## Organizations get wake-up call on internal controls

Representatives of MICOM organizations were told last week to get started now with their internal controls program for avoiding fraud, waste and abuse, rather than waiting until later in the fiscal year.

Homer Reynolds, the internal management control administrator for the Missile Command, conducted a fiscal 1992 kickoff meeting for internal controls Dec. 4. "We have 120 days as of today to get the checklists applicable to our organizations completed," Reynolds said.

Organizations are responsible for maintaining checklists to keep track of how well they manage their resources. Requirements in particular areas are detailed in an annual Management Control Plan from Department of Army; DA circular 11-91-3 is the management control plan for fiscal 1992. In the past, organizations here would start working on their checklists in May or June in preparation for the command's annual assurance statement which goes to higher headquarters. Reynolds made it clear to the 49 attendees that this won't be the case for fiscal 1992: They have 120 days to get their checklists completed.

"What we're doing here is we're kicking off the annual assurance statement early," he said, explaining that this can save time and avoid problems later.

He asked that each organization inform him of their

internal controls representative by Dec. 15; he requested the name, organization, telephone number, and an alternate representative. Reynolds also asked that each organization submit an internal controls roster by Jan. 15.

Last week's meeting was the first of a series of four planned. "I plan to have a quarterly meeting with all the internal controls points of contact on the material weaknesses and initiatives relating to improving the internal controls within those organizations; those (issues) should be reported to my office no later than the 15th working day after each quarter," Reynolds said.

Every August, the Missile Command assesses how well it has managed funds during the fiscal year. MICOM and agencies throughout the Department of Defense — in fact, every executive agency — are required to make such an assessment under the Federal Managers' Financial Integrity Act. This is a public law, signed by Congress in 1982, which requires that the head of each executive agency provide feedback to Congress. The Annual Assurance Statement on the Status of MICOM's Internal Controls, signed by the commanding general, goes to headquarters Army Materiel Command; AMC in turn reports to Secretary of the Army who in turn reports to Department of Defense which ultimately reports to Congress.

## Cantata heads full slate of chapel Christmas events

The cantata Sunday is for everybody while the performance Monday night is mainly for the troops, added Chaplain (1st Lt.) Steve Logan, an assistant staff chaplain.

Rick Melton, the choir director for Post Chapel, is directing the cantata. The narrators are Clair Goodridge, who is a retired serviceman, and Marne Gannon.

- A Christmas Eve Mass will be celebrated 10 p.m. Dec. 24 at Bicentennial Chapel.


- The Christmas Mass will be celebrated 9:30 a.m. Dec. 25 at Bicentennial Chapel.

## Reservist recognized for efforts in Saudi

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — A reserve officer who served at the Missile Command during Operation Desert Storm was honored by the Army Materiel Command commanding general for his outstanding efforts during the Gulf War.

Capt. Craig Hogan from Decatur, Ala., was called up to Saudi Arabia to serve with a detachment from MICOM. He received a plaque from Gen. William Tuttle at a ceremony held at the Association of the U.S. Army convention in Washington, D.C., in October.

The ceremony came at the conclusion of a multimedia presentation which portrayed the story of logistics during Desert Storm. Hogan's experience was part of the story.

Hogan's mission was to modify or replace older Ground Launched Laser Designators with a newer version. The GLLDs had been modified to protect

operators from the damage a stray laser beam might cause if it came into the eyepiece.

The plan was to go from unit to unit and do the job quickly. But when Hogan and his team arrived in Saudi Arabia on Jan. 13, no one was where they were supposed to be: Everyone was moving north in preparation for the air war. That meant tracking the units down by driving thousands of miles and working as fast as they could before the ground war started.

They succeeded. In two weeks, they replaced more than 200 GLLDs after driving 10,000 miles.

Hogan is representative of the thousands of AMC employees who served overseas and at home during the war. His contribution is symbolic of the many efforts put forth by everyone in AMC and his story was selected to represent the countless stories of personal sacrifice and accomplishments achieved by people throughout the command. ## Redstone's proposed growth subject of meeting

A public meeting to define the scope of an Environmental Impact Statement for a proposed move of missions and workers to Redstone Arsenal will be held 7 p.m. Thursday at Ridgecrest School.

Comments received at the meeting will be used to assist the Army in identifying potential impacts to the quality of the human environment that would result from moving about 1,900 jobs to Redstone from other installations.

