## Alternative work schedule could start in November



Thousands of local Army civilians could have the chance to change to a work schedule that would enable

them to have a Friday off each pay period, pending higher headquarters' approval of a union-management agreement.

**VOLKSTRUCK** — People can't believe Jim Fisher's custom truck seats four...until he opens the rear compartment and reveals a rumble seat. He started with a '69 VW, cut away the back and built on a box bed. Fisher says the vehicle represents a lot of effort but not much money, since the framework beneath the shiny fiberglass is fabricated from scrap lumber, wall paneling and other cast-off materials. "I've just got to be building," says Fisher, 42, a mail clerk in building 4488 who exercises his creative side by crafting custom vehicles. Earlier projects have included a street rod, a hovercraft, and a propeller driven sports car. He and his wife, Rosmarie, live in Ardmore. The rumble seat is for their daughters, Shelly, 11, and Casey, 9.

Alternative Work Schedules could go into effect in November if the higher headquarters for the various activities involved find the AWS agreement includes no violations of law or regulation. Army Materiel Command, Troop Support Agency, Information Systems Command and Department of Army are among the headquarters who have a maximum of 30 days by law to review the agreement signed by all parties Aug. 30 and Sept. 3.

"If things go smoothly and the approval is given within the 30 days, we expect it to be implemented sometime around the first to mid-November," said Ashley Tyson, a labor relations specialist in the management-employee relations branch of Civilian Personnel Office. The agreement results from two years of negotiations between the American Federation of Government Employees Local 1858 and management.

Under AWS, bargaining unit employees would have two choices. They could either continue to work their current eight hours per day, five days per week schedule; or they could decide to change to a 5-4/9 schedule. This compressed work schedule would mean working nine hours per day for eight days of a pay period; eight hours for one day in the period; and have

## Post commander OKs proposed bypass across Redstone

A proposal that would allow the city of Huntsville to route a north-south bypass across Redstone Arsenal has been endorsed by local Army officials.

The proposed road would skirt the Arsenal east boundary from Buxton Road, cross Martin Road and then turn west along the line of Neal Road, Toftoy Thruway and Rideout Road to connect with I-565.

Maj. Gen. William Chen has agreed to recommend that the Secretary of the Army approve the bypass subject to certain conditions such as that the city and state pay for the road and that the Army determine its specific route across the Arsenal.

State Highway Director Perry Hand said in Huntsville last week that the state would build the road and fund it 100 percent. Estimated cost is \$165 million. The construction timetable is not known.

The road would be a limited access route with exits including one near the site for the proposed Sparkman Center administrative complex. The section of road to be constructed first would extend from I-565 to Martin Road.


The Sparkman Center, meanwhile, is funded at \$67.6 million in the Defense appropriations bill awaiting the president's signature. The timetable for it anticipates requesting proposals in October, taking bids in January, selecting a contractor in May and starting construction in June with completion in about two years.

By allowing the north-south bypass to come onto the Arsenal, the Army will save millions of dollars in road construction that would have been necessary for the Sparkman Center which will have a working population of about 5,000.

The city and state will also save a lot of money by not having to purchase right of way.

The route under proposal for the bypass before Redstone Arsenal became an option did not come onto

Army property except to cross a corner near Gate 10 before following Jordan Lane north to I-565.





## Hospital care

### Editor:

On Aug. 6 my husband, Norman, was taken from his office to Fox Hospital by a fellow worker because he was unstable on his feet. When Walt Ford arrived at Fox emergency room with him, Walt was asked if Norman needed to be brought through emergency. After a brief discussion, he was seen by a doctor and tests were ordered. After the tests were received, it was then decided that he needed a cat scan. At this point, my husband was placed in a van, not an ambulance, without medical personnel, and taken to Lincoln County Hospital for a cat scan because the military has their contract with them. When I arrived at Lincoln County Hospital, Norman was standing outside in the heat and was still not under any medical supervision. I brought Norman back to Fox with the test results from Lincoln County. When the doctor at Fox looked at the results his reply was, just as I thought, the scan is clear except for a stroke. At this point, another doctor was called in to examine my husband and we were told that they wanted to admit Norman for observation — even though the neurologist was not going to be available for several days. At this point, I told the doctor it was my desire to take my husband to Humana so that he could be properly treated and to see a neurologist. Now, keep in mind that through this entire ordeal, my husband was disoriented and so unstable on his feet that he had to be supported when he walked. When we started to leave Fox, we were told he would have to walk from the emergency room to the record room to sign for his medical records — please, he had just been diagnosed as having had a stroke — what was going through the minds of these idiots. It was finally decided that his daughter could get the records with his ID card — which she did. We requested Fox to notify Humana that we were bringing him to the emergency room and what their diagnosis was. Upon arriving at Humana, we found no one had called and notified the hospital so that meant more time explaining the story. When my husband was finally taken into the emergency room, it was an immediate diagnosis that he had in fact had a stroke. When I talked to the doctor in emergency, he said that the scan done in Fayetteville would have to be redone because it was so unclear.

