## Logistic rep redeploys for Operation Provide Comfort

Like the troops they support, many of the Missile Command logistic assistance representatives have returned home from Southwest Asia.

But not all the LARs are back in the U.S.A. One of these civilian workers volunteered to redeploy with his unit for Operation Provide Comfort in Turkey and Iraq.

Santiago "Jim" Hernandez redeployed May 5 with the 6th Battalion of the 6th Air Cavalry from Illersheim, Germany. He supports that unit as his normal duty in Germany, and volunteered to accompany it when the unit was alerted for Operation Provide Comfort. Hernandez had already served in Southwest Asia from Dec. 13 until March 16 for Operation Desert Shield/Storm.


"His normal job of course is to assist the using units that he supports in maintaining the readiness posture of their equipment, by assisting the unit maintenance personnel in their maintenance/troubleshooting and repair of equipment," said Leo Baghdoian, chief of the land combat operations branch of logistic assistance division at Missile Systems Readiness Directorate. "The feedback I'm getting is he's doing an outstanding job. He says living conditions in the forward area are horrible."

Hernandez is in the border area of Turkey and Iraq in support of his unit which doesn't stay in one location. He travels between the U.S. Air Force base in Incirlik, Turkey, and the forward areas where the U.S. troops are in Iraq. Towns he has mentioned in his dispatches include Zakhu which is in Iraq, and the Turkish town of Diyarbakir.

An equipment specialist, Hernandez supports MICOM missile systems that are installed on aircraft. His unit has Apache AH64 helicopters equipped with Hellfire missiles, OH58D helicopters with the Mast Mounted Sight system, and OH58C helicopters armed with Air-to-Air Stinger.

"All is doing as well as can be expected," Her-

nandez said in a May 7 dispatch. "Unit is providing as best support as they have for themselves. Accommodations are presently not the best. We are in 'Irak,'

I moved forward with the unit the next day that I arrived. The 6-6th is at present colocated with the 4th Brigade. We are living in an abandoned Iraqi building."

At 46, Hernandez has been a MICOM logistic assistance representative since September 1986. He was stationed at Fort Lewis, Wash., before going with his family to Germany. He and his wife, Steffi, have two sons: Lorenzo, 23, and Calvin, 20.

Hernandez is one of only two Missile Command

LARs remaining in Southwest Asia. Carlton Mason, who deployed Dec. 19, is still in Saudi Arabia and Kuwait for Operation Desert Sunset.

Three LARs departed Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, May 11. "But requirements to support MICOM systems may still exist and would be supported accordingly," Baghdoian said. The number of logistic assistance reps in Southwest Asia reached a peak of about 55 during the war. They lived with the troops they supported and endured whatever conditions those soldiers were enduring.

"During most of the time, I was assigned as a first-line supervisor in Europe, V Corps-Europe. And of course I was involved in deploying the LARs out of V Corps. And I felt and the feedback I got was the LARs, although of course not happy about being deployed to Southwest Asia, realized it was part of the job and they went and did a commendable job," Baghdoian said.

"They had horrendous living conditions, horrendous working conditions; and in spite of all this, they did an outstanding job," he said.

As an example he showed a Certificate of Achievement from Maj. Gen. William Pagonis of Army Central Support Command. The recipient was logistic assistance rep Antone Vital, but Baghdoian said the certificate is indicative of the feelings toward all the LARs who served in Southwest Asia. The award cited "outstanding logistic support of deployed units in Saudi Arabia."

Hernandez is among 85 logistic assistance representatives assigned to the land combat branch. His temporary duty orders indicate he could remain in Southwest Asia for as many as 179 days. "I wouldn't say that he'll be there for 179 days. He *could* be there for that length of time, because we may choose to replace him," Baghdoian said.

There are 80 LARs in the air defense management and operations branch, according to Stan Reid, the branch chief.

