Army's top installation award the goal here for 1992-93

Now that Redstone has cleared the initial hurdle of becoming the Army's most improved installation, officials here are setting their sights on an even bigger ACOE prize next year.

The goal now is to win the Commander in Chiefs award and the \$1.5 million check that goes with it in the annual Army Communities of Excellence competition. Redstone is the 1991-92 winner in the most improved category with its \$125,000 prize.

Officials here will decide whether Redstone competes in the large installation category or the medium installation category. "We've always been on the borderline and we'll just decide; but it doesn't matter really which one we play in, we're going to win it. We're confident," said Col. Joseph Mabry, the deputy post commander and the commander of Redstone Arsenal Support Activity.

"After you've won Most Improved, you cannot compete in that category ever again; so, your competition is in whichever category your installation falls in: large, medium or small," Mabry said. "But that was our strategy last year — that we compete in the most improved category, get experience of being inspected, know what it's all about, know the rules — so the next year we'd go for the best in the particular category."

Fort Sill, Okla., is this year's winner of the top prize, the Commander in Chiefs award with its \$1.5 million check. Winners of Chief of Staff awards and \$1 million each include

Fort Bragg, large installation in Continental U.S.; Heidelberg, large installation Outside Continental U.S.; Fort Leavenworth, medium CONUS; Vicenza, medium OCONUS; White Sands, small CONUS; and Yongsan, small OCONUS. There were no large installation CONUS or OCONUS runners-up. Winners of runners-up awards and \$250,000 each include Fort Irwin, medium CONUS; Camp Zama, medium OCONUS; 7th ATC, medium OCONUS; Dugway, small CONUS; and Wiesbaden, small OCONUS.

"I'm confident that we will win whatever category that we're playing in, but our goal is to shoot for the top," Mabry said. The top prize is of course the Commander in Chiefs award.

"Again it's just going to be the same kind of effort that we put in last year: a total team effort," Mabry said, explaining how Redstone can win. "And we're at such a level now that going over the top is not going to be as tough as where we've come from." Plans include putting forth the same team effort as last year with emphasis on customer services and Total Quality Management.

Ideas were sought on how Redstone can best spend the \$125,000 check it will receive as the most improved installation. On April 6, a computerized message from the command group to Army activities here stated that the money must be spent by Sept. 30; and ideas on how to spend it were due by April 13 to Jean Keahy, the Missile (See ACOE, cont'd on page 14)

Easter Sunrise Service slated on post this Sunday

The Office of the Chaplain on Redstone Arsenal will conduct its 40th annual Easter Sunrise Service at 6 a.m. Sunday, April 19.

The service is to be held behind Post Chapel, Patton Road. Rain location would be Bicentennial Chapel, Goss Road. The public is invited.

"I think for Christians it is a celebration of the most significant event in maybe history and certainly their lives," said Chaplain (Col.) Norbert Bykowski, the staff chaplain for Redstone Arsenal. "It's triumph of good over evil. It's the resurrection of the Man they revere as God.

"So I think it (this service) does two things. I think it commemorates an historical event, but it's also a chance to renew a personal spiritual commitment," Bykowski said.

Patton Road's Gate 10, which is usually closed weekends, is to be open from 4:45-7:30 that morning for the convenience of those coming from off post. The hourlong service includes a processional featuring representatives from local military and patriotic organizations marching with colors. All the Redstone Arsenal units and their guidons are to be represented.

Easter greetings will be extended by Maj. Gen. William Chen, commander of the Missile Command and Redstone Arsenal. Scheduled speaker for the service is Chaplain (Col.) Donald Gover, staff chaplain

for Army Materiel Command in Alexandria, Va.

Gover, 55, is a native of Fort Worth, Texas. Ordained in 1961 at a Southern Baptist pastor, he was commissioned as a chaplain in the Army in 1967. Gover has served as AMC chaplain since August 1988.

The combined choirs of Bicentennial and Post Chapels will provide special music under the direction of Rick Melton, the choir director at Post Chapel. The combined choirs consist of about 40 members. There will also be a brass ensemble.