After my husband's neurologist ran another cat scan, an EEG, and a test for artery blockage in his neck, they discovered that the right artery in his neck was totally blocked and that he, in fact, did have a second stroke from the time he left Lincoln County Hospital and the time the second scan was run the

following morning. This hospital stay was followed by a week in a local rehabilitation hospital — which, at this point, it has not been determined if our primary insurance will cover.

However, there is a bright side to this tale of horror. Luckily, the strokes were on the right side of my husband's brain; and hopefully, he will recover completely. I have watched him struggle to do the slightest task and I wonder if the second stroke could have been avoided if Fox had acted with a lot more concern. During my encounters with the doctors at Fox, I felt like they didn't give a damn.

My question is this: If the doctors at Fox did in fact suspect stroke, why in hell was he not sent to a local facility for a scan? I realize that the contract with Lincoln County is done to save money. What money did they save when another scan had to be done because of poor quality. What about emergencies? Does a life not mean more than a dollar? I wonder how the doctors at Fox would feel if a member of their family had been shuffled and carted around like my husband with a diagnosis that they gave to me.

My husband gave this country 27 years of faithful service and what was he given in return — nothing. I'm angry about the treatment he has received and I won't just stop with this letter. I intend to send letters to anybody with any power that will listen to me. It's high time that these people take responsibility for their actions — a civilian doctor would already be in court for malpractice for such gross negligence. I'm lucky, I stood up to the fools at the hospital and I have my husband still; will the next person be so lucky?

A final word of advice: If you think you have a serious illness, you would be crazy to let anyone at Fox Hospital touch you. They have seen Norman their last time; my husband can't be replaced and he deserves nothing but the best!

*(Editor's note: Col. Percy Dunagin, commander of Fox Army Community Hospital, provided the following response. "We greatly sympathize with the anxiety and frustration Mr. Taylor's family has experienced due to his recent illness. Moreover we welcome any suggestions or criticism relating to our operations. My review indicated that Mr. Taylor was properly diagnosed and treated at Fox Army Community Hospital consistent with the urgency, severity, and nature of his illness. Based on recommendations from our Internal Medicine Specialist, the family decided to seek admission to Humana Hospital for observation and rehabilitation. Mrs. Taylor correctly pointed out limitations we have in our ambulance service. On that occasion we had only one fully equipped ambulance for emergency use and therefore transported Mr. Taylor to the site of the CAT scan by a patient transport vehicle, which was entirely consistent with*

*Mr. Taylor's medical condition. The observed changes in the CAT scans done a day apart are an expected progression of the event which occurred several days before Mr. Taylor reported to the Emergency Room on Aug. 6 and do not represent additional or worsening of the patient's illness. Like most hospitals in the United States we are constantly faced with the necessity to obtain the most effective use of our health care dollars, and we anticipate continuing emphasis on cost effectiveness in the future. We have been able to obtain CAT scan services at a considerable cost savings at a site 35 miles away from Redstone Arsenal. The reduced cost allows us to provide this procedure to greater numbers of beneficiaries. Furthermore, because this facility has immediate openings, it provides more rapid service to our patients. We are, however, greatly concerned with the question Mrs. Taylor raised about quality of CAT scans. We will not elect to reduce quality in favor of reduced cost, and my staff is presently investigating the comparative quality of CAT scans available to us. Hopefully this issue will be resolved when we obtain our own CAT scan instrument sometime next year. Once again, we appreciate Mrs. Taylor's concerns and the opportunity to evaluate our health care processes so that we may provide better services to the community."*

## Official vehicle parking permits expire Oct. 31

If you have an official vehicle parking permit for Redstone, you'll need to get a new permit soon.