## More than half of post families participate in recycling

For the first time since the program here began last November, participation in the blue-bin recycling program in the Redstone housing areas has topped 50 percent.

Some 51 percent of the Redstone residents took part in the curbside recycling program in April, up from 48 percent in March. The weekly pickup day will be changing from Wednesday to Tuesday effective June 4. The reason for the change to Tuesdays is the Huntsville Solid Waste Disposal Authority's contractor will be doing Wednesday pickups in Decatur.

"Our participation rate was 51 percent in April, and that's the first time we've gone over 50 percent participation. And our goal is to get to 80 percent participation," said Jerry Holton, the recycling program manager at the Missile Command's Environmental Office. "And to help achieve that, we're going to be running a promotion in June for two reasons: One is to make people aware of the (pickup) day change, and the other is to increase awareness of the program and hopefully get more people to participate."

The Solid Waste Disposal Authority plans to inform Redstone residents about the pickup day change and provide additional recycling information through door hanger notices and newspaper ads. "The special feature for the month of June is they're going to pick at random one blue bin that's been put out and correctly filled; and they're going to walk to the front door of that house and hand a \$50 check to whoever that bin belongs to. And obviously, the purpose of that is to get people to recycle and do it right and hopefully they'll make it a habit to continue to recycle and participate in the program," Holton said.

All 1,165 family housing residences on post have been issued blue bins for recycling items such as aluminum cans, glass food containers and newspapers. Collection figures from November through the end of

March show 72,208 pounds were collected including 36,562 pounds of newspaper, 3,276 plastic, 2,779 aluminum, 6,800 steel, 14,868 glass (clear), 5,384 glass (green) and 2,721 glass (brown). Participation rates have included: 43 percent in November, 46 percent in December, 47 percent in January, 46 percent in February, 48 percent in March and 51 percent in April.

"Basically we're pleased with results of the program. Nationally about 30 percent participation rate is considered successful," Holton said. "The program is designed to keep this stuff out of landfills, and to get it recycled to save natural resources."


"It's the right thing to do. We have to conserve resources. It takes a lot less energy to recycle things than it does to make new things, generally. And we owe future generations a clean place to live with enough resources available to live well. People really need to view it as if they're doing something for their grandchildren and their grandchildren's children," he said.

Browning Ferris Industries (BFI) of Houston, Texas, is the city's curbside recycling contractor. The Huntsville program began in June 1989 as a 1,000-home pilot project. An Army regulation, AR 200-1 dated May 1990, encourages installations to join in local community recycling programs whenever feasible. Redstone paid about \$17,500 to the Solid Waste Disposal Authority to participate for the first year beginning last November; the money represented part of the proceeds generated from other recycling programs here.

"Our entire recycling program returned \$45,000 to Nonappropriated Fund Activities and (another) \$45,000 for pollution abatement and other environmental projects. And we just did that distribution in April. The blue bin program is paid for out of other recycling revenues on the Arsenal. And this is the only expense money that we pay because we're trying to maximize the proceeds that we can give for Nonappropriated Funds and for pollution abatement and other environmental programs. We've made a conscious decision to keep overhead costs as near zero as possible," Holton said.

An example is the office paper recycling program which utilizes old used boxes for collections and volunteers in the various buildings who move the filled boxes to where the contractor picks them up. "We made about \$6,500 last year in office paper recycling," Holton said. "And I believe if we can improve our participation in the buildings that have it, we could double or triple that amount of money." About 25 buildings are participating in the program which began in June 1989. Four more buildings — 4566, 5400, 5435 and 7103 — have been identified as generating enough paper that they will be added to the program soon. The new contract award is expected in June, but building custodians of these four buildings will be notified as to actual startup dates.

As another recycling initiative, the Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office suggested that the Environmental Office could make more money off production and construction scrap — things like scrap computer cabinets — if the items were better separated when turned in. In response, the Environmental Office has hired two summer employees to sort the scrap and will determine at the end of the summer whether profits increased. "We're looking for ways to increase revenue from our recyclables," Holton said.

