## Handmade quilt is record of a military career

A handmade gift is much appreciated at Christmas, unique in that no other one exactly like it exists.

Lt. Col David Osborn, commander of the 74th Maintenance Battalion, Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment, got a Christmas present from his mother, Deloris Osborn, a little early this year, when he found out she had cross-stitched a quilt depicting his military career.

The quilt, destined to become a family heirloom, consists of 12 cross-stitched blocks inset on a red, white and blue field. The blocks depict the progress of his military career with the symbols of his military ranks and branches of service, various military unit crests and patches, military schools attended and various locations he was stationed.

"Most of the cross-stitch designs could not be found at commercial dealers so they had to be created from insignia and patches," Mrs. Osborn said.

She got a friend to chart 21 of the 37 designs the quilt contains, she said. In return, she taught the friend to play the organ.

She was for many years organist and pianist at the Mt. View Baptist Church but has now retired. Her husband, Leroy, is retired from the Marshall Space Flight Center.

Mrs. Osborn came up with the idea of making the quilt during Desert Shield/Desert Storm, in which Lt. Col. Osborn participated.

"During an interview with one of the officers, I saw on the wall behind his desk some sort of wall-hanging with military patches on it, and that's when I decided it would be a neat idea to do a career quilt for my son," Mrs. Osborn said.

She got quite a bit of work done on the quilt while

## Civilian equipment experts go to Somalia with soldiers

Logistic Assistance Representatives from MICOM are involved in the first significant operation by U.S. forces since Desert Storm.

The relief mission to Somalia brought the scheduled deployment of the 10th Mountain Division out of Fort Drum, N.Y. Two of the Missile Command's logistic assistance reps were slated to go with that light infantry division.

Both men are from the east region at Fort Bragg, N.C., and will be assigned to the logistic support group which is an Army Material Command team. Their mission is "to provide logistic assistance to the 10th Mountain during the operation," said Frank Gardner, chief of the fire support branch in the logistic assistance division at MICOM.

Logistic assistance representatives are civilian experts in Army missile systems. These equipment specialists wear battledress uniforms when they go to the field with the units they support. During the Somalia mission, the LARs will be living in tents like the soldiers and coping with the same conditions — including a lack of water in that African nation. "They'll be living under field conditions is a good way to put it," Gardner said.

Paul M. Smith and John Neuding have orders for as long as a 179-day stay in Somalia. If the mission goes beyond that period, "we'll have to rotate like we did in Desert Storm," Gardner said.

Both are fire support people who are highly-trained in missile systems such as TOW. Neuding served an assignment in Southwest Asia.

There are about 150 logistic assistance representatives worldwide; these include fire support people

# MLRS celebrates delivery of 500,000th rocket

The Multiple Launch Rocket System team achieved a milestone in November with delivery of the 500,000th rocket by the contractor, Loral Vought Systems Corp., to the Army.

A ceremony, complete with fireworks, was held Nov. 14 at the contractor's manufacturing facility in Camden, Ark.

"When we signed the first contract in 1980, we had never intended to build 500,000 rockets," said Bob Ryland, chief of production engineering at MLRS Project Office. "We had intended to build approximately 365,000. And here 12 years later we have built 500,000, and we're nearing the end of the program. We will complete delivery in late 1993 of this what we call basic program."

Referring to the recent milestone, he said "500,000 of anything is a very large number."

Col. William Taylor, the project manager, expressed the Army's thanks to the MLRS team during the ceremony in which he was among four speakers. There

are 159 members of the project office; 17 are military and the rest civilian. Dennis Vaughn is the deputy project manager. MLRS Project Office is under the Program Executive Office for Tactical Missiles.

The first rocket rolled off the production line in May 1982; and production of the basic system will end in late 1993. New developments include the extended range rocket and the SADARM (Search and Destroy Armor) rocket. These new rockets will go into production in the 1995-96 time frame. "In the meantime, production of a newly-developed reduced range training rocket will commence in late '93," Ryland added.