Among the participants from the community are veterans groups, patriotic and civic groups, high school ROTC groups and the Boy Scouts.


More than 700 people attended last year's Easter sunrise service "even though it was freezing that morning," recalled Astrid Lahiere, program assistant at Office of the Chaplain.

Transition support programs Thursday geared for Army people at crossroads

Two programs are slated here Thursday morning for Army people — civilians, military and family members — facing transition during these days of defense downsizing.

From 9-10 a.m., a video entitled "Discovering the Future" by Joel Arthur Barker will be presented at the Post Chapel. "This is a how-to-make-the-changes presentation that will enable individuals to create a more positive and beneficial future," said Chaplain (Lt. Col.) David McLean. It is recommended for civilians, military and family members.

At 10, the attendees will have the opportunity to go over to the Army Career and Alumni Program building for an hourlong tour of the ACAP facilities and programs. To attend the tour, call McLean 876-5751. "The size of the group is limited so please make arrangements early," he said.

The Army Career and Alumni Program, under Redstone Arsenal Support Activity, became fully operational last Oct. 1. Its seven-member staff at building 3433 on Aerobee Road includes four government civilians and three contractor employees. ACAP is a transition and job assistance program to assist military personnel, civilian personnel and their family members as they transition out of federal service.

A postwide family transition support group has been formed to assist military families affected by the Army's downsizing. The group meets the first Monday of each month from 6:30-8 p.m. at Bicentennial Chapel. The May 4 program includes a presentation of "Working for America," a professionally-produced video about the American servicemembers.

"The people (in the support group) are very openly sharing the decisions and the choices that they are having to make," McLean said. "And on the negative side of it, we are discovering that some families are finding

Local Army commands named to seatbelt honor roll

The Strategic Defense Command and the Army Engineers Division Huntsville, two Army commands that share office space on Wynn Drive, also shared recognition from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration for seatbelt safety.

The two Army commands qualified for the award when a survey of employees at their Wynn Drive complex showed that 72-74 percent routinely use safety belts.

Larry Nelson, highway safety coordinator for North Alabama, presented a plaque to Col. Paul Mullek, SDC deputy for operations, and Lt. Col. Eugene Cranor, AEDH executive officer, naming these Huntsville Army commands to the 70 percent Plus Honor Roll. When employees driving into the Wynn Drive parking lot were surveyed in November and December, 72 percent and 74 percent, respectively, were found to be wearing safety belts.

This compares to a Huntsvillewide safety belt usage of approximately 60 percent which is considerably higher than the national safety belt use rate of just under 50 percent.

"This is a significant award," Nelson said. "What we're really talking here is lives saved — that's the bottom line." A high level of safety belt use means fewer traffic fatalities and less severe injuries.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration started this honor roll in support of President

Bush's goal of achieving a national average of 70 percent safety belt use by 1992. Statistics show that about 45,000 people in this country die each year in motor vehicle crashes and hundreds of thousands are injured. From 1983 through 1989, the agency estimates that more than 20,000 lives were saved by safety belts. If all front-seat occupants wore safety belts, it is estimated over 15,000 lives would be saved each year.

Nelson indicated that the Army commands were the

first organizations in Cummings Research Park to achieve this 70 percent Plus award. Any organization with more than 100 employees is eligible to participate in this national award program.

In July, Alabama drivers will begin being cited for not wearing safety belts as the mandatory safety belt law goes into effect.

"Buckle up — not just because it's the law — but because it saves lives," Nelson urged.

More foster parents needed for children in community

The need for foster parents is a classic case of the demand always exceeding the supply. There always seem to be more children in need of temporary homes than there are people willing to share their homes.

The sad part is those children awaiting placement in foster homes are being removed from high-risk or abusive environments, said Sal Riccardi, family advocacy program manager at Army Community Service and also Redstone's foster parents program coordinator. If foster homes cannot be found, this only makes the situation more difficult for the children.

"It's a real shame that they end up bearing the brunt of an abusive situation," Riccardi said.

