Community families to ride in style

Directorate of Community and Family Activities gets brand new bus

Twenty-nine passenger seating. Television. VCR. You name it and this brand new shuttle bus has got it.

The Directorate of Community and Family Activities is the proud owner of a new \$50,000 bus purchased by Army Materiel Command from morale, welfare and recreation money. When Redstone families go on recreation tours this spring and summer, they'll ride in style.

"In the past two years the Appropriated Fund budget has been reduced in the support of MWR activities. This diminishing budget has had an impact on our recreational programs, such as tours to various places of interest around the tri-state area, i.e., Six Flags Over Atlanta, Point Mallard, Grand Ole Opry, etc.," said Bob Brown, director for the Directorate of Community and Family Activities. "On Sept. 26, 1991, a board was convened at Headquarters, U.S. Army Materiel Command for distribution of proceeds from the Army & Air Force Exchange Service pay telephone contract. Each of the AMC major subordinate commands appeared before the board requesting project money for MWR needs. Our thanks to Bob Anastasio, the AMC MWR chief, and the cross

Redstone implements respiratory protection program

The corroded piece of purported respiratory protection equipment appeared to have more dried paint on the inside than it did on its exterior. This is an example of the unsafe equipment being found in the possession of some workers here.

Redstone has implemented the Army Respiratory Protection Program which is designed to provide safe respiratory protection equipment — don't call them gas masks — and fit-test and train people in their proper use.

"People that have respiratory equipment who haven't been trained and haven't been fit-tested are really a lot more at risk than people who don't have it; because people who don't have it know they don't whereas the people who do, may think they are protected," said Pat Ricard, a safety and occupational health specialist in the Missile Command's Safety Office.


In February 1990 the Army published regulation AR 11-34 on respiratory protection which expanded on an Occupational Safety and Health Administration regulation. The Missile Command and Redstone activities came on line with the Army regulation by designating a central organization to service respiratory requirements on post. This respirator service center is part of the Directorate of Logistics' missile division at Redstone Arsenal Support Activity. The office, at building 3775, covers all respiratory protection equipment with the exception of the military masks.

It consists of two installation respiratory specialists — Ken Bailey and Garland Walker — who belong to the air defense branch at missile division. Their respiratory-protection equipment mission is to provide maintenance, repair, fit-testing and training for both supervisors and employees. Frank Hart, chief of the MICOM Safety Office, is director of Redstone's respiratory protection program.

Charity campaign

Editor:

In light of the recent investigation into the management practices of United Way of America and the extensive media coverage it has received, the Local Federal Coordinating Committee (LFCC) wants to take this opportunity to explain how the Combined Federal Campaign works and what our relationship is with local United Ways.

The Tennessee Valley Combined Federal Campaign is the annual charity drive for federal employees in Cullman, Limestone, Madison, Marshall and Morgan Counties in Alabama and Lincoln County, Tenn. The Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) is the only authorized charitable fund-raising drive in the federal workplace. The CFC is an independent campaign run by federal employees for federal employees.

The campaign is administered by the LFCC, who make all decisions regarding the fund-raising effort. The LFCC consists of one voting member from 33 government agencies in the Tennessee Valley area. The LFCC is subject to guidelines established by the Office of Personnel Management.

The CFC is a donor preference campaign. There are no pre-determined allocations. All agencies do not receive money simply because their names appear in the brochure. Agencies listed in the brochure receive money only if designations are made to them. Last year 149 agencies received no contribution through our CFC because no one designated to them.

When you designate your contribution to an agency or agencies, whether local, national or international, your money goes to the agency or agencies less *only* the CFC administrative fee of 5.6 percent.

When you designate to United Ways, your contribution is subject to dues paid to United Way of America if your United Way has chosen to be a member. Voluntary dues result in shared information and resources that benefit local United Ways and may not be readily available or affordable locally. Members' dues typically represent only 1 percent or less of United Way campaign pledges.

United Ways are autonomous organizations. United Way of America does not set policy or procedure for local United Ways, even if local United Ways pay dues. For example, the United Way of Madison County volunteer board of directors makes all decisions regarding that agency's activities.

All United Ways participating in our CFC are listed in United Way of America's International Directory as

members. Because United Ways are autonomous, their boards of directors have responded independently to the investigation of United Way of America. For example, the United Way of Madison County board of directors voted to withhold dues pending the completion of the investigation and their review of the findings.

