Soldier recalls night Scud hit next door in Saudi Arabia

The night a Scud missile destroyed a U.S. Army barracks in Dhahran toward the end of the Persian Gulf War, Spec. Richard Moore was in the building next door.

Moore, a personnel management specialist for Headquarters Detachment, TMDE (Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment) Support Group, recalls the building shook so hard that everybody fell down. At the time, he was standing guard as part of a five-member traveling team of personnel management specialists who cut orders for soldiers arriving in country. They were in a large room with glass windows inside this "Expo Center" barracks building for incoming soldiers. About 50 people were in the building when they heard the explosion.

"When it first hit (the building next door), there was no siren or anything. We thought it was just a Patriot hitting another Scud, knocking another Scud down. But when we went outside to check everything out, we saw the building burning," Moore said. The barracks building, which he estimates was about 100 yards away from the Expo Center, was engulfed in flames and he saw some people running out.

The NCO-in-charge for the team made him and the others return to their building in gas masks because of the possibility there may have been chemicals in the warhead. "We had to stay in masks about an hour and a half," Moore said.

An all-clear sign was given to remove the gas masks. Soldiers from the barracks who did not require hospitalization stayed in the Expo Center that night. Moore learned the extent of the devastation from his commander who was in charge of casualties. The Scud missile Feb. 25 that impacted into the warehouse used by U.S. forces as a barracks in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, had killed 28 and wounded 98 U.S. Army soldiers.

"It shocked me because I never thought I'd be so close to a place where a Scud hit. I never thought one would get through," Moore said. "I felt like (with) the job the Patriots had done, we'd never have a Scud to hit. I felt a lot of confidence in the Patriot — I still do, you know, it was just an unfortunate incident." The

Department of Army announced June 5 that an investigation of Patriot operations concluded an inexact computer software calculation is the most likely explanation as to why the battery did not effectively detect or track the incoming Scud.

Moore was stationed in Dhahran from Jan. 21 through June 4 with the Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 3rd Personnel Group from Fort Hood, Texas. He had been sent from Redstone to Fort McPherson, Ga., Jan. 15 then to Fort Benning, Ga., and from there to Saudi. Sleep came hard in Saudi because of the planes taking off and refueling, and there was the constant worry of possible terrorism, Moore recalls. "I was usually nervous," he said. "It feels good (to be back at Redstone) but it's hard to adapt, to come back to a desk job, relaxed atmosphere." He found that the military training he never thought would come in handy, helped him to survive in Saudi.

The 23-year-old soldier from Jackson, Miss., was greeted at the Huntsville airport June 5 by his wife, Regina, fellow soldiers and civilian workers. They included his commander, Maj. Margaret Withrow, who has since departed for Korea; his first sergeant, SFC Norman McKinney; his supervisor, SFC Ernest Ashford; and co-workers Cpl. Travis Clubb, Sgt. Vincent Ray, Deborah Wallace and Gwendolyn Rhone. "I was just real happy to see them because, you know, sometimes you think you'll never see them again. Your first thought is like: Wow, I made it," Moore said.

A 1986 graduate of Calloway High School in Jackson, Moore joined the Army that August. He is the oldest of four children — three sons and a daughter — of Jeanette Durr of Jackson. He went to Fort Knox, Ky., for basic training; Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind., for advanced individual training; to Garlstedt, Germany, as a strength management (See Hit, cont'd on page 2)

The celebration should prove to be a time of fun and relaxation for everyone. Missile weapon systems such as Patriot, Apache, Multiple Launch Rocket System, etc., will be on display. The halls of building 5681 will be decorated to reflect work activities as well as fun times.

Plans include computer demonstrations in the Executive Conference room. Arts and crafts will be available for viewing. Entertainment is planned for throughout the day. Old-timers — retirees/former employees — will be socializing with everyone. MLC plans to honor civilian and military personnel who served their country during Operation Desert Shield/Storm/Sunset.

Festivities begin at 9 a.m. with the Grand Opening at 10. The remainder of the day will be spent socializing with the special guests and enjoying the various scheduled entertainment, hobbies and arts and crafts. Each MLC organization has \$1 tickets for sale; the ticket entitles the holder to a hot dog, sno cone, soft drinks, popcorn and chips.