## Bond deductions

**Editor:**

I would like to comment on the open letter from the secretary of defense regarding the annual Savings Bond Campaign published in the May 15 *Redstone Rocket*.

The letter ended with what appears to be sound advice to a GS-12 with three young children to educate in the future by saying "sign up for U.S. savings bonds or increase your current allotment by a small amount. You'll be glad you did."

Like many government employees I now participate in the payroll savings plan by having \$25 a pay period deducted from my wages. When the canvasser arrived with this year's bond information, I wanted to increase the amount of my allotment but like many families we are feeling the financial pinch of the '90s. After much thought and a discussion with my wife we decided to increase our bond deduction \$10 a pay period, which is small progress but we felt we could afford it while

meeting our present financial obligations. To my surprise a few days later I received a phone call from SDC Human Resources office informing me that no bond cost was divisible by \$35 and therefore could not be deducted for bonds. My choices were \$25 or \$50 deductions for bonds of \$100 or \$200 denominations or \$31.25 if I would change to \$500 denominations. I explained to the Human Resources representative that I could not afford \$50 per pay period and didn't want \$500 denomination bonds.

I don't understand why amounts like \$30, \$35, \$40 or \$45 can't be deducted for bonds since \$5, \$10 and \$25 are acceptable deductions. The mechanism for holding money until a bond can be purchased is already in place and it's obvious that payroll could handle any odd amounts by their adept handling of TSP, Medical Insurance, FICA and Taxes.

Maybe a \$25 a pay period required increase is considered small to Mr. Cheney but I doubt it is considered small to most federal employees. Therefore I believe the rules for bond deductions prevent following the seemingly good advice contained in the letter from the secretary of defense. I believe that many federal employees would increase their bond allotment if it can be made in small increases so as to be less painful. As it is, my only choice was to have my bond increase card destroyed, hope for better economic times and hope the rules for bond deduction are changed in order to better serve both the government and the American savers.

# Redstone to celebrate golden anniversary June 13

The Army will celebrate its 50th anniversary in Huntsville with a gala extravaganza dinner that will feature a laser show and a video showcasing the success of Army missiles in the Persian Gulf War.

The golden anniversary celebration is set for June 13 at 6 p.m. at the Von Braun Civic Center. The dinner is being sponsored by the Huntsville/Madison County Chamber of Commerce.

Ticket sales have been excellent so far, according to Florette Haisten, program chairman.

The event will be in the North Hall of the VBCC, which seats 1,000. Tickets are \$25 and can be purchased from the Chamber. Call 535-2000 for more information.

Gen. William Tuttle, commander of the Army Materiel Command, is scheduled guest speaker for the event.

Entertainment will be by the Whitesburg Baptist Church choir performing portions of their "I Love America" program, a barbershop quartet and several other groups.

"It's going to be a really special event. The closing birthday extravaganza is a real surprise. The backdrop for the stage is based on one I saw used at the White House for the Great American Workout," Haisten said.

The community wanted to sponsor this event for the Army to mark 50 years of harmonious co-existence between a military installation and the surrounding community, she said.

"What the Army's presence has meant, not only to the city, but to the state, is that Huntsville has been at the forefront in technological developments. The Ar-

my has given Huntsville an international reputation gained recently by the success of Army missiles such as the Patriot (in the Persian Gulf War).

MICOM hardware from the parade will come to rest around the staging area and there will people on hand to explain the equipment, she said. The Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School is also involved in providing hardware for this event. Equipment being provided by OMMCS includes Avenger,

Bradley, Hawk, Multiple Launch Rocket System, TOW on a HMMWV, and a Vulcan.

A recent addition to the entertainment in the park is a commitment from singer Bobby Goldsboro to attend and sing his hits from the 1960s and '70s.