Total hiring freeze hits AMC family

An immediate civilian hiring freeze that may not end any time soon was announced at MICOM and other AMC commands and activities last Thursday.

AMC headquarters directed the freeze which applies locally to MICOM, TMDE Support Group, Redstone Technical Test Center and AMC Management Engineering Activity who collectively have about 7,300 workers.

The AMC action does not apply to activities such as SDC and OMMCS which are not part of the AMC family.

AMC imposed the freeze on all hiring in response to

Armywide plans to build down civilian strength by 25 percent over the next five years.

An AMC official said the freeze is "open-ended" and could last through the end of the fiscal year in September.

A March 5 memorandum signed by Ernest A. Young, MICOM deputy for procurement and readiness, characterizes the freeze as "total" and states, "At this time there are no exceptions."

The memo says also that an earlier prohibition on filling GS/GM 13-15 positions remains in effect.

SDC contracts benefit Huntsville

The Strategic Defense Command has awarded two systems engineering and technical assistance contracts (SETACs) with a total potential value of \$587 million that will involve a number of local companies.

Systems engineering and technical assistance contractors play a significant role in SDC activities by developing plans, conducting studies and performing analyses relating to strategic defense experiments, technology validations and advanced engineering development programs.

For the first time, the SDC SETAC was divided into three separate areas: Interceptor Technology, Sensors, and Mission Support. A contractor for each area was competitively selected, and each company will be awarded a basic contract for 36 months with two one-year options.

The Interceptor Technology SETAC with a potential value of \$90 million was awarded to Nichols Research Corporation, 4040 South Memorial Parkway. This contract will support SDC's Kinetic Energy Weapons directorate and Ground-Based Interceptor project office.

Nichols Research proposes to award major subcontracts to: Teledyne Brown Engineering; SPARTA Inc.; Dynetics Inc.; Mevatec Corporation; Sy Technology Inc.; BDM International and independent consultant Marcus Whitfield, all located in Huntsville.

Both the Mission Support and Sensor SETAC were awarded to Teledyne Brown Engineering, 300 Sparkman Drive northwest. The potential value of the combined effort is \$497 million.

The Mission Support portion of the contract will support the SDC directorates for Systems Analysis/Battle Management; Survivability, Lethality, and Key Technologies; and Advanced Technology; as well as the command's Test and Evaluation, Intelligence, Cost Analysis, Computer Resources and Engineering, Systems and Program Integration offices and the Treaty Adviser.

The Sensors portion of the SETAC will support SDC's Sensors and Directed Energy Weapons directorates, Ground-Based Radar and Ground-Based

Seatbelts help, but many accident witnesses don't

A two-vehicle accident Friday morning on post could have caused more serious injuries if both drivers had not been wearing seatbelts, according to Provost Marshal officials.

But many motorists apparently just drove by the .45 a.m. mishap on the south side of the Martin-Patton overpass without bothering to stop and render assistance.

"Roads were wet; visibility was clear however. Preliminary investigation at this point indicates the possibility of the pickup truck exiting from Martin Road heading east, took the Patton exit and apparently lost control," said Sgt. Maj. Jeff Gilmore of the Provost Marshal Office. The Chevy S10 truck collided with a Datsun stationwagon which was heading north.

The driver of the pickup suffered minor injuries to the neck and back, while the driver of the car had cuts on his right hand. Both were transported to local hospitals by Huntsville ambulance. The one with the hand injuries was admitted, while the other driver was treated and released.

"Both drivers were wearing seatbelts which prevented more serious injuries, if not fatal," Gilmore said. "Provost marshal concern as well as of all military police on the Arsenal, is speed and not driving smartly relative with the conditions of the roadway. Cause of this accident was speed and poor (wet) road-surface conditions.

"As we stress constantly: Slow down, buckle up, drive defensively," Gilmore said.

Lt. Col. Randy Holloway, the provost marshal for Redstone Arsenal, also expressed a concern about the lack of compassion shown by passersby. "Numerous individuals saw the accident and drove by without rendering any degree of assistance whatsoever," Holloway said. "In fact, one of the witnesses on the scene commented he was surprised that five or six vehicles drove by without giving any assistance."