Among the highlights of the Nov. 14 ceremony was the showing of the "MLRS in the Storm" video. Scenes from Desert Storm came to life on a large projection screen. The footage of the night firing of MLRS led into the big event — a fireworks display.

"We like to use Desert Storm as a good indication of the proof of the pudding: the fact that we shot some 20,000 of these rockets during Operation Desert Storm with a high degree of success," Ryland said.

## Command opens internal controls effort

The MICOM commander urges managers to become personally involved in the Army program by which they manage their resources.

On Monday morning, Maj. Gen. Joe Rigby addressed managers of the Missile Command at the fiscal 1993 kickoff for the internal management control program. Internal management controls are the "format by which we control fraud, waste and abuse," he said. "They're also important because they're vital to the way we do business."

Rigby told the managers the program has received recent emphasis from the secretary of the Army.

"I want you to become very very personally involved with the management control processes within your organization," he said.

The secretary of the Army is looking to the Army Materiel Command to take the lead in the internal controls effort, according to Col. Melson Kahue, director of resource management.

Homer Reynolds, a management analyst in the productivity management division of Resource Management Directorate, serves as administrator of the internal management control program. The Army has identified 76 checklists for completion this fiscal year, but not all of the checklists are applicable to MICOM, Reynolds said. He outlined the following schedule for managers:

- Update your internal management controls' point of contact listing and provide this update to the administrator by Jan. 4.
- Material weaknesses and internal management control initiatives are due to the administrator by the 10th workday after each quarter. The next report is due Jan. 15.
- Primary organizational elements are to identify and complete applicable checklists; they should give

the administrator a listing of identified checklists with completion date by Jan. 20.

- Internal management control responsibility rosters should be updated and provided to the administrator by Jan. 29.

- Managers should identify the number of people needing internal management control training and report to the administrator by Jan. 29.

"Managers need to make sure that in signing their annual assurance statement that all checklists are completed and that they have the correct people signing the checklists as the operating manager and the reviewer," Reynolds said.

Lt. Col. Osborn is commander of the 74th Maintenance Battalion, which is moving from Fort Lewis, Wash., to Redstone. Expected completion date for the move is Jan. 1.

Lt. Col. Osborn and his wife Dawn, a pharmacist, have four sons: Shaun, 11, Ryan, 9, Kyle, 6, and Kevin, 3. They live on Redstone.

Deloris Osborn has made other quilts, and is now working on another quilt that contains world-famous Hummel figurine designs. But the recently completed career quilt is unlike any other handmade project she has been involved with.

"I found it a challenging and rewarding project that other mothers or wives might be interested in. Since no two military members would have identical assignments or units, a career quilt serves as an individualized record of their service," she said.

and air defense people. They are GS-12s with mobility agreements — meaning they can be assigned anywhere at anytime, within reason. About 100 LARs served in Southwest Asia, and five air defenders are still there.

"We had them in Vietnam," Gardner said, referring to past deployments involving logistic assistance representatives. "The mission is not always the same; but as long as it's a military mission, we'll be there."

watching television "more than usual" to get the latest news from Saudi Arabia, she said.

She also logged many hours on the quilt during a six-month trip she and her husband took to Alaska in the early part of this year. "My husband was heavily involved in genealogical research at the time, so I had a lot of time to devote to my project," Mrs. Osborn said.

Reading three blocks across and four rows down, the quilt includes blocks for: Jacksonville State University; military associations at Jacksonville State; Fort Benning, Ga., where Osborn attended basic and advanced infantry, airborne and ranger training; Fort Riley, Kan.; Fort Dix, N.J.; his assignment in Germany; Fort Hood, Texas; Desert Shield; Desert Storm; 74th Maintenance Battalion, TMDE, Redstone; the Army seal; and the last block which shows a house with the motto, "Home is where the Army sends you."

The Osborn family has lived in Huntsville since 1958, where Lt. Col. Osborn attended Chapman Elementary and Middle Schools and graduated from Lee High School in 1970. He is a 1974 graduate of Jacksonville State University with the distinguished military graduate award.