"We hope you will be able to join us for this special occasion," stated an open message from Jim Flinn, director of Missile Logistics Center.

The July 1981 realignment established the MLC and a Missile Systems Readiness Directorate through transfer and realignment of existing Weapon Systems

Management Directorate, Targets Management Office, Maintenance Engineering and Material Management Directorates. The once independent functional organizations with sometimes conflicting objectives were now unified under the same director, sharing common goals and objectives.

When first activated, MLC had a manpower authorization of 56 military and 1,296 civilians. Its

current manpower authorization is 60 military and 1,369 civilians.



Swimming safety

Editor:

Please will someone in authority give me a direct and simple answer to the following question. Why is a child who is wearing inflatable armbands and who is accompanied by his/her parent not allowed in the camp swimming pool? I find it extraordinary that I am not allowed to use my own judgment regarding my child's safety. Safety for my child is the reason that I am writing this letter.

I have been shown a sub-clause in the pool regulations which states that floats must be U.S. Coast Guard approved and yes, I agree, that unattended children floating out of their depth on blow-up toys must not be permitted. However I would argue that attached armbands, being used with a parent in atten-

dance and where the child can touch the bottom are safe. It seems to me that the blanket application of a rule makes it more likely for an accident to happen. My child has already had a shock from slipping over. Young children can accidentally be pushed under by older and more lively children. Armbands would help prevent this.

I have talked to several other parents who feel as I do and surely there are many more who feel concerned about this matter. After all one of the main reasons that we take our children to the pool is so that they can learn how to swim! This they will not learn to do whilst wearing a life-jacket.

The pool rules exist for safety. I believe that I have highlighted an area where their rigid application is at best inappropriate and at worst potentially dangerous. Please can someone apply common sense to this matter. I look forward to a reply.

(Editor's note: Michael Chemsak, chief of the Community Recreation Division at Redstone Arsenal Support Activity, provided the following response.

"There are numerous swimming flotation devices on the market and the quality of some is questionable. Coast Guard approved flotation devices offer a standard by which to judge the quality of the equipment. Only Coast Guard approved flotation devices are permitted in Redstone Arsenal swimming pools. A child who does not know how to swim, even when using a flotation device needs the individual attention of an adult. With all the splashing and noise there is at a swimming pool, it is easy for an adult to be distracted.

Base closure commission OKs new jobs here

The Base Realignment and Closure Commission announced over the weekend that it had accepted Army recommendations that could result in more than 1,800 civilian positions being moved to Redstone Arsenal from other commands and agencies.

The recommendations, which had been outlined in April by Secretary of Defense Dick Cheney, are these:

- That armament and chemical functions and about 1,400 associated civilian spaces be moved from Rock Island Arsenal in Illinois to Redstone.

- That missile-related fuze development and about 250 jobs be moved here from Harry Diamond Laboratories in Adelphi, Md.

- That the Materiel Readiness Support Activity at Lexington-Blue Grass Army Depot in Kentucky and the Logistics Control Activity in San Francisco be merged at Redstone into a single agency reporting to Army Materiel Command. About 230 civilian spaces would be moved here by that action.

The BRAC's plan including the recommendations affecting Redstone were forwarded to President Bush July 1. He has 15 days to accept or reject the plan from the commission in its entirety. If he rejects the plan, the commission must submit a revised plan by Aug. 15

and the president must then act on it by Sept. 15.

If the plan is approved by the president, Congress has 45 days to vote to approve or reject it. If Congress takes no action on the plan, it goes into effect automatically and the Department of Defense must begin closing bases and reorganizing under the plan within two years.

The seven-member, base realignment and closure commission voted 5-2 to keep Fort McClellan open for at least two more years.

Local firm fined for false claim

A Huntsville area company has pleaded guilty to submitting a false Material Receiving and Inspection Report with the Department of Defense, according to U.S. Attorney Frank Donaldson.

Military Aircraft Sales Inc. pleaded guilty to one count of submitting a false document to the Department of Defense. U.S. District Judge Clarence W. Allgood ordered the company to pay a \$5,000 fine and cease to do business with the government for a period of two years and not to bid on any new government contracts effective immediately.

