## BAT comes to light upon entering development phase

Let's get all the jokes out of the way first. No, the BAT Project Office is not housed in a cave. No, the project manager does not drive a batmobile or wear a mask and cape.

The Army decided to name this newly-declassified, anti-armor submunition "BAT" because it utilizes acoustic sensors much like an actual bat uses its inter-

nal radar system. The moniker is not an acronym; the Army just likes to capitalize missile system names.

"The name was selected by Department of Army after evaluation of a number of candidates," said Thomas Lambert, the deputy project manager. The missile project became public in June when the Army notified Congress, and Congress gave its OK.

"BAT is an anti-armor submunition, a smart sub-

munition," Lambert said. "It utilizes advanced technology of acoustics and infrared to seek out and destroy enemy armor."

The submunition is about 36 inches long, 5 and a half inches in diameter and weighs about 44 pounds. "It's dispensed from several different types of carriers including ATACMS (Army Tactical Missile System) as a candidate and the Tri-Service Standoff Attack Missile," Lambert said. The submunition is dispensed from those systems and autonomously seeks moving armor; it is unpowered, possessing no propulsion or motor. The BAT carriers are launched from the Multiple Launch Rocket System.


"It's a single submunition, (which) contains a dual-shaped charge warhead that is designed to defeat all known armor in a top-attack mode," Lambert said. He explained that it tries to hit its target from the top rather than the side or front. The submunition's main function is to attack armored vehicles such as tanks, armored personnel carriers, and so on.

"It is designed for deep attack; that is, attack moving armor between 100 and 200 kilometers (between 60 and 120 miles) from the battleline," said Lambert.

With the recent completion of a proof-of-principle program, permission was granted by the Office of Secretary of Defense to begin engineering and manufacturing development. Engineering and manufacturing development was formerly known as full-scale development. A contract for about \$344 million was awarded in early June to Northrop Corporation of Hawthorne, Calif., to develop the submunition. The principle subcontractor is Raytheon Company in Manchester, N.H.

BAT has been under development for more than five years, and has been tested extensively at the Naval Weapons Test Center at China Lake, Calif. Northrop, the prime contractor, conducted at least 30 flight tests against stationary and moving targets over the last five years at China Lake. "The tests were successful enough for the Army and OSD (office of secretary of defense) to approve the entering into the engineering and manufacturing development phase," Lambert said. That phase began in June with the award of the contract.

The project office was formed in 1985 to manage (See BAT, cont'd on page 9)

## Project manager for BAT has infantry background

Col. David Trevor Jones is the fourth project manager in the more than five year history of the previously-classified BAT submunition program.

Jones, 48, has an Infantry background and is qualified as an Airborne Ranger and fixed- or rotary-wing aviator. He graduated from West Point in 1965.

"Lead, follow or get out of the way" is Jones' description of his leadership philosophy.

A native of Albany, N.Y., he served as platoon leader, company executive officer, company commander and battalion operations officer for the 24th Division at Augsburg, Germany, from 1965-67. Jones went on to serve as district senior adviser with the U.S. Military Assistance Command (I Corps) from 1968-69. He was company commander with the 197th Infantry Brigade at Fort Benning, Ga., from 1969-70. He served as company commander with the 128th Aviation Company in Oujungbou, South Korea, from 1973-74. From 1974-77, Jones was research and development coordinator at the Ballistic Research Lab, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. He served as battalion executive officer, operations officer, and assistant chief of staff for G-6 in the 9th Infantry Division at Fort Lewis, Wash., from 1978-81.

From 1982-84, Jones served as battalion commander with the 4th Battalion, 20th Infantry

(Mechanized) in Panama. He was staff officer in the office of deputy chief of staff for research, development and acquisition, from 1984-85 at the Pentagon. Jones' next assignment took him to Fort Hood, Texas, where he served as deputy assistant chief of staff for G-3 operations and plans at III Corps from 1986-88. He was chief of staff at Test and Evaluation Command, Aberdeen Proving Ground, from August 1988 to September 1989 before coming to Redstone.

Jones received a master's degree in aerospace engineering from Stanford University in 1972, and a master's in operations analysis-engineering from Stanford in 1973. His military education includes the Infantry Officer, Advance Course in 1970; Fixed and Rotary Wing Flight School, 1971; Command and General Staff College, 1978; Industrial College of the Armed Forces, 1986; and Defense Systems Management College, 1988.