# Retention register part of reshape planning process

As part of the reshaping planning process, the civilian personnel office has distributed retention registers for the Missile Command's competitive area.

According to officials at the Civilian Personnel Office, MICOM is in competitive area 01, which also includes TMDE, the PEO for Tactical Missiles, Redstone Technical Test Center, LOSAT, ADCCS, FAAD Sensors, UAV-SR, UAV-CC, and the Defense Systems Management College. Employees in these areas are included in the retention registers. Retention registers are also being distributed for competitive area 02, which is comprised of the Redstone Arsenal Support Activity.

Everyone within these competitive areas should have the opportunity to review the register to make sure individual information is correct. Employees who have access to the Sperry system can review entries by typing the word retention at the \$ prompt and then entering the competitive level code. This could not have been done without the help of Army computer programmers located at Redstone Arsenal, according to the Civilian Personnel Office.

Leonard Farbman, chief of the Technical Services Branch of CPO, stressed that this is a working retention register to be used for RIF planning purposes as directed by the Army Materiel Command. Distribution of the register does not mean a RIF has been ordered.

"We are very concerned that people's records are correct and we want to take corrective action as quickly as possible," he said.

Don Dixon, chief of Recruiting and Placement in CPO, agreed.

"Employees need to see where they stand, and see if there are any questionable areas, especially in the regular service computation date and the adjusted service computation date," he said.

Below is some of the information contained in a retention register. To ensure that your name is listed in the correct location on the register, make sure the following items are correct.

- Tenure Group: Group I includes career employees who are not serving a probationary period; Group II includes those employees who are career-conditional and those serving a probationary period for an initial appointment to a competitive position; Group III includes employees serving under indefinite appointments, temporary appointments pending establishment of registers, term appointments and any other non-status, non-temporary appointments.

- Subgroup: AD is for compensably disabled (by 30 percent or more) veterans; all other veterans are identified by the letter A; nonveterans are assigned the letter, B. Tenure group and subgroup identification is combined like this: I-B. A person in group/subgroup I-B is a career, nonprobationary employee who is not a veteran.

- Service computation date: This is the date the federal government recognizes as the first day of your creditable federal service. If you had military service or if you had a break in federal service, this date is adjusted to reflect your total service.

- Adjusted service computation date: This date, like the one above, is very important, since it can affect your standing on the register. The adjusted service computation date is based on your job performance. Your three latest annual performance appraisals are used to compute this date. For each exceptional rating you receive 20 bonus years; for each highly successful rating, 16 years; and for each fully successful, 12 years. Any rating below these does not earn bonus

years. To determine your adjusted service computation date, CPO adds the bonus years from each of your three latest performance appraisals, then averages them to get one figure, which is rounded to the next highest whole number.

Here is an example. Say your service computation date is Oct. 16, 1971. Your latest appraisal rating is exceptional. Your two previous appraisals were fully successful. That gives you a total of 44 bonus years. The average number for the three years is 14.66. Rounded up, the figure is 15. Subtract 15 from 1971 to arrive at the adjusted SCD of Oct. 16, 1956. You should do this math yourself, and check it against what is on the register.

Remember that bonus years are awarded only for purposes of figuring a RIF retention register. They don't count toward retirement.

If you think something is incorrect in your retention register entry, or if you have any other questions let your administrative office know so the information can be forwarded to CPO.

# Deer-car strikes continue declining trend

Redstone is in the middle of high deer-strike season now, but the downward trend in the number of deer-vehicle collisions that began several years ago seems to be continuing.

Figures provided by the Provost Marshal's Office show the numbers of collisions going down since 1988. Here are the calendar year totals: 1988, 70; 1989, 64; 1990, 61; 1991, 56. The total as of Dec. 9 of this year is 44.

CSM Jeff Gilmore of the provost marshal office said he believes the decreasing numbers are the result of an aggressive campaign on the part of the Redstone Arsenal Support Activity that includes driver education, warning signs, and anti-deer reflectors placed in high-strike areas.