The single count information charged the company with submitting a document which claimed that the parts they were making were made via a forging process of aluminum alloy 7075, but in fact the parts were made by a casting process of aluminum alloy AL 356.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael Whisonant. The case was investigated by the U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command's (CID) Huntsville Fraud Team, the Defense Criminal Investigative Service (DCIS), and the Air Force's Office of Special Investigations (OSI).

Civilian layoffs to hit missile school

The Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School will conduct a reduction in force of its civilian work force.

The reduction in force, announced Friday by OMMCS, is caused by budget reductions which resulted in the elimination of a number of civilian spaces.

Sixty-two positions have been identified for elimination. Through the use of vacancies and reassignment of personnel, an estimated 29 civilians will be removed from the OMMCS rolls. Notices are scheduled to be issued July 15 with an effective date of Sept. 27.

Every effort has been made to lessen the impact on the civilian employees and every effort will be made to

help those separated find new jobs, OMMCS said in a news release.

Several placement programs are available to assist employees. The Department of Defense priority placement program is available for employees willing to relocate and work at other installations. The Office of Personnel Management's displaced employee program is available for referral to other federal agencies.

In addition, the Transition Assistance Office on Redstone Arsenal has implemented an Army Career and Alumni Program which is designed to assist military and civilian personnel in finding employment outside of the government.

Initial full-scale production Army TACMS arrives early

DALLAS — The Missiles Division of LTV Aerospace and Defense has delivered the first full-scale production Army Tactical Missile System missile to the U.S. Army.

The Army TACMS missile was delivered five months ahead of schedule and is one of 318 to be delivered under the full-scale production contract awarded to the Missiles Division last November. The contract is valued at \$132.3 million. LTV has delivered 257 Army TACMS missiles to the Army, including missiles for the development program.

The first full-scale production Army TACMS missile was accepted by Col. David F. Matthews, Army TACMS project manager, during a ceremony at LTV's final assembly facility at Horizon City, Texas, near El Paso.

"We're very proud of delivering the first full-scale production missile five months ahead of schedule," said Bud Laughlin, vice president for deep attack programs. "We're also very pleased with the superior job ATACMS did during Operation Desert Storm."

LTV accelerated production of the long-range missile so that it could be deployed for use against high-priority targets during Operation Desert Storm.

In a report to Congress, the Army subsequently called Army TACMS a "priceless asset" which destroyed or rendered inoperable the "very select targets" at which it was fired.

LTV won the competition to design and produce Army TACMS in March 1986 after almost a decade of research and testing. With a range of more than 60 miles (100-plus kilometers), the conventional warhead missile gives battlefield commanders the capability to attack enemy ground targets at long ranges and disrupt the flow of reinforcements.

Each missile is approximately 13 feet long and 2 feet in diameter. The current warhead consists of 950 M-74 high-explosive bomblets, approximately the size and shape of a tennis ball. They are dispersed over the target area, detonating upon impact.

LTV Aerospace and Defense manufactures missile, rocket and space systems; military vehicles and subassemblies for military and commercial aircraft. The 20th largest defense contractor in the United States, it is a subsidiary of The LTV Corporation, a Dallas-based diversified manufacturing company also involved in steel and energy products. Civilians can donate annual leave to deployed reservists

A governmentwide leave-bank program enables federal workers to donate their annual leave to civilian employees who were activated for military service in the Persian Gulf.

Workers here and elsewhere can donate leave to this governmentwide leave bank. The beneficiaries will be federal civilians who were called to wartime military duty in the National Guard and Reserve. July 13 is the deadline for contributing annual leave under the Desert Shield/Desert Storm Reservist Leave Bank Act of 1991, but there might be an extension.

"This (program) will benefit reservists and National Guard personnel who were activated for the Persian Gulf War between 2 Aug. '90 through 30 April '91," said Teresa Greene, an employee relations specialist in the management-employee relations branch at Civilian Personnel Office. The program is not for everyone: only those persons who were activated during that

period and whose military orders were issued under 10 U.S. Code 672(A), 672(G), 673, 673B, 674, 675 or 688. This excludes people who were activated solely for training purposes, Greene added.

Any federal civilian can donate their annual leave to this leave bank by filling out a Standard Form 71 which should be available in their office or their administrative office. Supervisory approval is not needed. All they have to do is date the form, sign it and fill out the amount of leave contributed. The address here to send it to is: AMSMI-PT-CP-ME, building 7437.