There is no Alabama law requiring an individual to stop to render assistance; however, there is a "good Samaritan rule" that anybody who does help under these circumstances would not be held liable for the results of his or her aid. "Our emphasis is show compassion and at least give some type of aid," Gilmore said. This can be anything from comforting the injured to directing traffic.

Try to render assistance as possible "because you never know when you might need help," Holloway said.

Drivers must stop when in accident

Huntsville Police Department issues the following guidance concerning driver responsibility when involved in an accident:

"If you are involved in a traffic accident, you must stop at once and aid any injured persons. Call for medical assistance if it is necessary. Before the police

arrive, use whatever means available to warn other traffic (flags, flares, etc.).

"While waiting on police to arrive give your name, address, and registration number and show your drivers license to other persons involved. This applies to any type of accident."

Army studies 1941 maneuvers as model for 1994 version

Dr. Christopher Gabel, an instructor at the Combat Studies Institute, U.S. Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., finds himself much in demand these days.

Ever since the Army chief of staff wrote a personal note to Gabel last September telling him of his interest in Gabel's 1991 book, a lot of others have also become interested.

In a telephone interview, Gabel said it's "surprising" but nice that he's being sought out as a subject matter expert on maneuvers the Army conducted in 1941.

Gabel's 1991 book is an account of the Army's largest training exercise in U.S. history that pitted entire field armies against each other in mock battle on a 30,000 square-mile area in northwest Louisiana and later in North Carolina in 1941.

The Army is looking at conducting similar large-scale maneuvers in 1994, and Army planners want to learn how it was done in 1941, Gabel said.

Gabel said Gen. Gordon Sullivan, the chief of staff, wants to make sure the Army will remain strong in the face of the post-Persian Gulf War defense dollar slashing.

In the midst of the Army's current downsizing, Sullivan wants to break a pattern of U.S. "postwar decay," Gabel said.

The exercises could show up any weak spots in personnel and equipment.

The original objective of the 1941 maneuvers was to train higher-level commanders and staffs, but it evolved into full-scale unit training.

The "1941 Maneuvers," also called the "Louisiana Maneuvers," were conducted as the United States was facing the prospect of total war on a global scale. As the Army moved from a state of military unpreparedness, reflected in its size of 190,000 in 1939 to 1.6 million two years later, and as new arms and equipment began to replace the World War I vintage items, new doctrines emerged that needed to be tested, Gabel writes.

More than 740,000 men, 27 of the Army's 34 divisions and nine air groups participated in the maneuvers, according to Gabel's article, "The 1941 Maneuvers," which appeared in the August 1991 issue of *Military Review*.

The maneuvers allowed the Army to test these new doctrines, especially in the armored warfare and tactical air power categories, Gabel writes.

Gabel assesses the benefits of the 1941 maneuvers as "significant," because a generation of young officers, most of whom had never seen more than a regiment

assembled in one place, learned to move, sustain and fight entire field armies.

Further, Gabel says, training deficiencies were exposed in time for the Army to correct them before the United States became involved in World War II.

But Gabel believes that perhaps the most important outcome of the maneuvers was they "acclimated Americans — both in and out of uniform — to the fact that neutrality was at an end. War was coming, but for once, the United States would not be caught completely unprepared."

Gabel began researching the Louisiana Maneuvers for his doctoral dissertation at Ohio State University and it was first published in 1981. It was republished last year by the U.S. Army Center for Military History (*The U.S. Army GHQ Maneuvers of 1941*, by Christopher R. Gabel, 227 pages).

Much of his research was at the National Archives in Washington, D.C., where the exercise is well-documented, Gabel said.

He said the exercises were also reported in *Army Times*, *New York Times* newspaper, and *Life* and *Time* magazines.

Gabel presented a lecture to the Army's deputy chief of staff for operations and others a few weeks ago at the Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, Pa.

"The one point I made in my talk was don't try to accomplish too many things in the exercise. You end up with too many uncontrolled variables and you don't know which condition caused which outcome," Gabel said.

Civilian jobs available with 8th Army in Korea

A representative from the 8th U.S. Army civilian recruiting office will visit Redstone May 1 to provide information on civilian employment opportunities in Korea.

