## Sparkman Center move operation takes teamwork

Instead of assault operations or defensive maneuvers, the occupants of a war room here are planning the massive move of MICOM civilians into the Sparkman Center.

The so-called war room, located at the Directorate of Logistics building 7471, includes a large board with color-coded markings to indicate buildings and what will fill them. Members of the four planning teams represent a cross section of organizations.

They are planning the move into the Sparkman Center, an eight-building complex to be completed in June, and into backfill buildings. Backfill buildings are facilities such as the current Missile Command headquarters, building 5250, which will be vacated by the prospective Sparkman occupants.

"The way we're running this is like a war room type situation. The first team is the occupancy team or red team," said Roger Schwerman, chief of the red team. "Then we have a furniture team, and the furniture team is looking at the current furniture available within the command to help the CG determine the most cost-effective way of using current furniture assets in this time of declining dollars so we do not waste money."

"Another team is the move team. And the purpose of that team is to come up with the most effective way and least disruptive process to move all of the people either going into Sparkman or going into the backfill buildings," he said. "And the last team is the telecommunications and computer network team, and their purpose is to figure out how to make all the telephone and computer moves that coincide with the move-team time frame."

Col. Walter "Jack" Culberson heads the furniture team; Dave Sparks leads the move team; and Terry Yancey directs the telecommunications and computer network team. Team members vary from as few as two or three to as many as 20, depending on the needs at the time.

The four teams interface with each other daily in the war room. They meet to determine any problems or (See Team work, cont'd on page 2)

## Missile school here impacted by Army training shuffle

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Army announced Jan. 26 the restructuring of its combat service support professional and specialty branch schools in a move that will cut nearly 1,000 military and civilian positions and save \$37 million annually.

One of the activities affected is the Ordnance Missile and Munitions Center and School at Redstone Arsenal. Officials said there will be reductions in the total number of soldiers and civilian workers now assigned to the OMMCS staff and faculty. Just how many has not yet been determined.

The restructuring will consolidate functions from each of the schools under the Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM) at Fort Lee, Va. The reorganization is expected to increase efficiency and eliminate numerous redundant functions. Reorganization will begin immediately and be completed by Oct. 1.

Military positions eliminated at each of the schools in the consolidation will be drawn down by attrition.

As soldiers leave CASCOM for other assignments, replacements will not be assigned to the military positions. Reductions in the civilian work force at each location could occur through both voluntary and involuntary separations.

Officials at OMMCS expressed hope that their new civilian strength levels could be reached without a reduction in force and said they would do everything they could to avoid a RIF. Voluntary Separation Incentive Pay (VSIP) or Voluntary Early Retirement Authority (VERA) options will be offered to civilian workers.

Essentially the reorganization centralizes at Fort Lee similar functions now performed at each school. The overall effect, the Army said, will be that a smaller number of personnel at CASCOM will manage the functions which have been handled by a larger total number of personnel at the many schools. In general, the reorganization removes personnel authorizations

from Army CSS schools for all but instructor and command and control positions.

OMMCS officials stressed that there were no plans to close the school at Redstone and it will continue to perform its major functions of teaching and training soldiers.

Responsibility for the development of CSS doctrine and concepts, proponentry for CSS personnel, CSS evaluation and standardization efforts, resource management and most other non-training functions will shift from the CASCOM schools to Fort Lee.

In addition to OMMCS, CASCOM schools include: the Soldier Support Center at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind.; the Ordnance Center and School at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.; the Quartermaster Center and School and the Army Logistics Management College, both at Fort Lee; the Transportation School and the Aviation Logistics School at Fort Eustis, Va., and the Chaplain Center and School at Fort Monmouth, N.J.

## Recycling reply

### Editor:

(This is a reply to the letter titled "Paper recycling" which appeared in the Jan. 19 *Rocket*.)

There are people who think we recycle too much, and people who feel we don't recycle enough. There are people who feel it is up to someone else to do the labor to get things recycled and some people who volunteer their efforts gladly. We are acting like a business trying to gain the optimum recycling proceeds for the minimum cost. We are running a cost efficient program by recycling the most valuable parts of the waste stream and sending the rest to the waste energy facility. We have designed our recycling program to make as much money as possible. The profits, after overhead, go to Community and Family activities. All this money is used to improve the quality of life and the environment of Redstone Arsenal.