"The park will be a sea of yellow balloons, ribbons and flags. Being there will really make people feel good," Haisten said.




## Director of OPM to address luncheon meeting here

Constance Berry Newman, director of the Office of Personnel Management, is scheduled to be at Redstone Arsenal May 30 as a guest of the Association of the U.S. Army.

Newman is to speak at the AUSA general membership luncheon at the Officers Club. Focus of her address will be OPM policies and their impact on the Department of Army civilian workforce.

A social hour begins at 11:30 a.m. with a sit-down meal at noon followed by Newman's address. Cost is \$7.50 per person. For reservations, call Martha Townsend or Darla McClure 650-1000 by May 24.

Newman was sworn-in as director of OPM on June 12, 1989. For more than 20 years she managed public and private organizations. Among her major management positions were: assistant secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, director of VISTA, and president of the Newman-Hermanson Company. She was also commissioner and vice-chairman of the Consumer Product Safety Commission.

From 1987-88, Newman worked for the Government of Lesotho as a Cooperative Housing Foundation consultant to a committee formed to advise the

Ministry of Interior on the establishment of a housing corporation to receive World Bank Funding.

During her public career which began in 1961, Newman worked in 12 federal government agencies with four Presidential appointments, three of which were confirmed by the Senate. She began her career as a GS-3 typist at the Department of Interior, Bureau of Land Management. For six years, she worked in the personnel department of the Bureau dealing with such issues as classification, adverse action appeals, recruitment and placement and training. She continued as a career civil servant until 1969 when she became a political appointee.

Newman was a Woodrow Wilson Visiting Fellow from 1977-85 and a member of the adjunct faculty at the Kennedy School, Harvard University from 1979-82. She has received an honorary doctorate of laws from Bates College, her alma mater, and from Amherst College. In addition to receiving an A.B. from Bates College, she received a bachelor of science in law degree from the University of Minnesota Law School. In 1985, she received the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service. She is a life member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, and has served on numerous civic boards and committees.






# Symposium outbrief airs ways to improve services

Customer service was an underlying theme of the outbrief meetings held since the annual Family Symposium in March.

The third such meeting was held May 15 at the Challenger NCO Club. Col. Joe Mabry, the deputy post commander, conducted these follow-up briefings to hear recommendations and proposed actions on the 85 quality of life issues addressed by the fourth annual symposium.

Last week representatives from activities such as medical, dental and finance discussed what they are doing to serve their patrons — their customers — and what they can do to improve that service. Issues raised by the symposium included complaints about waiting times and eligibility for services. Some of the issues have been forwarded to higher headquarters.

"Everything isn't perfect in the MEDDAC, but we're trying to address these problems," said Lt. Col. Jack Durkan, deputy commander for administration

at Fox Army Community Hospital. "Through a forum like this, we hear your complaints or desires and resolve them."

Mona Moorer, chief of pay examination branch at Finance and Accounting, addressed the finance issues. "We strive at all times to provide the type service that we ourselves would like to be getting if we were at the other end of that telephone or we were at the other side of that counter," she said.

The quality of life issues will be included in Family Action Plan IV which is expected to be published in June. Issues that cannot be resolved locally are forwarded to Army Materiel Command or to Department of Army. AMC will have its family action plan meeting this summer. Beyond that level is the Department of Army which will have its family action plan meeting in October. Last year four issues that surfaced at Redstone Arsenal were taken to the Department of Army level.

# Chaplain looks forward to his tour at Redstone

Redstone Arsenal's new head chaplain has been on the job only about three weeks. He's anxious to be finished with unpacking and settling in so he can do one of the things he likes to do best in his spare time: fish.

"Fishing has become my favorite sport. Since I'm growing old, it's more in my league," the 62-year-old Chaplain (Col.) Norbert Bykowski said with a laugh.

"During my younger days it was handball, racquetball, football, basketball — all the power sports in which I had an advantage because of my size," said Bykowski, who stands 6-3 and weighs about 214.