Foster parents are people who have been trained and certified by the state to provide a temporary home for a child who, for whatever reason, has been removed from his or her home of origin. It takes a special person to serve as a foster parent: opening up their home to a child in need while knowing that the child will eventually be returned to his or her original home. Duration of foster care can range from as little as two days to as long as two years.

Riccardi serves as an advocate and as a referral source for foster parents. The number of military and Army civilian workers here serving as foster parents has dwindled through attrition while the statewide need continues.

"It's a way of giving to the community, both to our community and to the future of our community," Riccardi said.

Without a good environment, children who are abused or neglected often end up becoming abusers or criminals. "Giving a child love can go a long ways toward keeping them out of what basically is a dead-end street," Riccardi said.

The Alabama Department of Human Resources does the recruiting, training and certification of foster homes. There are five members of the foster care resource and adoption unit within the Department of Human Resources in Madison County.

First, prospective foster parents are given a broad picture of what the program is all about and what the minimum standards are. They then receive the application forms. They must be cleared statewide and federally and have their fingerprints submitted. They go through a 16-hour training period on the Department of Human Resources and being a foster parent. Next the department does a home study to license them as foster parents. It takes the fingerprints about six weeks to be returned, so the certification process can take from six weeks to two months.

"Right now we have approximately 240 children in foster care," said Pat Cronkhite, who supervises the foster care resource and adoptions for Madison County. "This is always constantly revolving and changing. We have children coming out and coming in."

Ages of the children range from infancy to 18 years. There are 4,500 children in foster care statewide.

"The primary goal is for them to be returned home," said Nettye Jackson, a coordinator for foster

care in Madison County. "Foster care is supposed to be temporary; and then adoption care is our permanent program and that's forever." Besides the foster care program, Jackson serves as a coordinator for the One Church One Child adoption program which began in January.

At least 25 more foster homes are needed in Madison County, according to Jackson. Marriage is not a prerequisite; single people can serve as foster parents, too.

All that is necessary to become a host family is to include the student in the family and community, as opposed to being a tourist.

Why are host families needed? Although a large number of students were placed last summer, thousands more would have loved to come if there had been more host families. Dr. Yee still a chemist here after all these years

Dr. Tin Boo Yee first came to Redstone Arsenal (then Huntsville Arsenal) in May 1942 to work as a chemist during World War II. Now, 50 years later, he's still here, still working as a chemist.

He left for a time at the end of the war to earn his doctorate in chemistry and ceramics at the University of Illinois, but returned to Redstone in 1955.

On Thursday, he received a pin and certificate for 40 years government service. If he's asked why he's stayed so long, his answer is, "we have the best facilities in the country for research, and everyone here is so helpful. We're just like one big family."

Yee works in the Structures Directorate of the Research Development and Engineering Center.

He was born in Southern China in 1915 and came to the United States in 1926 with his father and brother. They settled in Wynne, Ark., where he graduated high school as valedictorian in 1935.

He holds a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Arkansas State College in 1938 and a master's in chemistry from the University of Arkansas.

Yee was recognized by Ripley's "Believe it or Not" in 1983 for a sunflower he developed by cross pollination and laser energy that yielded 110 flowers on one plant.

He also patented his invention to repair worn out edges of shoe heels. The material extends the life of shoe heels to six years, Yee said.

Yee has an ongoing quibble with the U.S. Patent Office, to whom he submitted an application entitled, "Device and Method for Demonstration of Perpetual Motion." The application was turned down, Yee said, but he has resubmitted his application under another title, "Device and Method for Demonstration of Autorotation." The Patent Office doesn't believe in perpetual motion, Yee said.

Weapon systems organization opens total-quality effort

The Weapon Systems Management Directorate on Monday opened an effort to improve the way it does business.

Total Quality Management includes customer focus, process orientation, continuous process improvements, and is a cultural change, Maj. Gen. William Chen said during the directorate's TQM kickoff. lustrate the TQM process — with the help of volunteers from the audience. Participants and the roles they played included Emily Saile, customer; Terry Chumley, delivery coordinator; CWO 2 Dwight Durmon, inspector; Kathy Engle, production analyst;

John Zimmerman, loadmaster; and Richard "Rick" Lindsey, timekeeper.