The proposed realignment of missions involves transferring 1,430 civilian and 80 military positions from Rock Island Arsenal, 270 civilian and 10 military positions from Lexington-Blue Grass Army Depot, 120 civilian positions from the Presidio of San Fran-

cisco and 30 civilian positions from Harry Diamond Laboratories.

To house these people and activities, two new buildings and renovation of a third are among proposed construction alternatives. Other alternatives include off-site leasing, utilization of existing facilities on Redstone Arsenal, incremental realignment of employees and missions, and no action.

## Hunting season under way at Redstone

Those who want to enjoy Redstone Arsenal's outdoors need to be mindful of hunters before wandering into wooded areas, as the deer hunting season is once more upon us.

None of Redstone's recreation areas are in a designated hunting area, but walking in the woods when hunters could be out is dangerous, according to Bill Moreland, director of Outdoor Recreation.

"All hunting areas on the Arsenal are marked and anyone interested can get a map at Outdoor Recreation that shows all designated hunting and fishing areas," Moreland said.

He mentioned one side of Weeden Mountain, near the housing area, as being a safe, non-hunting area and a good place for nature lovers, joggers and outdoorsmen. However, crossing over the top of Weeden Mountain and walking down the other side of would put a person in a hunting area.

"People just need to be careful; to know where they're wandering when they're in the woods," Moreland said.

Deer season for both bow and gun hunters will continue through January unless the 500 quota is met before then. The number of kills now stands at 138.


## CORPS SAM project under program exec

CORPS SAM came under Missile Command management in August 1990. Since that time, operational concepts have been defined, a study team has been formed and potential for cooperation with foreign countries has been explored.

Under PEO management the project will complete the concept definition process and integrate it into the overall Army air defense plan.

CORPS SAM is envisioned as the centerpiece of Army Corps Air Defense brigades and replacement for the Hawk missile system around the turn of the century.

# Extended range intercept program won't hurt environment


The Strategic Defense Command on Dec. 4 announced completion of an environmental assessment which concludes that no significant impact would result from the proposed Extended Range Intercept Technology program for the Strategic Defense Initiative.

The Extended Range Intercept Technology program activities would include developing and flight testing of the ERINT intercept missile and the ERINT Target System (ETS) missiles. Two types of ETS missiles would be developed and tested: a ballistic tactical missile target and a maneuvering tactical missile target. An existing air-breathing target would also be used for some flight tests. The two targets developed for ETS would also carry a payload of nonhazardous chemical simulant in order to permit demonstration of Theater Missile Defense lethality against simulated bulk and submunition chemical warheads for the TMD Chemical Flight Experiments (TMDCFE).

The ERINT flight test program would consist of 11 flight tests at White Sands Missile Range, N.M., scheduled to begin in late 1991 and continuing through 1993. Seven of these flight tests would incorporate TMDCFE activities. The flight tests involving use of the maneuvering tactical missile target have not yet been completely defined. Therefore, supplemental environmental documentation to address these later flight tests, or any other additional developments in the program, will be provided prior to conducting those activities.

The proposed activities for the ERINT missile and the ETS target missiles consist of design; fabrication, assembly and testing; rocket motor development, refurbishment, and inspection; flight preparation; launch, flight and intercept; and data collection and analysis. Proposed TMDCFE activities consist of processing, storing and transporting the nonhazardous chemical simulant; incorporating it into the payload; and data collection and analysis of chemical simulant dissemination resulting from flight testing.

In addition to White Sands Missile Range, the ERINT flight test missile development and test activities would be conducted at LTV Missiles and Electronics Group, Grand Prairie, Texas; Rockwell International, Anaheim, Calif.; L. A. Gauge, Sun Valley, Calif.; and Holloman Air Force Base, N.M. ERINT rocket motor development and test activities would take place at Atlantic Research Corporation facilities in Gainesville and Orange County, Va., and Camden, Ark. ETS target development and test activities would be conducted at Aerotherm, Mountain View, Calif.; Orbital Sciences, Space Data Division, Chandler,

Ariz.; Hill Air Force Base, Utah; and Pueblo Depot Activity, Colo. The nonhazardous chemical simulant for TMDCFE would be prepared at Battelle facilities near West Jefferson, Ohio.

The environmental assessment evaluated the potential for environmental effects of the ERINT activities listed above. The environmental effects of ERINT activities were determined not to be significant at all locations.