Bykowski's Army career began in 1961 when he joined the Reserves for a most unusual reason. He was a priest in one of Chicago's largest Roman Catholic parishes when an Army general who was good friends with the bishop complained that he couldn't get a priest to say Mass to his troops.

So before he knew it, he was "drafted" to join the Reserves. Five years later, in 1965, he entered active duty after getting a telephone call from the cardinal.

"Vietnam was just heating up and the cardinal felt strongly that I could contribute something. I was given 24 hours to make a decision," Bykowski said.

"I was 36 when I came on active duty, the oldest first lieutenant in the Army, well, not quite, but I was an old, dumb first lieutenant," Bykowski jested.

He recalled how difficult the military life was for him in the beginning, in that parish life included having someone do everything for you. "Everything was done for me. We had a cook, housekeeper, secretary. Then I came into the Army and I was on my own. I didn't even know what size clothes I wore.

"I'm still a lousy cook; it hardly seems worth the effort," he said.

He is a graduate of St. Mary of the Lake College, Mundelein, Ill., and spent four years in the School of Theology. Upon graduation he was sent to a Catholic industrial school in Niles, Ill., where his job was to take care of dependent, predelinquent children. He taught high school classes and was the physical education director.

"I ran with the kids to tire them out so the room mothers wouldn't have so much trouble with them," he said.

Bykowski's education prepared him for service to God, but he had no idea during college that he would become a priest.

"I was an unlikely candidate for the priesthood. I was free spirited, loved sports, was for having a good time and didn't like discipline. I got in trouble like most guys my age and I liked the girls," he said.

"But there comes a time when you have to figure out which way you're going to go. I wanted to work with people. And there was no doubt that I wanted

God and religion to be a part of my life. Through college and theology school they kept telling me I'd better get serious. Finally I came to a decision point. And I knew that taking the vow of celibacy was not to be taken lightly.

# Turning in Caribou like losing old friend, says pilot

Redstone Army Airfield's old C-7A Caribou made its final long-distance flight Friday when it was taken to an annual air show in Amarillo, Texas, where it was transferred to a museum.

The plane and its three-member crew departed the airfield that morning for the trip to Trade Wind Airport at Amarillo where the plane was turned over to the Texas Aviation Historical Society. A dedication ceremony for the turn-in was held Saturday evening.


Two planes from here went to the air show in Amarillo: the Caribou and a Sherpa. The Caribou didn't make the return trip to Redstone, but stayed to become part of the museum. The 1963 airplane arrived July 15, 1983 from Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery. It saw duty in Vietnam. In 1989 a five-member crew flew the plane to the Virgin Islands for Operation Hugo hurricane relief efforts.

"It's kind of a sad day for us," said Jim White, the pilot in command, before departing for Amarillo. "It's kind of like getting rid of an old friend."


White and fellow crewmember Doug Paddock have been flying a Caribou at Redstone since 1972. "We've been flying together for 19 years so that's a long time to have to put up with him," joked Paddock, who flew a Caribou in Vietnam in 1963 and 1966.

Lash Wisener was the third member of the crew. White, Paddock and Wisener received a Caribou lapel pin as a memento of the occasion before their departure. The presentation was made by retired soldier Homer Howard, a member of the Army Otter-Caribou Association which will be having its annual meeting Aug. 18 in Reno, Nev.

A small black plaque had been affixed to the plane, under the pilot's side window just above the Army Materiel Command emblem. It read, "C-7A Caribou 63-9719 presented by the Directorate of Flight Operations, United State Army Missile Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, May 20, 1991."

"But there's always a price to pay for what you want in life," he said.

One of the biggest challenges to mankind in modern-day life is determining what happiness really is, he said.

"Hearts are restless. We don't know what happiness is, and we'll never find it so long as we look for the new thrill, the nirvana, the ecstasy.