As of June 1, 1990, all of our trash and garbage that is not recycled, including newspapers, has gone to the Huntsville Refuse Fired Steam Facility. This is the type of low valued items that the Refuse Steam Facility was designed to recycle by turning them into steam to supply heat to the Arsenal on these sub-freezing days. We have received suggestions from people who want to take nothing out of the waste stream and send everything we generate to be burned at the Refuse Fired Incinerator, because they feel it would be worth

more as energy than as recycled fibers. We believe we need to extract the more valuable materials out of the waste stream and send the low value items to be recycled by energy conversion. It is not cost effective to develop a separate waste stream for newspapers/*Redstone Rockets*. The letter to the editor suggesting individuals take their papers home to be placed in their blue bins is a viable alternative to incineration.

We consider that we are currently recycling all paper generated on Redstone Arsenal. High value bond and computer paper are recycled for fiber; low value newspaper and mixed paper are recycled as fuel to heat the Arsenal. This allows us to both generate profits and to reduce our dependence on scarce fossil fuels. We are recycling everything practical within the workplace, while appropriately balancing economic and environmental concerns.

## Energy use

### Editor:

This letter concerns an apparent waste of energy on Redstone Arsenal, specifically at the unfinished Sparkman Center. The Jan. 19 issue of the *Rocket* featured articles on Sparkman Center (page 1) and on saving Army energy (page 3).

Frequently, I drive past Sparkman Center about 6:15 a.m. Each time, for several months, there have been hundreds of lights blazing in unfinished, unoccupied buildings; apparently the lights burn all night for no good reason. These lights have long appeared to me as sheer waste.

Recently, with the extreme cold and TVA warnings of electrical overloads, this apparent waste seems even more inexcusable. The *Rocket* article on saving Army energy stated that "The importance of saving energy has never been more critical... than now."

Am I right about energy waste at Sparkman Center, or is there good reason for these many lights to burn — a reason that is not apparent to Arsenal visitors?

revised plans. "We're working with the points-of-contact for all the organizations that are being affected; and hopefully these POCs are providing this information back to their organizations," Schwerman said.

Red team started around mid-1993; and the other teams evolved as the focus sharpened on areas like furniture, the move itself, and telecommunications needs. Many scenarios have been created for the move because of organizational changes. Army Materiel Command (AMC) Management Engineering Activity has been a big help in the planning process, according to Schwerman. He describes the work as hectic with frequent changes and relooks.

"We have done a by-name layout for all the Sparkman Complex. The furniture has been identified that's been required for movement, modification or purchase. The move sequence has been planned for all organizations; and the telephone and computer by-name interface has been worked out," he said. "Now we've got to finalize all of the occupancy layouts for the buildings that will be backfilled. We've got to finalize the purchase orders for the last pieces of furniture that need to be done. And then we've got to go back to each organization and review the rest of the details that will be necessary to make sure everybody has been accounted for and their space will be adequate — sort of a doublecheck. And then after that, I expect we'll still have one final check before they make their move."

Based on current configurations, about 2,400 people will move into the Sparkman Center; and 1,300 other MICOM workers plus 650 Program Executive Office people will move into backfill buildings such as 5681 and 5250. Planners promise there will be no double

kept on at night for several reasons, the main one being security. It is customary on all large construction projects to illuminate the building at night to deter vandalism. Since the construction projects have no lockable doors nor total perimeter fencing, the lights help to keep intruders off the premises and to spot movement on the jobsite at night. The lights are also kept on for the safety of the workmen that have been working long hours to complete the facility on schedule. The contractor chooses to burn the lights and pay the bill instead of constructing fences.")

# Calibration leaders look toward future of TMDE

Worldwide leaders of the Army calibration organization can look forward to the future with a better understanding of forthcoming changes, thanks to a conference last week in Huntsville.

TMDE (Test Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment) Support Group brought together about 90 of its commanders and site chiefs for the event held Jan. 25-28 at the Hilton downtown. The conference theme was, "Bold Leadership in Face of Change."

"Purpose is to bring the chiefs from all the independent sites together to make them aware of the changes the organization is going through," said Col. Alfred Lopez Jr., commander of TMDE Support Group. These include changes in force structure caused by downsizing, base realignment and closure, national performance review, and early retirements.