His military awards include the Combat Infantryman Badge, Silver Star, Legion of Merit (one oak leaf cluster), Bronze Star, Purple Heart, and Meritorious Service Medal (three oak leaf clusters).

He and his wife, Patti, have two daughters: Kimberly, 25, and Kristin, 21.

"Skeet (shooting), water-skiing and reading" are his hobbies, he said. "Reading is hobby No. 1."

## Hot and humid

I think the Army Communities of Excellence program is great. All the landscaping and work done on buildings is a real improvement. A lot of money has been invested in revamping the old barracks buildings in the school area. We have been moved into one of these buildings, and it is a luxury to work in a building with new paint and carpet. There is one problem that must be considered in these new surroundings — lack of adequate air conditioning. Our building is constructed in two adjacent wings. One wing has air until noon or 12:30. The other wing has had no air at all this year.

When the buildings were refurbished, all the insides were torn out, and the interior completely redone. Nothing was done to repair/replace the current (old) air conditioning/heating system. In our old building (in the same area) we had to suffer through the hot summer last year with the air out at least one day a week. The story was the same: "The chiller is out." "The parts are on order." "They're working on it." "We don't know, it will be up as soon as they can get to it." "Everybody's is out in that area." This lasted until it was time to turn the heat on. It is not as bad when the heat doesn't work; you can always put more clothes on, you just can't take them off when you get hot in the summer.

Our building custodian called in our air conditioning not long after hot weather began. That was some time in May. We now have three job order numbers. We had someone come to look at the system today (July 15). This was after numerous calls (one to two per week). The service man said he couldn't check the system because everybody's air was shut off because they were replacing a part. Our building custodian went to where they were supposed to be, but no workmen were there.

Could we not spend some of this ACOE money on improving all aspects of our "community"? It is very difficult to work in an environment where it is so hot and humid and you can't move without perspiring. This can really be bad when you have 25-30 people with the same "problem." If I wanted to sweat, I could go home and work for my wife.

## Select health-care program planned

A new way of getting Champus care that will both save money for beneficiaries as well as cut their claims paperwork will soon begin operation in the Huntsville area. This new voluntary health-care benefits program is called Champus Select.

This program is *not* a Champus supplemental program; rather, it's intended to be a less-expensive alternative to the standard Champus program. It will cover five Southeastern states: Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi and Tennessee.

Champus Select will enable beneficiaries to get care from what's called a "preferred provider organization": a group of doctors and hospitals who have agreed to accept lower fees for their services, in an-

icipation of getting more Champus business. They'll also submit claims for beneficiaries. The result of all this will be lower cost-shares and less paperwork for Champus beneficiaries.

In addition to lower costs and no claim filing, Champus Select offers all of the benefits of standard Champus, plus easy access to civilian health care providers when the type of health care required is not available at the local military medical facility.

## Psychiatrist gets 10 years for defrauding health plans

A 62-year-old Virginia psychiatrist who recently pleaded guilty to four counts of defrauding Champus, Medicare, Medicaid and a private insurance plan has been sentenced to 10 years in prison, fined \$100,000, and ordered to pay full restitution to those he defrauded. Dr. Pung S. Liu also admitted unlawfully dispensing a controlled substance.

In another case, a woman who filed six false Champus claims while employed as a patient account clerk in a Pennsylvania hospital was sentenced to a year in jail and three years of supervised release. The clerk, Louise B. Robinson, was also ordered to repay Cham-

pus more than \$12,000 for the fraudulent claims, which listed hospital services never provided to the patient.

In a third fraud case, a Virginia dentist will serve three months in a halfway house, three years of probation, perform 300 hours of community service, and pay nearly \$15,000 in fines, for submitting claims for services not performed to Champus, Medicaid and a private health care plan, over a period of more than three years. Dr. James P. Julian has also paid about \$5,000 in restitution to Champus and the other health plans. (Champus news release)



# Acquisition manager makes Army's honor roll

James Bell was just told to be at the award ceremony. He knew he would be getting an award, but had no idea what type or why. What it turned out to be was the largest honor so far in his career in acquisition management.

Bell received a plaque, certificate and letter signifying his selection to the Army Honor Roll for Acquisition Streamlining Excellence for 1990. The award was for his work as a member of the Follow-On To Lance Project Office which was disbanded last year. He is now assistant project manager for product assurance, test and configuration management in the Army TACMS (Tactical Missile System) Project Office.