Gilmore stressed that even though numbers are down, the potential for hitting a deer in this area, whether you're on or off post, still exists.

"Alabama has the third highest deer population in the United States," he said.

Here are a few reminders from the PMO:

- Redstone has several high-strike zones. They include the southern part of Patton Road; Rideout Road; and the eastern and western portions of Martin

Road. But these aren't the only places you might encounter deer. You should be alert any time you're traveling in areas that include a forest "edge," a treeline that ends near the road.

- Dark hours near dawn and dusk are risky, because deer are moving about more then than during the daylight hours.

- If you see a deer on the side of the road, slow down. Deer are extremely unpredictable. They tend to panic and run into cars.

- If you collide with a deer, don't get near it. It could revive and bolt, and could injure you with its hooves. Be sure to notify the MPs if you hit a deer or a deer hits you.



# Redstone units raise money, contribute time to ACS

Two Redstone Arsenal units have been recognized for their support of the Army Community Service Emergency Food Locker.

Companies E and C, 832nd Ordnance Battalion, received Army Communities of Excellence certificates from Colleen Rigby, wife of the MICOM commander, at their unit headquarters Thursday.

Both units have had the emergency food locker as their community service projects for the last year and a half; during the past eight months they have saved ACS about \$1,000 because of their donations, according to Juanita Adams, Army Emergency Relief officer.

Not only have the units sponsored fund-raisers for money to buy food, soldiers have picked up shopping lists from ACS, done the shopping, labeled the items and stocked the shelves at the ACS facility.

"I think it's wonderful. It's a way of providing tangible savings to the government," Adams said.

Leah Amato, one of the volunteers who had shopped for the food locker for the past four years, had words of praise for the units.

"We owe all of them a big hug. Since they've undertaken this project I haven't had to do the shopping for the food locker even once," she said. "And the neatest part is they're doing it for their own. It's a wonderful cause."

The ACS Emergency Food Locker is established to supply soldiers and their families food on a short time basis — not more than five days during an emergency. The locker stocks canned and staple food items, baby formula and even disposable diapers.

"We see a peak in soldiers' needs at the beginning of the school year, prior to the holiday period and right after the holidays — times when they have a lot of extra expenses," Adams said.

Any need that exceeds five days is handled through Army Emergency Relief, which provides interest-free loans or grants to soldiers.

In certain cases, the food locker serves as a quick-fix to the spouse of a soldier, Adams said.

"AER can't give a loan to a spouse, so through the food locker we can give immediate relief to a spouse while we contact the soldier who's away from Redstone and can't be reached immediately," she explained.

The Tropical Roots and Tuber Research Project (ROTREP) executive committee meeting was held at the university Dec. 5-9. ROTREP is a U.S. Agency for International Development (AID) sponsored technical assistance project in Cameroon. Its main objectives are the development of a rapid seed multiplication and distribution system for roots and tubers — Cassava, cocoyams, yams and sweet potatoes — in Cameroon, development of a root rot disease resistant variety of cocoyams, and the strengthening of the research capability of the Institute of Agricultural Research (IRA) through academic and technical training of Cameroonians. IRA is the collaborating host country institute on the project.

There are three U.S. universities involved in the project: Alabama A&M, Florida A&M, and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore which is the lead institution. The project is currently funded for eight years from 1986 at a level of \$9,939,937 from the U.S. government and additional \$3,870,934 matching from the Cameroon government.

The executive committee is the governing or policy-making authority on the project and meets once a year alternately in Cameroon and in the United States to review and approve work plans and budgets. It consists of the representatives of the government of Cameroon, the three participating U.S. universities, the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) in Nigeria which is a collaborating international research center in the project, and the U.S. AID mission in Cameroon.

Among those at the meeting held at Alabama A&M was Dr. Jacob Ayuk-Takem, Cameroon's minister of higher education, computer services and scientific research (MESIRES); and his wife, Sophie.

The ROTREP is one of many such technical assistance projects which Alabama A&M University

carries out in many less developed countries mainly in Africa and the Caribbean.