This representative will give four presentations of one and a half hours each at 9 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. in the Rocket Auditorium. The presentations scheduled for 9, 11 and 1 are intended for current Defense Department civilian employees. The 3 p.m. presentation is open to all individuals.

The session at 3 is open to non-status candidates who may apply under 8th U.S. Army's direct-hire authorities; presently these authorities include: professional engineers, grades GS 800-11 and 12; medical officer (developmental pediatrics, pediatrics, psychiatry and general), grades GS/GM 602-11 through 15; nurse (clinical, operation room, occupational health), GS 610-9 and 11; clinical psychologist, GS 180-11 and 12; social worker, GS 185-12; occupational therapist, GS 631-11; physical therapist, GS 633-9; speech pathologist, GS 665-11 and 12; and child development services coordinator/specialist/director, GS 1701-8, 9 and 11. This session is also open to veterans who may

be eligible under special appointing authorities (30 percent compensable disabled/VRA) and reinstatement eligible provided there are no hiring restrictions and the area of consideration is open to such candidates.

The majority of occupations recruited for Korea are professional, administrative or technical in nature, and at the GS-9 and above levels. No clerical or wage grade (except for occasional wage supervisory jobs) positions are recruited for Korea. General information will be offered on current working and living condi-

tions, application procedures, benefits and allowances, tours of duty, etc., and will include a short video presentation. Special updated handout material will be available. No applications will be accepted during the course of the scheduled visit, but current vacancy listing and announcements will be available for review.

Army worker making strides in country music career

There may have been some chuckles and skepticism two years ago when an Army worker here began moonlighting as a professional country music performer. But his fast start in the music business has replaced the scattered laughter with well wishes and support.

Will Clements, a logistics management specialist in Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment (TMDE) Activity, can be heard on local country radio stations. His first cassette, "Half My Life Slipped Away," is on sale in some Wal-Mart Stores and other outlets. He will sing the national anthem at a Huntsville Stars baseball game this season; and one of his songs, "You Struck Out (And Now I'm Out)," will be used in some capacity at the ballpark.

Clements is on a new record label out of Nashville called NCP Records. "They're really making great strides and we feel it won't be long before they'll be one of the frontrunners in music in Nashville," he said. The same could be said about Clements: He has made great strides in the business so far. He was elected in January to the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) out of Nashville. Clements wrote six of the eight songs on his first album which was released about a month ago. The cassette can be found at the Wal-Mart Store on Drake Avenue in Huntsville and also in Wal-Mart stores in Arab and Guntersville.

He has picked up two sponsors: Carriage Cadillac of Huntsville and G&S Restaurant in Morgan City. Clements does radio spots for them plus his album on WTWX FM-96 out of Guntersville.

"I just want to be able to do the very best that I can in country music. That's my goal," said Clements, who hopes to end up with a major record contract.

"But even if I don't make it, I have had more fun even now already. I mean I have been backstage at Grand Ole Opry. I have sat down and talked with the greats of country music, one-on-one, backstage at Grand Ole Opry. I've been with Mark Chesnut; 'The Voice' Vern Gosdin; just so many of the great Nashville people, songwriters; the great Hank Cockran — they call him 'the legend' in Nashville. But working with people like that and getting as far as I have in just a two-year period has just been gratifying to me."

The Maryland native, a former soldier, gives much of the credit to his wife, Jackie. She is his biggest supporter and fan, and serves as his manager and pro-

ducer. She manages to do this in addition to working at Residential Lighting on Bob Wallace Avenue and operating her own interior designing business, Jacqueline's Interiors, out of the couple's home in Union Grove.

There are many others he feels grateful to. This includes the members of TMDE Activity for their words of encouragement: Robert Dubois, the director of TMDE; Col. Mike Boyd, commander of TMDE Support Activity; Troy Ellis, director of logistics; Gary Hodge, chief of the field support division; and Irv Tarbox, who is Clements' immediate supervisor. Two local businesses, El Mejicano Restaurant and Peacocks Apothecary, have helped by offering his album for sale. Tommy Tarbox, general manager of Carriage Cadillac, is among the many others who have provided support.

"You can't do it without people. You cannot do it without support, I don't care who you are," Clements said. "It took Vince Gill 10 years around Nashville to get to the top, and he's one of the greats."