"This was a surprise to me," Bell said, referring to the award he received June 25. The Department of Army award was presented by George Williams, the program executive officer for fire support. Chester Domaracki, who had served as deputy project manager for Follow-On To Lance, also participated in the presentation. Domaracki nominated Bell for the award in June 1990; he is now the deputy of the CORPS SAM (Surface-to-Air Missile) Project Management Office. Col. David Matthews, project manager for Army TACMS, was among the attendees at the award ceremony held at the program executive office for fire support.

The award recognized Bell for his "efforts in streamlining the development of the Follow-On To Lance test and evaluation master plan," according to the accompanying letter. In laying out the flight test program for the Follow-On To Lance missile, Bell was able to reduce the number of missiles required for these flight tests thereby saving money. He was able to prepare, coordinate and obtain Office of Secretary of Defense approval of the test and evaluation master plan in time to support the acquisition schedule.

His activities leading to the award occurred in 1989-90. Bell served as acting assistant project manager for product assurance, test and configuration management at Follow-On To Lance from November 1988 until President Bush canceled the program in 1990. He joined the Army TACMS Project Office in July 1990.

"I feel like we had an exceptionally good team in the Follow-On To Lance Project Office as well as the support that we got from the rest of the MICOM missile team," said Bell, a GM-15. "I felt we had developed an acquisition strategy and developed a Request for

Proposals for development and procurement of a Follow-On To Lance missile system, that — if the program hadn't been canceled and we could have implemented our plans — would have resulted in a cost-effective system."

Bell, 48, is a Tennessee native who was born in Chattanooga and raised in Tracy City which is about 50 miles west of Chattanooga. He graduated from Tennessee Technology University in 1966 with a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering. His government career began in August 1966 as an engineer in the quality lab at Marshall Space Flight Center. He came to the Missile Command in December 1967 as an electrical engineer in the industrial engineering division at Procurement and Production Directorate. From there he went to the Army Missile Laboratory in 1971 as a member of the Hellfire concept team in the advanced systems concepts office. Bell became a charter member of the Hellfire Project Office when it was established in 1973 and worked there until June 1986. He went on to the Unmanned Aerial Vehicles Project Office as chief of product assurance, test and configuration management division. Bell then joined Follow-On To Lance in 1988.

He and his wife, Carolyn, have a daughter, Carissa, 16, who will be a senior at Buckhorn High School; and a son, Mark, 13, who is entering the eighth grade at Riverton Middle School. Bell's hobbies include running, riding his horse, and fishing.

"I would like to be able to share my experiences in acquisition management with others who are coming into the acquisition management career field in an effort to encourage and guide them along their careers," Bell said, describing his goal for the future.

## Here's blue-ribbon recipe to teach kids about recycling

# Logistics Center 'talk show' delivers serious message

If you closed your eyes, you might have really thought that you were sitting in the audience at the Arsenio Hall Show as the emcee made his nightly pitch, "Let's get busy!"

John Holden, a systems analyst in budgeting and programming division at Materiel Management Directorate, did his best Arsenio imitation as the Missile Logistics Center kicked off its phase two Total Quality Management efforts. The talk show format enabled an auditorium roomful of MLC workers to have fun while taking care of the serious business of discussing processes and ways of making those processes better.

The panelists included Liz Wilson, a management analyst at Redstone Arsenal Support Activity and member of the Total Quality Management cadre; Marcella Mathis, a TQM officer for the Missile Command; Tommy Cobb, a member of Materiel Management Directorate; and John Howard of Maintenance Engineering Directorate.

"It takes all of us to make Total Quality Management work," Arsenio — uh — Holden told the audience.

# Army Community Service provides relocation assistance

*Editor's note: Army Community Service at building 3491 will observe ACS's 26th anniversary with an open house from 9-11 a.m. Thursday. ACS at Redstone provided the following information for a series of articles about its services.*

Relocation is a major life change and the stress associated with it has a definite impact on organizational management concerns such as recruitment, retention, readiness and morale.

Frequent moves actually constitute a mobile lifestyle that places constant pressure on Army families and creates the need for quality support systems. In order to ensure that the demands of this lifestyle do not decrease readiness, retention, or family well-being, a coordinated, comprehensive relocation assistance program must be provided.