The Weapon Systems Management Directorate and its 152 people, mostly civilian, are augmented by matrix personnel from other organizations.

Military retirees most concerned about pay, health care

Top issues on the minds of military retirees these days include cost of living adjustments to retired pay, and retiree influence on health care policy changes.

These were among 51 issues considered at this year's meeting of the Chief of Staff, Army Retiree Council. "The council received and reviewed 51 issues that were submitted by installation retiree councils," said Lawrence Welcome, a member of the chief of staff's council and the representative from Redstone Arsenal.

It recommended that seven of these issues receive the personal attention of the Army Chief of Staff, Gen. Gordon Sullivan. From one to seven, they are: cost of living adjustments to retired pay; retiree influence on health care policy changes; extension of Champus eligibility; retiree dental insurance; issue of pharmaceuticals; retiree demographics in facility planning; and military courtesy.

"All retirees should be concerned with that," Welcome said, referring to the cost of living issue, "not just at Redstone, it's all over."

"This could cause reduction in your purchasing power, and impact on the quality of life of the current population," he said.

Over the past several years, protection of military retired COLA (cost of living adjustment) has been provided by congressional binding together of military and federal civil servant retirement pay and Social Security, the council reported. The fiscal 1993 Administration Budget proposal includes a provision for discontinuing this binding. Loss of the protection provided by connection of retiree COLA to the politically sensitive adjustment of Social Security benefits creates an obvious risk to future COLA, the council stated. The council recommended that the chief of staff seize "every opportunity to express his personal support of COLA and his opposition to any action which would weaken the current assurance that retiree pay and survivor benefits will be treated exactly as Social Security benefits when adjusting them to reflect changes in the cost of living."

Retiree influence on health care policy changes was listed as the No. 2 issue. "What this all sums up to: They need to provide some type of reliable communication between retirees and leaders of the Army and allow retirees the opportunity to analyze and in-

fluence policies and decisions which affect them," Welcome said.

Welcome and the other 22 members of the council, including two co-chairmen, had their annual meeting March 23-27 in Washington, D.C. These Army retirees were from various stateside installations and from as far away as Belgium and Germany. The council's 32nd meeting was the second for Welcome. Next year's meeting is set for March 29 to April 3.

This is Welcome's second year of a four-year term as a council member, a voluntary position. Members are nominated by their installation retiree council and approved by Department of Army. Welcome received a letter in December 1990 confirming his appointment.

The 49-year-old native of Orange, Texas, has been active on the Redstone Arsenal Retiree Council ever since he retired from the Army as a sergeant first class

in March 1985 with nearly 22 years service. Welcome is an electronic integrated systems leader in the missile division, air defense branch, in Redstone Arsenal Support Activity's Directorate of Logistics.

"We hope that the recommendations made to the chief of staff of the Army reflect the feelings of the total retiree community," Welcome said.

There are more than 15,000 military retirees in northern Alabama and southern Tennessee, according to Phil Fredrich, the retirement services officer for Redstone Arsenal and a retired command sergeant major. The Retirement Services Office for military retirees can be reached at 876-2022/4668. Retired Lt. Gen. Robert L. Moore is chairman of the Redstone Arsenal Retiree Council.

Military retirees should make their concerns known to the retirement services office, according to Welcome. "They need to stand up and be counted," he said. "United we stand, divided we fall. That's the way I look at it."







Redstone golf course growing through construction

The opening of one of the biggest golf tournaments of the year, the Masters in Augusta, Ga., made for a good excuse — uh, reason — for this reporter to visit Redstone's own golf course last Thursday. Strictly business, of course.

Redstone Golf Course is expanding through construction. The current project adds a new two-acre lake which will irrigate all the fairways and also heighten the challenge for golfers on holes 2, 3 and 4. A future project will add nine holes and also construct a new clubhouse, driving range, parking facilities, and a tunnel connecting the present 18 holes with the new nine. Also, that project will include complete renovation of the existing 18-hole course.

"After which we'll have a 27-hole facility probably in late summer, early fall of '96," said William "Chip" Enlow, the pro/manager at Redstone Golf Course.