# Contractor delivers first Avenger multi-year fire unit

Dec. 8 marked a new chapter in Avenger missile system history, when the first fire unit manufactured under a multi-year contract rolled off the production line at the Boeing facility in Huntsville.

A ribbon cutting ceremony to mark the event was held at Boeing Defense & Space Group Missile & Space Division with project office people joining Boeing employees in the celebration.

Some 325 Avenger fire units have been manufactured and delivered to the Army under the original Avenger contract awarded to Boeing in August 1987. That contract was worth \$232 million. Under the new multi-year contract awarded to Boeing last February, 679 additional units will be delivered to the Army and Marine Corps. The contract is worth \$436 million and production will extend into 1997.

Lt. Col. Jerry Hamilton, Avenger project manager, spoke to the Boeing employees who had gathered for the ribbon cutting event, along with Alex Henschel, Boeing's program manager for Avenger and MICOM programs, and Ross Dessert, Boeing's Avenger production manager.

"This milestone represents more than a long-term production contract with the Army," Henschel said. "It also symbolizes to us that we are producing a valuable system for our country's military troops that will be a part of the government's arsenal for years to come."

The system carries eight Stinger missiles in two pods ready for rapid firing from a gyro-stabilized turret.

The High Mobility Multipurpose Wheeled Vehicle (HMMWV) is the primary carrier, but the system is designed to operate in a stand-alone configuration or from various military vehicles. Targets are acquired either direct vision using the heads-up optical sight or by using a Forward Looking Infrared (FLIR) system.

Avenger was first fielded during Operation Desert Shield/Storm. The following Army units have the Avenger: 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment, Fort Bliss, Texas; 2nd Battalion, 6th Air Defense Artillery, Fort Bliss, Texas; 4th Battalion, 5th Air Defense Artillery, 1st Cavalry, Fort Hood, Texas; 5th Battalion, 5th Air Defense Artillery, Korea; 1st Battalion, 5th Air Defense Artillery, Fort Stewart, Ga.; and 1st Battalion, 2nd Air Defense Artillery, Fort Stewart.

Avenger is assembled, integrated and tested at the Boeing facility in Huntsville where about 200 employees work on the program.

Avenger is managed by the Program Executive Office, Tactical Missiles, which is headed by George Williams, program executive officer. Col. Thomas Devaney is his deputy. Lt. Col. Hamilton's Avenger deputy is John Sundberg.



# Exchange uses high-tech surveillance to nab shoplifters

The Christmas season brings more business to the Post Exchange but that also means an increase in shoplifting.

Shoplifting is a big problem at the PX as it is at most stores these days. Whether it's the tough economic times or the sophisticated surveillance cameras, or a combination of both factors, shoplifting is on the rise and more people are getting caught.

The PX has already had a whopping 147 cases so far this year — from the end of January until last Friday. An even more staggering number is the average of about five cases each day that go undetected — about 150 a month. "We can't catch everybody on those cameras," said Stanley Drejewski, the PX manager.

There are electronic surveillance cameras throughout the store. A customer who acts suspicious can literally be followed from one end of the store to another. Since the cameras were installed in June 1991, the number of shoplifters nabbed has risen from the days when store detectives had to walk the floors. About four per month were getting caught in 1990. "Now we're catching 13 a month," said the exchange detective supervisor who asked that her name not be published.

"Additional cameras were added just recently in

areas that were really high-theft areas," Drejewski said, "so we're going to be doing an even better job."

Shoplifters at the PX range from teen-agers to people in their 60s, include males and females, civilians and military, guests and cardholders. Excuses given

are just as varied. They take colognes and perfumes, music tapes, jewelry, clothing and other items. One person got away unobserved with \$247 worth of lingerie.

"Our shortage for fiscal year '91 was \$184,567 which equates out to 1.04 shortage which is over our allowed percentage," Drejewski said. The PX is only allowed a .5 percent inventory loss by the Army and Air Force Exchange Service.

The losses hurt the store as well as the customers themselves, because part of the PX profits go back to Redstone Arsenal. "The customers are really stealing from themselves," Drejewski said.