Proactive relocation assistance ensures that transferees have the tools they need to cope with this lifestyle. Therefore, the focus of the Relocation Assistance Program is to ensure the support and management of the transferee, not just before and after the move, but throughout the entire tour cycle.

## Program objectives

The objectives of the Relocation Assistance Program are to:

- Provide a focal point for the coordination and provision of comprehensive relocation assistance to soldiers, family members, reserve components, and to Department of Army civilians where the separate DA civilian relocation assistance program services are not available.
- Provide current information, guidance, counseling, education and training during all phases of the relocation process to include: extensive preparation and planning before the move to prevent soldiers and

families from making uninformed decisions; assistance during the actual transfer period; and facilitating adaptation and "settling-in" to the community.

- Identify, support and assist families who are separated from the military sponsor due to duty requirements.

## Relocation services

Army Community Service provides, coordinates and otherwise ensures quality assistance and support to transferring personnel and their family members. Relocation services are provided on an individual or group basis for soldiers and family members and eligible DA civilians. While relocation counseling is available to both inbound and outbound transferees, the primary focus is on predeparture counseling and relocation planning. As a minimum, soldiers and families preparing for their first permanent change of station or first overseas PCS take into consideration family stability, knowledge of Army relocation policies and procedures, financial readiness, exceptional family member needs, family member employment assistance requirements, educational considerations, housing and transportation issues, and include:

- Assessing the client's individual or family needs and particular relocation circumstances and helping the client plan for their relocation.
- Providing information on the destination area such as schools, housing, spouse employment, community resources, and cost of living. School information for youth includes, to the maximum extent possible, size and population of schools, graduation requirements, honor programs, extracurricular activities, basic grading scales, and vocational/technical and college preparation information.

- Referral, follow up, and advocacy in resolving specific relocation-related programs.
- Providing information prepared by appropriate agencies on entitlement, reimbursements, household goods shipments, and recognizing and dealing with the psychological stress of relocation.

## Newcomers orientation

Other components of the Relocation Program at Redstone Arsenal, include the Relocation Automated Information Systems (RAIS), the Newcomers Orientation program, and the Lending Closet.

Relocation Automated Information Systems is designed to help with counseling, administrative, and management activities associated with providing relocation assistance for inbound and outbound soldiers and their families. Information is available on Army installations worldwide, is computerized, and can be printed out for individual knowledge.

The Newcomers Orientation program is designed to link soldiers and their family members with support service agencies. It validates information through experts. It is mandatory for all newly-arrived permanent party soldiers; family members are encouraged to participate. Child care is free and is provided on site.

The Lending Closet is located at ACS and provides basic housekeeping items for temporary loan to incoming and outgoing families and in other cases as determined to be appropriate. Some of the items include, but are not limited to, basic kitchen items, high chairs, child car seats, play pens, ironing boards, irons and cots.

# Army addresses needs of exceptional family members

Certain myths surround the Exceptional Family Member Program which is among the programs provided at Army Community Service. To help dispel some often misunderstood facts, here are answers to questions asked most often about EFMP:

**Q. What exactly is the Exceptional Family Member Program?**

A. It's a program that provides medical, educational, housing, community support, and personnel services to families with special needs.

**Q. Who are exceptional family members?**

A. They are bona fide military dependents of any age who suffer from an emotional, physical, developmental or intellectual disorder that limits their capability to take part in activities with peers and that requires special treatment, therapy, education, training or counseling.

**Q. You say "any age"? Isn't the program limited to children?**

A. No. Any dependent with a documented disorder can be in the program.

**Q. What about exceptionally gifted children such as musicians or artists?**

A. The program doesn't apply to gifted or talented family members.

**Q. Is enrollment in the program mandatory?**

A. Yes. Enrollment has been mandatory for soldiers with exceptional family members since 1986.

**Q. How does a soldier enroll in the program?**

A. The soldier contacts the nearest medical treatment facility EFMP point of contact for enrollment forms. Once the forms are completed, they are sent to the appropriate regional medical center for coding. The coded information is then forwarded to the U.S. Total Army Personnel Command in Alexandria, Va., where soldiers are officially enrolled in the program.

**Q. Is enrollment permanent?**

A. No. Enrollment must be validated every three years or as often as the needs change. The procedure for revalidation is the same as that for initial enrollment.