A TMDE worker since 1980, Clements has about 22 years of government service including eight years as a soldier. He and his wife have three children — Garry of Union Grove and daughters Roseanne Messina and Debbie Harper, both of the Baltimore, Md., area — and five grandchildren. Family members in Maryland have been putting his album out up north; and Clements has contacted a Maryland cable television show. Within the next two to six months he hopes to begin a concert tour in Maryland, working his way down south.

Clements — who says he's "holding at 49" — is making a relatively late start on his music career. "I'm starting a little later in country music; but for anyone that's trying to do something, age should not matter. It's abilities, it's determination. People who listen to country music are special for this reason: They don't judge an individual by how old he is, they judge him on his music. And that's how they've been judging me, and I'm grateful for that."


"Exercise your power today," states the message below the Patriot drawing. "Submit a suggestion!"



SDC manager for ground-based interceptors wins honor

James Katechis has been named "Engineer of the Year" of the Strategic Defense Command by the National Society of Professional Engineers.

NSPE recognized 35 federal agency engineers as the top engineers for their respective agencies at a banquet in Crystal City, Va. The Federal Engineer of the Year Awards program is sponsored by NSPE and the NSPE Professional Engineers in Government practice division. This award program was part of National Engineers Week, Feb. 16-22, and was initiated to provide recognition for engineers employed in the federal government.

As project manager for the Ground Based Interceptor, Katechis is responsible for SDC's missile program effort that is developing a cost-effective ground-launched interceptor. The GBI effort is validating technology for intercepting ballistic missile reentry vehicles in space during the midcourse of their flight. The effort is also infusing new technology to increase capability and cost effectiveness.

On Jan. 28, 1991, GBI's ground-launched Exoatmospheric Reentry Interceptor Subsystem intercepted a target reentry vehicle in space. The test was the first successful intercept of a mock warhead accompanied by decoys/countermeasures. Critical information was also provided in the areas of interceptor performance, target signatures, and range instrumentation, which enhance the entire strategic defense research effort.

Some of Katechis' honors and awards include: Auburn University Engineer of the Year, American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) Professional Engineer of the Year, and Huntsville Association of Technical Societies Professional of the Year in 1988; Association of Government Auditors Distinguished Leadership in Financial Management in 1989; Meritorious Civilian Service Award in 1990 and the American Defense Preparedness Association (ADPA) Most Significant Technical Achievement Award in Strategic Defense in 1991.

Katechis has been involved in research and development of missile systems technology for most of his

32-year career, 27 of which have been with the Army.

He is a graduate of Williams School in Montgomery, and earned a bachelor of science degree in mechanical engineering from Auburn University in 1958. He later graduated from the Defense Systems Management College (1970), the Industrial College of the Armed Forces (1973), and the Harvard Graduate School of Business (1976).

Katechis, a resident of Florence, is married to the former Shirlee Carroll and his sons are Kevin, Dale and Chris.





Program assists soldiers in registering, voting

It could be considered one of the great ironies of our society. Men and women who defend our country seldom participate in the democratic process of choosing the very leaders who may someday send them off to war.

When it comes to voting, soldiers don't have a very good record, according to E.J. Dlugasch, MICOM's deputy adjutant general.

"Some may not be aware they have the right," since they are prohibited from participating in most partisan political activities, he said. Others may not be familiar with the absentee voting process that allows a soldier to vote in his or her home of record.

The Army uses the Voting Assistance Program to clear up these misconceptions by providing voting assistance officers down to the company level to help soldiers register and vote.

"The voting assistance officers will have the voting rules for each state," Dlugasch said. Registration and voting can be done through the absentee program.

"When they register to vote, and keep their address current, the registrar may automatically send absentee ballots. It depends on the voting laws of the state," Dlugasch said.

If you're a soldier who wants information on how to vote ask your unit commander or first sergeant for the name of your voting assistance officer.





Base support contractor takes steps to help environment

The base support contractor, in cooperation with the Missile Command and the MICOM Environmental Office, has taken steps in its motor pool area to protect the environment.

Improvements in the vehicle/equipment maintenance activity include a freon recycle machine to service air conditioners on vehicles; a dry filter system in the paint booths in the body paint shop; an oil filter press; a completely-reworked battery shop; and a paint stripping vat in the furniture repair/refinishing shop. Also the contractor, BAMS, is eliminating its underground storage tank for used oil in favor of two 2,000-gallon, above ground tanks.