Shoplifting penalties are stiff. There's a six-month revocation of privileges at the PX. The value of the items taken determines what happens beyond that — a loss of rank, dishonorable discharge, and so on. The crime becomes part of an individual's record.

"Shoplifting is stealing, that's the bottom line," said Sgt. Maj. Jeff Gilmore of the Provost Marshal Office. "It's nothing more."

# Retired supervisor missed by workers at missile school

*Editor's note: The following news release came from the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School.*

When an organization loses one of its people to retirement, that can and often does upset the daily routine. It has an effect that touches every person in the organization, both directly and indirectly. Such was the case with the retirement of Charles McGougan.

McGougan served as deputy director with the missile systems training department at the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School. He spent more than 26 years at OMMCS, coming to work at Redstone in 1966 after five years in the Air Force. He began his civil service career as a GS-7 training instructor. His accomplishments as an instructor and his determination to succeed earned him the respect of all those who worked with him.

"Mr. McGougan's experience will be deeply missed and his retirement will have a profound effect on the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School," said Lt. Col. Lawrence Johnson, director of missile systems training department.

McGougan's service as a supervisor began in 1979 and included many notable achievements. He managed the phase-out of the Pershing 1a and initiated new training programs for the Pershing 2 military occupational skills. He also carried out the development of

the Multiple Launch Rocket System training and the inclusion of the Forward Looking Infrared Radar modification training in the Chaparral missile system course.

He was selected as the deputy director for the land combat defense training department in 1984. While serving in this capacity, McGougan planned and managed the OMMCS Intermediate Range Nuclear Force (INF) Pershing 2 Retrograde Program.

Due to reductions in force and mandated consolidation of training departments, McGougan was instrumental in the development of the largest training department within OMMCS. His thorough planning brought about the merger of the air defense and the land combat training departments into the missile systems training department which now conducts training in all missile and support systems managed by Redstone Arsenal. He also brought about the transfer of the training mission for the automatic test equipment from Fort Gordon, Ga. The missile systems training department is responsible for over 54 military occupational skills and additional skill identifiers for enlisted, officers, warrant officers and international students in both basic and advanced missile systems training courses and training products.

In recognition of his work, McGougan received the Meritorious Civilian Service Award.



# Platoon a big contributor to Christmas food basket drive


They may be the smallest platoon in E Company, 832nd Ordnance Battalion, but 1st Platoon with its 51 people stood tall in holiday goodwill this year.



# Local Combined Federal Campaign has best year ever

Awards were presented Thursday to individuals and agencies who helped this year's Combined Federal Campaign exceed its \$1,265,000 goal.

"I think all of you have a lot to be proud of," said Ernest Young, representing the MICOM commander at the ceremony held in the Recreation Center. Maj. Gen. Joe Rigby had planned to attend but was called to a meeting with higher headquarters that morning.

Young, deputy for procurement and readiness at the Missile Command, expressed the general's appreciation for the campaign which raised \$1,331,335. "This has been the most successful Combined Federal Campaign that the Tennessee Valley has had," he said.

The Dental Activity achieved \$100 per capita and 100 percent participation.

# Angel project answers Christmas prayers for children

The conference room at building 5687 was filled with Christmas presents, enough gifts to make more than 100 underprivileged children very happy indeed.

The annual "SOS Angel Project" at the Integrated Materiel Management Center was a big success and, according to its chairperson, an answered prayer. the SOS Angel committee included Glendor Wilkerson, Jan Gentry, Donna Tatum, Mike Short, Kevin Harris and Linda Dixon, with Sheaffer as chairperson.

"It's been very rewarding," Short said. "We've enjoyed it. Children need to be involved in Christmas and have some of the same rewards that other more fortunate kids have. It's been very rewarding to us."

Col. Roy Dixon is director of Materiel Management Directorate where Sheaffer is an item manager in its fire support division. "She's got a beautiful heart," Dixon said.