**Q. Does enrollment have any effect on the soldier's career?**

A. No. Enrollment in the program does not adversely affect selection for promotion, schooling or assignment. Information concerning enrollment or any of the data used in the program is not made available to selection boards.

**Q. What benefits come from enrollment?**

A. Enrollment allows assignment managers at

PERSCOM to consider the documented special medical and educational needs of family members. When possible, soldiers are assigned to an area where the special needs of their exceptional family members can be met. This will depend upon the valid personnel requirements for the soldier's grade, military occupational speciality/special skill identifier and eligibility for the tour. All soldiers still are eligible for worldwide assignments.

**Q. Are special education needs always considered in the personnel assignment process?**

A. No. Special education needs are considered only in assignments outside the United States. Assignments within our 50 states and trust territories are not based on the educational needs of children. To do so would unfairly burden those military and civilian communities chosen to receive children requiring special education. Every local school system must obey public laws regarding the provision of special education.

**Q. Where do families turn for help when their children aren't receiving the required special education services in our 50 states and trust territories?**

A. Families may go to the installation EFMP coordinator, who generally is in Army Community Service.

## Program serves as avenue to community resources

Soldiers and their families require ready access to information that will assist them in meeting their basic needs and improving the quality of their lives.

Frances Howard is the program manager at Redstone for the Information, Referral and Followup service. She reports that many activities in the military and civilian community provide information and referral services, and together function as an integrated system of services and service delivery.

Army Community Service is the commander's primary coordinating service agency and maintains a cooperative relationship with many public, private, and voluntary information and referral agencies, in order to provide efficient service for the entire community.

The program objectives are to: provide com-

manders, soldiers, and families with information regarding military and civilian community resources; and, link soldiers and families with available and appropriate resources at the lowest cost and without duplication of effort.

Simple or complex information will be provided in response to inquiries. Howard says simple information is that which requires a limited response, such as an organizational name, telephone number, and address; in such cases, it is not necessary to obtain additional information from the client to answer the question and no problem is presented. No outgoing calls are made in relation to this type of inquiry and there is no follow-up.

For the client who presents a problem, an assess-

ment is made to provide a referral. Referrals may be simple or complex. Simple referral is made when there is reasonable assurance that the client is competent enough to follow the referral without assistance and that service is available at the level required within the necessary time frame. Otherwise, the request is considered as a complex referral. An outgoing call is made on behalf of the client and follow-up occurs. Howard says follow-up will consist of contacting the referral agency and the client to find out whether or not contact has been made and if the service is being provided. She says it is important to note that if linkage has not occurred, an offer of advocacy on behalf of the client is made to assist them in obtaining needed service.

## Full range of child care services available

Child Development Services offers a wide range of child care options for the military and civilian family at Redstone Arsenal. Full-day and hourly care services are available.

Redstone Arsenal Support Activity provided the following information about these services:

The CDS administrative office, building 257 on Wesson Circle (phone 876-3704), coordinates all Child Development Services for Redstone Arsenal.

Child Development Center is operated for family members of active-duty or retired military personnel with limited services for Defense Department civilians. Children age six weeks to 12 years, must be registered prior to their being admitted for the first time. The center offers a full-day and an hourly care developmental program with degreed teachers and aides in every age group. The center can be reached at 876-7947/7952.

Family Child Care Program is a professionally managed network of individuals providing child care

in government quarters. All FCC providers receive 20 hours of instruction in such topics as cardiopulmonary resuscitation, nutrition, and early childhood development before being professionally certified. In addition, providers receive ongoing in-service training. The FCC program offers parents flexible hours to include weekends, evenings, extended hours, hourly, full-day, and special needs child care. This service is available to active duty, retired military, and federally-employed families with children age four weeks through 12 years. Call 876-9298/7880.

Supplemental programs and services include the School-Age/Latch Key Program. This program provides before or after school care, a full-day program for teacher in-service days, and school holiday care for children in kindergarten through age 12. For more information about this program, call 876-2752/7889.

what was then a classified program. It is currently authorized to have 46 civilians and six military members. Plans are to expand to about 68 civilians and six military by fiscal 1993.

Col. David T. Jones is the project manager, and Lambert is the deputy PM. Timothy Summers serves as assistant project manager for product assurance and test. Gary Hitchcock is the chief engineer, and James Coble is chief of the program management division. The project office reports to George Williams, the program executive officer for fire support, and the deputy PEO, Col. Tom Devaney.