"I'm ecstatic," said Diane Bowers, an ecologist in the Environmental Management Office. "When I first came to Redstone five years ago, the motor pool was in pretty sad shape.

"They have cleaned it up tremendously," she said. "It's just been like night and day."

BAMS has been the base support contractor since October 1989. The environmental improvements are a joint effort between the contractor, the environmental office and the Directorate of Logistics' contracting division. "We're discharging far less pollutants in the air, and we also completely eliminated discharging pollutants into the ground and into the water system," said J.D. Pyle, the contracting officer representative at logistics. "And we have a cleaner environment in which to work in the shop area."

Bob Sartain, supervisor of equipment management division for BAMS, said the improvements include the following:

- A freon recycling machine, purchased with the cooperation of the government, services air conditioners on vehicles. It removes the freon from the air conditioner, cleans the freon and puts the freon back in for reuse.

- The two large paint booths in the body paint shop were changed from a "waterfall" system to a dry filter system, thus eliminating possible contamination of water.

- An oil filter press was purchased which mashes used oil filters into one-sixth their original size for easier disposal. This process also squeezes out all the waste oil from a spent filter.

- BAMS expects to replace in March its underground storage tank for used oil in favor of two 2,000-gallon above ground tanks. These new tanks will incorporate a spill detector system and a pumping system. The pumping system will enable the used oil to be pumped directly from the vehicle to the waste oil tank, eliminating handling in drain pans.

- The battery servicing shop has been completely reworked by using acid-resistant paint coatings on all

charging racks and installing a neutralizing vat for any acid spills.

- With government approval, BAMS fabricated a paint stripping vat for its furniture refinishing operation. This vat has reduced the cost of materials used to strip paint by 75 percent and has reduced the waste by-product 90 percent, according to Sartain.

"We'll be in the continuing years looking at better

ways to clean up the environment and taking the recommendations from the government and the environmental people, trying to make a cleaner environment," Sartain said. He estimates the government has spent approximately \$26,000 on the improvements; this includes about \$16,000 total for the two above-ground oil tanks. Sartain said the changes have been cost-effective, particularly in the furniture refinishing operation.

Bowers, the ecologist, is including the motor pool improvements as part of Redstone's submittal for the Secretary of Army "Hazardous Waste Minimization Incentive Awards Program." This is the first year for the awards program which has an estimated top installation prize of from \$150,000 to \$250,000. The BAMS motor pool and the Thiokol operation are among the examples of how Redstone is doing things to minimize its waste and prevent pollution, according to Bowers. "The motor pool is a good source for the kind of information I needed," she said.

So far about 100 people within 24 buildings have been fit-tested with respiratory protection equipment and trained in its proper use. Officials here are sure there are more people who need the service but have yet to come forward. Those who are fit-tested and trained must repeat the process at least yearly to satisfy the annual requirement.

"Once we find out who you are, we do a monthly inspection on your equipment," said Tom Slinkard, chief of the missile division. "It's only got to save your life once to be worth it."

His 82-member division, half military and half civilian, provides direct support and general support repair for tactical missile systems. The respiratory protection program within its air defense branch became an additional responsibility.

"We want to make sure everybody that needs (respiratory) protection gets the best equipment and services possible," Slinkard said. "We're a service organization."

"If you even think you have a demand for these services, either get in touch with industrial hygiene or call us at 876-2200," he said.

Fox Hospital pharmacy cuts back on some medications

Editor's note: Fox Army Community Hospital provided the following release on changes to the hospital's formulary.

The frequently discussed reductions in force and budget limitations are impacting on the Army Medical Department's available resources like those throughout the military.

The 1992 operating budget for Fox Army Community Hospital was actually reduced in comparison to that of 1991 in spite of an anticipated increase in workload and inflationary pressures. Consequently services must be reduced at Fox Hospital to include the pharmacy as well as expenses incurred in performing exotic procedures by community based health care providers.

