during the summer months," he said. "Redstone's electrical consumption is approaching our contract demand limit due to the increased use of computers and other electrical equipment. Everyone is encouraged to do their part in reducing our electrical demand by using this energy source wisely."

The refrigeration machine is being operated by the installation support contractor, BAMSII. "This is the first one. We're going to do it in 4488, 5400, 5250," Eubank said, listing some of the major buildings which will be using larger refrigeration machines in the future.

Buildings in the area of the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School which are using the new refrigeration system include the following: 3200, 3201, 3202, 3203, 3204, 3205, 3206, 3207, 3208, 3209, 3210, 3211, 3212, 3213, 3214, 3215, 3216, 3217 and 3218.

"Why don't you make the (photo) caption: 'It ain't no April Fools' joke; energy conservation is everybody's business'," Eubank suggested.

Message center operator being sent to Saudi Arabia

While many U.S. servicemembers are looking forward to returning home from Saudi Arabia, a Redstone soldier says he's looking forward to going.

Spec. Trevor Rieger of Information System Command-MICOM is leaving April 18 for embassy duty at Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. He will be a telecommunications center operator at the U.S. embassy on a 12-month unaccompanied tour beginning April 20.

"I won't be representing the military, I'll be a diplomat over there," said Rieger, who was selected for the assignment by the ISC director at Fort Huachuca, Ariz. "It's not like a typical duty assignment."

I'll get to work with civilians when I come back to the states," Rieger said.



His mother, Darlene, is an assistant motel manager in Hayward, Calif. His younger brother, Ronald, works for United Postal Service in Oakland.

The telecommunications center at MICOM headquarters gave Rieger a farewell party April 5. Richard Lee is chief of the center which consists of 24 civilians and 13 military members.

"Oh I love it," Rieger said, when asked what he thinks of his Saudi Arabian assignment. He said he has no apprehensions "especially not where I'll be at and all that."

"Now if they were going to send me one or two months ago, I'd probably have different opinions about it," Rieger added.





Deactivated reservists have rights to their old jobs

Members of the Guard and Reserve who have been activated in support of Operation Desert Storm have re-employment rights if they leave jobs that are other than temporary. Part-time and probationary employees are protected.

The federal law that provides these rights, the Veteran's Reemployment Rights Law, is found in chapter 43 of Title 38, U.S. Code. This law is administered by the Office of Personnel Management for federal employees, and by the U.S. Department of Labor for all others.

In order to exercise their re-employment rights, guardsmen and reservists need to contact their civilian employer upon release from active duty. The contact can be verbal or in writing. Written contact is highly recommended for documentation purposes. The letter should include, at a minimum: the fact that you formerly worked there, that you left to enter active military service and that you have satisfactorily completed the service and want your job back.

THOSE CALLED TO ACTIVE DUTY under mobilization authority exercised by the president Jan. 18, and those serving on voluntary active duty which is not for training, have a maximum of 90 days to apply for reinstatement. However, all are advised to contact the employer as soon as possible after release from active duty.

Reinstatement in the job should be immediate, if possible. If not, it should not take more than two weeks. Benefits such as health insurance should be resumed immediately upon application.

The returning Guard or Reserve member is to be restored to the same job as the one he or she left, or in a position with like status, seniority and rate of pay. In

the event a disability is incurred while on active duty which renders the reservist unable to perform the pre-service job, the employer must offer a job which the individual is able to perform. That position should afford the same status, seniority and rate of pay as the pre-service position, or the closest possible approximation thereof.

IN THE EVENT PROBLEMS ARISE, the reservist should call the ombudsman at the National Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve at (800) 336-4590, (703) 696-1390/1391/1392, or Autovon 226-1390/1391/1392. Local offices of the Department of Labor, Veterans Employment and

Training Service also stand ready to help resolve conflicts. Their number can be found in the U.S. Government listings of the telephone directory or be obtained by calling (800) 442-2VET.

Members of the Guard and Reserve who are on active duty or have been deactivated are entitled to consult with an attorney at the Redstone Arsenal Office of the Staff Judge Advocate. Members who have been unable to resolve their re-employment problems should call the Legal Assistance Office 876-9015 and request an appointment. Also, information materials on re-employment rights are available in the Legal Assistance Office.



95th soldiers welcomed back home from Saudi Arabia

A jubilant crowd gathered at the Redstone Airfield early Thursday to welcome nine soldiers home from Saudi Arabia after their almost seven-month stay in the desert.

The soldiers are assigned to the 95th Maintenance Company (Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment).

Family members and well wishers waited at the Redstone Airfield, some for as long as three and a half hours, before the plane carrying the soldiers arrived at 12:30 a.m. Thursday.

Returning soldiers include SFC Kevin M. Wangbickler, SFC Monte C. Moore, SSgt. Gregory W. Anderson, SSgt. Benjamin M. Canaba, SFC Roy E. Elmore, SSgt. Lancelot S. Latouche, SSgt. James

P. Morgan, SSgt. John A. Mulka and Sgt. Leon O. Breece.

SSgt. Robert W. Dubose, one of the group who left Redstone in September, had returned home a few weeks ago on emergency leave.

"Over the past several weeks, as we've been sitting home watching troops returning to Fort Stewart, Fort Bragg — those were just folks on TV," Col. Michael Boyd, TMDE Support Group commander, told the soldiers as they stepped off the plane.

"But tonight it's our soldiers. In this situation, looking at you standing here, it's tough to find words to describe our feelings. But we can say welcome home, and God bless America!"

The soldiers arrived at Philadelphia International Airport and were brought back home by a crew from the Redstone Airfield aboard a C-23A Sherpa, the latest addition to the airfield's fleet.

The arrival in Huntsville was later than expected because of a refueling stop in Knoxville.

The 95th soldiers were in Dhahran working in the only Army calibration laboratory in Southwest Asia, except for Breece, who was assigned to a team attached to the 1st. Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas, Capt. James Kolasinski, 95th's commander, said.

The Dhahran-based group supported calibration teams who in turn serviced the test equipment for weapon systems in Saudi Arabia, Kolasinski said. The soldiers who were deployed were chosen for the special skills.

The calibration laboratory here had to close down while the 10 soldiers were deployed in Operation Desert Storm, Kolasinski said, and civilian counterpart laboratories had to pick up the workload.

The TMDE Support Group has worldwide command and control over the Army's metrology and calibration program, and soldiers assigned to the 95th Maintenance Company calibrate and repair equipment that is used to test the accuracy of other weapon systems.







Collision injures two, causes major vehicle damage

come out of Calhoun County," Parker said. Parker Hall, one of the buildings on the academic circle at Maxwell Air Force Base, is named after James.

Parker was an outstanding athlete at Anniston High School where he lettered in football for three years and was captain of the team. A 1942 graduate he received a football scholarship to Georgia Tech and was drafted into the Army in February 1943 during his freshman year. He served in World War II; commanded a unit in

the Korean War; and served two tours in Vietnam where he commanded a support brigade and was a senior adviser. He earned a bachelor's degree in military science in 1956 from the University of Maryland while working at the Pentagon. In 1973 he was assigned to come from Vietnam to Redstone Arsenal as inspector general for the Missile Command. He retired from the service in July 1979. Parker received a master's degree in administrative science in 1979 from the University of Alabama-Huntsville.

His daughter, Mary Branda Hill, 38, is the wife of

Lt. Col. David J. Hill, a Texas A&M graduate and engineer stationed in Chatterden, England, as an American instructor with the Royal School of Engineering. They are to return to the states this summer when Hill becomes an instructor in the tactics department at Fort Leavenworth, Kan.