All existing official vehicle parking permits — AMSMI-RA form 2337 dated Feb. 1, 1990 — and all previous editions will expire Oct. 31. New permits should be obtained before Oct. 31, according to Bobby Noles, the traffic specialist for Directorate of Engineering and Housing.

Permits can be obtained by submitting a letter of request to AMSMI-RA-EH-MP-PC (Attn: Bobby Noles). The request should state the number of permits requested, building number and name and phone number of the person responsible for these permits.

The new blue and white permits will be good for two years, Noles said.

Official Vehicle Permits are issued to organizations that have people using their private vehicles for official business on Redstone Arsenal. This permit should be displayed on the driver's side of the dashboard when parking in an official vehicle parking space.

Official vehicle parking permits are valid at any building on post except the building at which the user is assigned.

Permits are not sent through mail service; they should be picked up at building 7613 in room 213 after notification that permits have been processed and are ready.

Redstone hunters can hone their shooting skills during the Outdoor Recreation Activity Day set for Sept. 21.

Events will include a turkey/ham shoot, a trap and skeet clinic and a retrieving demonstration.

...e day off. The agreement states that the off day could be Friday; once your supervisor determines whether you would be off either the first or second Friday, you would normally be off the same Friday each pay period. Supervisors can determine how many of their workers will be off the first Friday, and how many the second Friday. Most supervisors will probably opt for the 50/50 approach, Tyson said.

Most workers on the compressed work schedule would come to work between 7 and 8 a.m., depending on their selected starting time which would be available in 15-minute intervals. They could decide to come to work at 7, 7:15, 7:30, 7:45 or 8. Those who currently come to work between 8 and 9 may be allowed to continue their present start time.

Current employees will have the option of trying a compressed work schedule for three months then returning to their old flexitour if dissatisfied. They can turn to their old starting time of 6:30 a.m., for example, after the first try. If they try a compressed work schedule again and decide to go back to flexitour, they would in most cases then be restricted to starting work between 7 and 8 a.m. New employees, whether they choose a compressed work schedule or not, would only be able to start work between 7 and 8 a.m.

If a holiday occurs during a pay period, that day would become the eight-hour day for the pay period. If the holiday falls on your normal Friday off, you would take your holiday on another day.

The agreement covers bargaining unit employees of the Missile Command, Information Systems Command-MICOM, Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment (TMDE) Activity, Commissary, Program Executive Office for Air Defense and PEO for Fire Support, among others. This represents an estimated 6,500 Army civilians.

"Based on mission and workload requirements, individual employees or group employees may be excluded from participation in this Alternative Work Schedule program," Tyson said. He added that the agreement does not cover part-time employees or employees outside the Huntsville area.

Workers who are not within the bargaining unit include such groups as supervisors, personnelists (such as staffing specialists), and some employees involved in intelligence work. Activity chiefs will determine whether or not these non-bargaining unit people will be allowed to participate in the same AWS as bargaining unit employees.

"There's going to be a lot of situations we're going to have to deal with on a case-by-case basis," Tyson

said, referring to implementation of Alternative Work Schedule.

When AFGE Local 1858 initially asked management to negotiate proposed Alternative Work Schedules, management refused on the grounds that flexitour already represented such a schedule. Under flexitour, workers can choose to come to work anytime between 6:30 and 9 a.m. The union, after management's refusal, filed an unfair labor practice charge and management subsequently agreed to come to the negotiating table. Negotiations began Oct. 31, 1989.

Wendell Hopkins, president of AFGE Local 1858 since last April, was one of the original members of the negotiating team. "Many posts, camps and stations have already had AWS," Hopkins said. "It's been proven to be good at those places for morale, and giving people a day off once every pay period. Why not have it for our people?"