Over the last three years, TMDE Support Group has adopted a reimbursement system in which many of its customers pay for the services they receive. The Federal Aviation Administration, for example, became a new, \$2.5 million customer beginning last Oct. 1; and the amount it pays is expected to grow.

"With the force structure getting smaller, what we've done is look at new business opportunities," said Lopez, explaining the move toward a reimbursement system. "As the Army gets smaller, we're continuing to look where we can get more customers."

TMDE Support Group's main mission is to provide calibration and repair work to the Department of Army. It also provides such services for other agencies. "We support 750,000 items of TMDE around the world," said Dr. Frank Westmoreland, deputy to the commander of TMDE Support Group.

The support group has 94 fixed sites worldwide plus several mobile operations. It has about 850 civilians and 602 soldiers.

"We have one battalion that's headquartered here at Redstone, and a company in Europe, a company in Korea, and a company headquartered here at Redstone that has detachments which basically support each one of the divisions in continental U.S.," Westmoreland said. "And then we have three regions which are predominately civilian and they support customers in every state of the union, including: the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Panama, Honduras, Alaska and Hawaii. We have soldiers in Saudi Arabia who are supporting equipment in Kuwait; and we're in Japan, Italy, Okinawa, Korea, Germany."

The support group is the servicing element of TMDE Activity. The project management element of

TMDE Activity buys the equipment that the support group uses to serve its customers. Bob DuBois is the director of TMDE Activity; and Col. Steve Dasher is its project manager.

Last week's conference marked the first such event for the support group in the past 10 years. Smaller, regional events have been held during the past decade; but this is the first on such a large, worldwide scale. The goal is to conduct such a conference annually, according to Lopez.

"I think it's an outstanding chance to get together," said Donald Morris, technical director for Area TMDE Support Detachment-Hawaii. The other two attendees from that detachment included CWO 3

Craig Kelly, the detachment commander; and SFC Edmond Sigmon, its NCO-in-charge.

Capt. Darryl Cole, commander of 524th Maintenance Company (TMDE) in Germany, made his second trip to Redstone. His first visit was for initial orientation in October 1991. Cole, based in Pirmasens, Germany, commands TMDE in Europe to include units in Italy and Saudi Arabia; this represents some 181 soldiers and 35 civilians. "I think it's a very informative conference here, a chance to get all the leaders together in Conus (continental U.S.) and discuss the future of TMDE and to share some of our knowledge," he said.





# SSDC's top contracting manager completes career



The C and F Fund returns vary from the Wells Fargo returns because of C and F Fund expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds. The Wells Fargo returns are time-weighted; they assume constant dollar balances invested during each month and throughout the period.



# Certified child-care quarters a good alternative

Redstone Arsenal gained two new Family Child Care providers in December. Lucile Nealy and Darcie Grindrod both received their provisional certification allowing them to care for children in their on-post homes.

Family Child Care (FCC) is a truly special alternative type of care for children on Redstone Arsenal. FCC is a private business regulated by the Army that provides loving, developmental child care in homes (government quarters) on post. Certification is required for anyone living in government housing caring for unrelated children (paid or unpaid) for 10 or more child-care hours per week.

Becoming a certified FCC provider takes many steps

such as understanding the Army's involvement and Family Child Care, developing a professional attitude and realistic expectations, considering business responsibilities, family commitment, policy compliance and program benefits, and completing provisional certification and full certification requirements. This is a three-phase process that every provider must follow to receive FCC certification: registration, provisional certification (good for 12 months), and full certification (good for three years). To maintain full certification, each provider must complete 24 credit hours of training annually.

When you choose an FCC provider, you are not leaving your child with just a babysitter. Your child will receive physical, mental, emotional, and social development. The goal of Army family child care is to provide developmental care.



# Quality of life issues resolved through symposium process

Among the many issues resolved by the Redstone Arsenal Family Symposium process are extended hours for the Child Development Center.

The center will extend its closing time to 6 p.m. on a trial basis March 1-31. This was among the staff recommendations announced Thursday at a backbrief meeting for the symposium held last November. Current hours for the Child Development Center are 5:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday; and 6:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday. An issue had been raised that 5:30 p.m. does not allow adequate time for parents to pick up children after duty hours.