The new lake is being built to the right of the No. 2 green, extends in front of the ladies tee No. 3, and circles around to the right of the No. 4 green, according to Gerald Brock, the golf course superintendent. The entire golf course will be irrigated from this lake which should be completed this summer. "The water supply will be derived from two sources: a well that has been drilled to the right of No. 14 fairway; and the other source of supply will be runoff upstream," Brock said. "The irrigation system is being installed by Nebraska Sprinkler Company out of Omaha, Neb."

This irrigation project, funded entirely with non-appropriated funds, costs more than \$500,000. Scheduled completion date is Aug. 1, but "from the latest discussion with the contractor, he plans to be out of here by June 1 provided the weather holds up and everything," Brock said.

The project to add nine holes on the west side and behind Fox Army Community Hospital is in the design phase. "This project will also include a new clubhouse in the same area, driving range, parking facilities and a tunnel connecting the present 18 with the new nine,"

Enlow said. The project has been contracted for design; and the design work should be completed by early fall.

"Also, part of this (expansion) project will include the complete renovation of the existing 18-hole course," Enlow said. "After the new nine is finished, then the existing front nine — the current front nine — will be closed for approximately one year; then when it's open for play, the current back nine will be closed for approximately one year."

A 27-hole facility should result by late summer or early fall of 1996 "if things move smoothly," he said. Pettyjean and Associates of Birmingham is the contractor on this \$2.9 million project, funded entirely by non-appropriated funds.

"Pettyjean is the clubhouse designer for all of the new Sunbelt Corporation golf courses throughout the state including the new facility in Huntsville (on Hampton Road across Monte Sano Mountain)," Enlow said.

John LaFoy of South Carolina is the golf course architect for the new nine and renovation of the existing 18. "John LaFoy has designed new and renovated courses throughout Alabama including Valley Hill and Huntsville Country Clubs, Birmingham Country Club East Course, Montgomery Country Club, Vestavia Country Club, Mountain Brook Country Club, and several others. He also re-designed several holes at Fort Jackson, S.C.," Enlow said.

The ongoing irrigation project has caused some inconvenience for golfers since one or two holes have been required to be closed at a time. The future expansion project should have little impact on play since there will be 18 holes open for play throughout that project.

"When the total project is finished, Redstone should again have one of the better golf facilities offered in north Alabama and within the military environment," Enlow said.

Redstone course getting its share of golf boom

Golf's growing popularity has caused some policy changes at Redstone Golf Course in order to accommodate the increased number of players.

"We have had to go to reserved tee times Tuesday through Friday until noon each day," said William "Chip" Enlow, the pro/manager.

A tee time on the front nine may be reserved by calls only one day prior, anytime after 3 p.m. A reserved tee time for Tuesday will be made after 3 p.m. on the previous Friday. A minimum of three golfers are required to obtain the tee time; for groups with only three players, the fourth slot will be filled by the Starter off the waiting list.

"For weekend and holiday tee times, active duty personnel and their family members may reserve tee times in person or by phone each Tuesday. A minimum of three golfers are required to secure the tee time, of which two must be active duty personnel," Enlow said. "Any remaining weekend/holiday tee times are distributed through a 'lottery' system that was recently activated."

Lottery system

The drawing or lottery is conducted on Wednesdays at 3 p.m. Boxes labeled Saturday, Sunday and Holiday, will be provided at the Pro Shop. Application cards may be dropped in one, two or all three boxes from 3 p.m. the preceding Wednesday through 3 p.m. on Wednesday of the drawing. Application cards must be printed and must include at least three names, of which, two must be Golf Course members; membership numbers must be indicated. A single active duty person, who does not meet the minimum required two for Tuesday priority consideration, may participate in the drawing.

Any remaining tee times, after the drawing, can be acquired by other authorized users of the Golf Course,

by telephone only, after 4 p.m. on Wednesday. On Thursday, tee times may also be reserved in person.

To reserve a tee time, golfers can call 876-6888 or 837-7950. If a holiday falls on Monday and the course is closed on Tuesday, active duty tee times will be taken on Wednesday from Pro Shop opening until 3 p.m.