"I think it's a great thing for the employee," he said. "It gives the employee the same treatment at this post that they have at other locations. The trend governmentwide is to loosen up some strings so people can take care of their kids, make a doctor's appointment. It also decreases the amount they have to travel. We have several hundreds of people that live in outlying areas like Scottsboro, Arab, Fayetteville, Decatur and Hartselle. That gives them one day a pay period they can save on a tank of gas and stay home."

He expects that most workers who become eligible for AWS will opt for the compressed work schedule. "I'd say 60 to 75 percent," he estimated.

The AWS agreement is "definitely a victory for the union," Hopkins said. "It's probably the best victory the union's gotten here at Redstone in several years."

After negotiations ended in a deadlock, a mediator was called in to determine the starting time: whether workers would come to work at 6:30 a.m., as the union requested, or 7 as management wanted. "He couldn't satisfy and get both sides together. Then it had to go back to the impasses panel again; they made the final determination as to what it would be," Hopkins said. The Federal Impasses Panel decided that the starting time would be 7 a.m.

Vicki Fuller was the union's chief negotiator for the final three months of negotiations. She succeeded Jim Brothers as negotiator when Brothers served as union president upon the retirement of Dennis Garrison. Management's chief negotiator was Buford Jennings of Research, Development and Engineering Center.

Local federal activities that already have AWS for their employees include the Strategic Defense Command, the Missile and Space Intelligence Center, Management Engineering Activity, and certain elements of Marshall Space Flight Center.

# Redstone rings in Constitution Week next Tuesday

Local church bells and special activities on post will ring in the celebration of Constitution Week, Sept. 17-23.

# Weapons management deputy receives recognition

Dr. Eugene Paro II, third quarter recipient of the Weapon System Management Award, received his certificate from Army Materiel Commander Gen. William Tuttle during a ceremony Aug. 29 at MICOM headquarters.

The awards were established at all AMC subordinate commands by direction from Tuttle, who has worked to instill the weapon system management concept into AMC during his tenure as commander.

The award recognizes individuals whose performance best reflect professional excellence, service to weapon system management and contributions to MICOM's and AMC's acquisition and sustainment missions in support of the Army.

Paro is deputy director of MICOM's newest directorate, Weapon Systems Management Directorate. It was formed in 1989 to intensively manage readiness and effectiveness of older weapon systems. These include Hawk, Chaparral, Improved-TOW Vehicle, Lance and Dragon.

Paro's career has included service in the military, and in the private and public sectors as a civilian.

After graduation in 1953 from the U.S. Naval Academy where he received awards in football, basketball and boxing, Paro was commissioned a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps. During the next 24 years he had a wide variety of assignments, including commanding a battalion of 3rd Division Marines in Vietnam in 1969-70.

Paro retired from the Marine Corps in 1977 as a colonel and spent five years working in private industry. In 1982 he joined the Strategic Defense Command in the Plans, Analysis and Evaluation Office. In 1985 he became deputy director of MICOM's Pershing Project Office. Paro was instrumental in forming the WSMD and developing its operating methodology.

"Our mission is to keep the weapon systems assigned to us ready and effective. Our systems still require intensive management because they're very important to our operating forces," Paro said.

"The weapon systems we manage usually require a multidiscipline approach to management. For example, they may still need engineering or product assurance support. During Desert Storm we found certain shortcomings in some of our systems and we're working on upgrades," Paro said.

"All this brings up the interesting question: Do we keep and upgrade our older weapons, or make the decision to replace them with new systems? Is the new system worth the money it would cost to build it? It's a trade-off," Paro said.

He said the weapons the directorate manages may be old but they are "what we fight with."

Both sides of the case can be successfully argued, but in view of the lean times ahead for defense spending, Paro said that perhaps we should consider the case of the North Vietnamese.

"They didn't have very good equipment but they knew how to use what they had and they made it tough for us. It's often how you fight your weapons that makes the difference," Paro said.

"We have to look at what our mission is, look at all the resources that directly contribute to our mission and ask if our resources are adequate. Anything that doesn't directly contribute to our mission must be a candidate for elimination.

"Our role in life is readiness. That's a statement of fact and mustn't be confused with willingness, which is a state of mind."

Paro is the son of a retired Navy admiral. His wife, the former Virginia Tabor, is the daughter of Jim "Rawhide" Tabor, former all-star baseball player with the Boston Red Sox. They have two children, John and Victoria, both of whom are in college.