Final determination of whether to proceed with the proposed ERINT activities will be made after a 15-day comment period which began Dec. 4. For more information contact U.S. Army Strategic Defense Com-

# Missile school receives TRADOC excellence award

The Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School has won a 1991 TRADOC Communities of Excellence Commander's Award from the Training and Doctrine Command.

The missile school was named the command's best school on a non-TRADOC post. In earning this trophy, the missile school won three subcategories: best overall academic facility, best Army barracks and best use of self-help in the barracks.

Members of the school, along with representatives from the Self-Help Center and other Redstone activities, attended a ceremony Friday afternoon in which the school's commandant presented the trophy to the commander of 832nd Ordnance Battalion.

"We are here today for me to share an award the commanding general of TRADOC, Gen. Franks, presented to me — but you'all and a whole lot of other people earned it," said Col. James Boddie, the commandant. "The U.S. Army Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School was recognized by TRADOC as the best TRADOC school on a non-TRADOC installation. This is part of the TRADOC Communities of Excellence Program which is part of the Army Communities of Excellence Program.

"The Army Communities of Excellence Program is important today and will become even more important tomorrow as we face the challenges of fewer resources and have to do things better. What is a community of excellence? I think it is a community that pulls together to make it a great place to live, work and play. I think we have a great challenge here at Redstone because we have a lot of different commands located here on an AMC (Army Materiel Command) installation — and I think we are meeting that challenge. OMMCS did not win the award we are presenting here today all by itself. We all won this award," Boddie said.

"It was a lot more than just OMMCS, a lot more than just the 832nd Ordnance Battalion. It was all of us that won this trophy. It was all of you," he said.

## Physical sciences complex slated for construction

The Missile Command has received a go-ahead from the Department of Defense to build a new \$10 million Physical Sciences Research Complex.

A contract for construction is to be awarded this month with project completion expected in about two years.

The facility will house primarily optics and laser research programs in a two-story 88,000 square foot structure that will include a laboratory and administrative area and a high bay. There will be an adjacent outdoor laser test range.

The project manager here is Jerry Hinson in the master planning and construction office at Directorate of Engineering and Housing.

The building site is northwest of the intersection of Patton and Buxton Roads on the southern part of Redstone Arsenal.

The Physical Sciences Research Complex will be occupied by elements of the Weapons Sciences Directorate of MICOM's Research, Development and Engineering Center.





# AMC commander sees attrition as the way to downsize

As the Army builds down and the budget shrinks, so will the Army Materiel Command work force, but Gen. William G.T. Tuttle Jr. believes downsizing can be accomplished without resorting to involuntary separations or layoffs.

"We will try to handle the remaining reductions through attrition and transfers of function," the AMC commander remarked recently.

Although earlier-on a reduction in force seemed

almost a certainty next year due to defense budget cuts, a budget-directed RIF may no longer be necessary, Tuttle said.

His comments came during an interview with Rock Island Arsenal's *Target* newspaper in which Tuttle, making a final visit before his January retirement, addressed the transfer of missions and people from AMCCOM to MICOM, and praised the AMC team's performance in Desert Storm.

Tuttle also made these points:

- AMC still has an objective of reducing its number of installations "when it is feasible and is the cost-effective way to go."

- Army resources must be used for training, readiness and modernization and not for running installations that aren't really needed.

- AMC is going to do all it can to make relocation "an attractive proposition" for those who must move with their jobs.

- Those Rock Islanders moving from the Quad Cities will find Huntsville "a delightful place to live."

MICOM is scheduled to take over armament and chemical responsibilities and more than 1400 civilian jobs from AMCCOM.

This consolidation, along with the one that will combine the Depot Systems Command with part of AMCCOM to form an Industrial Operations Command, were chosen over other AMC realignment options because they were the most cost effective.

Specific restructuring proposals were divided into a series of decision packages and ranked in order of return on investment. "We then started at the top and took whatever offered the fastest payback," Tuttle explained.

He said the cost of establishing the Missile, Armaments and Chemical Command at Redstone will reach about \$85 million, including new construction outlays, but resultant savings are estimated at \$36 million annually and the investment will be paid back in less than three years.

Tuttle told the *Target* that AMC is continuing to analyze costs and benefits of consolidating all the commodity commands. "We can't do it all at once because it's too expensive," he observed. "This means that we have to devise a strategy for getting there over a long period of time, possibly 10 to 12 years. Once we do get there, though, we expect total annual savings of \$250 million to \$300 million, compared to the way we do business today."