Helen Roadarmel, coordinator for Child Development Services, also announced that the Family Child

Care Program — in which Redstone residents can be certified to provide child care in their quarters — is undergoing major changes in its operation and policy.

Staff recommendations for 56 quality of life issues addressed at the symposium were presented last week

at backbrief meetings held Wednesday and Thursday. Maj. Gen. Joe Rigby, the post commander, thanked the participants and presented certificates at the final session.

"We certainly aired the issues," he said, "and many of them I think we most certainly resolved."

Some of the issues and the staff recommendations include the following:

- The automated telephone system at Fox Army Community Hospital, which has been criticized as complex and confusing, was to be revised with a new menu Feb. 1.
- To expand parking at the youth sports fields on Goss Road, the Youth Center submitted a work order last Nov. 17; plans are being designed and the actual work should be completed this summer.
- A process action team at Civilian Personnel Office has reviewed CPO's system of processing personnel actions — an issue had been raised that it takes the personnel office too long to process these actions. The process action team made a number of recommendations for improving this system; and a plan of action should be completed within the next few weeks.

# Children's dental health focus of monthlong observance

*Editor's note: The Redstone Arsenal Dental Clinic Command brings you this article in observance of National Children's Dental Health Month. It is the first in a series of dental health articles for children. As a reminder, preschool children from the Redstone Child Development Center will visit the main dental clinic for a short tour and video presentation on the following dates: Feb. 4, 11, 18 and 25 at 9:30 a.m.*

February is National Children's Dental Health Month — a good time to do something to protect your children's teeth. Enrolling in the Uniformed Services Active Duty Dependents Dental Plan (DDP) can help your family maintain good dental health by providing comprehensive dental health care services comparable to or better than dental health plans offered by civilian employers.

DDP offers a wide array of dental health care services for children at an affordable price for parents or guardians. Preventive services for children, such as cleaning and fluoride treatments, are covered at 100 percent. The plan also provides 100 percent coverage for space maintainers for children up to age 14. Parents will be glad to know that sealants for children's teeth are covered at 80 percent. DDP also provides 50 percent for orthodontic treatment (such as braces) for children up to 19 years of age. In addition,

many other important dental services, such as fillings, extractions, root canals and emergency treatment, are covered by the plan.


DDP has the benefit of no deductibles. It also has an annual \$1,000 maximum per patient on all services except orthodontics and a lifetime \$1,200 maximum per patient for orthodontics. The service branch pays 60 percent of each sponsor's premium, so the sponsor's payroll deduction remains reasonable at \$9.65 for one dependent or \$19.30 for two or more dependents.

Parents can make appointments for their children with any licensed dentist they choose — including pedodontists (dentists specializing in children's teeth). By going to one of more than 110,000 Delta dentist offices, your family can save money, time and paperwork. Delta dentists have agreed to charge DDP patients fees that have been preapproved by Delta and will submit patients' claim forms. Delta dentists accept payment directly from DDP\*Delta, so you are not required to pay up front for covered services (except for the patient copayment for services covered at less than 100 percent).

DDP is voluntary, so active duty servicemembers must enroll their dependents at the personnel office. Spouses and children living in the United States, Guam, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands can be

enrolled in DDP for a minimum enrollment period of 24 months.

The Health Benefits Adviser (HBA) in the CHAMPUS office at your local installation can explain DDP coverage in detail. Your HBA also has a list of Delta dentists in your area. You can call DDP\*DELTA Customer Service at (916) 381-9368 (west of the Mississippi) or (313) 489-2240 (east of the Mississippi) to find out more about how DDP can maintain your children's dental health.

# Finance provides 24-hour service in Mogadishu

MOGADISHU, Somalia — The 24-hour tellers in Mogadishu are not machines, they're people.

The 33rd Finance Battalion Forward, from Fort Drum, N.Y., has an open-door policy. It's open any time, day or night, to help U.S. servicemembers get paid.

Though the University-compound finance office closes at 4 p.m., the 13-member team lives conveniently across the hall from the office. Many times, they've helped soldiers who needed money for emergency leave — sometimes in the middle of the night.

"We have a no-appointment-necessary policy," said SFC Reginald Dixon, detachment sergeant. "I don't really care if they wake us up. We're here for them."