Paro enjoys all kinds of music, particularly classical and opera, and plays piano. He said he aspired to become a classical pianist during his boyhood but his father said no.

In his spare time Paro is interested in old post and beam houses and pursues building this type structure as a sideline business, he said. He also enjoys sailing.

# Military retiree families have their day this weekend

Military retirees and their family members are invited to Redstone Saturday for the annual event in which they can get updates on services available to them.

Redstone's 15th annual Military Retiree Activity Day will be held from 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday at the Officers Club. As in past years there will be a guest speaker, a services panel and county-fair-style information tables.

"It's to have involvement from the retirees within the community and to update them on different topics," said Sgt. Maj. James Blackwood, the sergeant major for Military Personnel Division. A Redstone Arsenal Services Panel from 10-11 will include commanders or their representatives from the following: Fox Army Community Hospital, Dental Activity, Military Personnel Office, Post Exchange, Commissary, Legal Assistance Office, Office of the Chaplain; and Morale, Welfare and Recreation.

"There will be door prizes," Blackwood said. "We will have county fair exhibits and services from various organizations and facilities on post — what their benefits are, what they can provide and cannot provide." These informational tables will be available throughout the day.

The only charge will be \$3.75 for lunch which is set for 11:20 to 12:20. The retiree advisory council is defraying 50 cents of the actual meal cost, \$4.25, so the participant will just pay \$3.75.

From 600 to 800 people are expected to attend, according to Blackwood. Attendance in past years has ranged from 400 to 600.

His business has picked up since he now gets referrals from the ACAP office, and he urges anyone who thinks he or she may be eligible for benefits to talk to him.

Gray's office hours are 7:30 to 11 a.m. and 11:30 to 4 p.m. He welcomes walk-in customers, but those who want to avoid a delay may want to call him at 955-6785 for an appointment.

Being a member of the over-30 group, I will be one of the first to say that being older than 30 does not mean you're over the hill. Needless to say, the Combined Federal Campaign is now over 30 and still going strong.

CFC was created under President Kennedy in 1961. It was designed to provide a more equitable method for different charities to solicit the government workforce. Before the CFC, each charity passed the hat at various times throughout the entire year. It wouldn't be too hard to guess the type of reception a solicitor would receive if they arrived late in the year

after several dozen or hundreds of other charities had already dropped by to say hello.

This year's contribution list includes more than 800 names. There are regulations that define what an agency must do to become eligible to make the list. While you may see agency names that you don't agree with, the list cannot discriminate. Just remember that for any agency which you are opposed to, there are hundreds of others to choose from that serve a valid cause. Would you deny a child a Christmas present or medical support just because you don't like one particular group?

One of the common myths of CFC funds disbursement is that we already know how the funds will be split. This is not at all true! Many agencies do not

receive any donations. Last year about 150 of the agencies on the list fell into this category. The CFC itself requires a Certified Public Accountant audit each year to ensure that the money is being sent as designated. Last year's CFC received its first Office of Personnel Management (OPM) Inspector General audit with no financial errors and virtually no administrative questions. A copy of these audits are available in the CFC office, building 3197, for anyone to review.

So, Happy Birthday CFC; and thanks to the generosity of all the government workers that have made this such a successful program throughout the years.

Bud Martin, a Huntsville chess teacher, organized the event held Aug. 20. He has been teaching children how to play chess at the Youth Center over the summer.


Eighteen youngsters participated in the tournament which consisted of two divisions: kindergarten through third grade, and fourth through sixth graders.









Two of the best teams in the country — Michigan and Notre Dame — meet Saturday at Ann Arbor.







Sponsoring this event is the Space City Racquet Club, a Huntsville tennis club which began a junior tennis development program this summer on the courts at Alabama A&M University. The Sept. 21 clinic will be held from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. here on the courts next to Pagano Gym.


Al Garrett, a contract specialist in Procurement Directorate at the Missile Command, serves as junior tennis development coordinator with the Space City Racquet Club. "We established a summer junior tennis development program and the home courts have been Alabama A&M University. But one consideration of this program — and this is looking further down the road — is that we'll have three or four tennis clinic sites throughout Huntsville area," he said. "And in considering where there might be an interest in tennis development, we made the decision to contact the commanding general's staff office and the Directorate of Community and Family Activities."