Its first project manager, Lt. Col. Charles Vaughn, served in that capacity from the then-classified program's inception until December 1986. His successor

was then-Lt. Col. Earl Finley who served as PM from December 1986 to March 1988. Finley was succeeded by Lt. Col. Roy Millar who served as project manager from March 1988 until September 1989, when Jones took the reins.

"It's estimated it (BAT) will go into production in mid-'90s. The total number to be procured is classified, and it has not as yet been offered to NATO

How effective will BAT be when it spreads its wings? "Testing to date has indicated that the capability far exceeds the ROC (required operations capability) requirements' specified effectiveness," Lambert asserted.



# Virginia revises tax law affecting non-residents

Attention all non-residents holding property in the state of Virginia! New legislation has been passed which now affects your income tax responsibility. In 1990, the Virginia Code Section 58.1-317 was passed and became effective July 1, 1990.

For purposes of this section, non-resident includes any one of the following:

- Non-resident individuals — persons who are not domiciled in Virginia or who live in Virginia for less than 183 days during the taxable year.
- Non-resident estates and trusts — estates and trusts administered outside of Virginia or relating to other than a Virginia domicile.

- Partnerships and S-corporations which have any non-resident partners or shareholders.
- And corporations which are not formed or organized under Virginia law.

## Law's requirements

In general, the new legislation requires all non-residents, having property in Virginia for which they receive rental payments of at least \$600, to register receipt of this money, using Form R-5, with the Virginia Department of Taxation. The owner of such property is "directly" responsible for registering with the department unless a broker is involved in the transaction. If a broker is involved, the responsibility shifts to the broker and he becomes subject to a \$50 per month fine for failing to properly register.

The new legislation also extends to bring within its coverage those non-residents selling property held in Virginia. Once again, registration is "required" subject to the same penalties applicable for failure to register income received from rent.

## Lone exemption

The only exemption to the registration rule applies to the individual who lives outside of Virginia but keeps Virginia as his domicile or whose transactions are not subject to federal or Virginia income taxes. Persons exercising the right to this exemption must fill out and file the exemption certificate, Form R-5E, with the Virginia Department of Taxation.

Anyone having questions concerning their status or responsibility as a non-resident in Virginia can consult with an attorney at the Redstone Arsenal Office of the Staff Judge Advocate. To make an appointment, call the Legal Assistance Office at 876-9015. The Legal Assistance Office has requested the above mentioned Virginia tax forms from the Virginia Department of Taxation, and upon receipt the forms will be available in the Legal Assistance Office.

# Redstone Arsenal's Bicentennial Chapel gets its first stained glass window

A project to add stained glass windows to Bicentennial Chapel has reached its first milestone, thanks to a continuing community effort.

The Bicentennial Chapel Historical Society presented the first stained glass window at a ceremony held Sunday afternoon, July 7. Maj. Gen. William Chen, commander of the Missile Command and Redstone Arsenal, accepted the window from George Turnmeyer, a retired major general who serves as president of the Bicentennial Chapel Historical Society.

Bicentennial Chapel is a religious center for military personnel of Redstone Arsenal, and serves as a cornerstone of patriotic, historical heritage for both

military and civilian people. A non-profit organization, the historical society was formed in 1988. The idea was "to promote community involvement in the historical recognition and preservation of the religious heritage of this community and the United States Army," according to a chapel news release.

The local community provided sufficient funds to permit the historical society to donate a major stained-glass window for placement over the chapel entry. This window — in keeping with the bicentennial theme of the chapel — shows General George Washington in prayer at Valley Forge. Thirteen additional stained glass windows, also with themes relating to the original 13 colonies, are planned for installation beginning in 1992.

"These stained glass windows will serve as a continuing reminder of the Huntsville Community's appreciation for our military and government personnel, their dedicated service to the nation and their contribution not only to our national security but also to the unequalled quality of life in Madison County," the chapel release states.

# 832nd Battalion commander puts his soldiers first

The new commander of 832nd Ordnance Battalion says any policy changes he makes are aimed toward the well-being of the soldiers in the battalion.

Lt. Col. Joe Paddock took command of the 832nd on June 27. He leads an advanced-individual-training battalion of about 1,200 soldiers at the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School.