People can either donate half of the leave they

already have or half of what they will accrue by the end of the leave year — whichever is the lesser amount, according to Wally Reynolds, a supervisory employee relations specialist. For example, if you already have 20 hours of annual leave and will accumulate 50 more by the end of the leave year, you can donate up to 10 hours. If you already have 100 hours of annual leave and will accumulate 50 more by the end of the leave year, you can donate up to 25 hours. In each example "it's the lesser of those two" half totals, Reynolds said. "It's to protect you so you won't give away all your leave and have just a little left."

Civilian workers who were activated for military duty and may be eligible to receive leave under this program, should also contact the Civilian Personnel Office. They should send a copy of their military orders to AMSMI-PT-CP-ME; building 7437, to ensure they may be included in the program. Records indicate at

Strategic defense test a leap forward for technology


The U.S. Army Strategic Defense Command and the Strategic Defense Initiative Organization have successfully completed the hover test of the smallest and lightest kill vehicle yet developed for the SDI program — the Army's Lightweight ExoAtmospheric Projectile (LEAP).

The fully integrated LEAP projectile was tested June 18 inside a specially designed hangar at SDI Organization's National Hover Test Facility, Phillips Laboratory, Edwards Air Force Base, Calif., according to Lt. Col. Gary J. Hagan, manager for SDC's Hypervelocity Launcher Product Office.

In the seven-second test, the LEAP projectile's divert engines lifted the 6-kilogram projectile 10 feet above the test stand, where it hovered as it tracked a target located outside the test hangar. In maneuvering the projectile, its divert engines fired approximately 100 times. The attitude control engines, which allowed the projectile's seeker to maintain focus on the target, fired more than 1,200 times.

The successful hover test demonstrated that the LEAP projectile components can perform functions such as propulsion, guidance and control, and accurate acquisition and tracking during actual flight. It also demonstrated SDI Organization's continuing progress toward lighter weight, high-performance

miniature exoatmospheric projectiles projected for both strategic and theater missile defense systems.

The LEAP projectile tested at the National Hover Test Facility is one of several advanced technology projectiles being developed under the SDI Organization LEAP program. Its new lightweight high-performance components include a liquid bi-propellant propulsion unit and high density electronics such as an infrared seeker, acquisition and tracking computer, and an inertial measurement unit. At less than 6 kilograms, LEAP is one-third the weight of the projectile tested previously at Edwards.

Two ABM treaty-compliant suborbital space tests of the LEAP projectile will be conducted at White Sands Missile Range, N.M., in late summer. Higher velocity tests of the LEAP projectiles will occur at White Sands and at the U.S. Army Kwajalein Atoll in the Pacific over the next few years.

LEAP acquisition is through the U.S. Army Research, Development and Engineering Center and the projectile is designed, integrated and built by Hughes Aircraft Company Missile Systems Group.



The morning skies were overcast but that didn't reflect the spirit of the participants and the many spectators as the 832nd Ordnance Battalion changed commanders Thursday.

Lee will serve as the OMMCS representative to the office of chief of ordnance.

least 41 local federal civilian employees, in agencies serviced by the Civilian Personnel Office, were activated for military duty.

President Bush signed the Desert Shield/Desert Storm Reservist Leave Bank Act on April 6. Leave is being collected for the bank governmentwide. Office of Personnel Management will divide it up and inform each agency how much each person will receive.



The worldwide Army organization that provides social services for soldiers and their family members will celebrate its 26th birthday this month.

Army Community Service at Redstone plans to observe the anniversary with an open house from 9-11 a.m. July 25. ACS is located in building 3491 on Honest John Road.

Everyone is invited to stop by ACS for the informal open house, walk through the building and pick up a welcome packet. Army Community Service provides such open services on a continuing basis. "I guess you can say we celebrate every day," quipped Frances Howard, the family services program coordinator.

What began 26 years ago as an organization of volunteers has evolved into an agency of professionals along with volunteers. "At first we were just seen as giving out pots and pans," Howard said. "We are seen as a full-service social services organization with professional people providing all types of services.

"We are a commander's program," she said. "ACS is worldwide — overseas and Conus (continental U.S.) — so it's not just here at Redstone."