"Happiness is complete, permanent. That's why we'll never find complete happiness with things in life. Something always happens to spoil it. We can have joy, but we're always chasing happiness.

"Complete happiness will never be found until we find rest in God," he continued.

"Why can't we grow old gracefully, enjoy every phase of life we pass through? We become victims of a society which imposes pressure on us to be young forever. You see it with people having face lifts, tummy tucks, plastic surgery, baldness cures. Why can't we accept growing old? We become victims. And we have to ask ourselves, 'Are people better?'"

"What do we profit if we gain the whole world and lose our souls? I think we've lost our values. Instead of being a God-fearing people, we have attempted to make Him in our own image and likeness.

"I think many Christians have fallen in love with their church. But the church's purpose is to intensify, not replace, the relationship with God," Bykowski said.

As he looks toward retirement in the near future, Bykowski said his decision will be driven by how his health holds out.

"After all these years I still want to assume the burdens of being a pastor, and I'm not talking about burdens of a religious nature. The burdens are raising money, repairing buildings, meeting assessments — those kinds of things.

"I want to go fishing more," when not performing the religious duties, he said.

"I have several options. I can leave the Army and become a pastor immediately. Or I can be an associate for one year to see how things are done in Chicago these days and then become a pastor. Or if I'm tired of responsibility and giving orders and nobody listening, I can live in a rectory or on my own and work part time in teaching or administration."

He explained how all priests in the Army must be certified as a valid priest by a local superior or a bishop before the Army will accept them.

"We're just on loan to the military. When we retire, we revert back to the church.

"There's a shortage of priests in the Army now. We should have about 500, based on the percentage of the Army population determined to be Catholic. We have 190. And a high percentage of priests are 50 or more years old. This is explained first by a general shortage of priests existing right now. Secondly, bishops are reluctant to let priests go into the Army because many of them retire and don't go back (to the church). They don't mind a 20 year loan, but often they lose them forever."

Bykowski said he's blessed in his new assignment with having smart people around him and doesn't expect to change anything "unless it's absolutely necessary."

During his 26 years in the Army he has been in Korea twice, Germany twice, Fort Bliss and Fort Hood, Texas, Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind., Fort Hamilton, N.Y., Fort Lee, Va., and Fort Bragg, N.C.

He looks forward to his Redstone assignment. "When the chief of Army chaplains asked me what I wanted in my next assignment I told him, 'A small place with good fishing.' I look forward to being here," he said with a smile.



# Airport Authority relaxing security

The Huntsville-Madison County Airport Authority was notified Thursday by the Federal Aviation Administration that some reduction in security measures could be implemented.

The decision is expected to have a positive impact on airport concessionaires whose revenue has recently been affected due to the limited number of people in the concourse. # Army exec thanks comptrollers for good management

The guest speaker for the American Society of Military Comptrollers monthly luncheon in May was Gary Tagtmeyer, holder of the Army chair, Executive Institute. He thanked the comptrollers for managing the funds properly when there was an abundance of funds, which helped the U.S. be successful in the Persian Gulf War.

He also said the government environment will be tough, challenging and exciting but the cream of the crop will remain.

Tagtmeyer's main topic was Total Quality Management as applied to personal development. He listed four basic steps:

- Evaluate and study yourself. This can be done by determining your assets and liabilities.
  - Determine whether you're satisfied or dissatisfied with your assets and liabilities and make improvements where possible.
  - Prepare a plan by setting benchmarks. The benchmarks should be where the best is or will be in three or five years from now.
  - The final step is to implement the plan.
- The most forgotten element of TQM is to be an in-

formed customer, Tagtmeyer said. The customer must receive the appropriate feedback.

Tagtmeyer challenged the comptrollers to: Decide what *it* is. Know what *it* is when you find *it*. Evaluate *it* to see if *it* is of any use. If anyone figures out what *it* is, he said, then let him know.