Referring to the success of this year's project, Dixon said: "That's fantastic that 100 children will have a Christmas they might not otherwise have."

The gifts included bicycles, teddy bears, at least one rocking horse, and items in wrapped boxes which filled about half of the conference room. They overshadowed the 3-foot Christmas tree, with its cutout angel on top, which stood on the table. "It's not just toys. Usually it's about two or three toys and clothes (per child). Whatever you need; whatever makes a child happy," Sheaffer said.

"Without the people, we could do nothing; and I sincerely believe that the IMMC has the nicest people on the Arsenal," she said.

## Officers Wives offer merit awards

# Top female marathoner represents Army 10-Miler

The director of the Army 10-Miler road race was in town last week as an invited runner for the 16th annual Rocket City Marathon.

Claudia Ciavarella, a non-appropriated fund employee at Army recreation services at the Pentagon, is not your typical road racer. At 43 she's ranked by national publications as the eighth fastest female masters' runner in the United States.

She was the overall female winner in 1986 in the Virginia Beach (Va.) Marathon. She qualified for the Olympic Trials marathon in 1988. In 1989 she was the 20th female finisher overall in the Boston Marathon. In 1990 she was ranked by The Athletics Congress (TAC), the sport's governing body in the U.S., as the 18th best female masters' runner in the world. Ciavarella was the third female masters' finisher in the 1990 New York Marathon. She was the second female masters' finisher in the 1991 Los Angeles Marathon. She holds state age group records in North Carolina, Florida and Tennessee.

Entering last Saturday's Rocket City Marathon, where she was seeded the top female 40-and-over runner, her personal best time for the 26.2-mile distance was a nifty 2:48:18. She set that three years ago in Grandma's Marathon in Duluth, Minn.

The Army hired Ciavarella last July to serve as race director for the annual Army 10-Miler. "It is the biggest 10-miler in the country," she said, referring to the number of runners. There were 5,741 finishers in the race held Oct. 11. David Clark of New York City won in about 51:50; Laurel Park from Ann Arbor, Mich., was the female winner in 58-plus.

"Anyone can run (in the Army 10-Miler) but obviously we have more Army personnel than anything else," Ciavarella said.

"We had 47 times run this year that constitute national class times. We had three age group records set, and we had one single-age group record set; so, it's an excellent course," she said. "It's just a real fast course, and it's just a really nice course. It starts and finishes at the Pentagon. We do have to change the course this year because they're building another monument in Washington; so, everybody's got to change their course — Marine Corps, Cherry Blossom (road races). I'm hoping we'll be able to go like right around the Washington Monument, take in more of the city."

The race is sponsored by headquarters Army Rec Services; it's also sponsored by the Association of the U.S. Army (AUSA) and the Military District of

Washington. The ninth annual Army 10-Miler will be held Oct. 17, 1993. For more information, call (703) 697-1050 or (703) 614-1551. "It's grown from about 200 people the first year to almost 6,000, so it's grown a lot," Ciavarella said.

As race director, she's too busy to run in that particular race. But she makes her presence known in plenty of others. Since running her first marathon in 1982 — finishing in a respectable 3:20 which qualified her for Boston — she has done at least 35 marathons. "I had no preconceived ideas that it was something I shouldn't be doing," she said, explaining her success in her initial marathon in Detroit after only six months training. "I obviously picked the right sport for me."

Ciavarella, a native of Akron, Ohio who now resides in Arlington, Va., has run an average of about 50 miles a week for the last 12 years. At 5-5 and 106 pounds, she says her strength is endurance rather than leg speed.

During her stay in Huntsville she was the guest of Jean Grotophorst, a member of Huntsville Track Club. "She's delightful to be with. And it's really nice to be able to mingle with a world-class runner; she's so personable," said Grotophorst, an industrial engineer

here at the Army Tactical Missile System Project Office.

"I love Huntsville," Ciavarella said. "I think this is one of the best cities in the country to race in and to run in, because the people are just really supportive."

She finished the Rocket City Marathon in 3:04:39 for first place in the female 40-44 age group.