That way of doing business cannot continue, he pointed out, for one simple reason: "We cost the Army more than we should." (Editor's note: This article was adapted from an article by Paul Levesque in the *Target*, Rock Island Arsenal's post newspaper.) ©

# ID card section to try Saturday hours

The identification card section of the Military Personnel Office will experiment with Saturday opening hours beginning in January.

The ID card section will be open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for the first Saturday in January, February and March for the convenience of its customers. The scheduled dates are Jan. 4, Feb. 1 and March 7.

"If response is good, we'll continue it on indefinitely. This is in response to feedback we've gotten from customer survey forms," said Maj. Skip Sharples, the Missile Command's adjutant general. "It's also to try to support the command's ACOE (Army Communities of Excellence) effort."

Patrons have indicated on the survey forms that they would like to see the ID card section expand its hours. The section is open from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Monday through Friday, a schedule which could conflict with times for picking up children from school or cases in which both spouses work.

The idea for Saturday openings originated from the customers' feedback. "It seems like over the past six months we've received a lot of comments on expanding the hours of the ID card section," Sharples said.

"This is a three-month deal to see what the response is, then we're going to adjust the program depending on the response," he said.

Charles Ham, chief of the personnel information branch of Military Personnel Office, and Carol Lanier, lead clerk for ID card issuance, are credited with developing the Saturday openings program. The ID card section of military personnel office is located in building 3710.



# TMDE employees reap benefits of streamlining program

Members of TMDE Activity are rewarded for helping their organization save money through reductions and better efficiency.

This program at Test, Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment Activity is called Productivity Enhancements, Efficiencies and Rewards (PEER). It is an Army Materiel Command initiative designed to reduce the use of resources by encouraging organizations to develop innovative ideas in becoming more efficient while still maintaining the same level of output. During fiscal 1991, TMDE Activity eliminated 91 civilian spaces out of a total of 1,474 authorized civilian spaces with no adverse actions.

Linda Hachey received the first of 1,338 of the Activity's PEER payout checks for eligible employees. Gen. William Tuttle, commander of Army Materiel Command, presented her the check during his Dec. 3 visit to the Missile Command.

The Activity entered the three-year PEER program in fiscal 1991 after implementation of a defense management review decision which combined four separate test, measurement and diagnostic organizations into a single activity at Redstone Arsenal. Since the Activity is facing the same challenges caused by diminishing budgets and downsizing of the Army as other military organizations, the deputy executive director for TMDE, Robert DuBois, felt further enhancements and efficiencies were necessary and possible. He proposed and obtained agreement from

Army Materiel Command to conduct the three-year PEER study using Total Quality Management to identify specific areas of the organization where savings can be achieved.

Under PEER, reductions and efficiencies are documented as savings which are validated by external auditors and then shared equally by the parent command — in this case, Army Materiel Command — and the participating organization, the TMDE Activity. The Activity's half of the savings is shared among its employees.

Irrespective of grade, all civilians employed by TMDE Activity who meet certain employment criteria will receive a payout computed on a \$97 per month share. Civilians employed for less than one year or who fail to meet other criteria will receive a prorated payment. For fiscal 1991, maximum payout was \$1,164.

# Association cites worker here for Desert Storm service

Daryl White, director of MICOM's Systems and Cost Analysis Office, has been honored by the Association of the United States Army (AUSA) for exceptional service in support of national defense.

White was presented the Department of Army Civilian (DAC) Award by Gen. Gordon Sullivan, Army chief of staff, at the annual DAC luncheon Oct. 16 during the association's annual national convention in Washington, D.C.

The new DAC Award was established this year to recognize in each of AUSA's seven regions civilians who made a significant contribution during Desert Shield/Storm.

As the Redstone-Huntsville Chapter nominee, White beat out 16 other chapter winners to become 3rd region winner. Of the seven region award recipients,

White is the only one who served in the Gulf region during the war.

White served as civilian executive assistant for the U.S. Army Support Group from December 1990 to May 1991. The 876-member command was responsible for general support and depot level maintenance operations for the theater of operations.

All 671 civil service personnel were volunteers, and with the 134 U.S. military and 71 civilian contractors, supported combat troops by repairing over 1,000 tanks and Bradley Fighting Vehicles, fielded over 2,500 trucks and other combat vehicles, painted over 1,400 vehicles and issued over 1,500 major subassemblies that resulted in the repair of over 5,000 combat vehicles.