The finance team arrived in-country Aug. 16, with orders to stay for six months and to serve all U.S. troops in Mogadishu. The finance staff tries to provide services to the troops without making them travel to the University. So a mobile pay team ventures via convoy or helicopter to the other U.S. and U.N. bases around town.

"We got a call from some soldiers at the Boat Basin who needed to cash checks and get their (Leave and Earning Statements), so we sent a mobile team," Dixon said.

The finance office is equipped with all the conveniences you might find in-garrison. It is hooked up directly to the main finance office at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind., so the staff can queue up the most recent pay histories.

The direct line simplifies transactions, making them smoother and faster, even, than back home, said clerk SSgt. Randy Butterfield. The volume of work is not as heavy here, which enables the group to ensure faster service.

"In-garrison, it could take three to four days — after an appointment is made — to receive pay," Butterfield said. "Here, we don't require appointments and don't have the extra paperwork to mess with."

The office handles casual pay, allotments, check-cashing, and temporary duty travel. It also funds contractors and operates the payroll for Brown and Root, the Texas-based company that provides many services for the United Nations Operation in Somalia.

Within a two-week timeframe, the 33rd financed more than \$1 million, because of requirements for redeploying troops and Christmas travelers.

"We can do anything a finance office can do in the rear, only faster," Dixon said. "We'll take care of you on the spot."



# ACOE evaluation team to look at customer service

Customer service is the most important thing the ACOE evaluation team will consider when it visits Redstone March 29 to April 1, according to the post commander.

commitment, provide that input, to make this final push," he said.



# Fort Lewis soldiers augment Somalia redeployment

MOGADISHU, Somalia — As the American military involvement in Somalia winds down, the last thing you'd expect is for more soldiers to deploy here. But 33 soldiers from Fort Lewis, Wash., arrived Dec. 14 to help clear vehicles, equipment and people from this country.

The soldiers, a platoon of the 571st Military Police Company, is augmenting the 21st MP Co. from Fort Bragg, N.C. Eighteen of them were here before,

January through April; they expected a similar mission, but found that much has changed.

"I figured this deployment would be a continuation of what we started earlier this year," said SSgt. Jeff Goerke. "I thought we'd still be doing patrols in the city, chasing bandits and doing other security missions."

Instead, their focus has shifted to convoy security missions and customs inspections, said 1st Lt. Jeff Jackson, platoon leader.

"We're like a regular line platoon," Jackson said. "We're increasing (the 21st MP Co.) strength, because with customs work and convoy escorts, the mission in-country is more than a regular MP company can handle."


To prepare for this deployment, the platoon focused on convoy security training.

"We thought that's what we'd be doing when we got in-country," Jackson said. "It's really not that much different from what we do back home, because this is all part of our mission-essential task list."

By providing military units with convoy security and customs inspectors, MPs here play a major role in troops redeployment. Although they must often put aside their own needs and work extra duty hours, the protection they offer is invaluable to U.S. and U.N. forces.

# Customer service spotlight: Provost Marshal Office

The Provost Marshal Office is getting a much needed facelift, one that will not only improve the interior appearance of the 1950s-era building, but provide a more streamlined way of handling daily business.

A major flaw in the building's design is its five front doors, and visitors and customers are never quite sure which one to use, said Ray Clift, chief of Law Enforcement Branch.

When reconstruction is complete the building will have only two entrances: a main door into the Military Police area and a centrally located door for the Security Guard Force Section. All visitors and customers will enter the building at the MP entrance and be directed from there by the MP desk sergeant.

The location of the radio dispatch office is being moved and will be the "pulse point" of the entire building, Clift said. Henceforth, every radio transmission, telephone conversation and person who enters the building will be recorded.

Traffic flow within the building will be improved when the redesign is finished. "As it is now, we all run

back and forth and are always criss-crossing each other," Clift said, referring to the people who work in Security Guard Force Section, Operations and the MP Section.

Within the Operations area, a receptionist desk area will be added complete with a seating area, he said.

After contractors have finished with structural improvements, individual employees will take the responsibility of cosmetic touches to their offices, i.e., painting, plants, prints, etc.

In addition to structural improvements and decorating, the Provost Marshal is always striving to improve the way it does business to help customers. For example, the Operations office has recently changed the way it handles police reports and has decreased the number of days it takes to process traffic accident reports, from 10 to three days, Clift said.