ACS was established in 1965 to assist commanders in reducing conflicts between a soldier's family responsibilities and duty requirements. The initial support was in the areas of Information and Referral and Relocation Assistance. Over the years, the program has evolved and developed into the commanders' primary vehicle to assess, coordinate, and implement an installation and Armywide soldier and family support system. Today, services are available at 166 ACS centers Armywide.

The 12-member staff at Redstone includes Dr. William Resha, chief of ACS; Juanita Adams, the Army Emergency Relief officer; Dan Kelly, consumer affairs/financial assistance program manager; Sue Paddock, installation volunteer coordinator and family member employment assistance program coordinator; Virginia Dempsey, coordinator for the Total Tots Program and the outreach program; Sal Riccardi, the family advocacy program manager; Howard, coordinator for information/referral followup, the relocation assistance program and the Exceptional Family Member Program; Barbara Mabry, honorary volunteer supervisor; and administrative workers Mozelle Thompson, Norma Dalton who also serves as





Readiness Group members cited for deployment support

Members of Readiness Group Redstone were recognized with awards Friday for their efforts in preparing Reserve and National Guard units for deployment to Saudi Arabia.



Program manager honored for meritorious service

Joe Butler, program manager for the Extended Range Intercept Technology (ERINT) Division of the Kinetic Energy Weapons Directorate, has received the Meritorious Civilian Service award in a ceremony at the Strategic Defense Command.


The Meritorious Civilian Service honor, the second highest Department of the Army honorary award for civilian employees, was presented by Maj. Gen. John Peppers, deputy commander.

A native of Newberry, S.C., Butler was responsible for developing and demonstrating the ERINT-1, a prototype missile and launch control system that could be applied to theater missile defense.

The ERINT-1 program began in March 1988 as a follow-on to evolve the promising technologies developed in the Flexible Lightweight Agile Guided Experiment (FLAGE) program. ERINT is a more robust and more capable missile that will extend the operating envelope over that of FLAGE.

Butler holds a bachelor's degree in math from Lincoln University and a master's in aerospace engineering from the University of Virginia. He has received numerous exceptional and highly successful performance awards and has authored 15 publications. He is a member of Beta Kappa Chi scientific honorary society.

He and his wife, Sharon, have two daughters and a son.





Computer contract stopped by court

A district court in Washington, D.C., has ordered the Army to terminate the contract it awarded in April for a new computer at the Missile and Space Intelligence Center.

The ruling Friday puts an immediate stop to the contract awarded to Technology Applications Inc. of Alexandria, Va. TAI received an eight-year contract, with a maximum amount of \$25.6 million, from the local contracting office April 19.

Grumman Data Systems of Bethpage, N.Y., filed a protest April 29 with the General Services Administration board of contract appeals.

The basis of Friday's ruling was "something about some information was given to IBM that wasn't given to other offerers, which is not true," said Mike Thomason, the contracting officer. He said the Army is issuing a stop-work order to the contractor and will comply with the district court's ruling.





World War I soldier receives belated Medal of Honor

WASHINGTON — A corporal who died during World War I became the first black from that war to receive the Medal of Honor during a recent White House ceremony.

President George Bush presented the military's highest award to Corporal Freddie Stowers, a squad leader in Company C, 1-371st Infantry Regiment, 93rd Division, who died in action Sept. 28, 1918.

Stower's sisters, Georgina Palmer of Richmond, Calif., and Mary Bowns of Greenville, N.C., accepted the award on behalf of their brother. The soldier's great-grandnephew, SSgt. Douglas Warren of the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) — recently returned from Southwest Asia, also attended the ceremony.

"On that September day, Corporal Stowers was alone, far from family and home," Bush said during the ceremony. "He had to be scared; his friends died at his side. But he vanquished his fear and fought not for glory but for a cause larger than himself."

Stowers earned his medal during an attack on Hill 188 in the Champagne-Marne sector of France. A German unit opposing Stowers' unit had faked a surrender to lure Company C into the open, where machine gun fire cut down more than half of the Americans.

Crawling forward under heavy fire, Stowers urged on his soldiers until they reached and destroyed an enemy machine gun nest. Continuing to crawl forward while rallying his men to attack a second trench line, Stowers was mortally wounded by machine gun fire, but he pressed on until he died.

Stowers had been recommended for the Medal of Honor within two years of his death, but the recom-