In his award citation, White is credited with improving living conditions for civilian and military personnel

assigned to the group, and for contributing to readiness of the coalition forces through repair and return of over 5,000 combat vehicles to full mission capable status.







## American soldiers home from Kuwait

WASHINGTON — The last American soldiers in Kuwait should be home by Christmas.

Elements of the 3rd and 8th Infantry Divisions left Kuwait Nov. 25, en route to Germany, with the main body of the force expected to leave in early December, said Pentagon spokesman Pete Williams. A task force of about 1,500 soldiers from the two divisions has been in Kuwait since late August.

With the redeployment, all but 2,000 of the quarter-million U.S. soldiers in Southwest Asia at the height of Desert Storm have returned home. Most of the remaining soldiers will stay until spring 1992 to handle the redeployment of close to 400,000 tons of ammunition and equipment. (Arnews)

# New community activities deputy impressed by Redstone

The deputy director for community and family activities says his goal is to improve Redstone's high quality of services despite diminishing resources.

"We've already got less resources (less appropriated fund dollars). We're working with the possibility of less people. But we still want to be able to provide the services and we're doing it," said Bill Goldstein, deputy at the Directorate for Community and Family Activities (DCFA).

The plan for 1992 is to improve on an already outstanding program, he said. "Our goal is to be self-sufficient in all areas. We want to still provide outstanding services for soldiers and their families; we want to continue to provide it with less resources."

Goldstein arrived here last September from Darmstadt, Germany where he was director of personnel and community and family activities. Darmstadt won the 1989 Army Communities of Excellence award for medium-size installations overseas. Goldstein hopes Redstone, a finalist in the most improved category, wins a 1991 ACOE award.

"I think it's great," Goldstein said, referring to Redstone. "We have a lot of fun activities, get a lot of support from command. Good people to work for, and we have a lot of good people we're serving. I really mean it."

"The one thing I've noticed about Redstone in the quality of life field is there are so many different activities for the family and also the soldiers here," he added. "There are just a lot of great activities. I've never seen so many activities that we have here on the post for the soldiers. Another thing I've noticed here: When I go to different divisions, different directorates, people go out of their way to serve me. I've never had anybody say no since I've been here."

He cited an ongoing renovation project at the golf course as an example of a quality of life improvement paid for by non-appropriated, self-generated funds. Another improvement project is upgrading the marina. "And we do a lot of in-house upgrading ourselves," Goldstein added, referring to plans at the Challenger NCO Club and the Enlisted Club. The Challenger NCO Club, for example, will be open late nights every Friday and Saturday — from 10 p.m. until 4 a.m. — starting in January in response to requests from soldiers. DCFA did a marketing survey of enlisted soldiers to see what they want in their facility.


Goldstein, 53, is a Massachusetts native who joined the Army in June 1954 upon graduation from high school. He retired in August 1984 as a command sergeant major in Giessen, Germany. His civil service career began in November 1985 as a community operation division chief in Schweinfurt. The following

November, he got promoted and went to headquarters 21st Support Command at Kaiserslautern as chief of operations division. From there, he got another promotion and went to Karlsruhe in September 1987 as assistant director for community and family activities. Two years later, Goldstein moved to Darmstadt as chief of morale, welfare and recreation division. He became director of personnel and community and family activities there last April and served in that job until leaving for Redstone's newly-created position of deputy at DCFA.

He and his wife, Brigitte, have a daughter and four sons. Their daughter, Ramona Castell, 29, resides in Maryland. David, 28, lives in Germany where he is an IBM computer programmer for German banks; he and his wife have a 2-year-old son and 3-month-old daughter. Paul, 27, resides with the Goldsteins in Madison and works here at the Post Exchange. Danny, 24, and Rory, 26, reside in Herndon, Va. The Goldsteins' oldest daughter, Sandra Leonard, was 29 when she died in an automobile accident two years ago in Ohio.

"Racquetball's my only hobby. And I consider myself pretty good even though I'm overweight," Goldstein said. The family pets are two schnauzers: Tacha, a female, and Cooter, a male.

Goldstein is deputy to the director of DCFA, Bob Brown. The organization consists of 407 civilian workers, including appropriated and non-appropriated fund employees. "The impact I want to have in this job here is I really want to help soldiers and families," Goldstein said.





Boddie's many hobbies include running, golf, hunting, fishing, shooting and sports in general. "The Army's my first hobby," he added.