"If you honestly take care of your soldiers, and believe in them, they will take care of you," Paddock said. "This is what I try very hard to practice. The other thing that helps me is to always let my soldiers

maintain their dignity; don't put them into a position where you take that away from them.

"Both (of these leadership endeavors) are a lot easier said than done," he added.

"In the future, we are going to be asked to do a lot more, with a lot less," Paddock said of impending personnel reductions. "If we don't do the smart things today to prepare for this, may God have mercy on those that are left in the organizations.

"This is the time that we must look inwardly and find out where the non-value is added, and then eliminate it," he said.

The Persian Gulf War gave U.S. weapons a chance to be proven in battle. At the same time, soldiers had their chance to prove their worth. "We always knew that they could do it, but until you actually see them do it, you cannot really appreciate how good a group they really are," Paddock said. "The results reinforce the training we have given the soldiers."





# Exchange shoppers promised 'best price' in town

The Redstone Arsenal Post Exchange wants customers to know about its policy to beat local stores' advertised prices. However, it's important that people

understand the guidelines that govern "best price."

If a customer brings in a printed flyer from a local store advertising for less money an item identical to one found in the PX, the item can be bought at the other store's price during the time of the store's sale, said Felicia Orr, PX training coordinator.

"The key word here is identical. The ad must give model number, size, etc. We can't and won't match someone's price if their ad doesn't spell out specifically what the item is," she said.

For example, the PX won't match a discount store's ad price on pine bark at \$1.69 per bag. The store's ad must give a brand name and the bag weight.

Also, the PX can't match a store's ad for flat percentage off items; for example, a store advertising 25 percent off a certain name brand.

Orr stressed that best price applies in the local area — Huntsville and Madison. "We don't match the advertised prices of stores in Boaz, or Guntersville or any other area. Only the local area."

Other exclusions are gimmick promotions, one of a kind items, double and triple coupons, clearance items, going out of business sales and grand opening specials, Orr said.

The way to take advantage of best price is to bring in a copy of the printed ad and buy the item for the com-

petitor's price during the time that store's price is in effect.

This policy applies to the main PX but not in the shoppette, Class VI store, gas station and other PX-operated stores, Orr said.

"There's been some confusion about how best price works since we started it early this year," she said. "If people have questions we want them to ask. Bring in the ads and we'll honor them if we can; if we can't we'll tell them why."

"We hope people will comparison shop," said Kim Sumpter, sales and merchandise manager. "So far we haven't been out that much having to meet a competitor's price. PX prices are an average 22 percent lower than the competitors. We want people to know we're here to serve them and to help them when we can."



# Korean War vet memorial design finally approved

After more than two years of changes, the design for the Korean War Veterans Memorial was approved in April and the artist conception finished in early May.

The memorial will be built on the Washington (D.C.) Mall in a 2.2-acre section south of the Reflecting Pool near the Vietnam Veterans and Lincoln memorials. The design was approved by the memorial advisory board and several organizations charged with District of Columbia affairs, such as the national Capital Planning Commission and National Capital Memorial Commission.

Groundbreaking ceremonies are scheduled for Veterans Day, Nov. 11, 1991. The memorial will be built with private funds under the auspices of the American Battle Monuments Commission.

The 230-foot-long design features 38 larger-than-life-sized bronze statues of troops; their number represents the 38th Parallel, the demarcation of North and South Korea. Figures in the 180-foot-long column formation represent all services. The statues will reflect on a long brown granite wall with inscriptions that honor nurses and other specialists not represented in the troop formation. South Korean combat troops are also represented.

"It honors those who fought and survived and those who didn't make it home, including those still listed as missing in action," said retired Army Gen. Richard G. Stilwell, chairman of the memorial's advisory board. "Among the more significant features are the war-weary emotions on the faces of the statues. We'll also

have an accurate breakdown of the ethnic diversity of our armed forces during the war, including five African Americans, five Hispanics, two Asians and two American Indian statues."

The column of war-weary combat troops march toward a circular pool and American flag at one end of the memorial. Stilwell said the pool pays a simple, solemn tribute to the 38,000 Americans killed or missing in action and to the 4,000 who endured and survived as prisoners of war.

"It's a long-awaited recognition of victory achieved on the battlefield," said Stilwell, a Korean War veteran who eventually ended his military career as commander of the 8th U.S. Army, U.S. Forces/Korea and United Nations Command. He and historians point out the goals of the U.N. resolution under which the United States fought were to repel the invasion of South Korea and to restore its territorial integrity. Those goals were achieved, though the toll was high: More than 54,200 Americans died of all causes, and another 103,284 were wounded.