About six of the racquet club's coaches, including Garrett, are to participate in the upcoming clinic here for all ages. They have also invited some guest instructors including Mike Feltman, the head tennis pro for Las Vegas Golf and Tennis Discount Shop which is located in Huntsville. Feltman is to bring some demonstration racquets and provide tennis instructions along with the other coaches. Hourlong instructional periods are set for 9-10 a.m. and 11 to noon; the rest of the time will be spent practicing and having questions answered. The clinic is for military and civilian families. Anyone affiliated with Redstone is welcome to participate.

"The course will be set up so the advanced and intermediate players will be on courts 1 and 2. And the beginners to those who may just have some small background and limited skills will be on courts 3 and 4," Garrett said. "And there will be an exhibition match played. We're hoping that there will be some players from established teams on the Arsenal here. If not, we might just take four players from the coaching staff. We do want to encourage some players here on the Arsenal to come out to join us because we'd like to really get an opportunity to play with some of them."

The club started its junior development program in June after Garrett had an opportunity to go to Atlanta for a U.S. Tennis Association junior tennis league regional rally. Nine cities from four states were represented with junior players from the ages of 8-16.

He was impressed by these established programs. Also, he wanted to start a program here that would enable high school tennis players to improve their skills during the off season. The result was the

establishment of free tennis clinics for youngsters during the summer at Alabama A&M University every Monday from 5:30-7 p.m. and Saturdays from 9-11 a.m., unless the Space City club has a Saturday tennis match scheduled. The final clinic is set for Monday, Sept. 30, along with an end-of-the-season social.

One of the youngsters in the program, Michael Burton, 18, a graduate this year of Johnson High School, received a donation from the club's scholarship fund. "He's going to be attending Faulkner University," Garrett said.

Informally organized in the summer of 1975, the Space City Racquet Club, then known as Huntsville Tennis Club, began recruiting high school, college and adult players around the city. The founders of SCRC, Horace Rice and Charles Davis, were successful in finding young players with potential such as George Willis, Carlton Rice, Tracy Clark, Devon and Yvonne

Ford, and others. Among the adult players were Calvin Browne, Roosevelt Stewart, Eddie Humphrey, Skip Franklin, Melvin Starks and others.

"When this (junior development) program ends on Sept. 30th, the junior tennis development staff is going to sit down and assess what we started this summer. We're going to discuss the progress of the students, some of our needs and wants; and spend the next several weeks soliciting help from the Huntsville community so that in 1992 when we resume the program we can look at running a spring, summer and fall junior development program possibly utilizing four sites throughout the city. And possibly looking at Pagano Gym as one of the sites to regularly run a junior development program for young tennis players," Garrett said.

The upcoming tennis clinic here is for all ages, not just youngsters. Participants are advised to bring something cold to drink and a tennis racquet. "It's an opportunity for them to develop fundamental skills in properly gripping the racquets to begin hitting good forehand and backhand shots, and to gain confidence in those shots," Garrett said. "It also gives them the opportunity to meet other tennis players or people interested in learning the game."

# Special Forces members show their stuff

Members of 1st Battalion, 20th Special Forces Group demonstrated survival techniques here Aug. 24 and gave their observers, members of 832nd Ordnance Battalion, a chance to try these skills.

The 832nd soldiers had the opportunity to rappel down a 60-foot tower and from a helicopter hovering at 250 feet.

At the field training exercise site, the Special Forces Group also provided instruction in several other challenges which soldiers may face at any given time.

Use of fire on or behind enemy lines can be dangerous. Several different types of pits and examples of how to stack the wood were shown. There was even an oven made at the site.

How to start a fire without any matches or lighters was demonstrated. A battery from a radio was used to ignite magnesium shavings, which started a small fire.

Lessons were given on how to properly disassemble an M-60, how to rig an antenna for a radio and how to build a shelter.

The big draw was the opportunity to rappel from the helicopter. Almost everyone was waiting for the chance to try it.

This was a good opportunity for the 832nd soldiers to learn different techniques on survival, and who better to instruct it than the Special Forces.