Existing stockages of all medications listed for removal will continue to be distributed in a limited fashion until exhausted. Medications on the formulary reduction list will *not* be re-ordered. Patients with prescriptions for medications which have been identified for removal from the Fox Hospital formulary should consult their physician in order that a new prescription can be provided for one of the suggested alternatives. Patients who currently use medications which appear on the formulary reduction list, and

desire to continue with their use, will be required to have their prescription filled at a civilian establishment or another military medical treatment facility. Patients in need of any of the over-the-counter medications listed for removal will be required to purchase them at a civilian establishment.

Fox Hospital apologizes for the financial burden this action will place on patients it services. In order to maintain, and in some areas expand, the current services available, this action is required, the hospital said.

Questions or comments concerning this action should be directed to William Baird, chief of Fox Hospital's Pharmacy Section, 876-5773.

The following drugs will be deleted from the formulary and in most cases substituted as indicated:

- Lopid was removed; and Niacin 50 and 500 is the suggested alternative.
- Feldene was removed. And the suggested alternatives are Motrin, Indocin, Enteric Coated Aspirin, and Disalcid.
- Glucotrol was removed; and Micronase is the suggested alternative.
- Cardiazem was removed. Procardia or Verapamil is the suggested alternative.
- Orudis was removed. Motrin, Indocin, Enteric Coated Aspirin and Disalcid are the suggested alternatives.
- Carafate was removed. The suggested alternative is, in some cases, Tagamet.

- Novadex was removed. There is no suggested alternative.
- Lozol was removed; and HCTZ 50mg is the suggested alternative.
- Quesstran Light was removed; and Niacin is the suggested alternative.
- Methotrexate was removed; and there is no suggested alternative.
- Naprosyn 250mg was removed. Motrin, Indocin, Enteric Coated Aspirin, and Disalcid are the suggested alternatives.
- Plaquenil 200mg was removed. There is no suggested alternative.
- Viskin was removed. Inderal and Corgard are the suggested alternatives.
- Immuran 50mg was removed; and there is no suggested alternative.
- Immodium 2mg was removed; and Lomotil is the suggested alternative.
- Xantax Tab was removed. Suggested alternatives are Librium and Ativan.
- Hygroton 25mg was removed; and HCTZ is the suggested alternative.
- Over-the-counter drugs have been removed; and there is no suggested alternative.
- Selsun was removed. There is no suggested alternative.
- Cotazyme was removed; and Pancrease is the suggested alternative.
- Kerlone was removed. Corgard is the suggested alternative.
- Quibron TSR was removed; and Slo-Bid is the suggested alternative.

In addition, the following drugs will be restricted according to specific protocols available at the Pharmacy: Tolectin, Tagamet, Antihypertensives, Retin-A Cream, and Inhalers.

"I found out later that someone else had seen it a couple of days before, but he thought it was dead, so he didn't bother checking on it," Keller said.


He and Cutlip took the male red-tailed hawk to the post veterinary clinic.

leveling board for approving \$50,000 for a 29-passenger bus.


"The bus will be used to transport our military community soldiers and their family members to and from the points of interest around the tri-state area. Even with the number of tours and programs reduced as a result of the budget reductions, we can now continue our programs through the use of this bus. Our Youth Services Center, Child Development Center, Recreation Center and outdoor sports program will derive a benefit and an enhancement to the quality of life at our installation," Brown said.

This Ford Terra Transit — white with green and blue stripes, and a green interior — arrived Feb. 26. Features include the television and VCR which are located just behind the driver's seat, a public address system, reading lights for the passengers, plenty of storage space, and reclining seats for 29 riders. "It'll be great for long trips," said Shelby Williams, chief of Youth Services which is one of the potential users.

Youth Center will use it on trips and tours for its military family members throughout the summer. The center's initial use of the shuttle bus is expected to take place for its springbreak day camp during the week of March 30 through April 3. Williams and three others at the center — Barbara Dumas, Gordon Keene and Brenda O'Neal — must first get certified to drive it. "We all have to get our chauffeur license and it will be driven by a licensed driver for the safety of our kids," Williams said.

"We're very excited. Last summer we used vans and we had to do double trips everywhere. It'll save a lot of time, and it'll be nicer for the kids to ride in," she said. "It'll enable us to do a lot more with our programs — not just us, but all of DCFA (Directorate of Community and Family Activities).

"We're just glad to have it available so that we can plan our summer programs and not necessarily have to worry about how we're going to get them (the children) there," Williams said.