"The strategic results of that three-year war have been enormously favorable to the United States and the Free World. We saved 40 million human beings from being overrun by communists," Stilwell said. "We laid the foundation for the development of the very formidable Republic of Korea — a major player on the world scene today. I remarked at the Seoul Olympic Games that the playing fields of 1988 were made possible by the battlefields of 1950 to 1953.

"It was a vicious war," he continued. "The number

of our killed in action was about the same as the number killed in Vietnam, but ours were incurred in a much shorter period of time — just over three years (June 1950 to July 1953).

"The memorial will highlight a phase of military history that, for a moment, was forgotten," Stilwell said. In a staunch patriotic tone, he added the memorial will positively project the spirit of service, sacrifice and dedication to the cause of freedom that characterized all participants.






# Don't go broke trying to fix bad credit

Sgt. Mary Smith has been turned down for credit three times and can't understand why. She's tempted to call that credit repair company she saw advertised on television.

Bill Jones declared bankruptcy a few years ago. His life is in order now and he'd like to get credit, but he, too, is having problems. He's also tempted to call a credit repair company.

Don't do it, said consumer experts at the Federal Trade Commission. Some credit repair companies charge as much as \$200 before they do anything for a client. Some have taken money and disappeared. Many charge for advice or services that are already available free.

If Smith is being turned down because her credit record is inaccurate, she can correct the situation herself for little or no money. But even if she needs help, going to a credit repair company would probably be a big mistake, because the military services offer free financial advice to service members and their families.

Perhaps the easiest way for Smith to find out why she's been denied credit is to ask whoever turned her down, the consumer experts said. The problem may be an easily corrected mistake. If she can't get an explanation, Smith should call a local credit bureau, the experts advised — her credit union or bank or a local store can identify one, or she can look in the Yellow Pages under "Credit Bureaus" or "Credit Reporting Agencies."

With a copy of the credit-denial letter and proof of identity, Smith can obtain a copy of her credit report. Some credit bureaus will furnish free copies only to

consumers denied credit within the past 30 days; others do not impose a time limit. If the bureau charges a fee, the typical range is \$5 to \$20 — a lot less than paying \$200 or more to a credit repair company.

A spokesperson for Credit Bureau Inc., one of the nation's largest credit organizations, said the most common error in people's records is mistaken identity.

"This often happens to people with common names. Or if a father and his adult son have the same name and live in the same house, the creditor may report information on the son to us as information on the father," the spokesperson said. "We have to rely on information from creditors, and not all of them are equally careful.

"For example, they may fail to check the customer's Social Security number. Thus, a responsible John Doe could get knocked down for the actions of an irresponsible John Doe. We're happy to fix consumers' records for free when they call attention to such errors. We can usually straighten out their records quickly," added the spokesman.



If Smith doesn't understand something in her report, federal law requires the credit bureau staff to explain it. If a mistake is found, she should provide as much information as possible to show why it is wrong. For example, if her record shows she failed to pay a bill, she can send the bureau a copy of her canceled check to prove otherwise. The bureau must reinvestigate such disputes at no charge and correct any mistake or delete any information it can't verify.

In some cases, the credit bureau's information may be accurate but incomplete. For instance, Smith may have paid a bill late, but only because her mail was forwarded incorrectly after a permanent-change-of-station move or some other extenuating circumstance. She can file a written statement of up to 100 words with the credit bureau to explain her side. The explanation will be included in her credit report, and it may help, especially if the rest of her records indicate she's responsible in using credit.

If Bill Jones can't get credit because he declared bankruptcy, he may have to wait until time clears his record. Bankruptcy information is kept for 10 years, after which it should be erased. Other unfavorable information, such as late payments, is kept for seven years.

Credit repair companies cannot remove adverse information if it's accurate, so those that make such promises are lying, the Federal Trade Commission experts said. Companies that claim to be the only way to rid credit records of old or inaccurate information are also lying, they added. The FTC and several states have sued many credit repair companies for such fraud. A credit counselor suggested checking with the Better Business Bureau about complaints before using a commercial credit repair company.

One of these, the Consumer Credit Counseling Service, has offices nationwide and often works with military financial counselors and relief societies.