# High blood pressure: the silent killer

If you are thinking, "Why, I can stop reading this article now because I am not nervous or tense, nor do I have any symptoms of high blood pressure" — please read on. May is National High Blood Pressure Education Month, and an opportune time for you to learn about a condition which affects approximately 58 million Americans — about one in four. Intelligent lifestyle choices can reduce your risks for high blood pressure and heart disease.

One may have high blood pressure for years and not realize it. Since high blood pressure has few symptoms, it is known as the "silent killer." Research has shown that high blood pressure increases the risk of stroke, heart disease and kidney failure. Early detection and control are critical in minimizing the potential of physical damage to yourself. The only way to determine if your blood pressure is high is to have it checked. This is a painless test which only takes a few minutes.

Blood pressure is the force blood exerts against arterial walls as it is pumped through the body by the heart. A blood pressure reading consists of two numbers: for example, 120 over 80 (120/80). The top number, or systolic pressure, refers to the force exerted against the arteries when the heart contracts. The second number, the diastolic pressure, is the point of least pressure, when the heart is relaxing between beats.

## Hypertension defined

High blood pressure, also called hypertension, is defined as blood pressure that is consistently elevated

above 140/90 in the adult. Should you have a high blood pressure reading, remember that caffeine, nicotine and stress can temporarily elevate your blood pressure and that follow-up blood pressure readings are recommended to accurately diagnose your condition. Health care professionals will determine if you require close observation, treatment or only periodic screening.

Remember, even if your reading is normal, you should have your blood pressure checked every two years.

## Prescribed strategies

Should hypertension be diagnosed, medication is not automatically prescribed by your physician. Hypertension may be controlled by strategies other than medication. You may be recommended to:

- Lose weight — Obesity has been associated with high blood pressure. Your blood pressure may be lowered to a normal level, but the extra weight must not be gained back to retain this benefit.
- Modify dietary fats — Reducing saturated fats not only reduces your blood cholesterol, but studies suggest that a low intake of saturated fats is associated with lower blood pressure.
- Reduce sodium intake — The National Academy of Sciences recommends that Americans should decrease their daily sodium consumption to the amount found in one teaspoon of salt. To cut down on sodium in your diet, add less salt when cooking, use less salt at the table, avoid heavily salted foods (as chips, pretzels, salted nuts, luncheon meats, soy sauce and catsup) and also avoid processed and canned foods with a high sodium content. Do not use salt substitutes unless your physician approves.
- Exercise — Not only will exercise help you lose

weight, but it may also assist in controlling your blood pressure. Perform aerobic exercise, such as a brisk walk, every other day for 30 to 40 minutes. Of course, it is important to check with your physician before beginning any exercise program.

- Stop smoking — Smoking increases your risk of cancer, pulmonary diseases and coronary heart disease. Chain-smoking speeds up the heart rate, increases blood pressure and increases the work load of the heart.

- Drink alcohol in moderation — Excess alcohol intake may lead to elevated pressure. The 1988 Joint National Committee on the Detection, Evaluation and Treatment of Hypertension recommends that an individual with high blood pressure not consume more than one ounce of ethanol daily (two ounces of 100 proof whiskey, eight ounces of wine, or 24 ounces of beer).

- Control stress — Stress reduction may reduce blood pressure. Control of stress may also prevent other stress-related diseases or disorders. It can only help, not hurt. Techniques include relaxation techniques (taped relaxation exercises, relaxation cues, deep breathing, imagery, progressive muscle relaxation) and biofeedback.

Dietary changes, not-smoking, exercising and stress management techniques are helpful strategies to prevent and to control hypertension. If these methods fail to lower your blood pressure sufficiently, medication may be prescribed by your physician.

Remember, treatment controls hypertension — it does not cure it. If you discontinue your treatment plan, your blood pressure will surely rise again. As long as your blood pressure is under control, the risk of serious complications can be reduced.