"The unique thing about our group was, in addition to its important mission, it also supported itself," White said, which involved sorting mail, driving buses, maintaining housing and serving as billeting manager.

"People pitched in and did things they had never done before," he said, "and the lesson learned from that experience is that people should never be limited by job descriptions."

White was impressed by the willingness of people to pitch in and help, giving as an example 11 employees who volunteered to assist in sorting several acres of mail.

"People wanted to be busy, so they filled sandbags for defensive positions, helped build mess halls and find equipment for it — things that were beyond what they were there for," he said.

The most significant event for White while serving in Saudi Arabia was the night the first Scud came in.

"It wasn't just the pride of being a MICOM person," White said, as he recalled seeing the orange flash (Scud), the entire horizon lighting up in a flash (a Patriot launch) followed by an explosion low on the horizon and the bright flash in the sky as the Patriot intercepted the Scud.

"It was only when I saw the smoke trail that I knew it was a Patriot and felt the pride of coming from where the Patriot was born," he said.

The Patriot's success also served as a terrific morale booster in an environment where next to terrorism, a Scud carrying nuclear, chemical and biological agents was the biggest fear, White added.

Developing the "buddy system" was a concept new to civilians, and this came into play when you had to check the protective gear of the person standing near you when it was necessary to wear the suits and masks that protect against NBC agents, he said.

Of the 12 Missile Command civilians who deployed to Saudi Arabia to work for the U.S. Army Support Group, three were females.

"My job there had to do with people; I got a real dose of personnel management for executives," White said. "It consisted of 1,000 people coming together — diverse people with different backgrounds — and doing a job. In some cases there were no rules. It was doing things in a new way with common sense as the guiding light. Decisions were made by small groups of people with little written direction. We made things happen by face to face decisions and with a handshake.

"Overall, I'd say this experience gave me insight and extreme respect for logisticians and the logistics community in supporting an Army in the field. It's such a complex thing," he said.

"It was the best job I've had so far," White said, adding that he hopes to prove that statement wrong in the future.

White began his government career in 1973 in Germany as a management analyst in the reorganization of the Theater Army Support Command. He returned to the U.S. in 1976 to work at Fort Monroe, Va., and had subsequent assignments at Training and Doctrine Command headquarters, Forces Command headquarters and U.S. Army-Europe headquarters.

He was assigned as chief of Cost Analysis Division in October 1988 and has been in his current position since last August.

# Advanced telecommunications service grows in community

Pledging to assume the leadership role in Integrated Services Digital Network deployment among Bell operating companies by 1995, South Central Bell Nov. 15 unveiled plans to offer ISDN services to its customers' businesses and homes.

The benefits include single-line access for all services, increased speed and greater flexibility, especially in rearranging the system.

"Redstone Arsenal is the first U.S. Army base to deploy ISDN to meet its communications needs," said Tim Bell, communications officer for the base. "In fact, the Redstone system is a U.S. Army Information Systems Command/Missile Command prototype for future Army ISDN applications throughout the U.S. and other countries." 





# Soldiers learn about Jewish holiday

At the installation's December prayer breakfast, more than 300 832nd Ordnance Battalion and Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School participants learned about the Jewish holiday of Hanukkah.

Lt. Col. Joseph Paddock, commander of the 832nd, spoke of the annual holiday which is referred to as either the "Festival of Dedication" or the "Festival of Lights." Hanukkah celebrates the Jewish victory over the powerful Assyrian army in 165 B.C.E. and the following rededication of the Temple of David to God.

The Jews while under Assyrian rule were forbidden to practice their religion and directed to take up Greek idol worship — to refuse meant death, Paddock said. Under the strong leadership of the Maccabean family, a religious revolt occurred culminating in the Assyrian defeat and recapture of Jerusalem. A celebration to rededicate the Temple followed, but the priests could only find a small amount of holy oil to use in the ceremony. A miracle occurred, Paddock said. "What appeared to be enough oil to last one day actually burned for eight days, thus the eight days of Hanukkah — the Festival of Lights.

"Hanukkah remembers the first war ever fought solely for the right of a people to believe as they wish — a concept of religious freedom which today is practiced by all free nations," Paddock said.

Among the attendees SFC Charles Thibodeaux, from Lake Charles, La., said, "It (the prayer breakfast) was good because it helped build up our religious morale. I am a Catholic so it helped me learn about the Jewish religion."

The prayer breakfast is held at 6 a.m. on the first Wednesday of every month at the Enlisted Club.