Once all improvements are completed to the building, an Open House will be held and everyone can go by for a visit. That will most likely be in late February.

# Heart Month: Proper diet can help prevent heart disease

As February is National Heart Month, what better time to read an article about the new cholesterol guidelines.

First, there is good news about cholesterol levels. The cholesterol levels are declining in the United States. From data collected in major studies, the average cholesterol level among adults ages 20 to 74 dropped by 12 to 17 mg/dL (6 percent to 8 percent) since 1980. The proportion of adults with desirable cholesterol levels (less than 200 mg/dL) rose from 44 percent to 49 percent. Along with the declines in blood pressure levels and smoking rates, this means a 54 percent decrease in the death rate from heart disease.

These changes are attributed to the educational and medical strategies recommended by the National Cholesterol Education Program (NCEP). This is the coalition of government and private health organizations in charge of persuading Americans to control their cholesterol levels. In June 1993, the NCEP updated its guidelines for the first time in five years. The

new report reflects the increased knowledge about cholesterol and the treatment of elevations. Specifically, the changes include:

- There is a new emphasis on the determination of HDL-cholesterol (also known as "good" cholesterol) during the initial testing of total cholesterol. HDL is now considered an independent risk factor for heart disease.

- The recommendations have become more stringent if you have other risk factors for heart disease besides elevated cholesterol and low HDL. The risk factors are age (45 years or older for males, 55 for women), cigarette smoking, high blood pressure, diabetes, or a family history of heart disease (a heart attack or sudden death before age 55 in your father or before age 65 for your mother).

- A greater emphasis is placed on physical activity and weight loss. On the average, for each 2 pounds of body fat that is lost, there is a corresponding drop in blood cholesterol of 1 mg/dL.

- More caution is recommended in prescribing medication to control high blood cholesterol. Cholesterol-lowering drugs should be avoided or at

least delayed in men under 45 and women under 55, unless additional risk factors are present. But whatever the age, dietary and exercise measures should be followed.

Not changed are the guidelines for total cholesterol: Under 200 mg/dL is considered desirable, 200 to 239 mg/dL is borderline-high, and 240 mg/dL and above is high blood cholesterol.

To help you with your cholesterol level or to learn how to cook exciting low-fat, low-cholesterol foods, attend the Culinary Hearts Kitchen cooking course. This course is designed by the American Heart Association and will be offered by Fox Army Community Hospital.

The six session course shows step-by-step methods of cooking American favorites as well as international and ethnic foods. Students will learn how to cook meals low in fat, cholesterol, salt and calories, yet retain the natural flavor and zest of each dish. The course offers a wide assortment of recipes and each step in the course is illustrated by more than 250 slides of mouth-watering foods that are easy to prepare and good for your heart. Sessions are included on cooking meats and poultry, breakfast foods, soups, fish, vegetables and baked goods. Culinary Hearts Kitchen is the ultimate course for anyone interested in a healthier lifestyle.

The course will be taught at Fox Army Community Hospital by Peter Schwager, a registered dietitian, and me, Susan Goodman, a nurse educator. The program is free and open to all military beneficiaries and civil service employees. It will be held from 9-10 a.m. Feb. 23, 25 and 28; and March 7, 10 and 14. ## New military journal rides jointness tide

WASHINGTON — Officers serving in joint-duty assignments are receiving the second issue of a new journal aimed at their professional needs and aspirations.

The autumn 1993 issue of "Joint Force Quarterly" treats such topics as special operations forces, joint warfare, the Goldwater-Nichols Act and prospects for an information corps. This second, and latest, issue resumes the journal's in-depth coverage of joint-warfare concepts, doctrine and operations. Among its features is this parting word from former Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Gen. Colin L. Powell:

"Maximum effort to accomplish the mission, to win decisively, demands joint action on the battlefield. If there is a legacy of which I am the proudest, it is that we have come together as a joint team in an unprecedented way over these last four years."

The Institute for National Strategic Studies, which publishes the journal at Fort Lesley J. McNair in Washington, expects the publication to have an expanded "pass around" rate as more officers receive joint-duty assignments and training.

Issues are printed in 30,000 copies. These are sent automatically to the target audience of mid-level officers in all the joint commands and military services.




The Redstone Arsenal Sports Haven congratulates karaoke contest winners Nicole Kirby, first place, and Deborah Roan, second place.