"There are some general policies that have been in effect for some time, that go into effect on April 1 each year; and by necessity are strictly enforced," Enlow said. A person may only have one guest on Saturday morning before 11 a.m., and that guest cannot reside within a 50-mile radius of Redstone. After 11 a.m., a golfer may have up to three guests, with no restrictions on where they live.

"Also, fivesomes are no longer allowed at the golf course," Enlow said. "It's been in effect now for about a year."

New service

This year, for the first time, the golf course will be running a beverage and snack cart on the course eight hours every day to better serve its patrons.

A starter is on duty eight to 10 hours daily, and course marshals patrol the course daily.

Fees and hours

Authorized users of the golf course include active and retired military and their eligible family members; Redstone Arsenal government employees and, if they have a family membership, their eligible family members. "These categories are eligible to use the course on a daily fee basis or may pay advance annual green fees," Enlow said. "Government contractors who are members of the Officers Club or NCO Club are eligible to utilize the facility on only a daily greens fee basis."

For authorized users, the 18-hole green fees are \$10 during the week and \$11 on weekends or holidays. Guests pay \$13 during the week, \$15 on weekends or holidays. Enlisted soldiers E-1 to E-5 pay \$5 anytime.

Annual fees range anywhere from \$180 to \$810, depending on rank and number of family members. Fees may be paid either by lump sum or in quarterly installments. Lockers and club storage are also available; lockers for \$12 annually, and club storage for \$48 each year. Counting family members, some 601 people have annual memberships.

The snack bar and pro shop open at 7:30 a.m.; the course opens for play a half hour later, and closes at dusk. On weekends, the snack bar and pro shop open at 6:30 a.m., play begins at 7 and ends at dusk. Beginning May 1, the opening times will be 30 minutes earlier. The course is open six days a week and is normally closed Monday. When a holiday falls on Monday, the course is closed Tuesday.

"We had 50,000 rounds last year. And the last two years, we've increased by approximately 5,000 each year," Enlow said, describing the increasing play. "And I anticipate going over 55,000 this year. We're running ahead of last year at this same period of time by about 1,500 rounds; and I anticipate we'll go well over 55,000 this year."

The numbers show Redstone Golf Course is getting its share of the golf boom. "For authorized users of our course, I think that we provide the best golf bargain in the area," Enlow said. "Our course is challenging, enjoyable to play and well-maintained; and our prices are still slightly lower than the municipal rates."





Moder motors to win among female runners in 8K

A relative newcomer to running was the top female finisher in the fourth annual Scholarship Fund 8K (five-mile) road race Saturday in downtown Huntsville.

Trixi Moder, 25, of Madison, crossed the finish line in 34 minutes and six seconds. A runner since May 1990, she was 45th of about 204 finishers overall. Terry Daniel, 35, of Athens, won the race in 26:26.

"It was a great day. Slight breeze. Not too hot; I was surprised. The people were great, it's well organized," said Moder, an engineer at Saginaw Division, General Motors. "The third mile I was dying because I didn't get a water. And my last mile felt great because I did get a water, because I was replenished. But it was very hilly. If anybody wants to do strength work, try this course."

Daniel, a salesman for a chemical company, left for work right after winning the road race. Carl Nicholson, 45, finished second overall in 27:01. Kyle Rose, 30, was third in 27:10.

"Terry Daniel and I ran the first loop more or less together, exchanging the lead a couple of times along the way," said Nicholson, a Boeing engineer in Huntsville. "Then the second loop, he took off or I died. I probably died." Rose, the eventual third place finisher, took the lead just short of the first loop and held it for 50 to 60 yards.

The road race co-sponsored by Huntsville Track Club and Purity Dairies raised an estimated \$400 for HTC's Harold and Louise Tinsley Scholarship fund, according to Lawrence Hillis, president of the track club. The fund provides scholarships to HTC members who intend to run for a college track or cross country team. "We've had scholarship award winners for two years. And we've got some right now that will be decided on by the first of May," Hillis said.




